Applications from non-civil servants should be submitted in triplicate on PSC.2 form together with cards PSC.24 and PSC.24a duly completed.

Incremental credits will be granted to successful candidates who are not civil servants for approved previous experience provided the maximum salary is not exceeded. Vacancies in the Ministry of Agriculture:

Financial Analyst (One Post) (No. 273/74)

Salary scale.—£1,494 to £1,866. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be in possession of a degree in Economics or Statistics equivalent to a Ph.D. of the University of East Africa and have at least three years satisfactory experience at the level of Economist II or its equivalent. They should be capable of designing and implementing projects (including research) on their own

The successful candidate will be expected to do project budgeting which will include monitoring of the flow of project funds to the various organizations involved in the Livestock Development Project Phase II. He will be expected to concern the financial requirements involved in the project. He will be required to plan and implement a system for collecting data to be used in evaluation of livestock development projects.

Training Division:

Lecturer Grade I (Animal Health) (Three Posts) (No. 274/74)

Salary scale.—£1,494 to £1,866. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be in possession of a Bachelor of Veterinary Science degree from East Africa or an equivalent qualification registrable in Kenya. They should have considerable practical field experience. Teaching experience would be an added advantage.

The post is at the Animal Health and Industry Training Institute, Kabete and the successful candidates will be required to lecture, give practical demonstrations in Animal Diseases and examine students undergoing training in Animal Health, Range Management and in-service courses which are periodically held at the Institute.

As may be required by the Project Manager and the Co-Manager, or the Institute, the successful candidate will assist in carrying out any other duties relevant to the training carried out at the Institute.

Veterinary Services Division:

Livestock Officer Grade I (Three Posts) (No. 275/74)

Salary scale.—£1,212 to £1,614. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must possess a diploma in Animal Husbandry from Egerton College or an equipment qualification from an approved institution. The candidates must have served satisfactorily for at least three years, as Livestock Officers Grade II, on disease control in the field. Ability to deal with correspondence, public and the staff both in the office and in the field is essential.

Successful candidates must be prepared to travel extensively in the field supervising and implementing disease control measures in the field.

Technical Services (Water Department):

Senior Assistant Hydrologist (One Post) (No. 276/74)

Salary scale.—£1,212 to £1,614. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants should have passes in five subjects in the East African Certificate of Education, including one in English and one at the Advanced Level in either Mathematics or Physics. At least six years' experience is required in river gauging techniques, establishment of hydrological net-works and field investigations covering the study of river catchments. Preference will be given to candidates who have attended a specialized course leading to Hydrological Assistant's Certificate. The selected candidate must be prepared to carry out field work, often in remote areas.

The duties of the post include measuring of river flows, installations of hydrological net-works; field investigation covering the study and preparation of reports on river catchments and stream flow-behaviour, and supervising the work of junior officers in the field.

Superintendent (Mechanical) (One Post) (No. 277/74)

Salary scale.—£1,212 to £1,614. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Candidates should have had a good general education preferably up to School Certificate standard. They should have served a recognized apprenticeship or training in Mechanical Engineering. They should have had at least seven years' progressive post-training experience up to a level equivalent to Senior Inspector (Mechanical) in Civil Service in the operation and maintenance of a vehicle transport fleet. Experience of maintenance of construction plant would be an advantage.

Fluency in written and spoken English and Kiswahili are essential.

The post will be based in Nairobi but will involve travelling.

Superintendent (Water) (One Post) (No. 278/74)

Salary scale.—£1,212 to £1,614. PERMANENT or AGREEMENT.

Candidates must have a good general education preferably of School Certificate standard. They must have received a recognized three years' training in water supply construction, operation and maintenance. They shall have had at least eight years' post-training experience in these types of work including at least three years at responsible level equivalent to Senior Inspector in Water Department. They must be completely competent in all types of water supply installation, pumping, treatment, pipelines, boreholes, etc., and be capable of administration connected with running a large number of supplies.

A good knowledge of written and spoken English and spoken Kiswahili is essential. The appointee will be based on a provincial centre but must be prepared to travel extensively.

Chemist Grade II (Three Posts) (No. 279/74)

Salary scale.—£1,212 to £1,614. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

The applicants must hold a degree in Chemistry or its equivalent from a recognized institution of higher learning. Practical experience in examination and analysis of water samples from both ground and surface sources will be preferable.

The successful candidates will be expected to advise and make recommendations on the Chemical aspects in the design and operation of water treatment work, carry out examination and analysis of sewage, effluents; and should be able to organize and plan suitable courses for the instruction of water supply operators and sewage works supervisors.

Senior Inspector (Mechanical) (Two Posts) (No. 280/74)

Salary scale.—£972 to £1,302. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Candidates should have had a good general education preferably up to School Certificate standard. They should have served a recognized apprenticeship or training in Mechanical Engineering. They should have had at least four years' progressive post-training experience on a rank equivalent to Foreman/Inspector (Mechanical) in the Civil Service in the maintenance of motor vehicles and construction plant.

Fluency in written and spoken English and Kiswahili are essential.

The posts may be situated in any of the main towns of Kenya and will involve extensive travelling.

Senior Inspector (Electrical) (Two Posts) (No. 281/74)

Salary scale.—£972 to £1,302. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be in possession of the East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent. They must possess the City and Guilds Electrical Engineering Technician Certificate or its equivalent, followed by at least four years' practical experience in one or more of the following:—

- (a) The preparation of design drawings, specifications, estimates for electrical installations in buildings.
- (b) The installation, inspection and testing of electrical installations in public buildings, institutions, etc.

Or

Candidates must hold a Grade I Wiremen Trade Test Certificate and preferably should have served an approved apprenticeship in an electrical trade followed by two years in a supervisory position of inspector. They must possess a thorough working knowledge of the current regulations for the electrical equipment of building and hold "A" Licence.

Water Bailiff Grade II (Two Posts) (No. 282/74)

Salary scale.—£972 to £1,302. PERMANENT or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must possess East African Certificate of Education standard, should be fluent in written and spoken English and have a thorough knowledge of Swahili. They must have served as Water Bailiff Grade III for a period of not less than three years with experience in the use of dumpy level, reading survey plans, gauging of stream flow, revenue accounting, writing technical reports relating to flow measurements of streams and rivers.

The duties of the post involve the scrutiny of legal documents relating to water rights and permits and supervision of Water Apportionment Board field operations in the provinces. Successful candidates will be required to take charge of Provincial Water Bailiff offices and is essential that candidates for these posts must have good personality and ability to deal tactfully and when required with firmness with the public. The duties include extensive safaris along rivers in remote areas and living in canvas.

Senior Inspector (Water) (Eight Posts) (No. 283/74)

Salary scale.—£972 to £1,302. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Candidates must have five years' experience in the construction, operation and maintenance of the usual type of water supply and a good standard of education preferably East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent. Capacity to write and speak English and Swahili is essential. Account will be taken of relevant training courses that the candidates may have attended.

Successful candidates will be dealing with the construction, operation and maintenance of water supply installations of all types, main engines, pumps, boreholes and treatment. They will be responsible to a Superintendent or an Engineer of Water Supplies and will be required to supervise several technicians as well as training them on the job. The duties may entail taking charge of water organizations in extensive administrative districts.

The work may be in any part of Kenya, generally based on Provincial and District centres and be concerned with Urban or Rural supplies as required and may involve extensive travelling and living in camps.

Survey Assistant Grade II (One Post) (No. 284/74)

Salary scale.—£972 to £1,302. PERMANENT or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be in possession of East African Certificate of Education or an equivalent qualification. They should have completed a recognized course in Survey or formal period of training under agreement with an approved Company or Government Department. In addition they should have at least seven years' progressive experience in practical engineering survey preferably connected with water development. The selected candidate will be based in Nairobi but will be required to travel extensively throughout Kenya and must therefore, be thoroughly competent and capable of working on his own. He must be expected to supervise and train staff.

Draughtsman Grade II (Two Posts) (No. 285/74)

Salary scale.—£972 to £1,302. PERMANENT or AGREEMENT.

Candidates should have a good General Certificate of Education preferably up to East African Certificate of Education standard and should have had at least seven years' progressive experience in Civil and Mechanical Engineering drawing including approved training, preferably specializing in water supply work. The ability to work from rough sketches and survey field bookings to finished drawing is essential and experience in map preparation would be advantageous. A good command of English is very essential and desirable. The occupants will supervise the work of a number of draughtsmen and train junior personnel and must therefore be mature persons.

Senior Hydrologist Assistant (Three Posts) (No. 286/74)

Salary scale.—£714 to £1,008. PERMANENT or AGREE-MENT.

Candidates must be between 25 and 45 years of age and should possess East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent with credits in Mathematics. They should have had at least three years' experience in river gauging techniques, establishment of hydrological stations and field investigations covering the study of river catchments. They must be capable of and be prepared to carry out field work in remote areas and should be able to control labour.

The successful candidates will be responsible for measuring of river flows, installation, operation and maintenance of hydrological stations, supervision and execution of small construction work, collecting, checking and computing of field observations and controlling Government stores and accounts.

Inspector (Mechanical) (Seven Posts) (No. 287/74)
