# THE TRUST LAND ACT (Cap. 288)

THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the Municipal Council gives notice that the plots in Kakamega Municipality as described in the Schedules hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grants of the plots.

- 13. The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the land if used for one private dwelling-house and not more than 75 per cent if used for light industries of the area of the

14. The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the Annual Ground Rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th years of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at the rate of 4 per cent of unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT Cause No. 27 of 1974

Parties:-

Kenya Electrical Trades Workers' Union

and

Uganda Electricals (K) Ltd.

Issue in dispute:-

Refusal by the Management to sign Recognition Agreement.

- 1. The Kenya Electrical Trades Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Uganda Electricals (K) Ltd., shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 25th day of July, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

#### AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 27th May, 1974, was received by the Court on 19th June, along with the statutory certificate from the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute atoms from the Respondents' refusal to recognize the Claimants as a trade union to represent the interests of their employees. As at the end of June, 1974, the Respondents had 13 unionizable employees in their employment all of whom the Claimants stated were their members.

In early October, 1973, the Claimants approached the Respondents officially over this matter and despite several meetings between the parties the Respondents refused to recognize the Claimants.

On 16th October, 1973, the employees staged a walkout as one of their colleagues, a member of the Claimants, were alleged to have been wrongfully dismissed. This matter ended up at the Ministry of Labour and as a result a return to work formula was arrived at on 16th October, 1973, to which the two parties to the dispute and the Senior Labour Officer, Nairobi, were signatories.

The case of that particular employee was settled but the Claimants were not accorded recognition and on 9th November, 1973, they reported the existence of a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour on the issue of the Respondents' refusal to sign a recognition agreement with them.

On 15th November, 1973, the Senior Labour Officer, Nairobi, wrote a letter to the Respondents' managing director confirming that as they were carrying on the business of a wholesale and retail nature the Wages Orders applicable to their firm are—

"Legal Notice No. 116—the Regulation of Wages (Wholesale and Retail Distributive Trades) Order, 1968.

Legal Notice No. 179—the Regulation of Wages (General) Order 1973."

There was some delay before the dispute was accepted by the Ministry of Labour because representations were made on the Respondents' behalf to the Chief Industrial Relations Officer that the Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers was the proper union that should be accredited recognition by the Respondents. Anyhow, the dispute was accepted on 6th March, 1974, although on 19th March, 1974, the Respondents also through the Federation of Kenya Employers declared a trade dispute on the same issue with the Claimants and asked for it to be processed through the machinery laid down in the Trade Disputes Act.

During the hearing the Claimants relied on rule 3 of their constitution whereby their membership is open to all employees in E.A. Power & Lighting Co. Ltd., and other electrical undertakings. They submitted that the Respondents are engaged in dealing with electrical goods and also undertake repairs of such goods and they were therefore properly constituted to represent their employees. The Claimants produced a copy letter which was addressed by the Respondents' director to Mr. M. Kagwa who is one of their employees with copy to the Kenyanization of Personnel Bureau, on 10th January, 1973, whereby they appointed him as a trainee to understudy one radio engineer Mr. M. B. Patel with effect from 11th January, 1973, and Mr. Kagwa was told that his salary will be Sh. 280 per month.

The Claimants drew the Court's attention to the fact that the Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers had shown no interest whatsoever in representing the Respondents' employees and did not challenge the Claimants' stand on the issue.

The Respondents stated that they were in business of retail and wholesale trade and had been issued licences under section 7 of the Trade Licensing Act, 1967, these licences being regulated Trade Licence, Wholesalers Licence and Miscellaneous Occupation Licence authorizing them to indulge in retail and general wholesale trade and to import goods.

The Respondents admitted that their employees had every right to join a trade union and they also conceded that they would be prepared to recognize such a trade union provided it was the proper union as laid down in the industrial relations set up in Kenya which was organized on an industrial basis as opposed to craft.

The Respondents maintained that there was no doubt that the only union that was entitled to represent their workers and which they would recognize was the Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers and relied on the letter written to them by the Senior Labour Officer, Nairobi, which has been referred to hereinabove. The Respondents made it clear that they were resisting this demand on a matter of principle, and asked the Court to reject the Claimants' demand.

The Court is satisfied on the evidence before it that the Respondents are engaged in retail and wholesale trade of electrical goods and also import these items. There was no evidence produced to show that they traded in any other type of goods other than electrical goods and appliances. The Court is also convinced in view of the letter they have written to one

of their employees with a copy to the Kenyanization of Personnel Bureau that they undertake repairs to a limited extent of electrical items.

The fact that the Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers has shown no interest to represent the Respondents' employees is very significant.

The Court however, is not satisfied that the Respondents are actively engaged or undertake electrical repair work as is generally found in the case of electrical contractors. From the evidence produced during the hearing there is no doubt at all that the Respondents are engaged in wholesale and retail trade.

A representative of the Senior Labour Officer, Nairobi, after a visit on 15th November, 1973, to the Respondents' place of business, came to the conclusion that the Respondents were covered by the Regulation of Wages Order applicable to the wholesale and distributive trades.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion, mainly because the Claimants have failed to produce satisfactory evidence, that they should be denied the right to represent the Respondents' employees. The Court, however, directs that the Claimants be at liberty to raise this question of recognition with the Respondents after twelve months from the date of the Court award in the event of there being a change in the circumstances or additional evidence to support the Claimants.

#### THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 30 of 1974

Parties:-

Kenya Local Government Workers' Union

and

Association of Local Government Employers

Issue in dispute:-

Failure of the county councils to implement the agreement to pay new scales of increased wages as from 1st January, 1972.

- 1. The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Association of Local Government Employers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 12th day of August, 1974, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

#### Award

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 18th June, 1974, was received by the Court on 20th June, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties are agreed that some 8,000 workers in the employ of 38 county councils are subject to joint negotiations in Committee No. 3 between them.

The parties concluded an agreement regarding new pay scales in respect of these workers and it was further agreed that these new rates would be applicable from 1st January, 1972. In fact the parties have already printed the new scales and terms and conditions for employees in the non-salaried grades in a little booklet. The new scales appear as Appendix A on pages 14 and 15 of this booklet. The wage increases granted vary between £1 at the lowest to £2 at the highest. Again there is no dispute on these facts.

The Claimants are asking for an award against these 38 county councils to implement the aforesaid new pay scales with effect from 1st January, 1972.

The Respondents while admitting all the above facts stated that local authorities are required to obtain an approval of their budget from the Ministry of Local Government and where an increase is agreed similar to that of the present dispute then a supplementary estimate must be submitted and approved.

The Respondents stressed that the Ministry of Local Government had refused approval of the increases and rejected applications for suplementary estimates all based on the inability of the county councils to meet their financial obligations with their existing income.

The Claimants, however, submitted that most of the county councils were in a position to meet their obligations under the new agreement but because of the few who were in financial difficulties the Minister for Local Government had decided to reject the supplementary estimates for all. They strongly resented this move and produced a couple of documents in respect of their submission.

The Court notes with interest that the conciliation proceedings lasted well over 18 months and that a representative from the Ministry of Local Government was invited to every meeting. Their representative on numerous occasions stated that Government would soon make a policy statement on the future financial policy affecting county councils but no such statement has yet been issued.

It is common knowledge that many county councils are now in a precarious financial position and cannot meet their obligations without financial assistance from Government.

The fact, however, remains that these 38 county councils through their representatives have entered into a collective agreement with the Claimants way back in 1972 effective from the 1st of that year and the Court has now before it a prayer from the Claimants to order them to honour their obligations under the said agreement. The Court notes that agreed increases for all the 38 county councils will result in £142,000 extra expenditure per year. It is not the Court's intention to pass comments on the vital functions that these county councils perform in the national development of the country, neither does the Court feel that it should direct the Government to subsidize the finances of these county councils.

The dispute before the Court is straightforward and simple. The new agreed scales starting at M 1 from Sh. 150 per month going up to M 7 at Sh. 820 per month are not at all unreasonable for the year 1972. If anything, they are very much out of date.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has no alternative but to award that all these workers should be paid the new salary scales effective from 1st January, 1972. However, keeping in view the submissions made by the parties and also because detailed information was not supplied to the Court as to which county councils could meet their obligations, the Court directs that the parties should meet under the chairmanship of the Chief Industrial Relations Officer, Ministry of Labour and ascertain which county councils can meet the obligations under the said collective agreement immediately. The Court awards that those who can meet their obligations should implement the agreed new salary scales (effective from 1st January, 1972) forthwith. Others should implement the new scales from the first of the month following the date of the Court award and pay the arrears due to the workers under this award in six equal instalments to be paid quarterly commencing from 1st November, 1974.
