THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 18 of 1974

Parties:-

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers and

British American Insurance Co. Ltd.

Issues in dispute:-

- 1. Termination or dissolution of the Superannuation Plan imposed on some employees.
- 2. Refund of the employees' money deducted from their monthly salaries plus interest thereon.
- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and British American Insurance Co. Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 28th day of May, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 8th January, 1974, was received by the Court on 19th February along with the statutory certificate from the Labour Commissioner.

The Claimants are asking for an order for the termination or dissolution of the Superannuation Plan which is currently in force in the Respondents' undertaking and the Claimants further are asking for the refund to the employees of all the money that has been deducted from their salaries plus interest thereon which amount the Court was told is in the region of £20.000.

The main points on which the Claimants are seeking the termination of the Superannuation Plan briefly are that the employees have no say whatsoever in its running and that it is contributory. They further alleged that it is discriminatory in that messengers are not allowed to join it and are thus left without any retirement scheme.

During the hearing the Claimants submitted that the workers were faced with many deductions like their contributions to the N.S.S.F., to this Superannuation Plan and the premiums towards an insurance policy which every employee was forced to take on joining the Respondents' service. After all these deductions have been made a worker was left with an amount which was hardly enough to meet his bare necessities.

The Claimants maintained that the Superannuation Plan as it is at present was not in the interest of the workers as they would not qualify for any benefits until they attained the age of 60 and as most of them were comparatively young persons they saw the possibility of benefiting under this plan as very remote. Moreover this plan was different from some other plans which were in force in the country.

The Claimants drew the Court's attention to the fact that they were even denied the right of consultation on any particular points about which the workers were not happy and every time any query was raised they were given either no reply or if the reply was given it was very evasive.

The Respondents opposed the Claimants' demand on the ground that their pension scheme was in the interest of the workers and it was essentially based on the principle of pooling of risks and resources to provide protection against various contingencies that might affect participating members.

The Respondents explained in detail the working of their Superannuation Plan which was established in 1967 and stated that they did so in good faith as part of a welfare programme concluded to meet the Respondents' social and moral obligations of the employees during their well earned retirement.

There is no point in going over and reiterating the benefits of a pension scheme. Nobody could possibly quarrel with an arrangement which is primarily designed to help an employee during his retirement days provided the arrangements to which he is required to subscribe offer some visible benefits and he feels that he has a say in the running of such a scheme and that if need be he could put forward constructive points in order to further better such a scheme.

The Court has thoroughly examined the scheme as it exists at present and some of the points that need looking into are stated below:—

- (a) According to the Respondents the scheme established a fund as part of a welfare programme: at the same time membership became a condition of service.
- (b) Membership is subject to the sole discretion of the trustees: the trustees include no member representatives. Therefore though membership is a condition of service for those eligible, the categories which are eligible can be determined by the trustees and those excluded become excluded from a term of service.
- (c) The employee who has to join, contributes 5 per cent of salary. As a part of his terms of service he therefore is forced to contribute 5 per cent of salary to a scheme over which he has no control either directly, through the trustees or through his Union.
- (d) In addition to the 5 per cent the employee has to pay 5 per cent N.S.S.F. and to group life insurance. The employee on salary up to Sh. 800 is therefore paying a full 10 per cent of salary plus insurance premium: this is a heavy deduction for low paid categories.
- (e) Though the member's contribution is known, he has no information on the method of funding the scheme: without employee representation the extent of the company's contribution cannot be easily understood by the employee.
- (f) Retirement age is 60. Provision is made for retirement with the company's consent at 55-60 years. Also provision is made for pension as a result of total permanent disability. In East Africa it might be considered that a wide retirement range be set, i.e. 50-60.
- (g) As this is a contributory scheme it might provide a life cover. The vast majority of employees are now aged 28-35. The scheme, therefore fails to attract the members though it is for the ultimate benefit of those who remain throughout their total working life with this company. For those who anticipate reaching pension age, there are fears that life expectancy after 60 may not be very great and unless a reduced pension has been arranged, the pension will cease on the member's death.
- (h) The company can change or discontinue: a guarantee to existing members is provided. This shows that the scheme is more welfare than a term of service.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that keeping in view the long term interest of the employees themselves it would be unwise to terminate or dissolve this scheme. The Court, however strongly feels that the workers who are in fact contributing to this scheme and who are entitled to benefit from it should be properly involved in running it and they should also be given an opportunity of putting forward the difficulties which are forcing them to call for its termination.

The Court notes that by virtue of a recognition agreement that exists between the parties this item is negotiable and the Court therefore awards that the parties should embark on negotiations in order to eliminate or find another acceptable answer to the points which have been listed hereinabove in the award and any other that may be relevant. The Court feels that once this is done and the scheme modified in order to fit in with the local conditions and aspirations of the employees there would be no reason for the employees to object to its continuation which after all is intended to benefit them.

The Court further directs that the parties should conclude their negotiations within six months from the date of the award and in the event of there being a deadlock on any point during negotiations then that matter should be referred back to the Court as a fresh dispute for the Court's decision thereon.
