THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE No. 25 of 1976

Parties:-

Kenya Management Staff Association

and

East African Packaging Industries Ltd.

Issue in dispute.—Termination of Harbans Singh.

- 1. The Kenya Management Staff Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and East African Packaging Industries Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 18th day of January, 1977, and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:—

Claimants.—Harbans Singh Sabharwal.

Respondents.-Roy W. Michaux and Joseph M. Wachira.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 17th February, 1976, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 9th April, 1976, along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Harbans Singh Sabharwal was taken over by the Respondents with effect from 1st August, 1973, on or about which date the Respondents acquired the business of Transcandia (Mfg.). Mr. Singh had started working for Transcandia (Mfg.) Ltd. as a Factory Supervisor on 1st August, 1972, at a monthly salary of Sh. 3,000 and it was stipulated in his letter of appointment that three months' notice by either party was required for termination of employment. In November the Respondents offered Mr. Singh an inclusive salary of Sh. 3,400 p.m. and informed him that in accordance with their parent company's standard practice three months' notice period was now reduced to one month and annual leave was increased to 24 calendar days.

On 1st October, 1974, a letter terminating Mr. Singh's employment was left at his residence. This letter reads as follows:—

"This letter is to confirm our discussions of this morning when you were informed of the termination of your services as from 30th September, 1974.

"As agreed, you will be paid one month's salary in lieu of notice, plus any leave salary which is due. This amount will be forwarded to you in due course under cover of registered post to your above address."

The Claimants took up the matter on his behalf and reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour and on 8th July, 1975, the Investigator's findings were conveyed to the parties by the Chief Industrial Relations Officer. The findings and recommendation are as follows:—

"Findings

The Investigator met the Management of East African Packaging Industries Ltd. in the presence of the Chief Executive Officer of the Federation of Kenya Employers in his office when the Manager stated that Mr. Singh was Africanized, that is why he had his services terminated. However, it transpired that Mr. Singh is a Kenya citizen. The Federation of Kenya Employers advised the Manager that the action was wrong and that Mr. Singh be reinstated. They agreed to meet the Kenya Management Staff Association and sort out the matter. The parties took a long time without submitting written memoranda.

The contents of the written memoranda were quite different from the earlier verbal submission. When the Manager was asked about this he stated in confidence that he stood by his word but the written submission was Management's afterthought.

. It is evident from the above contradictory stories that the termination of Mr. Singh's services had no grounds at all. His termination was therefore wrongful and unjustified.

Recommendation

In view of the above remarks, I recommend that Mr. Singh be reinstated forthwith without loss of any benefits, alternatively Mr. Singh be paid maximum compensation as provided in the Trade Disputes Act for wrongful termination in addition to his terminal benefits, i.e. 12 months' salary."

The Claimants have relied on the findings of the Ministry of Labour Investigator to a large extent in this dispute and have argued that there was no valid reason at all for the Respondents to have terminated Mr. Singh's services.

The Claimants informed the Court that the General Manager of the Respondents not realizing that Mr. Singh was a Kenya citizen had "Africanized" his post and later on when the Respondents realized that they had made a mistake they had put forward the reasons on which they relied during the hearing for terminating his services.

Mr. Singh gave evidence on oath and confirmed that after he had finished the night shift on 30th September, 1974, he was called by Mr. Michaux, the Respondents' Factory Manager, to his office at 8 a.m. on 1st October and Mr. Neuert was also there. They told him that his services were being Africanized and that was the reason the Respondents had decided to terminate his services. Before that there had been absolutely no indication to him at all that the termination of his services was being contemplated. He categorically stated that the word "Africanized" came from Mr. Michaux's mouth and later on, after the letter of termination had been forced on to his father in his absence from his house, when he had tried to contact Mr. Michaux, Mr. Michaux told him that he was not prepared to talk to him by saying, "You are being Africanized".

Mr. Singh explained that at one time prior to joining Transcandia (Mfg.) Ltd. he was running his own business of manufacturing paper products but due to certain disagreements with his partners they closed down the business and eventually sold it. One Mr. Young of Transcandia knew him and on hearing that he had closed his business offered him a job with Transcandia which he took.

Mr. Singh denied that he had ever received any written or verbal warnings or that he had not been able to control the staff under him or that he had clashed with them or abused them.

The Respondents submitted that while they admitted that what the Ministry of Labour Investigator had stated in his findings was true the fact remained that because the General Manager of the Respondents had realized that they had not given any warnings to Mr. Singh they would not be able to prove their allegations of inefficiency they decided to use the word "Africanized" in order to justify their termination of his services.

The Respondents maintained that the sole reason for terminating Mr. Singh's service was his inability to control the staff under him and that during the period he was employed by them this was his main weakness and several verbal warnings were given to him that the situation was getting out of hand. The Respondents also added that the employees supposed to be supervised by Mr. Singh worked in an atmosphere of permanent strain and this was clearly to the detriment of their production.

Mr. Michaux gave evidence on oath and stated that Mr. Singh would come to him and tell him that the employees were not carrying out his instructions and although he told Mr. Singh that it was his job to supervise and control the employees under him, he, Mr. Michaux, had to intervene and issue warnings to those employees. Mr. Michaux also alleged that Mr. Singh's mechanical knowledge was limited to only one machine and that he would take many hours in setting up the machine whereas his employees could set them up quicker than him.

Mr. Michaux denied that he told Mr. Singh that his post was being Africanized and stated that on 1st October when he had discussed Mr. Singh's termination with him he had been explained all the reasons on which the Respondents had relied in this dispute. Mr. Michaux further stated that no one had been engaged in Mr. Singh's place as they had decided to wait and see what would happen in the future.

The Respondents also called one J. M. Wachira who was a shift supervisor during Mr. Singh's services with the Respondents and he told the Court that he and Mr. Singh had received verbal warnings because of loss of production due to faulty setting up of machines. He added that the practice was that whenever any supervisor was called, all the others were called in also. He said once when the perforation in the toilet rolls was faulty Mr. Singh was warned for that and he used to take 4 to 6 hours in setting the machines. He admitted, however, that Mr. Singh was senior to him and that at one time he was Mr. Singh's assistant.

The Court finds in view of the direct conflict in the evidence on oath as given by the parties' witnesses that it has to rely on other documentary evidence produced by the parties in order to ascertain the truth of the matter. The Investigator has made very emphatic statements in his findings and the Court has no reason whatever to doubt that what he has written therein is

the truth. The reason given by the Respondents for terminating Mr. Singh's services with them to the Investigator is confirmed by Mr. Singh in his evidence in Court. In other words his evidence is corroborated by the then General Manager's statement to the Investigator.

It may very well be that the Respondents expected a much higher standard of performance from Mr. Singh and that they came to a conclusion after six months or so that he would not improve. But then the question arises that if that was the true reason why did they try to hide under the guise of Africanization in terminating his services? The employers are only too well aware that if an employee is incompetent then they have to make no apology in stating so in terminating his services.

The letter of termination which was left at Mr. Singh's house when his father refused to sign for it, just says that "this confirms our discussions of this morning". This, to say the least, is most inconclusive and has resulted in the situation where the Court has two versions before it, i.e. of Mr. Singh and Mr. Michaux as to what was discussed between them at that time.

After careful consideration of the submissions and the evidence that was produced during the hearing and what is stated in the Investigator's findings the Court finds that the Respondents' motive in terminating Mr. Singh's services is indeed questionable in this dispute. Perhaps Mr. Michaux's statement that no replacement had been taken on for Mr. Singh holds the key to this dispute, i.e. perhaps the Respondents wanted to declare Mr. Singh redundant. The Court finds itself in a position where according to the Respondents' own representations there are three distinct possibilities of why Mr. Singh's services were terminated. The first one is that they mistakenly thought that they could Africanize a Kenya citizen or may be they did not know that Mr. Singh was a Kenya citizen. Secondly they wanted to reduce their staff and they decided that Mr. Singh must go, and finally that Mr. Singh was not living up to their expectations.

The Court has come to the conclusion that the Respondents' whole approach in this dispute has been wrong and improper and the Court has decided to find that Mr. Singh's services were terminated without any valid reason and he has suffered a wrongful dismissal in terms of industrial relations practice.

The Claimants told the Court that since April, 1975, Mr. Singh had started operating a business in partnership with his brother-in-law and is employed by that firm at a monthly salary of Sh. 1,500. The Claimants are not pressing for his reinstatement.

The Court notes that the Chief Industrial Relations Officer has recommended that Mr. Singh should be paid the maximum compensation as provided in the Trade Disputes Act for his wrongful dismissal in addition to his terminal benefits, i.e. 12 months' salary. The Court, however, feels that an award of five months' salary would be just and fair in the present dispute and the Court accordingly awards that Mr. Singh should be paid his salary for five months by way of compensation for the wrongful dismissal that he has suffered. This payment is inclusive of one months' notice salary. This would be in addition to any leave payment that he may be entitled to and any other terminal benefits.

Issue in dispute.-Wage increase.

- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and 3M-Mid Africa Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 20th day of January, 1977, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

Award

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 16th October, 1975, was received by the Court on 16th November, 1976, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner. The Labour Commissioner has given the explanation for this rather extraordinary delay and the Court accepts the same.

The parties concluded a recognition agreement on 8th August, 1974, and thereafter embarked on negotiations on a collective agreement covering unionizable employees. This agreement was signed by the parties on 12th February, 1975, and is effective from 1st September, 1974, for a period of four years. Under the aforesaid collective agreement the parties have stipulated consolidated minimum wages for Grades 1A to 1D and Grades 2 and 3. In addition to the minimum rates there is the following provision on increments:—

- "(a) Any employee who was in the service of the company as at 1st September, 1974, and whose consolidated minimum wages on 31st August, 1974, was higher than the consolidated minimum wages fixed for his or her grade shall receive a personal increase of Sh. 50 with effect from 1st September, 1974.
- (b) Future increment shall be as follows:-
 - (i) An employee in the service of the company as at 1st September, 1975, shall be granted an increase of 12½ per cent of his or her August, 1975, rate of pay. The increase shall become effective on 1st September, 1975;
 - (ii) an employee in the service of the company as at 1st September, 1976, shall be granted an increase of 10 per cent of his or her August, 1976, rate of pay. The increase shall become effective on 1st September, 1976;
 - (iii) an employee in the service of the company as at 1st September, 1977, shall be granted an increase of 10 per cent of his or her August, 1977, rate of pay. The increase shall become effective on 1st September, 1977."

The Claimants forwarded a demand to the Respondents on 4th June, 1975, for a 25 per cent increase in order to compensate the workers for the increase in the cost of living. They maintained that the Government had made a declaration setting the unions free to negotiate such increases.

The Respondents rejected this demand on the ground that the collective agreement provided for generous increments and an increment was due to the workers on 1st September, 1975.

The Claimants have argued that the Presidential Decree of 1st May had given the trade unions the green light to reopen negotiations with the employers in the private sector with a view to compensating the workers for the very high cost of living increases.

The Claimants relied on a letter which the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, had written to both COTU and FKE in which he had stated as follows:—

"4. After lengthy discussions, general consensus emerged that there was a need to compensate workers in the country for rises in the cost of living. For that purpose it was the understanding of the Minister that the parties see no objection to the modification of paragraph (x) of the Guidelines so as to allow revision of agreements within one year. This modification would enable paragraph (iv) of the Guidelines in their original form which allowed compensation to workers for erosion of their wages due to rises in the cost of living to be more effective. Following on this point the Minister stated that all agreements entered into before 1st January, 1975, should be revised immediately and that those entered into subsequently should be subject to revision within the period of one year of their coming into force. With the goodwill which was exhibited at the meeting, the Minister hoped that the workers' representatives and employers would co-operate and make this new change in the Guidelines operate successfully."

The Claimants frankly admitted that they had made a mistake in concluding the aforesaid collective agreement and for agreeing to a duration period of four years in these uncertain days of galloping inflation. They pointed out that prior to the collective agreement the workers were entitled to an annual leave allowance of Sh. 200 which had been reduced to Sh. 125 in the collective agreement.

The Claimants stated that the cost of living between September, 1974 to November, 1976, had gone up by 31.7 per cent or 41.8 points.

The Claimants commented on an unusual feature of this dispute which is that out of a total establishment of 40 only 12

are unionizable which indicated to the Claimants that there are far too many managers in this undertaking which is obviously at the expense of other workers.

The Respondents resisted this demand vigorously and stated that there was absolutely no justification whatsoever to tamper or vary an agreement which had been signed as recently as 12th February, 1975, after bearing in mind the total impact of inflation. They reminded the Court that this was the parties' first ever collective agreement and that they were facing severe competition in their main products which is photocopying which was further aggravated by a considerable delay in the processing of import licences by the Government and which necessitated the airfreighting of photocopying papers.

The Respondents also made a point that they had suffered severe setbacks due to their inability for obvious reasons to sell their products in Uganda and Tanzania.

The Respondents gave the salary details of the 12 unionizable employees from the date they joined them indicating how their salaries had progressed. This showed that with effect from September, 1976, the workers were drawing the following salaries:—

The Respondents referred the Court to Cause Nos. 10, 21 and 24 of 1965, 89/66 and 69/74 in support of their argument that the economic conditions in the country and the financial viability of their enterprise did not allow them to afford increases other than those laid down in the collective agreement. They further stated that the working hours per week had been reduced by five hours.

Regarding the allegations made by the Claimants of there being too many managers in their employment the Respondents stated that theirs was a highly technical and scientific field and as such they had to employ professional people and this was the sole reason why the unionizable employees were only 12 in number.

As has been pointed out by the Court in a couple of awards in the recent past the Claimants are technically within their rights in asking for their collective agreement to be revised. The Court notes that the parties concluded a freely and voluntarily negotiated collective agreement on 12th February, 1975, effective from 1st September, 1974, for a period of four years and forwarded a demand for a 25 per cent further increase on 4th June, 1975. This is most extraordinary and has no doubt been prompted by the aforesaid directive from the Ministry of Labour followed by the Presidential Decree of 1st May, 1975.

Notwithstanding the Claimants' right to reopen the collective agreement in the above circumstances the Court has to determine whether or not the circumstances surrounding this dispute i.e., increases already agreed to be given to the workers and the economic position of the Respondents' undertaking warrant a further revision with a view to giving workers added increases on the ones already agreed.

The parties' submissions have been analysed by the Employment Promotion Division and their report shows that the wage earners cost of living has gone up since 1st September, 1974, by 32 per cent up to December, 1976, and it was 1 per cent less up to September, 1976. The wage increases which were given to the employees covered by the agreement at the same time amounted to 30.2 per cent and taking into effect the slight increase in the fringe benefits the total increase in labour costs amounts to 42.5 per cent since the agreement came into operation.

In view of the above even if the Court was to apply the Guidelines as they were in 1975 there appears to be very little room for granting any further increases to the employees concerned. The Court feels that in this dispute because the parties had signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 16th October, 1975, that the workers should get the benefit of the Guidelines in force at that time.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that those workers earning less than Sh. 900 as at September, 1976, should get an additional 5 per cent increase each year to the increases already agreed effective from 1st September, 1976 and 1st September, 1977.
