Both the persons involved in this dispute were served with letters of termination on 31st March, 1973, and the reasons given were as follows —

Mr P M Amatuka

Reference to our letter to you dated 14th instant regarding the two tyres when you were on duty on 12th instant, which were found missing, we insist that you should be responsible for this, as the tyres were made during your shift. We have now decided due to your carelessness, and to avoid such cases not to happen again, to terminate your services forthwith, and enclose our cheque for Sh 540 made up as under

Mr Christopher Osoro

It has been proved that you are abusing Mr Thomas Odhier, one of the Directors of the company, which you have done in front of the other employees, which is completely wrong, and not to have any misunderstanding between the employees and the management, we have decided to terminate your services forthwith, please find enclosed cheque for Sh 441 made up as under

The Claimants are challenging these dismissals on the ground that both these persons were active trade union officials and they strongly feel that they have been victimized by the Respondents for their trade union activities. They maintained that the reasons given for terminating their services are very flimsy and cannot stand the test of an investigation

The Court notes that on 12th March, 1973, the Respondents lost two tyres which had come to their factory and which they had retreaded—one in the morning shift and the other during the second shift. Both the tyres were reported to be missing from the time of the second shift on that date when Mr Amatuka was on duty. The matter, however, was not reported at any police station although the Respondents had sent a copy of their letter dated 14th March, 1973, addressed to Mr Amatuka and three other employees on the subject of the missing tyres, to the police at Nakuru

The Respondents admitted that they had at one time threatened to deduct the wages of the employees concerned to recover the value of the tyres lost but explained during the hearing that this was done only as a threat to elicit more information about the tyres from these persons

Mr Osoro is the brother-in-law of Mr Thomas Odhier who is one of the three directors of the Respondents' undertaking. It is not denied that Mr Odhier had given employment to his brother-in-law first as a trainee and then as a technical worker in the Respondents' undertaking. Mr Odhier gave evidence on oath during the hearing and explained the circumstances under which his brother-in-law, Mr Osoro, during some discussions had called him *munga* (fool). This was heard by the other employees who were on duty at the time and they all laughed at the incident. The Court has no doubt that they were in fact ridiculing Mr Odhier for having been insulted by a worker who was also his brother-in-law

The Court is satisfied that Mr Odhier was aware as far back as 17th March, 1973, that both Mr Amatuka and Mr Osoro were union shop stewards but the Court does not find that the real reason why the Respondents terminated their services was because of their trade union activities

In the case of Mr Osoro the Court finds that Mr Odhier has given an account leading to his dismissal which under the circumstances is reasonable and worthy of credence. Mr Odhier was very disappointed at his brother-in-law's behaviour and attitude after he had joined the union and the Court is inclined to believe that there is some truth in what he says that since joining the union his brother-in-law thought that he was in a rather special and privileged position. The Court has very carefully considered all the submissions made by the parties and the evidence of Mr Odhier and has come to the conclusion that Mr Osoro's services were terminated properly and for adequate lawful reasons. The Court cannot condone acts of indiscipline which if unchecked can cause lot of damage. The Court has no sympathy for Mr Osoro who also showed total disregard of the hospitality, encouragement and the training which his brother-in-law, Mr Odhier, had made available to him. The Court must reject the Claimants' prayers in respect of Mr Osoro

Now dealing with Mr Amatuka's dismissal the Court has come to the conclusion that it was rather harsh on the part of the Respondents to hold him alone responsible for the missing tyres when in fact there were three other employees also on duty with him and there was a watchman on duty as well at the outer gate of the factory. No evidence was given of any investigation having been carried out by the Respondents and if any investigation was carried out no details of any such proceedings have been made available to the Court, neither was the matter reported to the police. In these circumstances the Court finds that Mr Amatuka has suffered wrongful dismissal but the Court would like to make it clear that neither Mr Osoro nor Mr Amatuka were dismissed because of their being union shop stewards and for their trade union activities

During the hearing the Respondents' advocate informed the Court that soon after the services of these two persons were terminated they found alternative employment where they have been working since then. Subsequent to the hearing and with the assistance of the Senior Labour Officer, Rift Valley Province, the Court got the information that Mr Amatuka has joined his brother, Mr Ambula, as a co partner in a motor vehicle repair business called Josam Motor Garage, P O Box 383, Nakuru. Mr Amatuka joined the business from 15th November, 1973

In view of the aforesaid information the question of ordering the reinstatement of Mr Amatuka to his former employment is out of question and the Court is left only with the question of determining what compensation should be awarded to him for his wrongful termination. The Respondents have not been able to produce any evidence to the Court to show that Mr Amatuka was in any other employment from the time his services were terminated by them up to 15th November, 1973, when he joined his brother in the aforesaid business. At the time of his dismissal by the Respondents his monthly income including housing allowance was Sh 284 per month. After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that Mr Amatuka should be paid a sum of Sh 1,136 by way of compensation for his wrongful termination

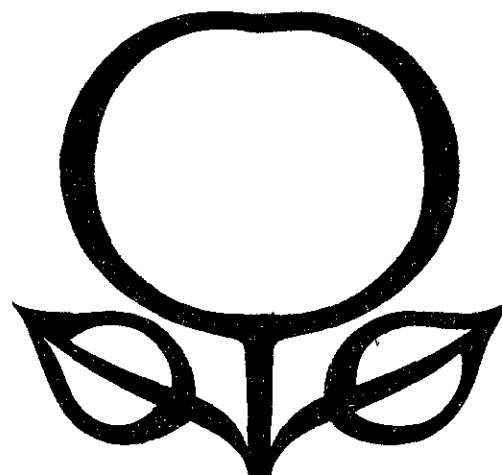

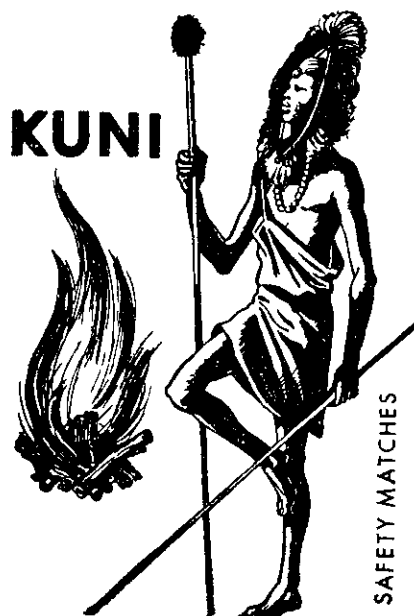
