## THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE No. 54 of 1973

Parties:-

Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers and

Embu District Co-operative Union Ltd.

Issue in dispute:--

Respondents.—Interpretation of clause Nos. 11 and 19 of an Agreement entered into between parties on 21st November, 1966, in respect of acting allowance for Mr. Thomas Njiru.

Claimants.—Acting allowance for Mr. Thomas Njiru in accordance with the agreed collective bargaining agreement.

- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Embu District Co-operative Union Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 7th day of March, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

### AWARD

3. On 13th November, 1973, the Court received the Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 9th November, duly signed by the parties' representatives along with statutory certificate under section 9 (9) (e) signed by the Labour Commissioner.

Mr. Thomas Njiru is an employee of the Respondents and in August, 1969, was performing the duties of book-keeper at a monthly salary of Sh. 500. On 22nd August, 1969, the Respondents' Manager proceeded on a course to Sweden. The Senior Book-keeper Mr. Karuchi was asked to execute the duties of the Manager and Mr. Njiru was asked to act as Senior Book-keeper which he did from 24th August, 1969.

Mr. Njiru was subsequently asked to act as an accountant with effect from 1st September, 1969, which job he performed until 31st December, 1970. This arrangement followed the resignation of the accountant.

There is ample evidence before the Court to show that Mr. Njiru started claiming acting allowance as early as 31st December, 1969, and it was not until May, 1970, that the Respondents informed Mr. Njiru that it had been resolved to pay him a duty allowance of Sh. 130 p.m. with effect from February, 1970, but not an acting allowance. Mr. Njiru while appreciating the payment of duty allowance continued pressing for the payment of acting allowance to him also. The Respondents, however, refused to entertain any such demand and the Claimants then stepped into the dispute.

The Claimants' main submission is that duty allowance is not the same thing as acting allowance and they claimed acting allowance for Mr. Njiru as follows:—

The Claimants pointed out that two other employees who had also performed acting duties had been granted acting allowance by the Respondents and in these circumstances they could not understand the reason why Mr. Njiru should be denied this allowance. They maintained that Mr. Njiru was entitled to be paid the acting allowance on the basis of the difference between his salary and the salary for the post in which he was acting.

The Respondents denied that they had been prejudiced against Mr. Njiru and had given preferential treatment to other employees. They maintained that proper consideration was given to Mr. Njiru's requests on acting allowance.

The Respondents referred the Court to the parties' collective agreement which was in force at the relevant time and submitted that the matter was entirely at the discretion of the Management Committee and since this Committee had given its decision that was the end of the matter. In any case they stressed that the duty allowance of Sh. 130 p.m. had not been withdrawn and had been integrated into Mr. Njiru's salary.

Finally the Respondents pleaded that there had been a certain amount of confusion over the use of the terms acting allowance, duty allowance and their interchangeability.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has no doubt that the Respondents' management had indeed failed to appreciate the subtle difference between a duty allowance and an acting allowance. This becomes obvious from a close study of the letters that were exchanged. The collective agreement in force at the time catered for some 19 items and whereas there is a provision under the heading of acting allowance there is no clause covering duty allowance. The acting allowance clause reads as follows:—

"Any employee who acts in a grade higher than his/her own grade for a period of one month or more, shall be paid an acting allowance as shall be determined by the Management Committee."

It is quite clear that the amount of acting allowance to be paid is left to be determined by the Management Committee. In the absence of a specific provision for the payment of duty allowance the Court believes that the Respondents' intention of giving an additional Sh. 130 p.m. to Mr. Njiru with effect from 1st February, 1970, was to compensate him for the extra duties and responsibilities which he had to undertake as a result of having to act in place of the accountant. In fact as it transpired Mr. Njiru has benefited considerably more in that the duty allowance has not been withdrawn and is part of his salary now. If he had been granted an acting allowance the amount to be paid was to be determined by the Management Committee and there is no way in which anyone could influence the Committee on that score.

The Claimants had no doubt realized the weakness on this particular point in the aforesaid collective agreement and have taken appropriate steps with the result that in the latest collective agreement the new clause on acting allowance reads as follows:—

"Acting allowance shall be paid to an employee who may act in a higher grade above his own scale, subject to such employee acting in that grade for a period of not less than 30 days. He shall be paid the difference between his basic salary or wage and the minimum point of the grade of the post he is acting for."

In the present dispute the Claimants are asking the Court to exercise the discretion which was vested in the Management Committee by determining the amount of acting allowance to be paid to Mr. Njiru which would be the difference between his salary and that of the accountant. The Court is not prepared to do this because it would be entirely wrong for the Court to usurp the discretion which was at that time vested in the Management Committee.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that since the duty allowance of Sh. 130 p.m. has been integrated into the salary of Mr. Njiru and in view of the wording of the clause on acting allowance in the relevant collective agreement Mr. Njiru is not entitled to any further allowance. The Claimants' demands are accordingly rejected.

### THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 59 of 1973

Parties:-

Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union

and

Motor Trade and Allied Industries Employers Association

Issue in dispute.—The Association's refusal to pay salary arrears to employees who have left but were in employment at the time the Industrial Court made their award in Cause No. 9 of 1970.

- 1. The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Motor Trade and Allied Industries Employers' Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 26th day of February, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

### AWARD

3. The Court received the Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 30th October, 1973, duly signed by the accredited representatives of both the parties on 4th December, 1973, with the issue in dispute as stated hereinabove. The Labour Commissioner issued his certificate in accordance with section 9 (9) (e) of the Trade Disputes Act, on 3rd December.

An agreement was entered into between the parties on 25th October, 1973, covering ten items including wages. The agreement was signed by J. P. W. Heather-Hayes for and on behalf of the Respondents and F. E. Omido signed it for and on behalf of the Claimants. The signing was witnessed among other dignitaries by an Assistant Minister for Labour, Mr. Peter Kibisu, and Secretary-General of Cotu (K). The signing ceremony was much publicised with photographs in the local Press.

This was the first time in several years that these two parties had voluntarily and without recourse to the Industrial Court concluded negotiations satisfactorily. In this agreement clause 1 (a) on wages reads as follows:—

"All employees currently in employment with companies which are members of the Association and who were in employment with those same companies at the time of the Industrial Court Award in Cause 9 of 1970, announced on 28th May, 1970, shall receive 12 months' arrears of increase applicable to the grade in which they were employed on 31st January, 1971, i.e. the arrears will be based on the increment which they would have received had the Industrial Court Award been implemented."

The Claimants now complain that the Respondents are refusing to pay salary arrears to employees who have left but were in employment at the time the Industrial Court made its award in Cause No. 9 of 1970.

During the hearing the Claimants submitted that the Respondents had conveniently inserted in the aforesaid part of the agreement words "currently in employment" although during negotiations preceding the agreement these words were not used and it was not the intention of the parties to use them. The Claimants produced the relevant minutes of the Joint Industrial Council meetings held on 11th and 19th October, 1972, in support of their contention.

The Claimants stressed that they had relied on the Respondents in good faith although the established procedure whereby a draft of minutes/agreements was first sent to them was not followed in this case.

Mr. Omido who appeared for the Claimants accepted the blame for having signed the agreement without reading it and according to him it was only later on that he realized that the actual agreement had been manipulated and contained words which were not agreed to be there.

The Claimants accused the Respondents of having inserted the said words in order to deprive certain workers of their right under the aforesaid Court award.

The Respondents on the other hand emphasized that there was no truth whatsoever in the allegation made against them and that the agreement in question was only signed after the Claimants' General Secretary had had ample time to study it and after he had expressed himself as satisfied with its wording. In fact they said that Mr. Omido and his colleagues scrutinized the agreement for nearly 20 minutes whilst everyone else waited.

The Respondents submitted that there was no ambiguity whatsoever in the wording used and the Claimants were attempting to introduce extrinsic evidence which is not permitted by the Kenya Evidence Act, 1963.

The Respondents conceded that the words "currently in employment" do not appear in the minutes but stressed that the words used in the minutes were "all employees" and not "all including exemployees". This was understood to mean all employees currently in employment, hence the wording in the agreement to make it absolutely clear.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court would like to make it very clear at the outset that there is absolutely no ambiguity in the clause on wages in the aforesaid agreement. What the Claimants are really after is to get a ruling from the Court that the words "currently in employment" should be deleted or declared to be of no effect because it was never agreed by the parties to use these words during Joint Industiral Council meetings.

The Court was shown a copy of the said agreement which bore the initials of Mr. Omido and Mr. Heather-Hayes on each page. That this was so was not denied by the Claimants.

A careful appraisal of all the circumstances surrounding the signing of this agreement make it almost impossible for the Court to believe that the Claimants did not know what they were signing.

In any case it would be a great error on the part of the Court to allow extrinsic evidence to be introduced to explain a document where there is absolutely no ambiguity. It would not only be entirely wrong if the Court accedes to the Claimants' request but it would also lead to chaos because the collective and other agreements would be instantly thrown open to the parties to try to get interpretations suited to their own ends by the introduction of the extrinsic evidence. This time it is a union which is seeking the Court's assistance but next time it can quite easily be an employer who will want to do the same thing. This will lead to an impossible situation.

The issue in dispute is the Respondents' refusal to pay salary arrears to employees who have left but were in employment at the time the Industrial Court made its award in Cause No. 9 of 1970. Subsequent to the award the parties exchanged letters and embarked on negotiations which resulted in the aforesaid agreement dated 25th October, 1972. In the preamble to this agreement reference is made to Industrial Court award in Cause No. 9 of 1970 and in the absence of any ambiguity the Court has no alternative but to find that this agreement supersedes all that had taken place prior to it in relation to matters covered therein.

In these circumstances and after a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that the Respondents' stand is proper and the Claimants' demand is rejected.

- 2. A plan of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office, situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3, post free.
- 3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the Clerk of the Council, County Council of Kipsigis, stating the plot required in order of preference. Applications must be on prescribed forms which are available from Lands Department and the office of the Clerk of the Council, County Council of Kipsigis.
- 4. Applications must be sent so as to reach the Clerk of the Kipsigis County Council, not later than noon on 19th April 1974.
- 5. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.
- 6. Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows:—
  - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
  - (b) If the application is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be refunded to him
  - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

### General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.

5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and the proportion of the annual rent together with the legal fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

### Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any conditions herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept surrender of the and comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period, no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and the buildings shall only be used for shops, offices and flats (excluding the sale of petrol).
- 6. The buildings shall not cover more than 75 per centum of the area of the land if used for shop and/or office purposes only or such lesser area of the land as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws, and not more than 50 per centum of the area of the land if used for combined purposes of shops, offices and flats or such lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.
  - 8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.
- 9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President; no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.
- sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of 10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sums as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and

- such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.
- 14. The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.
- 15. The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th year of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at a rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.
