Issue in dispute:-

Employer's wording.—The alleged wrongful and unjustified termination of service of Mr. Clement Kwame.

Union's wording.—Wrongful and unjustified termination of services of Mr. Clement Kwame.

- 1. The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as Claimants and Hughes Limited, Nakuru Branch shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 2nd September, 1974 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Respondents also called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath—

Hussein Bhanji

J. J. Cox.

#### AWARD

- 3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 20th June, 1974, duly signed by the parties with their respective versions of the issue in dispute was received by the Court along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner on 10th July, 1974.
- Mr. Clement Kwame's services were terminated summarily on 5th April, 1972, by the Respondents. He was the Claimants' chief shopsteward at the Respondents Nakuru branch.

The incident leading to Mr. Kwame's dismissal took place on 4th April, 1972, when he did not report for duty after the Easter weekend. The Service Manager, Mr. Bhanji became suspicious because on the previous day which was a holiday Mr. Kwame and the proprietor of Umoja Driving School had gone to his house for certain spare parts. He therefore decided at about 9.30 a.m. to go and look for Mr. Kwame first at his house and then at the premises of Umoja Driving School where he found Mr. Kwame's tool box open with a few spanners out near a Ford Anglia with its bonnet open. Mr. Kwame, however, was not seen.

Mr. Bhanji then went back to his office and came back with one Mr. Julius Macharia and this time went in the office where he looked around and quite incidentally found Mr. Kwame sitting under the table with his head covered by both hands. Mr. Kwame did not say anything and was speechless,

Later on after a couple of hours Mr. Kwame is alleged to have made a statement to Mr. Cox in the presence of Mr. Bhanji and Mr. Macharia. After making the statement he refused to sign it.

The statement as recorded by Mr. Cox read as follows:-

"Mr. Kwame states that he absented himself from duty on Tuesday, 4th April, 1972, because he owed another man some money which he could not pay and so he agreed to repair his car during working hours with this Company. He failed to report his absence to the Company."

The Claimants have challenged the dismissal on the grounds that:—

- 1. There was no evidence that he had been working on another vehicle.
- 2. There was no evidence that he was working for reward.
- There was no evidence that if he was working as alleged, that the owner of the vehicle was a regular customer of the Respondents and
- That he should have been questioned about his absence and not summarily dismissed.

The Claimants further deny that Mr. Kwame made any statement to Mr. Cox and further rely on the following clause in the collective agreement submitting that action should have been taken against Mr. Kwame under it.

"Any employee who is absent for 7 consecutive days, or a total of 10 days in any one calendar year without permission, will be deemed to have left his employment and will not be allowed to return to his work-place except where he produces satisfactory evidence that such absence was warranted."

The matter had been reported to the Minister for Labour as a dispute by the Claimants where unfortunately a long delay took place. An investigator was appointed and as a result the Chief Industrial Relations Officer forwarded his "Findings and Recommendations" to the parties. These were as follows:

#### "Findings:-

- (a) It can be argued that the case at Marshalls involving Mr. Opiyo is similar to this case of Mr. Kwame. However, there is one important fact which must not be overlooked and that is, Mr. Opiyo was found actually working on a vehicle while Mr. Kwame was found on the premises of Umoja Driving School hiding under the table as evidenced by Bhanji and Macharia.
- (b) There is a possibility that Mr. Kwame went to ask for money and on seeing them hid for fear that he could be reported for having been seen there.

Recommendation.—Considering the long service, Mr. Kwame had rendered to the Company faithfully and taking into account the circumstantial aspect of this case, I recomment that Mr. Kwame's instant dismissal be reduced to normal termination of service and he be paid his terminal benefits as contained in union/employer collective agreement."

The Respondents rejected this recommendation and maintained that their action under the circumstances was proper and justified.

During the hearing the Claimants did not call any witness and the Respondents called Mr. Bhanji and Mr. Cox to give evidence and Mr. Macharia was also present and available to give evidence if necessary.

Both the witnesses substantially confirmed on oath the incident leading to Mr. Kwame's dismissal.

The Court has carefully considered the parties' submissions and the evidence tendered in support thereof in coming to his conclusions.

The Court finds it very significant that Mr. Kwame was not called to give evidence during the hearing. In fact he was

not even present in Court during the hearing.

The Court would like to make it clear that the question of conflicting interests and application of clause 33 is not relevant to the present dispute because that refers to an employee's activities after working hours during his leisure time. That being so the points submitted by the Claimants in support of their case failed as Mr. Kwame was found in suspicious circumstances at another place during working hours.

The circumstances leading to this dispute quite clearly show that Mr. Kwame absented himself from duty on 4th April, 1974 and his tool box which was open was found near a car with its bonnet open at the Umoja Driving School and Mr. Kwame himself was found sitting under the table covering his head with both hands.

The Court has no hesitation in finding that all these facts are properly proved and that Mr. Kwame did indeed commit a serious misconduct as the Court cannot disregard the obvious inference from the aforesaid set of circumstances.

The Court has considered Mr. Kwame's long service with the Respondents and the fact that he was the Claimants chief shopsteward and finds that it is not a case of victimization of a union official.

For the foregoing reasons the Court finds that the Respondents action in summarily terminating Mr. Kwame's services was fully justified and the Claimants demands are accordingly rejected.

- 5. The successful allottee of the plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been successful the conveyancing, stamp duty and registration fees, contribution in lieu of rates and provisional service charges. In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allotment and the applicant shall have no claim to the plot.

#### General Conditions

- 1. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 2. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in the letter of application and will be subject to the Special Conditions set out below.
- 3. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the 1st day of the month following the issue of the letter of allotment.

#### Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The grantee shall within six months of the Commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in confirmity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any conditions herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantees expense) accept a surrender of land comprised herein.
- 5. The land and buildings shall only be used for the purpose of a church, church hall, and one residence for the Minister in charge.
- 6. The buildings shall not cover a greater area of the land than that laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.
  - 7. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.
- 8. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President.
- 9. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 10. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 11. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description, as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.
- 13.
