Applicants should preferably be graduates from recognized universities with Journalism or Sociology as one of their major fields of study or holders of a minimum of East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent, with a minimum of three years' experience in Journalism and news reporting. They must be conversant with both local and international affairs.

Professional experience in Journalism or other fields of writing is a great advantage.

Successful candidates will be required among other things, to sub-edit and compile News Bulletins for both radio and television.

They must be willing to work long shifts and at odd hours, including Sundays and Public Holidays.

Assistant News Editor (News Reader) (One Post) (No. 60/77)

Issue in dispute.—Recognition agreement.

1. The Pan Africa Insurance Co. Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 8th day of February, 1977, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 29th January, 1976, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 9th June, 1976, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute stems from the Claimants' desire to abrogate their recognition of the Respondents and instead become a party to the recognition agreement between the Respondents and the Insurance Employers' Group of F.K.E. (hereinafter referred to as the Group).

In 1973 the Group and the Respondents entered into a collective agreement and at that time the Claimants had expressed their interest in joining the Group. The Respondents, however, were opposed to this idea as they felt that their negotiations with the Claimants had gone a long way and were due to be completed. Eventually the Claimants decided to opt out of the Group agreement.

The parties to this dispute appeared before the Court in Cause No. 73/75 where the Court touched on this point although the issue in dispute was wages as the Claimants had submitted that they were prepared to apply the revised salary scales of the Group agreement to their employees in order to compensate them for the loss of purchasing power. At that time the Court had stated as follows in the last paragraph of the award:—

"In view of the Respondents' undertaking that if the Claimants accepted their membership of the Group the Respondents' employees benefits where they are better than those of the Group employees like medical, annual leave, maternity leave and the element of house allowance would not be reduced the Court would advise the Claimants to revise their approach to this question and study the result to see if their members will not be better off than at present as claimed by the Respondents' spokesman. The current collective agreement expires at the end of this year and the parties will have ample time to go into this matter."

The collective agreement between the parties has expired at the end of last year and the Group agreement is due to expire at the end of this year. The Claimants have once again asked the Respondents to accord them recognition through the Group but the Respondents are strongly opposed to this idea. Their main ground of objection is that in certain essential respects their members enjoy far superior benefits to the ones granted by the Group to their employees and they were not prepared to sacrifice them in order to facilitate the Claimants joining the Group.

The Respondents, while appreciating that there are certain advantages when the employers are organized into groups for the purpose of union recognition and collective bargaining, felt that in this particular dispute they were not prepared to ask the workers to undergo such a big sacrifice like agreeing to a consolidated salary as against the present entitlement of a salary and a separate housing allowance.

The Respondents further stated that they strongly opposed the Claimants' suggestion that the benefits which were superior to the Group agreement should continue in respect of their employees as being personal to them only in other words they would not apply to the new entrants who would automatically be subject to the terms and conditions of employment as laid down in the Group agreement. The Respondents strongly submitted that even if they were to accept the Claimants joining the Group they would certainly not agree to such a condition and would expect the new entrants in the Claimants' employment to enjoy the superior benefits which they had negotiated on behalf of their members.

There are further differences on the question of annual leave, sick leave medical benefits and also on the question of conversion from the Claimants' salary scales to those of the Group.

The Claimants went at length to argue that if they were allowed to join the Group it would help stabilize industrial relations in the insurance industry and pointed out that the workers would be far better off under the provisions of the Group agreement than they were at present as a consolidated house allowance would lead to their benefiting proportionately through the National Social Security Fund and the Provident Fund benefits, and their overtime too would be enhanced.

The Claimants stated that the idea of a consolidated house allowance was preferable as housing was a national problem and that the trade union movement should make appropriate representations to the proper authorities in order to protect the workers from greedy landlords and also for the provision of adequate housing in the country.

The Claimants pointed out that whereas the workers' entitlement to annual leave would be slightly less they would be adequately compensated as they would enjoy considerably higher leave allowance under the Group agreement which provided for Sh. 150 for single subordinate employees and Sh. 1,000 for clerical senior grades. In any case the Claimants stated that they were prepared to let their employees continue enjoying the benefits of their collective agreement with the Respondents in so far as they were superior to those of the Group agreement provided that such benefits would be retained by them on a purely personal basis.

The Claimants in one of their appendices showed calculations of how the workers would immediately benefit moneywise if they joined the Group. The Respondents, however, were quick to point out that these figures were fallacious as the workers would be denied their immediate salary increases which were due to be negotiated and further they would not get their annual increases due to them in October.

The Court has taken note of the fact that there are only six insurance companies who are members of the Group and that there are a few other companies who negotiate with the Respondents outside the Group on an individual basis.

Whereas the Court encourages the formation of groups for the purposes of industrial relations as they no doubt help to create smooth industrial relations over very wide sectors of the industry the Court would not be prepared to order the membership of a group to an employer where the trade union was so vehemently opposed to such a move as in the present case. The Court finds that the Respondents' opposition is justified particularly in view of the fact that their collective agreement has already expired and their negotiations are due to start and whereas the Group agreement will not expire until the end of this year so the workers will definitely lose salary increases. One other very important point which the Court feels should not be allowed to be tampered with is the workers' entitlement to a separate housing allowance in addition to basic salaries as follows:—

	Sh.
"Those in subordinate grade	48
Those in clerical grade II	80
Those in clerical grade I	150
Those in special grade	320."

The Court knows only too well the workers' deep concern on the issue of houses and housing allowance as it is a burning issue as far as the workers in Kenya are concerned. The Court would not like to take a step whereby the workers would be denied their entitlement to a housing allowance where they are already entitled to it. They would surely lose it if the Court were to award in favour of the Claimants in this dispute.

The Court has also given considerable thought to the idea of safeguarding the Claimants' employees' entitlements where they are superior to those of the Group but in view of the fact that there is so much divergence on some of the very important items as aforesaid the Court feels that rather than have an addendum to the Group agreement to cater for it the best thing would be to allow the Claimants and the Respondents to continue negotiating outside the Group.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court rejects the Claimants' demand to withdraw their recognition of the Respondents and the Court directs that the parties should embark immediately on negotiations to revise their collective agreement which has already expired.

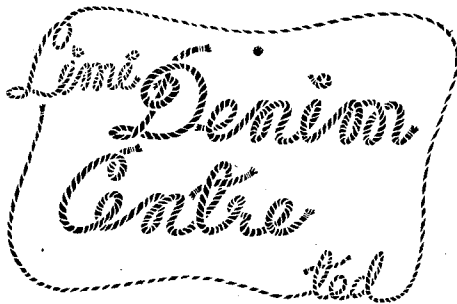
