The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280). If default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period, no refund shall be made.

5. The land and buildings shall be used for workshops and residential purposes only.

6. The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land or such lesser area that may be prescribed by the local authority in its by-laws.

7. The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.

8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President: no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.

10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sums as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.

12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard, the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description, as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.

14. The President of the Republic of Kenya or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

15. The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th year of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at a rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

and
R. B. Shaw Limited

RULING

This is an interpretation application made by the Claimants in respect of the Court award in the above dispute which was announced on 29th April, 1974.

The Court awarded a wage increase of 15 per cent with effect from 1st January, 1974, to all the workers affected by this dispute.

The Notification of Dispute Form "A" clearly stated that the class of workers affected were all unionizable staff.

The Claimants have bitterly complained that the Respondents had deliberately misinterpreted the Court award in respect of three employees, Messrs. David Mbithi, Phillip Kimani and John Mwangi.

The Claimants reminded the Court that during the hearing the Respondents had clearly stated that they had decided to up-grade the minimum wage throughout their undertaking to Sh. 300 p.m. after the completion of three months' probation period but in respect of Mr. Mbithi and Mr. Kimani, both of whom had started working for the Respondents on 1st December, 1973, at a wage of Sh. 255 p.m., and after they had been promoted to Sh. 300 p.m. beginning from 1st March, 1974, and after the Respondents had paid them arrears of Sh. 90 for the months of March and April, 1974, they had at the end of May, decided to deduct Sh. 45 from their wages, i.e. reduced it from Sh. 345 to Sh. 300 p.m.

The Claimants submitted that the Respondents had absolutely no justification for behaving in this manner.

In the case of Mr. Mwangi they maintained that his probation should have ended on 30th April, 1974, from which date his salary should be Sh. 300 p.m.

The Claimants also asked the Court to find that there was a minimum basic wage of Sh. 300 p.m. in the Respondents' undertaking with effect from 1st January, 1974.

The Respondents contended that they had interpreted the Court award to mean that every employee in the service of the company at 1st January, 1974, should receive 15 per cent increase on the salary paid in December, 1973, and they had in fact done this.

The Respondents denied the Claimants' allegations that Messrs. Mbithi and Kimani had been given an increase on 7th May, 1973, or that the agreed minimum wage in the Respondents' undertaking was Sh. 300 p.m. They explained that an increase was given on 18th June, 1973, and it happened that between that date and February, 1974, one man was increased to Sh. 300 but the minimum wage remained at Sh. 255 p.m.

The Respondents finally stated that both Messrs. Mbithi and Kimani were engaged in December, 1973, and were being paid Sh. 255 both of them were given an increase backdated according to the Court award from 1st January, 1974, and they now receive Sh. 300 an increase of 17.6 per cent instead of 15 per cent.

In the case of Mr. Mwangi they stated that since he was not in their employment as at 1st January, 1974, he is not affected by the award. They asked the Court to uphold their interpretation.

The Court would like to state that during the hearing a letter was produced written by the Respondents' Managing Director in which it is clearly stated that the Respondents had decided to up-grade the minimum wage throughout the company to Sh. 300 p.m. after the completion of three months' probationary period. So there can be no dispute on this point.

The Court announced its award on 29th April, 1974, by which time Mr. Mbithi and Mr. Mwangi were in receipt of Sh. 300 p.m. with effect from 1st March, 1974. The Court award was effective from 1st January, 1974.

The Court rules that these two employees should have received their wages as follows:—

Their wages should accordingly be adjusted.

In the case of Mr. Mwangi, he should be paid a wage of Sh. 300 p.m. from 1st May, 1974.

CAUSE No. 25 OF 1974

Parties:—

Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union
and
Ginza Motors Ltd.

Issues in dispute:—

1. The company's failure to pay Mr. Ibrahim Abdullah his overtime entitlements.
2. Wrongful and unjustified dismissal of Mr. Kefa Albert.
3. Terminal benefits of Mr. Peter Kibugi.

1. The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Ginza Motors Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 16th day of July, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" signed on 5th March, 1974, was received by the Court on 24th May, along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Issue No. 1.—At the commencement of the hearing the Claimants informed the Court that since Mr. Ibrahim Abdullah had died they were pursuing the claim on behalf of his widow and family. On being asked if the matter had been referred to the Public Trustee or if letters of administration had been obtained from the High Court the Claimants stated that this had not been done. In view of this the Court advised the Claimants that they should contact the Public Trustee or the widow of the deceased should apply for letters of administration after which she could pursue the claim on behalf of her deceased husband either in the High Court or in the Industrial Court.

The Claimants accordingly withdrew the demand under Issue No. 1.

Issue No. 2.—Mr. Kefa Albert was employed by the Respondents as a receptionist and at the time of the termination of his services was in receipt of a monthly salary of Sh. 495. On 29th January, 1973, he was verbally summarily dismissed by the Respondents.

On 15th December, 1972, the Respondents had served a letter of final warning on him stating that he had been absent every now and then and that if he would continue to do the same then his services would be terminated. The Respondents alleged that during the eight months' service which he had with them he was absent for 17 days without any lawful reason or excuse and in addition was marked "sick" for five days making a total of 22 days. Although the Respondents alleged that they had given him numerous warnings in writing and verbally, only a copy of the final warning was produced in Court. In fact during the hearing the Respondents conceded that they had given Mr. Albert only verbal warnings.

There is a collective agreement in force between the parties where under clause 13 a warning procedure is laid down. The last sentence of this clause clearly states that a copy of the final warning shall be sent to the General Secretary of the Claimants. It is admitted that a copy of this letter was not sent to the Claimants.

The Claimants maintained that in view of the history of the dispute relating to this particular member they could not accept his termination as they were at no time informed of his abnormal absenteeism at any time by the Respondents.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that however unsatisfactory Mr. Albert may have been it was the Respondents' duty to comply with the provisions of the collective agreement which on their own admission they failed to do. In these circumstances the Court finds that his services were terminated wrongfully but the Court is not prepared to order his reinstatement. Instead, the Court feels that he should be awarded two months' salary by way of compensation for his wrongful termination and so awards.

Issue No. 3.—Mr. Peter Kibugi was employed as a driver by the Respondents from March, 1971 till August, 1973, in which month it is alleged that he was involved in a serious accident and his driving licence was taken away by the Police who retained it for a period of time so that he was unable to produce it to the Respondents. The Respondents stated that accordingly they could not permit him to drive any vehicle.

There is a further serious allegation against him that in order to absolve himself of any blame for having caused an accident through gross carelessness he had after the accident cut the brakes pipes of the vehicle involved in the accident in order to make it appear that the accident was caused as a result of the failure of the brakes.

The Claimants vigorously challenged this termination on the ground that there appeared to be no record of the alleged accident at the Nandi Hills Police Station where they were directed by the Respondents. Moreover the Respondents had not shown them any documentary proof or tendered any other evidence to satisfy them that an accident had taken place and that the accident was as a result of Mr. Kibugi's gross carelessness.

During the hearing the Court was also surprised to find that no documentary evidence was tendered by the Respondents in support of their claim of the aforesaid accident. They, however, undertook to furnish to the Court documentary evidence in due course a copy of which they undertook to send to the Claimants also for their comments.

In view of the documentary evidence that has been tendered by the Respondents the Court has come to the conclusion that Mr. Kibugi's services were justifiably terminated. The Court, however, does not find that he merited a summary dismissal. No documentary evidence was produced about the serious allegation that he had cut the brake cables after the accident. In view of this the Court awards that his termination should be considered to be a normal termination and he should be given one month's pay in lieu of notice and other benefits that he may be entitled to under the collective agreement.

Printing and Kindred Trades Workers' Union
and
Brooke Bond Liebig Kenya Limited

RULING

The Respondents have applied to the Court for interpretation of the Court award as far as the first Claimant Union is concerned.

A recognition agreement has been drawn up and signed as far as their printing department is concerned and a collective agreement has also been negotiated and signed with the second Claimants Union in respect of their employees in the printing department.

Difficulty, however, had arisen when they were proposing a recognition agreement in line with the Court award to the first Claimant Union particularly concerning their employees in the Central Packing Factory. The Respondents referred to the following paragraph appearing on page 9 of the Court award:—

"After a very careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that the first Claimant Union be recognized by the Respondents in respect of their unionizable employees who were in the employment of Oxo (E.A.) Ltd., Kenya Fishing Flies Ltd. and those unionizable employees who are at their Mombasa warehouse."

The Respondents submitted that the award was very clear and as far as they were concerned there was no doubt at all as to what the Court had meant. They had interpreted the Court award very liberally and had offered to sign a recognition agreement with the first Claimant Union in respect of:—

1. Offices and Warehouse in Kampala Road where the remaining six employees of Oxo (E.A.) Ltd. are still working.
2. Kenya Coffee, Nairobi.
3. Kenya Fishing Flies, Kericho.
4. Head Office, Nairobi.
5. Mombasa Office and Warehousing Department.
6. Purchasing Department, Nairobi.

The Respondents bitterly complained at the unjustified and uncalled for strike that had been called by the first Claimant Union at the Central Packing Factory which had lasted for three days particularly when they alleged that the interpretation application had already been made to the Court.

The Claimants on the other hand very strongly maintained that Central Packing Factory was a department of Brooke Bond and because they had enjoyed recognition by this firm, it was understood that their recognition by this company extended to Central Packing Factory also. In view of this there was no need for the Court to specifically state that the first Claimant Union was awarded recognition in respect of Central Packing Factory employees also.

The first Claimant Union submitted documentary evidence in support of their contention that Central Packing Factory was in fact part and parcel of Sales and Marketing Division of the Respondents. They explained that the Central Packing Factory did the blending, etc., of all the tea for local consumption and that it sold tea to various customers in depots. They reminded the Court that they had been trying to get a recognition agreement with the Respondents since 1965 but had not succeeded until the Court award.

Finally the first Claimant Union stated that they could not produce the recognition agreement that had been signed between them and Brooke Bond because they had misplaced it when they had shifted offices twice over the last ten years. They asked the Court to rule that they were entitled to be recognized in respect of employees in the Central Packing Factory.

The Court must point out that all the submissions which the first Claimant Union has put forward during the hearing of this interpretation application were before the Court during the original hearing and the Court considered these submissions along with others before coming to its findings.

The Central Packing Factory was established for the packing of tea supplied from the producers to the pool and they number some 28 tea producing firms.

The case of the employees of the Central Packing Factory vis-à-vis their recognition by the first Claimant Union was very carefully considered by the Court and the Court came to the conclusion that the first Claimant Union should not be recognized in respect of them. The Court award as far as the first Claimant Union is concerned is very clear and the Court finds that the first Claimant Union is in fact trying to extend the Court award to cover a section in respect of which they were not awarded recognition.

The Court accordingly upholds the Respondents' interpretation on the matter in dispute.



Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

D.41. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.
