and

Fox Theatres (E.A.) Limited

Issue in dispute.-Wrongful dismissal of Mr. Kinyuka.

- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Fox Theatres (E.A.) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 19th April, 21st May and 2nd July, 1974 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The parties called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:—

Claimants.--John G. Kamau and Daniel Waweru.

Respondents:-Michael Ndedda and Cleophas Owinga.

#### AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 27th August, 1973 was received by the Court on 19th February, 1974, along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

On 2nd February, 1973, at about 8.45 p.m. an incident occurred at the Kenya Cinema involving Mr. Kinyuka who at the time was the doorman on duty at the Kenya Cinema and four Asian youths, as a result of which Mr. Kinyuka, who is also the Claimants' chief shopsteward in the undertaking, was first suspended and then a few days later dismissed.

It is alleged by the Respondents that on that particular day the Manager, Mr. Ndedda, was outside the cinema foyer on the pavement keeping a general supervision. He noticed four Asian youths walk past him who without going to the cashier for their tickets went straight to the door at the cinema entrance where they nodded to Mr. Kinyuka and just walked in. The Manager became suspicious and followed them and found them seated in the hall, and asked them to produce the tickets. They had no tickets and he called all of them to come out. When they all came to the foyer three of them absconded but one was caught by the Manager and taken to his office where he was locked and the Manager called the police.

An Inspector of Police, Cleophas Owinga, who at the time was attached to the Central Police Station and was on a 999 patrol, arrived at the cinema and proceeded to make inquiries. The Asian who was in the Manager's office wrote a note of apology and undertook to meet all the expenses.

The Manager, on coming out with the four Asians in the foyer asked Mr. Kinyuka as to why he had let in four patrons without tickets but Mr. Kinyuka replied that they had passout cards. The Manager could not find any truth in the statement.

The Respondents then proceeded first to suspend Mr. Kinyuka pending a meeting with the Claimants and subsequently dismissed him.

The Claimants are strongly contesting this dismissal on the ground that the Respondents had fabricated the whole incident in order to get rid of Mr. Kinyuka for his trade union activities as he was a chief shopsteward and because he had of late raised a few complaints on behalf of various employees about which the Respondents were not happy.

The Claimants have submitted their own version of what took place on 2nd February at Kenya Cinema at about 8.45 They maintained that an Asian came in with four tickets and informed Mr. Kinyuka that there were three other persons who would come in later and he left the three tickets with Mr. Kinyuka under instructions that when they turned up Mr. Kinyuka should call him from the hall so that he could identify them. After that three Asians came and asked Mr. Kinyuka if someone had left tickets with him and while they were standing with him waiting for an usher to come to fetch their friend who was already in the hall, the Manager came all of a sudden and demanded tickets from them. Since they did not know who he was they declined his request. Mr. Kinyuka tried to explain the position to the Manager but he refused to listen and requested the three Asians to accompany him to the office. The three then asked one of them to go to the Manager's office but on arriving at the office the Manager locked him in and called the police. In the meantime Mr. Kinyuka fetched the other person and went to the office where he explained the position and took the tickets to the police. The whole group was then taken by Mr. Kinyuka in the cinema hall and were shown the seats which they were supposed to occupy.

The Claimants denied that Mr. Kinyuka had made any statement to either the police or the Manager and when Mr. Kinyuka reported for duty the following day he was ordered by the Manager to go home until 5th February when he would meet the General Manager. When he went there he was suspended and was later summarily dismissed.

During the hearing the parties called their respective witnesses in support of their versions of the incident as it took place on 2nd February at about 8.45 p.m. The Court notes that while Mr. Kinyuka was present throughout the proceedings the Claimants did not choose to call him to give evidence on oath in which event he would have been subjected to cross examination by the Respondents.

The Court was very much impressed by the evidence of Inspector C. Owinga who was an impartial and independent witness in the whole incident. He told the Court that he received a call at about 9 p.m. while on patrol to proceed to Kenya Cinema, Government Road, where there was a reported theft. He proceeded there and met the Manager who informed him about the incident involving the four Asian youths. The Inspector confirmed that the Asian was in the Manager's office whom he interviewed and who told him that he was sorry for what had happened and asked for forgiveness and said that he would meet all the expenses. The Inspector was, however, not satisfied with his explanation and while he was still continuing his inquiries two Asians came in the same office and one of them produced four full tickets after which the Inspector and the others went into the cinema hall. These tickets were for row E, seats 17, 18, 19 and 20 whereas the seats where the Manager found them were row V occupying seats Nos. 1-4.

The Inspector told the Court that when they all came out of the hall he questioned the other two Asians as to why they had run away and was told by them that the Manager was very harsh and they had therefore run away but they could not give an explanation as to why the tickets were not in half. The Inspector further confirmed that during his investiga-

tion he tried to find the doorman, i.e. Mr. Kinyuka, but he could not trace him anywhere. The Inspector was also told by an informer that two Asian were seen by him, i.e. the informer, buying tickets. The Inspector took all of them to the police station and handed over the case to the crime branch.

The Court has carefully weighed the evidence given by the witnesses and has come to the conclusion, notwithstanding a few discrepancies in the evidence of the Respondents' witness Mr. Ndedda, that Mr. Kinyuka was involved in a transaction which was intended to cause a loss of revenue to his employer. The Manager's evidence has been corroborated by that of Inspector Owinga on essential points in this incident and the Court has no hesitation in finding that Mr. Kinyuka was indeed involved in a dishonest transaction.

The Investigator who was appointed by the Ministry of Labour to carry out the investigation was of the view that Mr. Kinyuka was at fault. The Chief Industrial Relations Officer forwarded the following findings and recommendations to the parties after the matter had been investigated:—

"It appears from the evidence adduced by both parties that Mr. Kinyuka was the sole person responsible for ensuring that patrons pay or produce tickets before entering the cinema hall.

"It is not understood why persons who had genuinely bought tickets should run away when challenged to produce them. Mr. Kinyuka's statement was rather shaky and his conduct is highly questionable. It was also stated by the management that this was not the first time that Mr. Kinyuka had conducted himself in this matter albeit he has a long service record.

"Having considered all the circumstances of the case it is my view that the action taken by the management to instantly dismiss the complainant with loss of all terminal benefits is harsh. I recommend that Mr. Kinyuka's dismissal be reduced to normal termination of service and he be paid all his terminal benefits as stipulated in the parties' negotiated collective agreement on terms and conditions of service."

The Court after careful consideration of all the submissions finds that the action taken by the Respondents to terminate the services of Mr. Kinyuka was fully justified. However, since, the Respondents had agreed to abide by the recommendations of the Permanent Secretary the Court awards that Mr. Kinyuka's dismissal should be reduced to normal termination of service and he should be paid as stipulated in the parties' negotiated agreement.

The Court must add that it had found no evidence whatsoever to support the Claimants' contention that Mr. Kinyuka had been victimized because he was a chief shopsteward and because of his trade union activities. The Court would also like to add that whereas it is always ready and willing to protect workers against any wrongful dismissals it can under no circumstances condone dishonest acts and workers who indulge in such acts should expect no sympathy and leniency from the Court.

City Council of Nairobi

Issue in dispute:

Refusal by the Council to permit its employees in the Inspectorate section of the Town Clerk's department to join the Kenya Local Government Workers' Union.

- 1. The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Council shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties appeared before the Court for mention on 27th June, 1974, when the hearing date was fixed on 12th August, 1974, but having settled the matter in the meantime requested the Court to make a consent order.

#### AWARD

3. The Court made the following award by consent of parties:

The parties agree that the Respondents shall permit the Uniformed and security members of the City Inspectorate staff to join the Claimants and the Claimants agree and undertake to regard them as essential as they shall be required to provide security for Council installations in case of general stoppage of work.

In pursuance of the above Agreement the Respondents and the Claimants agree to drop the dispute under this Cause.

Refusal by the Council to pay Mr. Joram Kibicho his correct salary of Senior Committee Clerk.

- 1. The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Nyeri Council shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 28th day of June, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

#### AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 23rd March, 1974, was received by the Court on 22nd May along with the statutory certificate from the Labour Commissioner.

Mr. Joram Kibicho was employed by the Respondents first as a cashier at a salary of £312 p.a. and then on 8th October, 1970 he was informed in writing that he had been appointed to the position of Senior Committee Clerk with effect from 1st June, 1970. In his letter of appointment he was told that he would remain in the salary scale £380 to £500 p.a. until such time as the new scales are approved by the Minister for Local Government when he would enter the bottom of scale A4—£900.

He left the Respondents' employment on 5th November, 1972 and is now holding a position with the Nyeri Municipal Commission.

The Claimants are demanding a sum of £628 on his behalf from the Respondents which they claim is the difference of salary due to him from the Respondents. The Claimants have based their demand on the fact that he was appointed to the post of Senior Committee Clerk at the aforesaid starting salary of A4—£900 after due permission had been obtained to that effect from the Minister for Local Government.

It is common ground that at or about that time new salary scales in respect of certain local authorities including the Respondents had been forwarded to the Minister for Local Government for approval and it was envisaged that approval would be forthcoming soon; under the proposals in salary scale A4—£900 by £48 to £1,188, the post of Senior Committee Clerk along with others was included. These proposals were, however, not approved and the new salary scales which were eventually approved by the Minister and effected on 1st March, 1971, under the salary scale £600 by £30 to £840 including the post of Committee Clerk. As stated before, the proposed post of Senior Committee Clerk was eliminated.

Mr. Kibicho was therefore graded in salary scale A6—£660 by £30 to £840 as Committee Clerk effective from 1st June, 1970.

The Respondents, since they had appointed Mr. Kibicho to a more senior job—that of a Senior Committee Clerk—but which did not materialize, sought the approval of the Minister for Local Government and appointed him to the position of Establishment Officer on 3rd March, 1972, in salary scale A4—£968 by £48 to £1,160.

The Claimants have strongly argued that notwithstanding the lack of approval by the Minister to the post of Senior Committee Clerk, Mr. Kibicho was entitled to be paid the salary under scale A4—£900 by £48 to £1,188. They maintained that there was a clear contact between an employer and an employee which the employer was bound to honour. They rejected any idea that Mr. Kibicho was trying to sue the Respondents on a breach of promise claim. The Claimants demand £628 made up as follows—

The Respondents resisted this demand on the ground that Mr. Kibicho's purported appointment as a Senior Committee Clerk at the aforesaid salary scale was subject to the approval by the Minister for Local Government and since approval was not granted Mr. Kibicho had to continue as a Committee Clerk and they were not bound in any way to remunerate him on the salary scale mentioned in his aforesaid letter of appointment.

The Respondents pointed out that Mr. Kibicho's successor is in salary scale A6—£660 by £30 to £840. They further maintained that the whole idea of a salary structure and job classification as contained in the agreed terms and conditions of service is geared to the establishment of equity within County and Urban Councils. To make exceptions to suit particular individuals would create confusion.

The Court notes that the Respondents on 25th August, 1973, resolved under Minute 3/73 (4) as follows:—

"That Mr. Theuri who has left the services of the Council be paid the difference of his salary as approved by the Council and the Ministry of Local Government and that the case be treated as closed as had been directed by the Ministry of Local Government; and further

"That the Council disassociates itself from any responsibility for any industrial unrest that may arise from non-implementation of these cases as the Council recommended the appointments unconditionally subject to the Minister's approval which was received long time and that the Council should not be held responsible of any legal charges in the event of reference of any of these cases to Court since these would have been implemented long before."

This case is not a simple one and there are many complications. To begin with there is a question of a local authority creating a new post outside the collective agreement with the Claimants but the Court is satisfied that the provisions of a collective agreement do not in any way preclude any local authority from creating new posts. Therefore as the matter stands the Respondents were within their rights to suggest a new post but the fact remains that such a post and the salary attached to it has got to be approved by the Minister for Local Government. When Mr. Kibicho was offered the appointment of a Senior Committee Clerk it was anticipated by all concerned that post would be approved with the proposed salary scale and it was on this premise that he received his letter of appointment.

The Court is of the view, keeping in mind that the Respondents feel that they are under an obligation to meet their promise to Mr. Kibicho, that he should be given the benefit of the maximum of the new salary scales of the Committee Clerk which is £840 and that it should be effective from 1st June, 1970.

The Court feels that the Respondents should meet their obligations as far as possible within the existing circumstances which have been set out hereinbefore and the least that they should do in fairness and equity is to give the maximum of salary scale A6—£840 to Mr. Kibicho until the date he was appointed as Establishment Officer at a starting salary of £968.

According to the Court's calculations Mr. Kibicho would now be entitled to £275 but as the Court cannot rule out some margin of error the Court directs the parties to work out the amount due to Mr. Kibicho under the Court's findings and to pay him such amount forthwith.

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
