ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS' EXAMINATION, 1974

IT IS notified for general information, that this year's Administrative Officers' Examination will be held on Wednesday, 14th, Thursday, 15th and Friday, 16th August, 1974, in accordance with the provisions of Personnel Circular No. 6, dated 4th April, 1970.

SCHEME OF THE EXAMINATION

2. The examination will consist of the following six test papers, held over three days as follows:—

First Day—Wednesday, 14th August, 1974

- (i) Law (Parts I and II) (2½ hours), 9 a.m. to 11.30 a.m.
- (ii) Government Organization and Practices (Parts I and II) (2½ hours), 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Second Day—Thursday, 15th August, 1974

- (iii) Civil Service Regulations (2½ hours), 9 a.m. to 11.30 a.m.
- (iv) Financial Control and Procedures (2½ hours), 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Third Day—Friday, 16th August, 1974

- (v) General Knowledge of East African and World Affairs (2½ hours), 9 a.m. to 11.30 a.m.
- (vi) Applied Logic and Report Writing (2½ hours), 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m.

SYLLABUSES

3. There is no change to the syllabuses given in Appendix "B" to Personnel Circular No. 6 of 1970.

ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER

4. The examination will be open to Administrative Officers Class IV, serving with the Kenya Government, either as Administrative Officers in the Provincial Administration, Assistant Secretaries in the Ministries, Finance Officers in the Treasury, or Second/Third Secretaries in the Foreign Service. It has now been agreed that the provisions of Personnel Circular No. 1 of 4th February, 1971, should be extended to cover the serving District Assistants for the purpose of sitting this examination. All the District Assistants may now, therefore, apply to sit the examination, if they wish to do so.

EXEMPTIONS

5. (a) Candidates who attempted this examination previously and passed in one or more subjects, but failed to pass the whole examination, will be exempted from those subjects in which they passed. They will, however, have to resit only those subjects in which they failed, in this year's, or subsequent examinations.

(b) Serving officers with legal qualifications from accredited Universities may, on application to the Registrar, High Court of Kenya, be exempted from sitting for Part I of the Law Paper. Similarly, Law Graduates from the East African Universities, including serving officers, who have obtained a pass in the Police Law Examination "B", can, on application, be exempted from the entire Law Paper of this Examination. All applications for exemption under this proviso should be made through the candidates' Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Department, to the Registrar, High Court of Kenya, giving details of the legal qualifications held and enclosing thereto photostat copies of the relevant documents to support their claims. Exempted candidates must quote reference numbers of their letters of exemption when they submit their entry forms.

ENTRY FEES

6. Each candidate will be required to pay a Registration Fee of K.Sh. 20 only, regardless of the number of subjects to be attempted. The fees should be paid in either CROSSED E.A. Money Orders, E.A. Postal Orders, or cash. The Money Orders, etc., should be made payable to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, Nairobi, and should be attached to the appropriate Entry Form. The fees will not be refundable in any event.

EXAMINATION ENTRY FORMS

7. Candidates are required to complete the Entry Form in triplicate, as set out at the "APPENDIX" to this Circular Letter. The forms should be reproduced and cyclostyled by

each Ministry/Department as necessary, as no further supplies will be obtainable from this office. The completed entry forms, accompanied by the correct Registration Fees, should be submitted through the Permanent Secretary, Office of the President, Harambee House, Nairobi, to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, so as to reach him not later than Friday, 28th June, 1974. Under no circumstances will late entries be accepted.

The Permanent Secretary, Office of the President, is earnestly requested to ensure that all entry forms are properly filled in, are from eligible officers only, in accordance with paragraph (4) above, are certified correct by him at Part "C" as required, and are transmitted to this office by the closing date. This will save us a great deal of time usually wasted in returning the Entry Forms to him for corrections.

EXAMINATION CENTRES

8. All Provincial Headquarters in Mombasa, Nyeri, Embu, Nairobi, Nakuru, Kakamega, Kisumu and Garissa will be the Centres for this Examination. Centres outside Kenya may be established for those intending and eligible candidates in the Foreign Service.

PASSES

9. Any candidate who passes this examination, in one or more papers, will be credited with a pass in that paper(s), and will be required to resit, in a subsequent examination, only those papers in which he/she failed. A full pass in this examination will, therefore, be awarded to those candidates who have passed all the six test papers in one or more sittings.

EXAMINATION PAPERS AND STATIONERY

10. Arrangements for the issue of Examination Test Papers and stationery, appointment of invigilators, arrangements for examination venues and submission, to this office, of candidates' answer scripts in respect of each Provincial Centre, will be made by the Provincial Education Officer in charge of the Centre, acting on behalf, and on the directions, of the Public Service Commission of Kenya. No special stationery, other than the ordinary writing foolscap, to be supplied by this office, will be required for this examination. All candidates will, however, bring with them their own rulers, pens and some ink.

They may also bring their own Law text-books to be referred to during Part II of the Law Paper, if they are offering the Law Paper. The Provincial Education Officers are requested to ensure that the relevant Law Books (Volumes of the Laws of Kenya, the Constitution of Kenya, etc.) are available at their Centres for the use of the candidates during Part II of the Law Paper. Such books should not be used at all in answering Part I of the Law Paper.

KENYA GOVERNMENT OCCUPATIONAL TESTS FOR STOREMEN, 1974

YOUR attention is invited to Personnel Circular No. 20, dated 17th August, 1968, which sets out the details of Occupational Tests for Storemen Grades I, II and III.

This year's Occupational Tests No. I, No. II and No. III will be held on Thursday, 29th and Friday, 30th August, 1974, in accordance with the following terms and conditions:—

SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS

2. Each examination will consist of the following papers:—

(i) *Storeman Examination III.*

(a) English Paper (1 hour).

(This paper will be set at the same level as that of Certificate of Primary Education (C.P.E.), or the former Junior Clerical Examination.)

(b) Practical Paper (2 hours).

(ii) *Storeman Examination II.*

(a) English Paper (2 hours).

(This paper will be set at the same level as that of the former Clerical Examination.)

(b) Arithmetic Paper (2 hours).

(This paper will be set at the same level as that of the former Clerical Examination.)

(c) Practical Paper (2 hours).

(iii) *Storeman Examination I.*

Practical Paper only (2 hours).

ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER

3. The examinations are open to civil servants only, who must be Kenya citizens serving with the Government of Kenya, and in the case of:—

(a) *Storeman Examination III*—should be serving subordinate staff exclusively employed on stores duties.

(b) *Storeman Examination II*—should be serving Storemen Grade III officers.

(c) *Storeman Examination I*—should be serving Storemen Grade II officers.

EXAMINATION FEES

4. A Registration Fee of K.Sh. 10 only will be paid by every candidate entering any of the three Storeman Examinations listed under paragraph (2) above, irrespective of the number of subjects the candidate is sitting. The fee, which will not be refundable under any circumstances, will be payable to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, in either a Crossed E.A. Money Order, E.A. Postal Order or cash. Personal cheques will not be accepted.

ENTRIES

5. Candidates must complete the examination entry forms in triplicate as set out in "Appendix" to this Circular Letter, copies of which can be reproduced and cyclostyled by each Ministry/Department as required, and the completed entry forms, duly certified correct by the candidates' Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Departments and accompanied by the registration fees of K.Sh. 10 per candidate, should be submitted to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, Gill House, P.O. Box 30095, Nairobi, so as to reach him not later than Saturday, 22nd June, 1974. Late entries, incomplete or wrongly filled in entry forms and the entries not accompanied by the correct registration fees, will automatically be rejected.

EXAMINATION CENTRES

6. The examinations will be held in all Provinces at Mombasa, Nyeri, Embu, Nairobi, Nakuru, Kakamega, Kisumu and Garissa Centres. Candidates must specify at which centre they wish to sit the test which will normally be that nearest to their station. The actual examination venue at each Provincial Centre will be notified to the candidates in due course.

CONDITIONS FOR OBTAINING A PASS

7. In order to obtain a full pass in the appropriate examination, a candidate must pass every paper at one and the same sitting. There will be no partial passes and the names of successful candidates will be published in the Kenya Gazette. No certificates will be issued to the successful candidates, and no syllabuses are available for these examinations.

EXEMPTION

8. Exemption from sitting the English and/or Arithmetic Papers will be in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs 3 (1) (i) (b) and 3 (2) (i) (c) of Personnel Circular No. 20 of 17th August, 1968, the Scheme of Service for Stores Cadres. It is emphasized that the Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Departments should ensure that only those candidates who obtained credits in the English and/or Arithmetic Papers in their E.A.C.E. Examination, or "O" Level Passes in their London General Certificate of Education, are granted exemption in the same subjects for the Occupational Test No. II. Mere E.A.C.E. Examination passes in the two subjects will not qualify the candidates for any exemption.

GENERAL CONDUCT OF THE EXAMINATIONS

9. Candidates will not be allowed to consult any books, files, notes, etc., during the examination, and any infringement of this rule will result in immediate disqualification from the whole examination and may also lead to disciplinary action being taken against the offenders. Examination papers and stationery will be supplied by this office, while the Provincial Education Officers in charge of the Provincial Centres, will be responsible for the distribution of the papers and stationery to their centres, appointment of invigilators, arrangement of the examination venues in their respective centres, and return to this office, of the candidates' answer scripts when the examinations are concluded, as directed by the Public Service Commission of Kenya.

FINAL DECISION

10. All in all, the decision of the Public Service Commission will be final in all matters related to these examinations.

6. Applicants must enclose with their applications cash, postal order or money order for Sh. 1,000 drawn on applicant's own banking account made payable to Commissioner of Lands as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows:—

- If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 8 OF 1974

Parties:—

Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union
and
R. B. Shaw Ltd.

Issues in dispute:—

1. Wages.
2. Redundancy.
3. Effective date and duration.

1. The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and R. B. Shaw Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 26th day of March, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. On 1st February, 1974, the Court received the Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 13th August, 1973, duly signed by the parties' representatives along with the statutory certificate under section 9 (9) (e) of the Trade Disputes Act signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute dates back to the middle of 1972 when the Claimants approached the Respondents with proposals on recognition and other terms and conditions of employment to be embodied in a collective agreement between the parties in respect of the Respondents' employees.

Prior to this there was some doubt as to the trade under which the Respondents' undertaking fell. This matter however was settled and the Respondents started complying with the Regulation of Wages (Motor Engineering Trades) Order.

The matter dragged on thereafter and the Claimants reported the existence of the dispute to the Ministry of Labour and a Conciliator was appointed to look into the dispute. A formal recognition agreement was signed by both parties at a meeting on 23rd January, 1973, which had been convened by the Conciliator. After that, further time was wasted while the Respondents attempted to have meetings with the Claimants at their own level without the assistance of the Conciliator and the Claimants' insistence on attending only those meetings which were called and arranged by the Conciliator. After further difficulties the conciliation meetings got off the ground and a final meeting took place on 18th June, 1973, at which agreement was reached on all but the three items which are in dispute before the Court.

The position of wages being paid to the Respondents' employees at present is that, except for five employees who are on probation and who are being paid the statutory rate prescribed under the relevant Motor Engineering Trades Wages Order, all the other employees are being paid above the statutory rates. The complete list of all the employees showing their designation, the work they are doing, the statutory wage in respect of that work and the actual wage which they are being paid was produced to the Court by the Respondents. In some cases the workers are being paid Sh. 45 more than the statutory rate while there are other workers who are Sh. 100 plus over the statutory rate.

The Claimants had started off by forwarding a demand for 25 per cent wage increase for all unionizable employees but during the hearing they informed the Court that they now demanded a flat wage increase of 50 per cent because of the enormous increases in the cost of living that had taken place since they had forwarded their demands originally. The Claimants accused the Respondents of being bad employers who had also tried to undermine the Claimants as a union by granting workers a small increase unilaterally knowing fully well that the Claimants were pressing them for higher increases.

The Respondents denied that they had a monopoly as manufacturers of brake linings and disc brake pads and finishing clutch facings. They pleaded that they had been facing severe increase in costs of materials from both overseas and locally and the Price Controller had to date not replied to their request to increase their prices. They also pointed out the favourable position in which their competitors in Uganda and Tanzania were placed in relation to them and stated that if any further burden was placed on them by exorbitant wage increase then it will more than likely affect their employment capacity.

The Employment Promotion Division of the Ministry of Labour carried out an analysis of the parties' respective stands in relation to wages and other costs and the copies of the analysis were before the parties and the Court during the hearing.

The Court notes that the current Regulation of Wages Order in respect of Motor Engineering Trades came into effect on 1st February, 1973. There may well be some truth in the Claimants' allegation that the Respondents had no choice at that time but to grant certain wage increases to their employees to bring them up to the statutory rates.

There is also no doubt that on 7th May, 1973, the Respondents of their own volition decided to up-grade the minimum rate throughout their undertaking to Sh. 300 p.m. These increases took effect from 1st May, 1973.

The Court has in the past criticized the employers who grant wage increases when they are fully aware that an accredited trade union is involved with them on behalf of their employees. In this case also the Court feels that the Respondents' action in granting wage increases under the circumstances prevailing at the time was detrimental to good industrial relations. The Court hopes that they will avoid such steps in future.

The fact, however, remains that the workers did get wage increases which according to the analysis of Employment Promotion Division amounted to an average wage increase of 23.42 per cent. The Court also notes that the Respondents have increased their labour force by nine which shows that the growth of their labour force had not been hampered by the wage increases in 1973.

After careful consideration of all the submissions made by the parties the Court awards as follows on the various issues:—

1. *Wages.*—The Court awards a wage increase of 15 per cent with effect from 1st January, 1974, to all the workers affected by this dispute.

2. *Redundancy.*—The Court awards that a redundant worker should be paid the appropriate benefit at the rate of 15 days' pay for each completed year of service.

3. *Effective date and duration.*—The Court awards that the effective date for the whole agreement should be 18th June, 1973, and the agreement should remain in force until the end of December, 1974.

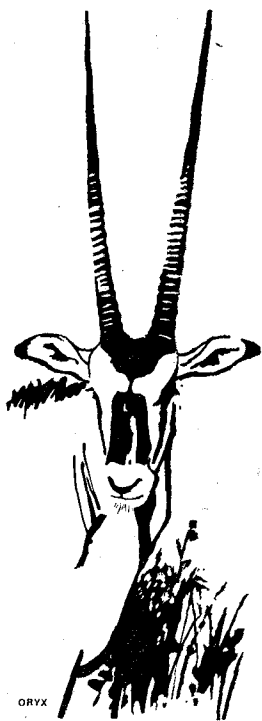
