THE TRADE DISPUTES ACT

ORDER UNDER SECTION 36—COLLECTION OF TRADE UNION DUES

THE TRADE DISPUTES ACT

(e) notify in writing the Registrar of Trade Unions, before the end of each month, of the amounts of any payments made into the accounts of that trade union and of that organization in that month.

In exercise of the power conferred by section 36 (2) of the said Act, the order made by Gazette Notice No. 256 of 20th January, 1966, is hereby revoked.

Knowledge of development planning and implementation, including preparation and evaluation, of the development projects and ability to discuss these projects with local authorities and relevant Government Ministries is essential.

Applicants must be graduates with a flair for educational journalism, publishing and writing and should show a sound working knowledge of Kenya educational system and be aware of current teaching developments in adult education. Duties include preparation of reading materials for newly literate and stimulation of rural newspapers to promote reading habits. The successful candidate will be expected to assist education broadcasters and journalists to prepare educational lessons for the media. He will be assigned to the Board of Adult Education and will be the Editor of the Board's publications. He must, therefore, be fluent in written Swahili. The duties of this officer will also include preparation of Youth Vocational guidance pamphlets, further development of the present Adult Education central library and clearing house, cataloguing of materials, books, periodicals, etc. He will be expected to carry out research and participate in teaching at various Adult Training Institutions and record minutes of professional panels as directed by the Board.

Assistant Secretary (Department of Adult Education) (One Post) (No. 102/74)

Salary scale.—£1,212 to £1,614. PENSIONABLE.

Applicants should be graduates from recognized Universities with at least three years' experience in Administration and Office Management. Knowledge of Government Regulations, budgetary procedures, control of votes, preparation and presentation of annual recurrent and development estimates is

essential. Experience in running an educational establishment for adults would be an additional advantage.

*Vacancies in the Ministry of Works:**Senior Photogrammetrist (One Post) (No. 103/74)*

They must have completed an approved apprenticeship training or completed training in an approved and recognized building trade and have passed Building Technician Certificate or its equivalent from a recognized institution followed by eight years' practical experience.

Ability to read and interpret Architect's drawings, Structural Engineer's drawings and Electrical and Mechanical Services drawings, carry out surveying and levelling and estimate cost of new buildings and renovations is essential.

(Cap. 280)

KERICHO TOWNSHIP—PLOTS FOR LOW-DENSITY RESIDENTIAL PURPOSES

THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the President of the Republic of Kenya gives notice that the plots in Kericho Township as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grant of the individual plots.

2. A plan of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or at the office of the Town Clerk, Kericho Town Council, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3 post free.

3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the Town Clerk, Kericho Town Council. Applications must be on prescribed forms which are available from Lands Department, and at the office of the Town Clerk, Kericho Town Council.

4. Applications must be sent so as to reach to the Town Clerk to Council not later than noon on the 5th July, 1974.

5. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.

6. Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows:—

- If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.

2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).

3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.

4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.

5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant, approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent. In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposed to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such

buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition, it shall be lawful of the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period, no refund shall be made.

5. The land and the buildings shall only be used for private residential purposes and not more than one dwelling-house shall be erected on the land.

Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union
and

White Line Tyre Retreaders

Issues in dispute:—

1. Preamble to Agreement.
2. Termination of service.
3. Sick leave.
4. Working hours for security staff.
5. Wages.
6. Effective date and duration.

1. The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and White Line Tyre Retreaders shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 17th day of April, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 12th February, 1974, was received by the Court on 15th February together with the certificate from the Labour Commissioner under section 9 (9) (e) of the Trade Disputes Act.

The parties appeared before the Industrial Court previously *vide* Cause No. 18/73 and the Court made a consent award on the issue of recognition and ordered that the Respondents should recognize the Claimants forthwith and a formal recognition agreement should be drawn and signed by the parties within three days of the date of the award. The Court further directed that the parties should meet thereafter to start negotiations on a collective agreement.

The origin of this dispute goes back to sometime in early 1969 when the Claimants first approached the Respondents for recognition on behalf of their employees. The matter dragged on and the parties eventually ended up in the Court in the above Cause as a result of which a recognition agreement was signed at the end of July, 1973.

After the signing of the recognition agreement the Claimants requested the Court to proceed with the hearing on the issue of terms and conditions of employment. The Court, however, after hearing the parties' views a couple of times, directed that they should start negotiations at their own level.

It should be noted that the Claimants have consistently accused the Respondents of using all sorts of delaying tactics as far as recognition and the matter of negotiation re: terms and conditions of employment of their employees are concerned and have alleged that they have done so in order to continue exploiting their employees by depriving them the benefit of union representation.

After a series of meetings agreement was reached on 20 items to be covered in the collective agreement leaving the aforesaid six issues in dispute.

The Claimants' demand is simple and straightforward and they have pursued it consistently, i.e. they want the Respondents to accept in whole their collective agreement with the Nairobi Tyre Retreaders' Group of F.K.E. (hereinafter referred to as the Group Agreement). They have not budged from this stand either during negotiations or during the hearing of this dispute. Their main argument is that there was no reason why the Respondents who were very much in the same business as the other firms who were members of the Group should pay and give lower benefits than the members of the Group with whom they were actively in competition.

The Respondents have relied very strongly on the argument that they are not only in tyre retreading business but were also tyre distributors and also manufactured balls, mats and a few other items. For these reasons they maintained they were quite different from the other retreading companies.

The Respondents explained in detail their incentive scheme which they were operating and submitted that under their system the employees were much better off and earned far more than would be possible otherwise. They stressed that their records proved that if the incentive scheme was withdrawn then the output fell dramatically.

The Respondents denied that they had exploited their workers or that they had used delaying tactics in order to keep the Claimants at bay. On the contrary they accused the Claimants' representatives of using abusive language towards their representatives and also for default in attending previously arranged meetings.

As usual, since the issues in dispute involved wages and other fringe benefits the parties' submissions were sent by the Court to the Employment Promotion Division of the Ministry of Labour for analysis. During the hearing the Court had the analysis prepared by this Division before it and the parties were able to make their comments thereon.

The Court notes that the 20 items which the parties have agreed at their own level are the same as they appear in the Group Agreement and after careful consideration of all the submissions made by the parties the Court can find no reason why the Respondents should be made an exception to the terms and conditions of employment that are being applied by the Group as far as the remaining six items are concerned.

The Court notes that the Respondents have stated very strongly that they wish to retain payments by result system rather than flat monthly wages. The Court is of the view that there is nothing to prevent them retaining such a scheme even if they were required to pay the minimum wages contained in the Group Agreement.

The Court has carefully considered the Claimants' request that the Respondents should be asked to implement the Group Agreement from the effective date as it appears in that Agreement which is 1st April, 1973, but having carefully considered the circumstances and the history of this dispute and also the fact that the Respondents have been operating payments by result scheme the Court has come to the conclusion that the effective date should be the first of the month following the date of the Court award.

The Court awards as follows on the six issues in dispute:—

1. *Preamble to Agreement.*—The terms and conditions of employment set out in this Agreement shall be observed by both parties and shall apply to all unionizable employees covered by the recognition agreement.

2. *Termination of service.*—After the completion of the probationary period, employment shall be terminable by either party by:—

- (a) From completion of probationary period to five years' service: One month's notice or salary in lieu of notice.
- (b) From five years onwards: Two months' notice or salary in lieu of notice:

Provided either party has the right to terminate services summarily for gross misconduct or other lawful cause as provided by the law.

3. *Sick leave.*—(1) In the event of illness, the period during which the payment for sick leave is obligatory, during any one calendar year, is based on the following sliding scale and is subject to the conditions set out in paragraphs (2) to (4) below:—

- (a) Up to two years' service.—One month on full pay followed by one month on half pay.
- (b) From two to five years' service.—One month on full pay followed by two months on half pay.
- (c) Over five years' service.—Two months on full pay followed by three months on half pay.
- (d) In appropriate cases, the periods indicated above may be extended by Management up to a maximum of three months on full pay on production by the employee of a certificate, covering his continued unfitness for duty, signed by an approved registered medical practitioner.

Provided that—

(2) The employee has completed the appropriate probationary period.

(3) The employee produces a medical certificate, authorizing such sick leave, signed by an approved registered medical practitioner.

(4) Sick leave may not be accumulated from year to year.

4. *Working hours for security staff.*—The same as specified in the Regulation of Wages (Motor Engineering Trades) Order, 1973.

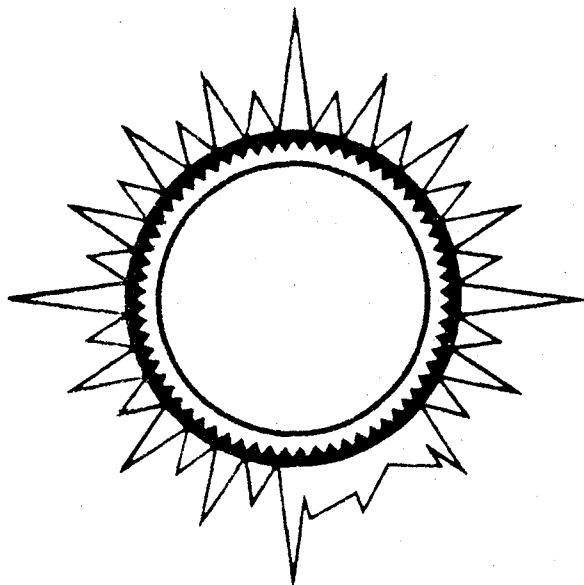
