Incremental credits will be granted to successful candidates who are not civil servants for approved previous experience provided the maximum salary is not exceeded. They will also be eligible for benefits and privileges enjoyed by civil servants in accordance with the existing Government Regulations.

*Vacancy in the Office of the President, Kenya Institute of Administration:*

*Lecturer Grade I (One Post) (No. 117/74)*

*Salary scale.*—£1,494 to £1,866. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Candidates should preferably be graduates of a recognized University with a major in either Accountancy, Business Administration or Government or holders of a professional qualification in C.I.S. or C.C.S. Preference will be given to candidates who, as well as holding the above qualifications, have gained working experience in the Civil Service or in business organizations for a period of at least three years. Experience in personnel administration and office management, will be an advantage. Successful candidates will be expected to perform lecturing duties in all aspects of personnel administration and office management, including planning for personnel courses for senior Government officers, and being course officer to such courses. He will also be expected to develop his own teaching materials based on current Central Government practices and procedures through individual research.

*Vacancy in the Vice-President's Office and Ministry of Home Affairs:*

*Superintendent (Mechanical) (One Post) (No. 118/74)*

*Salary scale.*—£1,212 to £1,614. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be mature persons of East African School Certificate standard of education and must be able to furnish proof of having served a recognized apprenticeship in Automobile Engineering plus a minimum of eight years' subsequent practical experience in the maintenance and repair of motor vehicles both petrol and diesel powered, and also, have experience of generating power plant. They must have served in a responsible supervisory position the duties of which include workshop administration, costing, staff control, budgeting control and be able to compile comprehensive technical reports on both motor vehicles and power plant. Willingness and ability to train junior mechanics are essential. Possession of a recognized technical qualification will be an advantage. Posting will be anywhere in Kenya.

*Executive Officer II (One Post) (No. 119/74)*

*Salary scale.*—£972 to £1,302. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be civil servants of Cambridge School Certificate standard of education or its equivalent with considerable experience of Government office routine. They should possess general knowledge of Government Code of Regulations particularly relating to housing and house allowances, Financial Orders and Financial Instructions. Preference will be given to those who have considerable experience in preparation of leases.

The duties of the post are mainly dealing with correspondence on renting of premises both residential and office accommodation on behalf of the Government. The successful candidate will be dealing with estate agents, landlords and their advocates and the actual preparation of leases and their interpretation. Although not directly responsible for the control of expenditure, the candidate will undertake the preparation of annual and supplementary estimates and is required to know details of the systems adopted in the payment of rent.

- Planned preventive maintenance of airport, or commercial and industrial electrical installations and plant.

## RULING

The Court announced its award on 28th November, 1973. In this award the Court had set out the departments, the number of employees affected in each department, the details of the outgoing bonus scheme agreement and the parties' respective position in respect of that particular department and finally the Court award.

The Court would like to make it clear at the very outset that during the hearing the parties at no time suggested that there was any dispute as to the sections which were to be considered as part of any one particular department. Further the parties had during negotiations come up to certain positions particularly in regard to the minimum standard output for each department beyond which they could not move. It was on the basis of this information and submissions made in respect thereof that the Court proceeded to make its award.

On 17th December, 1973, the Respondents applied for interpretation of the Court award in respect of item 14 (a)—Waiting Time, only. When the parties were called before the Judge for fixing the hearing date for the interpretation application the Claimants pointed out that they were also anxious to put forward some further information before the Court and were also keen to seek further clarifications on a few matters contained in the award. Accordingly it was decided that the parties would put forward their respective difficulties for consideration by the Court.

The Court is firmly of the view that the real reason or the cause of this interpretation application is because the parties had not carried out extensive and exhaustive negotiations in working out the mechanics of this incentive bonus scheme. The Court having made its award on the information and facts that were placed before it the parties found themselves in an embarrassing position in certain aspects of the award because they had not given adequate and proper information to the Court in respect thereof. Naturally in these circumstances it transpired that this interpretation application developed into a full scale second hearing of this dispute.

The Judge of the Court and the Members visited the Kenya Meat Commission factory at Athi River and made an extensive tour of all the departments and the various sections particularly the ones on which the parties were disputing. This visit has enabled the Court to appreciate better what the parties are after and come to a just and fair conclusion.

During the hearing the parties, apart from a few points on which genuine interpretation was sought, attempted to retreat from their original stands during the first hearing of the dispute and asked the Court to vary its award in some cases particularly on the matter of minimum standard output to a figure much less than that which they had agreed to during negotiations.

The Court had repeatedly in the past pointed out that it is always willing and ready to hear genuine interpretation applications but it will certainly not allow the parties to use this application by way of appeal to persuade the Court to change its award and in this case in some instances to allow the party to depart from its own clearly stated position when the dispute was being heard by the Court.

The Court gave the parties a full opportunity to express their views on all the items on which they thought they were in difficulty and in making its ruling the Court has rejected the parties' attempts to persuade the Court to vary its award. The Court has, however, in view of fresh and full information that was produced during this application but which was not made available to it during the hearing, clarified the various issues in dispute.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court rules as follows in respect of its award on the incentive bonus scheme announced on 28th November, 1973:—

#### 1. KILLING FLOOR

##### (a) The killing floor includes—

- (i) Bridge Gang;
- (ii) Freezer and Distribution;
- (iii) Cattle Race and Boma;
- (iv) Hides and Skins; and
- (v) Roller Cleaners.

##### (b) Four head of small stock will be equated to one head of cattle.

##### (c) Rough Tallow Floor edible will remain a separate department as for No. 2 in the award schedule.

Tank House will remain a separate department as for No. 5 in the award schedule.

Oleo will remain a separate department as for No. 3 in the award schedule.

The M.S.O. will remain 37,000 kg. of beef dripping p.m.

Catch Basin will remain part of the Tank House as for No. 5 in the award schedule.

Offals Packing Section will remain incorporated into R.T.F. edible as for No. 2 in the award schedule.

*Note.*—The parties had agreed to the arrangements specified in (c) above in their original submissions and the Court made the award accordingly. The Claimants now want a variation which is rejected.

#### 2. CANNING DEPARTMENT

##### (a) The Canning Department includes—

- Cook Room;
- Main Canning;
- Six Pound Tin Line;
- Tongue Room; and
- Incubation and Extract (50 kg.).

##### (b) The average bonus paid over the first four months (Sh. 145) does not indicate that the M.S.O. is unfair; it will remain as in the award, i.e. 750,000 cans p.m. It should be noted that the Claimants in their original submissions proposed M.S.O. of 700,000 cans p.m. as against the employers' suggested figure of 870,000 cans p.m.

##### (c) Cans Quality Checkers will qualify for bonus. This includes the special case of the two blind men who will qualify also. The Court is satisfied that these workers do not fall within the category of indirect labour.

##### (d) The Labelling and Packing Department will remain as in Schedule 9 of the award (the M.S.O. is the same, i.e. 750,000 cans p.m.).

##### (e) All cans will equate on the basis of one can of 6 lb. to 8 cans of 12 and 7 oz. in the previous agreement (metric conversion as applicable).

#### 3. BONING ROOM

##### (a) The award No. 6 on the award schedule will read "M.S.O. 90 batches per department per day". It should be noted that the Claimants had suggested this figure in their original submissions and which they now wanted to be reduced to 70. This request is rejected.

##### (b) A batch is defined as 230 kg.

##### (c) Mr. Matibo will qualify for bonus in the department in which he is employed for more than 50 per cent of a normal shift daily.

#### 4. NAIROBI DEPOT

The award No. 11 includes—

- Meat Porters;
- Headmen; and
- Distribution Turnmen.

#### 5. NAKURU ABATTOIR

(a) The award No. 10 includes—

- Slaughtermen;
- Flayers;
- Headmen; and
- Holding Ground Attendants.

(b) No change in M.S.O. award.

#### 6. NGONG ABATTOIR

The award No. 13 includes all staff except the Abattoir Superintendent.

#### 7. CUT BEEF

The award No. 4 does not cover sales area staff.

#### 8. CASING DEPARTMENT

To be included in award No. 2 R.T.F. (Edible).

#### 9. MOMBASA

The award covers Mombasa as follows—

Award 12 on schedule: Factory.

Award 8 on schedule: Boning (includes small stock and hides).

Award 14 on schedule: R.T.F. (Tank).

#### 10. TANK HOUSE

Item No. 5 in the award schedule should read "M.S.O. 300,000 kg. of meals and tallow p.m."

#### 11. ROUGH TALLOW FLOOR—EDIBLE

Award No. 2 should read "M.S.O. = 115,000 kg. of red offals p.m."

#### 12. OLEO

Award No. 3 should read "M.S.O. = 37,000 kg. of beef dripping p.m."

#### 13. WAITING TIME

The principle set out in the award will apply. However, it is necessary to update the system as the M.S.O. requirements now differ. The award should now read—

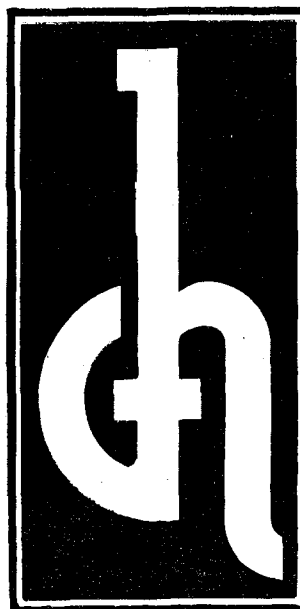
