Failure by the councils to pay house allowance to all employees as outlined in Union letter dated 28th July, 1973

- 1 The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall herein after be referred to as the Claimants and the Association of Local Government Employers representing the two councils shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents
- 2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 13th November, 1973, and 3rd January, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form 'A" dated 7th September, 1973, setting out the issue in dispute as stated hereinabove together with the relevant certificate from the Labour Commissioner bearing the same date were received by the Court on 10th September, 1973

The Claimants' demand is that the Respondents should pay house allowance to their employees at the following rates —

The position at present is that out of some 8,000 manual employees, 6,000 are housed by the Respondents and the remaining 2,000 who are living in private dwellings are entitled to a monthly house allowance of Sh 50 The salaried staff are not getting any house allowance and their current salary structure was implemented with effect from December, 1971

Before proceeding further the Court would like to dispose of the Respondents' submission that the issue in dispute does not include a demand for an increase in the housing allowance being paid to those manual employees who are not housed by the Respondents The Court is satisfied that the Claimants' letter dated 28th July, 1973, addressed to the Town Clerk, Nairobi City Council with the copy to the Mombasa Municipal Council makes it sufficiently clear that the Claimants intended the Sh 50 per month housing allowance for the manual employees to be increased to Sh 150 per month The Court accordingly rejects the Respondents' submission that the house allowance in respect of manual employees is not an issue in dispute

It is common ground that following the Job Evaluated Grade Structure and Salary Recommendations prepared by INBUCON the parties negotiated and agreed upon a salary structure and the relevant part of the minutes of the committee held in Mombasa on 30th November/1st December, 1971, reads as follows —

"Mr Richmond on behalf of the Councils stated that he had agreed with the union that they could discuss the question of a housing allowance for salaried staff. The employers, therefore, at their preliminary meeting had given full consideration to this problem bearing in mind that in Nairobi the Industrial Court had already ruled that housing had been consolidated into the salary levels and in Mombasa in 1970, a 10 per cent increase in salaries had been given directly attributed to the consolidation of the housing allowance into the salary levels. Having regard to these two facts, the employers, therefore, were of the opinion that they could not agree to any separate housing allowance.

Mr Ndombi, on behalf of the union, stated that he fully realized that the question of separate housing allowance was a big one and he, therefore, would prefer this item to be discussed at the end of the negotiations on salary levels. This was agreed "

The parties having agreed on a salary structure confronted considerable difficulty in securing the Minister for Local Government's approval to its implementation with the result that con sultations had to take place with HE the President Mzee Jomo Kenyatta as a result of which on 25th May, 1972, the Minister for Local Government issued a circular to all Town Clerks of Municipal Councils stating —

"After consultation with HE the President Mzee Jomo Kenyatta and with his blessings it has been agreed that the salaries for Nairobi and Mombasa will be those negotiated by the union and the representatives of Nairobi City Council and

Mombasa Municipal Council In respect of salaries for employees in the remaining municipalities it was agreed that the salaries negotiated by the representative of the union and of those municipalities will be paid with minor modifications and without any additional housing allowance. It was agreed at the meeting that the whole question of housing policy by local authorities should be a subject of further review at a later date."

In the current salary structure the employees are entitled to an annual increase on the first of every year

In 1969 the Claimants had raised the issue of housing allowance in Nairobi which issue was the subject matter of an award by the Industrial Court in Cause No 40/69 In that dispute the Court ruled as follows —

"In view of the foregoing the Court cannot accept the Claimants' submission that house allowance was not meiged in the salary scales. Were it not so it is very surprising indeed that the Claimants have not taken up this matter of house allowance for almost nine years when as recently as June, 1966, they negotiated new salary scales for the Nairobi City Council employees which was the subject matter of Industrial Court award in Cause No 3/67 Another surprising feature of this demand is that the Mombasa salary scales have now included in them a 10 per cent salary increase and 10 per cent housing allowance element which is consolidated in the salary scale This clearly shows that the Claimants appear to be pursuing an illogical policy In any case, even if the house allowance was not consolidated in the current salary scales in Nairobi the Court is satisfied that no case has been made out for introducing the house allowance for Nairobi City Council as a new fringe benefit The Court has given this matter very anxious thought and has come to the conclusion that this demand should be rejected"

The Claimants had made it abundantly clear that their de mands, the subject matter of this dispute, were prompted by the tremendous rent increases which had been announced by the Nairobi City Council for all its estates, they were quite frank in saying that had the rents not been increased then probably they would not have pursued this demand so soon

The Court finds that the important points in this dispute are —

- 1 Whether or not the current salary structure in respect of salaried employees is consolidated, i.e. contains an element of housing
- 2 Do the words 'the whole question of housing policy by local authorities should be a subject of review at a later date' give the Claimants the right to press for their present claim?
- 3 Can the Respondents absorb the extra expenditure which would be necessitated if the Claimants' demands were accepted without curtailing its capital development plans and vital services to the community?

Now dealing with the first of the three aforesaid points there is no doubt that in 1969 in Cause No 40/69 the Court ruled that the salaries at least as far as the Nairobi City Council employees were concerned, were consolidated After the Court award certain developments took place, the most important being the Job Evaluated Grade Structure and Salary Recommendations by INBUCON The Claimants' contention is that the negotiations that followed this report did not produce a consolidated salary structure, ie does not contain a housing element. The Court notes that they have stressed that they had used the word 'deferred' as against the word "dropped" as far as the claim for housing allowance was concerned.

The Court has studied the relevant parts dealing with the question of housing allowance in this report and it appears that the parties had various alternatives before them One important statement in the report on housing allowance reads as follows—

"Payment by the Councils of a total salary or a basic salary plus a house allowance is a matter separate from the consideration of the absolute levels of total remuneration The comparison with Government is in terms of a total remuneration. This could be paid as a total salary or could be split into a basic salary and a house allowance. This is a matter for negotiation INBUCON, however, strongly recommend that a total salary be paid because the payment of a house allowance not only leads to administrative difficulties and possible abuse, but also because it is inequitable in application as it discriminates against married women and holders of posts with duty houses.

It also provides differential benefits according to the type of house hved in (e g council house, privately rented or owned) "

The fact however remains that when the negotiations on salary structure were concluded the Claimants had reserved their position as far as their demand for housing allowance was concerned with the Respondents agreeing to the new salary structure on the basis that it was consolidated There was, however, no direct agreement on this point

In these circumstances and having carefully considered the parties' submissions on this point, the Court is satisfied that although the present salary structure cannot be termed as consolidated as such, there is definitely a certain amount of housing element in it. This point would be referred to in due course in the award

The second important point and which is in fact recorded in the circular issued by the Minister for Local Government dated 25th May, 1972, regarding the review of the whole question of housing policy by the local authorities is concerned, raises an interesting question. The whole sentence on this point reads "It was agreed at the meeting that the whole question of housing policy by local authorities should be a subject for further review at a later date" It is obvious that what was envisaged was a review of the whole question of housing policy by local authorities This only reinforces the Court's earlier finding that since the parties had not come to a definite settlement on the question of consolidation of housing allowance they had reserved their respective positions Of course a review could embrace the whole question of housing on a much wider basis than a mere demand for payment of housing allowance to the employees Technically the Claimants appeared to be within their rights in raising the demand for payment of a housing allowance on the basis of the aforesaid agreement

The Court would now like to tackle the most important point in this whole dispute which, however, the Claimants stated was not relevant. The Court does not agree with the Claimants' sentiments on this point because the financial viability of the Respondents and their continued ability to embark on capital development programme and provide essential and vital services to the community is very relevant and pertinent to the whole dispute. The Respondents had submitted that a major part of their income goes in salary and wages and fringe benefits to its employees. They maintained that the implementation of the 1972 salary review had led the city into a great financial difficulty in that for the first time over many years the Nairobi City Council realized a deficit of £441,183 in 1972, and it was estimated that a further deficit of over £550,000 will be realized in 1973. They maintained this was mainly because of the salary review.

The Court notes that the Respondents' estimate that if Nairobi City Council was to give housing allowance on the lines proposed by the Claimants it would cost over £1,000,000 per annum In Mombasa the cost would be £160,170 in a year They stressed that any implementation of such housing allowance as proposed by the Claimants would lead the City Council into a total financial collapse or alternatively would mean increasing the rates levy by about 50 per cent

As against the Respondents' aforesaid submissions the Claimants have put forward figures and the report of the Controller and Auditor-General which suggest that the financial position of the Respondents would not be so bad if they only realized properly and efficiently what was due to them They stated that for the year ended 1972 the Nairobi City Council had been unable to collect an amount to the tune of Sh 47,000,000 and Mombasa Municipal Council had been unable to collect £268,114 They strongly submitted that if the Respondents were facing financial difficulties it was because of poor planning and that things had gone wrong somewhere This was not a strong reason to reject the Claimants' demands

The Claimants refuted the Respondents' contention that they would have a considerable shortfall in their revenue as a result of the abolition of the GPT by the Government on the ground

that the Government had undertaken to make grants to the Respondents to offset any such loss in revenue

The Court has no doubt that the Claimants' demands if granted would have very far reaching financial implications for the Naiiobi City Council and the Mombasa Municipal Council

Having disposed of the extremely important points which would affect the decision in this dispute the Court must now proceed to make its award

The Court notes that the wages for the manual workers are due for revision in the very near future as the parties informed the Court that negotiations were about to commence The Court has also had the benefit of the analysis carried out by the Employment Promotion Division of the Ministry of Labour which was done expressly on the instructions of the Court The conclusions of the EPD are as follows—

- '1 If a housing allowance could be granted strictly on basis of compensation for actual rent increases, such an allowance according to our views would be in conformity with the Guidelines
- 2 If, for reasons we have been unable to investigate, such an arrangement should be technically impracticable, the alternative would be an allowance of a general nature. In that case, any amount that will be granted by the Court will reduce the scope for further salary increases. Since the Claimants have explicitly stated that they wish to avoid such consequences, the most rational solution might be to defer the matter until after an agreement has been reached on a general review of salaries."

The Court has further been influenced by the fact that the present salary structure for salaried staff includes an element of housing and since it would be impossible to deconsolidate such element from the existing salary structure it very much complicates the whole issue

The Court is surprised that the Claimants do not appear to attach the weight which they should to the fact that it is the basic salary that is most important as far as a worker is con cerned because it is the amount of the salary that affects his retirement benefits, his overtime, premiums and the level of the other fringe benefits The Court very much appreciates the frank admission by the Claimants that the increases in the rents announced by the Nairobi City Council had prompted them to raise this dispute so soon but it appears that they have been guided more by emotions than logic in putting forward this demand for housing allowance The Court has also taken into consideration the fact that the workers particularly those who are occupying City Council houses are very badly hit by the ircreases which have been imposed by the Nairobi City Council but surely this would be a very strong argument along with the argument of other increases in the cost of living indices to support the Claimants' demand for comparable increases in salaries

The new salary structure which was implemented with effect from December, 1971, was a result of the agreement in May, 1972, between the Claimants and the Minister for Local Government in which agreement however the parties also agreed that the whole question of housing policy of local authorities should be a subject of a further review at a later date

The Court has very carefully considered all these points and the other submissions made by the parties and has come to the conclusion that while it cannot be denied that the workers have made out a good case for loss of money value, the Court feels that the proper way to compensate the workers for such loss due to increases in rents and other increases in the cost of hving is for the parties to embark on salary revision. The Court feels that there is no reason why the parties should not be able to open negotiations for salary revision.

The Court has no doubt that the parties shall take into account the Guidelines which have been issued by the Minister for Finance when they are negotiating the salary increases. In these circumstances the Court rejects the Claimants' demand for the payment of a separate housing allowance


