THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the President of the Republic of Kenya, gives notice that the plots in Nakuru Municipality as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grants of individual plots.

4. Applications must be sent so as to reach the Town Clerk, Nakuru Municipal Council, not later than noon on 4th March, 1977.

5. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.

6. Applicants must enclose with their applications a sum of Sh. 1,000 in cash or send a postal order, money order or banker's order made payable to the Commissioner of Lands as a deposit. No personal cheques will be accepted. The deposit will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of 30 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE No. 71 of 1976

Parties:—

Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers

and

Avon Rubber Co. (Kenya) Ltd.

Issue in dispute.—Dismissal of John Obuya Owuoth.

1. The Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Avon Rubber Company (Kenya) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 11th day of January, 1977, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Respondents also called Cyrus G. Nderitu to give evidence during the hearing.

AWARD

3. The Notification of dispute Form "A" dated 30th July, 1976, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 17th September along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

J. O. Owuoth was employed by the Respondents as a tyre builder and was granted compassionate leave from after duty on 14th October, 1975, to 21st October, 1975. In the letter of approval of this leave he was clearly told that if he failed to return at the time stated the Respondents will of necessity engage another man to fill his vacant position and may not be able to offer him employment on his return in which event he would be considered to have resigned from the service.

The Claimants allege that he was only a day late in coming back but the Respondents stated that he reported for duty on 24th October, 1975, and as such they were justified in dismissing him.

The Claimants having made representations on his behalf and after having reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour an investigation was carried out by a Labour Officer. On 16th June, 1976, the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, forwarded the following findings and recommendation to the parties on this dispute:—

"Findings

It is quite evident from Mr. Owuoth's personal file record that he habitually absented himself without reasonable cause. Of the six warnings in his file four pertain to absenteeism.

The parties Collective Agreement, under clause 16, stipulated that when an employee has three current warnings outstanding the employee is liable to termination of service on committing a fourth offence.

The Management acted justifiably under this clause and furthermore Mr. Owuoth had signed a letter which required him to return for duty on 22nd August, 1975, at 8 a.m. which he failed to do.

Recommendation

In the light of the above findings I have come to the inevitable conclusion that Mr. Owuoth was justifiably dismissed."

The Claimants did not accept the investigation report and have brought the dispute to the Court and have submitted that this was a typical example of the high handed manner in which some of the employers in the country treated their workers. The Claimants in their three-quarter-page written submission had this to say in their third and fourth (and final) paragraph:—

"In a letter addressed to him dated 14th October, 1975, authorizing him to proceed on leave, he was warned that if he failed to return in time he would be sacked. Mr. Owuoth proceeded on leave and boarded a bus on the evening of 21st October, 1975, to return to Nairobi so that he could report on duty in the morning of 22nd October, 1975. On reaching a place called Magunga, the bus developed mechanical trouble and broke down completely forcing all the passengers on board to spend the night on the bus. The following morning the operators Messrs. E.A. Road Services Ltd., then sent another bus to ferry the stranded passengers to Nairobi. This forced Mr. Owuoth to be delayed for one day. When he reported a day late, the Respondent company refused to accept his explanation of the bus having broken down and proceeded to fire him summarily.

The Union contends that the dismissal was unjustified and requests the Court to order reinstatement plus compensation for the days Mr. Owuoth has been out on tarmac."

In their verbal submission to the Court the Claimants further relied on clause 33 of the collective agreement between the parties on absenteeism. This clause reads as follows:—

"Any employee who is absent for seven consecutive days, or a total of ten days in any one calendar year, without permission, will be deemed to have left his employment and will not be allowed to return to his work place except where he produces satisfactory evidence that such absence was warranted."

The Claimants argued that Mr. Owuoth's case should have been tackled under this clause and not under clause 16 of the collective agreement which lays down an elaborate warning procedure.

The Respondents submitted that Mr. Owuoth had three valid warnings on his record of service and when he absented himself without leave on 22nd and 23rd October thus disrupting the operation of the cycle tyre factory without explanation or valid reason they summarily dismissed him in accordance with the provisions of the relevant clause in the collective agreement which was awarded by the Court.

The Respondents strongly denied the allegation that they had exploited Mr. Owuoth as a casual worker and set out in great detail his employment history with them which showed that due to the vicissitudes of their business Mr. Owuoth had been offered employment for fixed terms on and off and that finally with effect from 1st June, 1973, he was offered and accepted permanent terms in their cycle tyre section where he worked until his dismissal.

The Respondents also gave extracts from his service record which showed that he had been served with warning letters on 12th November, 1973; 18th April, 1974; 7th December, 1974, 10th April and 5th June, 1975. Finally on 4th August, 1975, Mr. Owuoth was advised in writing of the current position regarding his warnings which was as follows:—

- "(i) The warnings on 12th November, 1973 and 18th April, 1974, were ignored.
- (ii) 1st warning on record—7th December, 1974.
- (iii) 2nd warning on record—10th April, 1975.
- (iv) 3rd and final warning—5th June, 1975, and that, should he commit a further offence, he would be liable to summary dismissal."

In addition to elaborating their written submission the Respondents called the Traffic Manager of the East African Road Services Ltd. to give evidence on oath. This witness confirmed that during the months of August, September and October, 1975, the E.A. Road Services Ltd. operated their Route No. 57 from Nairobi to Homa Bay only as the portion of the road between Homa Bay to Magunga was in a very bad condition. He also confirmed a staff work control ticket dated 20th October, 1975, for Route No. 57 which clearly showed that between 20th and 22nd October their service from Nairobi to Homa Bay and back arrived back in Nairobi at 6 a.m. on 22nd October, 1975. He denied any knowledge of any of their vehicles having broken down on these dates.

The Respondents also produced a letter from the Manager, United Land & Water Transport Co. Ltd., stating that according to the records available this firm did not run any of the East African Road Services Ltd. vehicles on any of their services between Homa Bay and Magunga between 20th and 23rd October, 1975.

The Respondents refuted the Claimants' reference to the clause on absenteeism by saying that it had no relevance to the present dispute and that the proper clause applicable was 16 under which they had acted.

Under ordinary circumstances and without the employment record which Mr. Owuoth had with the Respondents the Court would have been inclined to sympathize with a worker who was late for a couple of days when reporting back for duty after compassionate leave or any other leave but in this dispute the Respondents have completely satisfied the Court that this man, although clearly required to be on duty on 22nd October, 1975, did not return until 24th October, 1975.

The Court does not believe, in the absence of any evidence produced by the Claimants through Mr. Owuoth himself or any other witness, that he had boarded a bus on the evening of 21st October, 1975, to return to Nairobi and that the bus had developed mechanical trouble at Magunga and had broken down completely forcing all the passengers on board to spend the night on the bus.

The Court has carefully considered the letter which the Claimants produced from one A. N. Ng'ang'a who had signed for the Traffic Manager dated 19th October, 1976, in which he had stated as follows:—

"I refer to your letter of inquiry dated 14th October, 1976, and hereby wish to confirm that on 22nd October, 1975, our scheduled night bus service from Magunga to Nairobi did not operate."

This was due to the fact that the scheduled vehicle was held up at Londiani on its outward journey due to a mechanical problem and no replacement was possible to undertake the service from Magunga.

I hope the above information will be relevant and helpful to your case."

The Court has no hesitation in accepting the evidence of Mr. Ng'ang'a's boss, that is the Traffic Manager, Mr. Nderitu, who came and gave evidence on oath, in preference to Mr. Ng'ang'a's letter who used to be a depot manager with E.A. Road Services Ltd. having left their service in December.

The Court believes the Claimants' submission when they say that Mr. Owuoth had received a telegram on 13th October stating that his mother was sick and therefore there was no further proof necessary from him to justify his compassionate leave but the Court does not accept that he was delayed in coming back due to circumstances beyond his control because the Court is satisfied that his story of the bus having broken down and he having to spend the night along with the other passengers in the bus is not true.

Now turning to the Claimants' argument that clause 33 of the collective agreement was the relevant clause in this dispute the Court would like to recall that the Claimants' spokesman made his submission on this clause almost towards the end of the hearing and that the Claimants had at no time either before the Investigator or in their written submission relied on this clause. The Court feels that this was for a very good reason and that is because the wording of the clause on absenteeism shows quite clearly that that clause certainly could not apply to the circumstances of Mr. Owuoth's dismissal. The Court finds that the relevant clause is 16 of the collective agreement and the Court is satisfied that the Respondents have acted properly under clause 16 as Mr. Owuoth did have all the previous warnings as alleged by the Respondents in his record of service and which were confirmed by the Investigator.

Finally the Court would like to deal with the Claimants' submission that Mr. Owuoth was not asked to give any explanation. The Respondents produced a copy of notes covering a meeting held in the office of their Technical Director on 24th October, 1975, which was attended by the Shift Supervisor, the shop steward and Mr. Owuoth. The following four paragraphs show what transpired at the meeting:—

"1. The meeting was convened to obtain an explanation from Mr. Obuya Owuoth as to why he failed to report for duty at 8 a.m. on 22nd October, 1975, as instructed and instead reported two days late at 8 a.m. on 24th October, 1975.

2. When asked for an explanation he replied that the 'bus was delayed' but did not offer any evidence in support of this.

3. He acknowledged that he had read the letter setting out the terms of his proceeding on compassionate leave before signing it and he also agreed that he knew there were three current warnings outstanding on his record at that time.

4. As he was unable to offer a reasonable excuse, he was considered to have absented himself from his place of work without leave or other lawful cause. In view of three previous current warnings, it was decided to terminate his service with the company under section 16 of the Union/Association Agreement, i.e. Industrial Court Award 17/68 which sets out warning procedure."

The Court would be failing in its duty if it fails to record that the Claimants' written submission and their presentation of this dispute in Court left a lot to be desired and it may very well be that perhaps Mr. Owuoth did mislead them on some very important points in this dispute.

The Court having found that the Respondents had strictly carried out the provisions of the collective agreement between the parties as laid down in clause 16 rejects the Claimants' demand and finds that Mr. Owuoth's dismissal was justified.

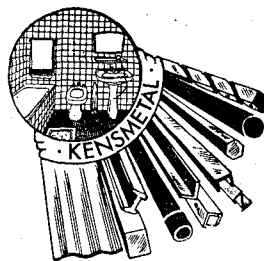

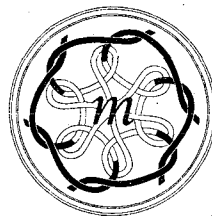
