3 Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands through the District Commissioner and not direct so as to reach the District Commissioner not later than 5th April, 1974

4 Applicants must enclose with their applications the sum of Sh 200 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows —

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of 30 days as required in paragraph 5 below the deposit will be credited to him
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be refunded to him
- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 30 days as required in paragraph 5, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

and

Timber Industries Employers Association

INTERPRETATION APPLICATION RULING

The Court announced its award in the above dispute on 2nd February, 1973, and while noting the present wage structure which was the subject matter of review in the dispute, awarded that the workers should get a wage increase of Sh 30 p m from 1st June, 1972, for the first 15 months, thereafter they should get another wage increase of Sh 15 p m for the next 15 months.

On 20th March, the Respondents applied for an interpretation of the Court award on the item of wages. The Respondents wanted to know if the ruling of the Court was to the effect that the wage structure which existed at the time of the Court award was increased, by Sh 30 in each case (and a further Sh 15 after a further 15 months) or does each man get an increase of Sh 30 regardless of the wage structure.

The Claimants at that time strongly maintained that the award gave each worker the specified increase on his wage.

The Court announced its ruling on 30th March, 1973, and upheld the Claimants' interpretation

This second application for interpretation has now been filed by the Claimants who have submitted that according to them the Court had also increased the following wage structure by Sh 30 and Sh 15 as awarded above —

They maintained that the above wage structure was under review before the Court and the Court had accordingly varied it

They complained that the Respondents had interpreted the Court award to mean that although each worker received the wage increases as awarded by the Court the wage structure remained as above

This had resulted in the new employees being deprived of the wage increase awarded by the Court

The Claimants were also worried as to how to approach the wage negotiations during the next review if the wage increases awarded by the Court are not incorporated in the wage structure

The Respondents submitted that this was nothing more than an attempt by the Claimants to persuade the Court to vary its award to give the workers a double benefit

The Court agrees with this view and finds that the award and the ruling on the first interpretation application have put the matter beyond any doubt

The case of new employees is simple and straightforward

They start at the aforesaid existing wage structure and should get the wage increase which becomes effective after the date they start working

This is clearly an attempt by the Claimants to persuade the Court to vary its original award. This the Court is not prepared to do. Neither is it necessary for the Court to advise the Claimants on how to approach the next wage negotiations under these circumstances

The Court must advise the parties that appear before it that genuine interpretation applications will always get a prompt and sympathetic hearing by the Court but the Court must strongly discourage the parties from using the interpretation applications by way of an appeal to persuade the Court to vary its award during the life of such award

Having said this the Court finds that there is no merit in the Claimants' interpretation application and it is rejected

Issue in dispute —

Wrongful and unjustified dismissal of Mr Jamin Omedo

1 The Kenya Motor Engineering & Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Cooper Motor Corporation (K) Ltd, shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 30th November, 1973, 22nd January and 11th February, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The parties called the following witnesses to give evidence in Court —

Claimants — Messrs J Omedo and B Okhonjo

Respondents — Messrs R Nanji, G Parker, P Kamau, W Thuo and S Muithya

AWARD

3 On 11th October, 1973, the Court received the Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 26th September, 1973, with the statutory certificates from the Labour Commissioner and the Minister for Labour dated 8th and 10th October, respectively

Mr J Omedo's services were terminated by the Respondents on 19th July, 1973, after about 5½ years' service with them. The letter of termination read as follows —

"Further to your conversation with the Senior Shopsteward, Mr Samuel Muithya, the Uhuru Highway Stores Manager and the undersigned on the morning of Thursday, the 19th July, 1973, this is to confirm to you that your services with this company are terminated with immediate effect

Please regard this as formal notice to terminate your services"

The incident which led to this termination took place on 18th July, 1973, at the Respondents' Uhuru Highway branch in the stores section. At the material time, the Stores Manager was Mr R M Nanji who occupied an office by himself with the adjoining room being occupied by three persons one of whom was Mr Omedo

Mr Nanji was authorized by the Respondents to dispose of, by sale, wooden packing cases and to retain proceeds thereof for the purpose of granting short-term loans to staff employed in his section. For this purpose he had a blue cash receipt book in which he used to record the receipts in respect of money received from the sale of these cases. On 18th July, 1973, he had collected a sum of Sh 1,060 out of which he had given loans to the extent of Sh 235 leaving a balance of Sh 835 with him. He used to keep the balance of cash in his possession in this blue book fastened with a paper clip in the top left-hand drawer of his table. Mr Nanji stated on oath that although the cash used to remain in his drawer as explained above he never bothered to lock the drawer and that other employees in his section also knew that a certain amount of money was in his drawer as he used to give loans from it

It is alleged by the Respondents that on the day in question shortly after 5 p.m. Mr Nanji was coming towards his office along the corridor and as he came exactly opposite his office from where he could see inside through a glass panel he saw Mr Omedo bending over his desk with the blue book in his hand. On seeing Mr Omedo in this position Mr Nanji ran into his office and as he did so Mr Omedo ran through another door to his own office and came out from the other door into the corridor. As he was passing Mr Nanji's office he was stopped there by the latter and questioned about the whereabouts of the money that was lying in Mr Nanji's drawer. Mr Omedo denied any knowledge of the money but the argument continued and both of them moved down the corridor towards the top of the stairs leading to basement where Mr Nanji is alleged to have caught sight of the money in Mr Omedo's right-hand trouser pocket which he grabbed from outside

Mr Nanji says that he then brought Mr Omedo to his room and Mr Omedo sat on his chair and opened the second right-hand drawer and put the money in that saying, "Here is your money". Mr Nanji then asked him if he was ashamed at having done such a thing and Mr Omedo is alleged to have said he was sorry and he then left

The next day a supervisor from the machine shop came with the blue book and asked Mr Nanji if it belonged to his section and Mr Nanji after identifying it, took it back. On the same day, i.e. 19th July he received a phone call from one Mr Pearce who used to be the Stores Manager prior to Mr Nanji taking over. Mr Pearce told Mr Nanji that Mr Omedo had told him that he, Mr Nanji, was making false accusations against him (Mr Omedo) of having attempted to steal some cash from his table and that this was calculated to put Mr Omedo into trouble. Mr Nanji then told Mr Pearce the full story with the result that the whole incident was investigated by the General Service Manager, Mr A H Beddoes and Mr G Parker who was at the time Service Manager at Uhuru Highway. Also present during the investigation was Mr Nanji and Mr Omedo when several witnesses were also asked questions in addition to Mr Nanji and Mr Omedo giving their respective versions of the incident

After the investigation was completed the Respondents came to a decision which resulted in Mr Omedo's services being terminated as quoted above

The Claimants are challenging this termination on the ground that Mr Omedo has been the victim of a frame up on the part of Mr Nanji who bore a grudge against him over a leave incident which had taken place between the two of them on or

about 21st May, 1973 It was alleged by the Claimants that Mr Omedo had applied for his 21 days' leave to commence on 25th June but Mr Nanji had turned the application down but later on Mr Nanji was forced to allow him to proceed on leave when Mr Omedo had contacted Mr Pearce over the matter The Claimants stated that Mr Nanji did not like this and was determined to get rid of Mr Omedo due to this incident

The Claimants also made other allegations against Mr Nanji to the effect that he did not get along well with the African personnel in his section They also accused the Respondents' management of having violated the principles of natural justice in that Messrs Parker, Beddoes and Nanji had constituted themselves into an employers' court and had passed summary sentence on Mr Omedo

This dispute at one stage was investigated by a Labour Officer from the Senior Labour Officer, Nairobi's office, as a result of which the Senior Labour Officer forwarded his findings and recommendations to the parties on 31st July, 1973 After setting out the parties' respective submissions the Senior Labour Officer's findings and recommendations were as follows —

"The Union's submission that Mr Omedo had worked for 5½ years without adverse reports was not challenged by the Management The dismissal of Mr Omedo was based on circumstantial evidence as only two people were involved in the argument and the matter was not reported to the police on the same day of the alleged attempted theft of some money

In view of the above findings I consider the Management's action in dismissing Mr Omedo instantly with loss of all privileges, and without any consideration to his past records as harsh and unjustified

However, in view of the now deteriorated relationship between Mr Omedo and his employers I consider that it will not be in his own interest to recommend his reinstatement and therefore, I recommend that his dismissal be reduced to normal termination of contract of services with full terminal benefits including notice and leave pay

I remain reiterating my appeal to both sides to adopt this recommendation as basis for settlement of the dispute"

The Claimants reacted sharply to the Senior Labour Officer's report and criticized him for his recommendations which were contradictory to his findings and informed him that they could not stomach his biased and pro employers report

The Respondents relied mainly on the version of the incident as given by Mr Nanji and corroborated by other witnesses who were also called to give evidence during the hearing and maintained that in their opinion the summary dismissal of Mr Omedo was fully justified

The Court has before it two versions of the incident which took place at about 5 p.m., on 18th July, 1973 one of Mr Nanji alleging that he caught Mr Omedo red handed while in the act of stealing money from his drawer and the other one of Mr Omedo who claims that Mr Nanji has framed him in this incident with a view to getting rid of him and that when he was searched only Sh 4 were found on him with Sh 835 lying in the second right-hand drawer of Mr Nanji's table

In these circumstances the Court has to look at the other available evidence which touches the said incident To begin with the reason which the Claimants have put forward as being the motive behind Mr Nanji's action of framing such a serious charge against Mr Omedo is very tenuous indeed The Court finds it highly unlikely that a person would go to all this length and even run the risk of committing perjury simply because a person working under him got his decision of refusing to let him go on leave reversed by a superior officer The Court is not prepared to believe that Mr Nanji had worked out an elaborate plan of incriminating Mr Omedo just because he bore a grudge against him due to the leave incident As a matter of fact, from the evidence it appears that if anyone had a grudge against anyone, it was Mr Omedo who had good reason to have it against Mr Nanji because Mr Omedo had been relieved of certain duties pertaining to local purchases

Then there is the evidence of Messrs Peter Kamau, Wandaka Thuo and Samuel Muithya The first two told the Court how the blue book was found on a bench in the machine room The Respondents' contention that it was thrown over the wire fence by Mr Omedo as he ran out of his office when he was spotted by Mr Nanji holding it, is more probable under the circumstances

The story of Mr Nanji is further corroborated by the evidence of Mr Samuel Muithya who told the Court how when he passed Mr Nanji and Mr Omedo twice—once when they were near the door of Mr Nanji's office and later when they were on top of the steps leading to basement, he heard Mr Nanji asking Mr Omedo to hand him back his, Mr Nanji's, money and that at one stage he saw Mr Nanji holding Mr Omedo's right hand trouser pocket and saying "this money"

All this lends great weight to the version of Mr Nanji as being nearer the truth than Mr Omedo's story

The investigation carried out by Mr Beddoes and Mr Parker the very next day also came to the conclusion that Mr Nanji's story was true If Mr Omedo's contention that he has been a victim of a conspiracy is believed it would lead to a preposterous result to the effect that Messrs Nanji, Beddoes, Parker, Kamau, Thuo and Muithya had all conspired against him No grudge was imputed against anyone else except Mr Nanji

After a careful consideration of all the submissions and the evidence the Court has come to the conclusion that Mr Nanji's story is true and that Mr Omedo, perhaps in a moment of weakness, was tempted to pocket the money which he knew was lying unlocked in Mr Nanji's table drawer In fact the incident would never have become so serious as to lead to Mr Omedo's loss of employment if he had not tried to forestall any action on the part of Mr Nanji by going himself to Mr Pearce and alleging that Mr Nanji was trying to frame him on a criminal charge Mr Nanji told the Court that most probably he would have decided to forget the incident if Mr Pearce had not telephoned him the next day to say that Mr Omedo had made the said allegation against him This had left him with no alternative but to tell the true story which led to the investigation and subsequent termination of Mr Omedo's services

The Court cannot accept the criticism which the Claimants have levelled against the Senior Labour Officer, Nairobi, as such criticism is completely unjustified The Respondents' intention as a matter of fact was to terminate Mr Omedo's services summarily with loss of all benefits, although the letter of termination may give a different view

The Court finds that the Respondents had good and justifiable grounds to terminate the services of Mr Omedo and accordingly rejects the Claimants' demand for his reinstatement The Court, however, feels that the Senior Labour Officer's recommendation should be upheld and Mr Omedo's termination should be considered to be a normal termination and he should be paid all his benefits including one month's pay in lieu of notice and the Court so awards

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 11th, 14th and 31st January 1974 and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Court received the Notification of Dispute Forms "A" on 19th and 22nd October, 1973, respectively with the issues in dispute as specified hereinabove. The Acting Labour Commissioner issued his certificates in accordance with section 9 (9) (e) of the Trade Disputes Act on 17th October, 1973.

The hearing of these two disputes proceeded with the consent of the parties on a consolidated basis with the result that although the Claimants had put in two separate written submissions the Respondents filed only a joint submission in respect of both the Claimants.

The Respondents are full and active members of the Kenya Tea Growers' Association (hereinafter referred to as the Association) in respect of all their activities. This Association has a Recognition Agreement covering all their members with the Kenya Plantation & Agricultural Workers' Union (hereinafter referred to as the Plantation Union) and the last Collective Agreement dated 1st July, 1971, between the Plantation Union and the Association provides for rates of wages not only for agriculture and plantation workers but also for all medical grades, printing trade workers, clerical grades, factory workers, drivers, mechanics and artisans.

There is no serious dispute on the organization of the Respondents' undertaking in that with effect from 1st July, 1970, the following companies became divisions of the new parent company, the Respondents —

Kenya Tea Co Ltd
Mabroukie Tea & Coffee Estates Ltd
Brooke Bond Oxo Kenya Ltd
Kenna Coffee Ltd
Brooke Bond Mombasa Ltd
Kenya Fishing Flies Ltd

The three "divisions" under the name of Kenna Coffee, Brooke Bond Mombasa and Kenya Fishing Flies continued to trade without change of name or address and the remaining effected the following changes —

Brooke Bond Oxo Kenya Ltd, is now part of the Sales and Marketing Division
Kenya Tea Co Ltd, is now part of the Estates Division of the Respondents
Mabroukie Tea & Coffee Estates Ltd, is now part of the Estates Division of the Respondents
Brooke Bond Services Ltd, have been integrated into the Respondents

The first Claimant Union is seeking the right to represent workers employed in the following sections of the Respondents' company which they allege are part of Sales and Marketing Division —

- (a) Head Office
- (b) Sales and Marketing Department
- (c) Warehousing Department at Mombasa
- (d) Tea and Coffee Packing Factories
- (e) Kenya Fishing Flies
- (f) Export Department for Tea and Coffee

The second Claimant Union are claiming the right to represent the workers in the printing department of the Respondents at Kericho.

At this stage the Court would like to mention that the Plantation Union at one time resisted the encroachment by the two Claimant Unions as far as the Respondents' employees were concerned. On 7th January, 1972, the Plantation Union, however, wrote a letter to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, stating that their union represented all employees of Respondents in spheres of plantation, tea processing factories, etc., whilst workers employed by Respondents in godowns and, sales field both at Mombasa are represented by the first Claimant Union and they expressed the hope that this would settle the issue in question.

During the hearing the Respondents criticized the then General Secretary of the Plantation Union saying that the General Secretary has since been discredited by his union and he obviously did not know what he was up to when he conceded the first Claimant Unions' right to represent Respondents' workers in godowns and sales field in Mombasa. Subsequent to

the hearing the Plantation Union has sent a letter dated 24th January, 1974, addressed to the General Secretary of the two Claimant Unions with a copy to the Court stating that they completely objected to any move by the two Claimant Unions to represent employees in any section of the Respondents' undertaking and that they would regard such a move as internal interference in their affairs. They had further claimed that the Demarcation Committee was convened without any representation from their union and alleged that this was contrary to the laid down procedure. They have also made it clear that the Plantation Union shall not accept any decision made by the Demarcation Committee in these circumstances.

The Court views the part played by the Plantation Union in this whole affair with great reservations under these circumstances. The Court cannot accept the Respondents' statement that the former General Secretary of the Plantation Union was discredited by the Union because of his part in this dispute as he lost his office for an entirely different reason. The Court also cannot rule out the possibility that the Plantation Union at this late stage has been prompted to make these representations. The Court has therefore decided to produce its award on the basis that the Plantation Union had really no interest in this matter otherwise they would not have taken such lukewarm stand.

This now brings the Court to the establishment and the role of the Demarcation Committee on which the Respondents have laid a lot of emphasis. In this context it is rather important to give very briefly the historical details of the developments which have taken place in the country in the field of industrial relations. The first document in this respect is the "1957 Agreement" in which the important points relevant to the dispute are as follows —

- (i) The function of a union of employees as a body with which employers can negotiate is accepted, but to be recognized, such a union must be duly registered and must be able to show that it can ensure that agreements reached will be observed by the workers in the industry.
- (ii) The overlapping of spheres of activity of unions should be avoided.
- (iii) Unions should be organized on an industrial basis.
- (iv) No form of coercion should be brought to bear upon the individual either to join or not to join a union.

Subsequently as a result of further meetings between the interested parties, industrial trade unions were established totalling 15 in number and later in 1958 separate unions were formed to represent workers in the following industries —

- (a) Laundry, Cleaning and Dyers
 - (b) Electrical Power Operators
 - (c) Timber and Furniture Workers
- Then in 1959 unions were formed representing —
- (a) Engineering Industry
 - (b) Tobacco, Brewing and Bottling
 - (c) Motor Engineering
 - (d) Quarry and Mine Workers
 - (e) Seamen

On 25th June, 1959, the General Council of the Kenya Federation of Labour gave authority for the formation of agricultural unions on an industry basis as follows —

- (a) Agriculture
- (b) Tea
- (c) Coffee
- (d) Sisal
- (e) Sugar

On or about 13th September, 1961, as a result of an agreement reached between the representatives of the Kenya Federation of Labour (KFL) and Federation of Kenya Employers (FKE) it was agreed to set up a National Joint Consultative Council (hereinafter referred to as the NJCC) and this Council agreed to adopt a method for dealing with disputes. This agreement appears in full in the Respondents' submissions, and led to the establishment of the Demarcation Committee.

The Claimants have challenged the validity of the procedure leading to the reference of such matters to the Demarcation Committee on various grounds, the principle ones being that for many years now the NJCC had not been properly constituted and further that it was clearly stipulated that there should be joint secretaries whereas in fact the whole body at present was in the hands of and was dominated by the employers' repre-

representatives. The Respondents admitted that there were certain irregularities but this state of affairs was a direct result of the apathy of the trade union movement and its internal leadership strife. They contended that the fact remained, however, that the Demarcation Committee had functioned over the years, whether validly or invalidly, and references had been made to it by various unions including the first Claimant Union and decisions of the demarcation Committee had been accepted by the unions involved.

The Court very much appreciates the important role which the NJCC and through it, the Demarcation Committee, are intended to play in solving disputes between various unions on matters of recognition by the employers. There is, however, no doubt that due to certain very obvious reasons the NJCC has, strictly speaking, no constitutional existence as the important provisions relating to the appointment of its members, the appointment of joint secretaries, etc., have not been complied with since 1969. The Court is satisfied that the labour movement is mainly responsible for having allowed such important organ in the industrial relations to lapse to this state where it continues to operate, at the most, on an unofficial basis. The court sincerely hopes that the parties concerned and the authorities will organize the NJCC on a proper and constitutional basis so that it can perform its functions with full authority and weight.

As indicated earlier, this dispute was referred to the Demarcation Committee and a meeting was held on 8th May, 1973, which was attended by three COTU (K) representatives, and two from FKE. From the minutes of this meeting it appears that the representative of the Plantation Union and the two Claimant Unions were also present. Much progress, however, was not made and the Committee agreed that as all the three unions had agreed to adjourn, the matter be adjourned to a date to be arranged as quickly as possible. It is not denied that the two Claimant Unions put in memoranda before the Demarcation Committee but when the Committee met again on 27th June, 1973, with three representatives from FKE and two from COTU (K), the representatives of the two Claimant Unions failed to attend. Nevertheless, the Demarcation Committee proceeded with its work and the following decision was arrived at —

It was unanimously agreed by all members present that it was most important for the future peaceful industrial relations in Kenya that the agreed principles of union representation be adhered to and should only be altered at a joint meeting between COTU (K) and the FKE when either of the parties wished to consider amendments to the 1961 agreement therefore, in accordance with this principle, it was agreed that all the employees of Brooke Bond Liebig Kenya Ltd Group were properly represented by the Kenya Plantation & Agricultural Workers' Union.

In May, 1973, the two Claimant Unions informed the Minister for Labour that they were not prepared to accept his advice and let their dispute with the Respondents be dealt with by the Demarcation Committee. Their grounds for doing so were —

- (a) The FKE/COTU (K) Demarcation Committee is a voluntary committee which has nothing to do with the Minister.
- (b) The Trade Dispute Act does not provide that if a dispute is declared the Minister is empowered to use FKE/COTU (K) Demarcation Committee.
- (c) That the union is rather prejudiced against the FKE/COTU (K) Demarcation Committee on the grounds that the employers with whom we are in dispute are direct members of FKE and as such we are convinced that at any Demarcation Committee, the FKE will always represent the interests of its members whereas the Union does not have representation because COTU (K) is not supposed to represent our interests at the Demarcation meeting.

In the aforesaid circumstances the Court, while appreciating the very important role which the NJCC and the Demarcation Committee should play in industrial relations, has come to the conclusion that the decision of the Demarcation Committee in this dispute, however, should not be held to be binding on the parties. The Court, therefore, must decide the issue in dispute on the evidence and submissions that were produced before it during the hearing.

The second Claimant Union made a submission that the Association did not have a valid existence and as such its purported recognition and collective agreements with the members of that Association including the Respondents had no legal basis. This was an interesting submission but one which would hardly seem to affect the issue in dispute because even if the Court was to

uphold this submission, that in itself would not give the Claimant Unions the automatic right to represent and be recognized in respect of the workers on whose behalf they have instituted this dispute. This submission is not very relevant to the dispute.

Both the parties solemnly declared during the hearing that their respective stands were in conformity and were designed to uphold the existing excellent industrial relations system in Kenya. The Claimants maintained that the real reason that had prompted them to pursue their demands vigorously was to end the exploitation of the workers in the printing sections and sales and marketing divisions in the Respondents' undertaking in that they were not being paid the comparative rates for the type of work they did which were prevailing in the country at present. The Respondents on the other hand strongly contended that if the Claimant Unions' demands were accepted by the Court it would throw into chaos the whole industrial relations system in the country. The Respondents wondered if the Claimants succeeded, where such demands would end and pointed out the various industries like the sugar industry, where different types of activities like engineering, etc., in addition to plantation work were carried out.

The Court fully realizes the extremely important principles that are at stake in this dispute and the Court is determined, in the absence of any valid and justifiable reason, to uphold the industrial relations system in Kenya which has become the envy of most of the newly independent countries and which is one of the major contributors to the smooth and stable industrial relations in Kenya.

The dispute has raised one interesting point and that is if a giant undertaking decides to embark on a programme of diversification and as a consequence acquires other firms which are not quite in line with their original activity then is such an organization going to be allowed to absorb all its new acquisitions as being part of the original industry? In other words the Court has to decide what is an industry.

In this dispute one firm Oxo E A Ltd, had a Recognition Agreement with the first Claimant Union which the Respondents purported to terminate after they acquired complete ownership of this firm, and then the firm Brooke Bond Mombasa Ltd, had on an unofficial basis a sort of understanding that the first Claimant Union will represent their employees and the Court is satisfied on the evidence that that was so. The firm Fishing Flies Kenya Ltd, was a manufacturing concern.

The printing section of the Respondents' undertaking at Kericho is indulging in commercial printing and the Respondents conceded this during the hearing although they stated that commercial printing will now be reduced by them and they will concentrate on meeting the requirements of their own departments only. The Court is satisfied that the printing section has in the past undertaken commercial work on a considerable scale and the Court is not prepared to accept a mere statement by the Respondents during the hearing that this pattern will cease in the near future.

The Court notes that the total number of employees in the Respondents' undertaking is 13,818 out of which some 98 are in the printing department, 127 in Sales and Marketing tea and coffee, 67 at Brooke Bond Mombasa warehouse and 268 with the Kenya Fishing Flies Ltd.

The Court has no doubt that the Respondents' major industrial activity falls within the plantation industry but that they have as a result of their diversification programme branched out, either from scratch or by acquiring existing enterprises, into fields which are not directly related to their industry.

The Court has come to the conclusion that where an enterprise extends its activities and ventures into fields which are not strictly part of its original activity then this would not automatically bring them into the fold of their original industry. The new undertaking that is acquired should, however, be clearly capable of being identified in its true activity. In the present dispute the Court has no doubt that the first Claimant Union has a right to be recognized by the Respondents in respect of their unionisable employees who were in the employ of Oxo E A Ltd, and those of their such employees who are stationed at Mombasa at their warehouse.

The Kenya Fishing Flies Ltd, which was acquired by the Respondents is clearly a manufacturing concern and the fact that now it is under one chairman and one Board of Directors does not alter the fact that this activity was not and is not even now part of the plantation industry.

The Court would like to record that the Respondents have gradually expanded and taken over new enterprises which have not changed the nature of their commercial activity and are not in line with the Respondents' basic industry. If the other unions who have the right to represent workers in such industries are not given the right to be recognized by an employer who takes them over, then it would lead to a very unhealthy situation. The fact that there is one management for all the various departments after the amalgamation should not determine the issue. This trend of giant organizations taking over various enterprises is currently very much in fashion not only in Kenya but elsewhere as well but this should not be considered a licence by such organizations to terminate the existing recognition agreements which the smaller firms which they take over have with the other unions.

Now coming to the printing section of the Respondents' undertaking, this issue is different from the one which the Court has dealt with in that this particular department has all along been a feature of the Respondents' undertaking and no other union had any official or unofficial recognition, apart from the Plantation Union, to represent such employees. But the important point on this matter is the fact that the Respondents have developed their printing section into a commercial undertaking and as such it is no longer an activity solely related to the plantation industry. Had this not been so, the Court would not have come to the conclusion that the workers in the printing section should also be given the right to be represented by the second Claimant Union. One other factor which goes against the Respondents is that they have been ordered to contribute the levy towards the training of workers in the printing industry by a Ministerial Order.

Further the Respondents have already created a precedent whereby the Tea Hotel at Kericho owned by them has a recognition agreement with the Domestic and Hotel Workers Union. This is no doubt because it operates as a hotel on a commercial basis.

After a very careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that the first Claimant Union be recognized by the Respondents in respect of their unionisable employees who were in the employment of Oxo EA Ltd, Kenya Fishing Flies Ltd, and those unionisable employees who are at their Mombasa warehouse.

The Court further awards that the second Claimant Union should be recognized by the Respondents in respect of unionisable employees in their printing department.

The Court would like to impress upon the parties both in the labour movement and the employer organizations and the Government through the Ministry of Labour, that urgent steps should be taken to put the NJCC and through it, the Demarcation Committee, on a proper and sound footing. Time is opportune now when certain further improvements can be made on to the existing system and this matter should receive urgent consideration and this important body should be properly and constitutionally set up.

Issue in dispute —

Non payment of overtime to Mr Munyau Nzioka

1 The Kenya Motor Engineering & Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and J S Davis & Co (K) Ltd, shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 15th day of February, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. In addition the Respondents called Mr D B Willcock to give evidence.

AWARD

3 On 30th November, 1973, the Court received the Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 26th September, 1973, with the statutory certificates from the Labour Commissioner and the Minister for Labour dated 23rd November and 27th November, 1973, respectively. The issue in dispute is as stated hereinabove.

The Claimants have raised this dispute on behalf of Mr Munyau Nzioka who is employed by the Respondents since September, 1969. Mr Nzioka joined the Claimants sometime in 1973.

It is not disputed that the parties had a collective agreement in force dated 16th May, 1967, effective from 1st March of that year for a period of 12 months. Thereafter, this agreement appears to have continued in force until 30th November, 1973, when a new collective agreement came into force from 1st September, 1973, and is to remain effective for two years.

The Claimants have formulated their claim on the clause covering hours of work in the 1967 agreement which clause reads as follows —

"The normal working week shall consist of 44 hours spread over 6 days of the week."

It is also specified in the said collective agreement that overtime shall be payable in respect of extra hours worked at the rate of time worked plus a half for work done on Mondays to Saturdays and double time for work done on Sundays and gazetted public holidays.

Mr Nzioka was employed as a watchman and although the lowest wage category in the Respondents' undertaking starts at Sh 245 per month he was offered, and he accepted, employment at Sh 300 per month. The Respondents made it clear through the evidence of the witness they called that the job categories in the collective agreement were not based on any job classification but were merely in relation to the salary structure which existed at the time. The witness also stated that Mr Nzioka was engaged at Sh 300 per month because he was expected to work longer hours than the other manual employees.

Both the parties agreed that when the 1967 collective agreement was signed the Respondents did not have any watchman in their employment and the Respondents went further to say that they did not even contemplate at that time employing a watchman.

The Claimants maintained that Mr Nzioka's hours of work should be considered to be 44 hours spread over six days of the week and that since the Respondents admitted that he has worked on an average 105 hours per week he was entitled to be paid overtime at the agreed rates for such excess hours of work. According to the Claimants' calculations the overtime worked amounted to 9,516 hours and they asked the Court to award Mr Nzioka a sum of Sh 14,274 in respect of such overtime worked.

The Respondents while giving the factual background to the dispute submitted that the Claimants' demand was fictitious. In any case they pointed out that an agreement had been reached in principle with the Claimants' General Secretary whereby the Respondents were to pay a sum of Sh 2,500 to Mr Nzioka in full and final settlement for his overtime claim but subsequently another official of the Claimants had persuaded Mr Nzioka not to accept the agreement. The Respondents maintained that Mr Nzioka was entitled to backdate his claim for only one year in accordance with section 15 (3) (a) of the Regulation of Wages and Conditions of Employment Act. They presented in Court the relevant details and stated that a sum of Sh 353/05 only was due to Mr Nzioka in respect of his claim.

The Court has carefully considered the parties' submissions and finds that since at the time the 1967 collective agreement was signed no watchman was employed by the Respondents it cannot be deemed that the clause on hours of work stated therein automatically applied to a watchman who was employed by the Respondents some two years after the agreement had been signed. Since the parties did not take steps to amend the agreement in order to specifically include the new type of work in the said collective agreement it follows that the employment of such new employees should be regulated by the relevant statutory provisions as far as his wages and terms and conditions of employment are concerned. In this case they were contained in

Regulation of Wages (Motor Engineering Trades) Order, 1967
Regulation 5 of this Order reads as follows —

"The normal working week shall consist of 44 hours of work spread over six days of the week, comprising five days of eight hours' work per day and one day of four hours' work

Provided that—

- (i) in the case of day security staff the normal working week shall be six shifts of ten hours each,
- (ii) in the case of night security staff the normal working week shall be five shifts of fourteen hours each "

That this is so is borne out and confirmed by a subsequent act on the part of the Claimants' General Secretary when on 17th January, 1974, he reported the existence of a trade dispute between his union and the Respondents in the matter of hours of work of the security staff. In his detailed report which he attached to that letter he wrote as follows —

"The current Motor Engineering Trades Wages Order in force provides that a night security staff should work for 70 hours in one working week made up of five shifts of 14 hours each

The employer Messrs J S Davis & Co (K) Ltd, is not complying with the above Order and instead overworks his night security staff by 2 hours weekly. This is to say that the night security staff in question works 72 hours in a week instead of 70 hours in a week "

The Court is further constrained to say that if the Respondents' version of the conditions under which Mr Nzioka was employed was not true then Mr Nzioka would certainly have raised this matter with them much earlier and not waited until he joined the union in 1973 for someone to take up the matter on his behalf. Whilst the Court appreciates that perhaps genuine welfare of the worker had prompted the Claimants to press with this claim it cannot entirely rule out the possibility that there is a certain amount of speculation in this claim, otherwise there seems to be no reason why an agreement which was arranged by the Claimants' General Secretary should not have been concluded to settle this dispute

In the circumstances the Court has come to the conclusion that Mr Nzioka is entitled to be paid for overtime worked by him in excess of the hours of work specified for security staff in accordance with the Regulation of Wages (Motor Engineering Trades) Order, which was in force at the time

The Court directs the Chief Industrial Relations Officer, Ministry of Labour, to work out the overtime dues to which Mr Nzioka is entitled in accordance with the Court's award after checking the relevant records kept by the Respondents in consultation with the Claimants


