 - (b) The amount of actual capital available for development with a bankers letter or other evidence of financial status in support;
 - (c) The manner in which it is proposed to raise the balance of the capital required for development, if any;
 - (d) Full details of both residential and/or commercial properties owned by the applicant in Kakamega Municipality.

General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Registered Land Act (Cap. 300) of the Laws of Kenya, and title will be Registered Land Act (Cap. 300).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.
- 5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Clerk to Council within 14 days of notification that his application had been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 3 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time, the Council may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Conditions

- 1. The lessee shall complete the erection of approved buildings on the land within 24 months of the commencement of the term.
- 2. The erection of buildings shall not be commenced until plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for disposing of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawing, elevations and specifications thereof have been approved in writing by the lessor and by any authority whose approval is required by law. Such plans, drawings elevations and specifications shall be submitted for approval in duplicate.

- 3. The lessee shall maintain the buildings and the drainage system in good repair and condition to the satisfaction of the lessor.
- 4. No additions shall be made to the approved buildings without the prior consent in writing of the lessor.
- 5. The land and buildings shall be used for shops and offices only.
- 6. The land shall not be used in any manner which the lessor considers to be dangerous or offensive to the public or the neighbourhood.
 - 7. The land shall not be subdivided.
- 8. The land shall not be charged, sublet, or subleased or transferred without the prior consent of the lessor in writing. No application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 1 has been performed.
- 9. The lessee shall pay all sums that may from time to time be demanded by the lessor in respect of the cost of construction, maintaining, repairing, improving and renewing all roads, drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land.
- 10. The lessee shall be responsible for all rates, taxes, charges or duties of whatever description that may be levied, imposed or charged by the Government or any local government authority upon the land or the buildings.
- 11. The lessee shall on receipt of notice in writing in that behalf from the lessor forthwith adequately fence or hedge the land and shall thereafter maintain such fence or hedge to the satisfaction of the lessor.
- 12. The lessor or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone and telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions either overhead or underground.
- 13. The buildings shall not cover more than 75 per centum of the land.
- 14. The lessor reserves the right to revise the Annual Ground Rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th years of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at the rate of 4 per cent of unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE No. 77 of 1976

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers and

Kenya Farmers Association (Co-operative) Limited

Issue in Dispute: -

Refusal to pay arrears to casual piece rate employees at Mombasa.

- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Kenya Farmers' Association (Co-operative) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 17th day of February, 1977 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 7th September, 1976 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 18th October along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The Respondents used to be members of the Distributive and Allied Trades Association (hereinafter referred to as DATA) until January 1964 when they resigned.

The Claimants have had over the years collective agreements, freely and voluntarily negotiated and others based on Industrial Court awards, with DATA.

In a dispute between the Claimants and DATA the Court made an award in Cause No. 26/75 giving an increase on the rates to be paid to casual employees for the tasks to be performed by them as stated in the award.

The Claimants submitted that even after the Respondents had resigned from DATA they had continued to honour the Claimants' collective agreements with DATA and the awards made by the Industrial Court in their disputes with DATA until the Industrial Court award in Cause No. 26/75. When this award was announced the Claimants had approached the Respondents to implement the same as they had done in the past but this time the Respondents refused to do so.

According to the Claimants' written submission they have asked the Court to make an award as follows requiring the Respondents to pay the arrears thereof:—

- "(a) Fifty-teen per cent increase on casual labour rates effective from 1st May, 1974 resulting from Industrial Court Cause No. 26/75.
- (b) Ten per cent effective from 1st November, 1976 and a further 10 per cent effective from 1st November, 1977 resulting from an agreement reached between DATA and the Respondents."

The Claimants asserted that there was an implied agreement between them and the Respondents that any agreement or award between the Claimants and DATA would be implemented by them in full.

The Respondents stated that they had a separate recognition and negotiating procedure agreement with the Claimants and the terms and conditions of employment in their undertaking were governed by a collective agreement between them and the Claimants which agreement had no provision for casual labour rates of pay. In the absence of a collective agreement between the parties governing rates of pay for casual labour the Respondents have in the past determined at their discretion such rates as they considered appropriate to their undertaking and the nature of work involved.

The Respondents referred the Court to its award in Causes 2/65 and 67/76 in which the Court had stated that the parties could not be bound to honour an agreement which one of them had with a third party unless there was an agreement to that effect

The Respondents, however, explained that they had implementend the Industrial Court award in Cause No. 26/75 in full except that whereas the award was effective from 1st May, 1974 they had implemented it from 1st August, 1974 and the real dispute was in respect of arrears for these three months. They added that since they were not bound by the agreement between the Claimants and DATA they were not responsible for paying the arrears as demanded by the Claimants.

The Respondents informed the Court that they had not yet adjusted their casual labour rates as a result of a latest agreement between the Claimants and DATA giving a 10 per cent

increase each year effective from 1st November, 1976 and 1st November, 1977.

The Court is satisfied that notwithstanding the resignation of the Respondents from DATA way back in January 1964 they had continued to honour and implement the casual labour rates negotiated between the Claimants and DATA in respect of their casual labourers in Mombasa and that they further implemented the Industrial Court awards in Cause Nos. 38/69 and 12/73. In fact the Respondents did not challenge the Claimants' statement that the Respondents had paid arrears to their casual employees as a result of the award in Cause No. 12/73.

This being so, the Court finds that there is considerable merit in the Claimants' submission that there is an implied agreement between them and the Respondents that the Respondents would accept the result of their negotiations with DATA and any Court awards made in disputes between them.

The Court notes that the Respondents admit that they were prepared to pay the prevailing rates to their casual employees in Mombasa and the Court further accepts the Claimants' submission that 75 per cent of the warehouses which give work to the casual employees in Mombasa are covered by the DATA agreement. It is obvious that the parties desire a uniformity of rates to be paid for the tasks performed by the casual labourers through their serangs.

In the present dispute the Claimants have not given the details of the arrears that they are claiming and in fact did not even tell the Court that the Respondents had implemented the Industrial Court award in Cause No. 26/75 with effect from 1st August, 1974. They, however, did not repudiate the Respondents' submission on this point.

As far as the two Industrial Court disputes are concerned which the Respondents have quoted in their written submission the Court finds that due to the peculiar circumstances of the arrangement in the present dispute the Court remarks made in those disputes do not apply to this one.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that the Respondents' casual employees who performed the tasks between 1st May, 1974 and 31st July, 1974 are entitled to be paid arrears to be calculated on the raies awarded by the Industrial Court in Cause No. 26/75. The Court appreciates the difficulty that might arise in trying to trace some of the casual labourers and the Court therefore directs that this award should be implemented under the supervision of the Provincial Labour Officer, Coast Province.

The Court would strongly advise the parties that if they want to revise the practice which they had followed from 1964 of implementing the DATA collective agreements and awards then they should take steps to formally recognize that position and negotiate as and when necessary rates to be paid to their casual piece rates employees at Mombasa so that they do not get involved in a similar dispute again.

Wrongful termination of Mr. Paul Njenga Mwangi.

- 1. The Kenya Management Staff Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Silentnight (Kenya) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 15th and 16th February, 1977 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath—

Claimants: -

P. N. Mwangi

Respondents: -

- J. K. G. Aikman
- D. Cadwallader
- B. NyagaR. Muchiri

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 15th June, 1976 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 2nd December along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Mr. P. N. Mwangi started working for the Respondents as an accounts clerk on 5th February, 1974 at a salary of Sh. 1,300 p.m. His services were terminated on 20th November. 1975 by which time he was earning Sh. 1,650 p.m. His letter of termination read as follows:-

"Further to your conversation with Mr. D. Cadwallader, Mr. B. M. Nyagah and myself, this is to confirm that your services are be terminated with effect from 20th November, 1975. Please regard this as formal notice to terminate your services.

On 27th February, 1975 he was paid a sum of Sh. 2,479 which included one month's salary in lieu of notice.

The Claimants reported a trade dispute on his behalf to the Minister for Labour. The dispute was accepted and an Investigator was appointed. The following findings and recommendation were conveyed to the parties:-

"Findings

The Management assertion that Mr. Mwangi's services were terminated for his refusal to accept Mr. Nyagah's promotion cannot be understood. There is no suggestion that Mr. Mwangi at any time refused to accept Mr. Nyagah's authority over him to obey a lawful order from the latter as his supervisor.

Mr. Mwangi's problems appear to have started soon after his election as a union representative and one is led to be-lieve, in the absence of any evidence, that the Management resented his activities in that field.

In the circumstances, I find that termination of his services was wrongful.

Recommendation

I do not consider reinstatement appropriate in this case because the relations between Mr. Mwangi and the Management have been strained beyond mending. I therefore recommend payment of the equivalent of three months' salary in compensation for wrongful termination of employment. This should be in addition to other terminal benefits such as leave pay, notice and salary for days worked."

The Claimants stated that Mr. Mwangi who was their shop-steward in the Respondents' undertaking was victimized for his membership of their Association. They pointed out that from the time he joined the Respondents until about July, 1975 Mr. Mwangi had received no verbal or written warnings. In July, 1975 when Mr. Mwangi had become their member his troubles started and he was served with several letters of warning in a matter of a few days which culminated in a conspiracy on the part of the Respondents in building up a story that Mr. Mwangi had refused to obey the order of his superior, one Mr. Nyagah. The Respondents had used this as an excuse in terminating Mr. Mwangi's services whereas the real reason was that Mr. Mwangi had been asked by the Managing Director of the Respondents to resign from the Claimants' membership and to persuade those had joined them also to do likewise and when Mr. Mwangi had refused to do so he was sacked.

The Claimants asked Mr. Mwangi to give evidence on oath and he denied any knowledge of an incident which is alleged to have taken place on 18th November, 1975 when he is supposed to have disobeyed instructions given by Mr. Nyagah.

The Claimants also made other very serious allegations against the Respondents that they were against Africanization policy of the Kenya Government and were using dubious means to frustrate it. In support of this they produced certain unsigned letters but which were dated 26th March, 1973 and 30th January, 1974 written by the Respondents' then Managing Director to the Respondents' parent company in U.K.

In view of the fact that these letters were written during a period when Mr. Mwangi was not in the employment of the Respondents the Court finds them to be irrelevant to the dispute before it.

The Respondents while agreeing that Mr. Mwangi was a good worker and that he had not received any warnings up to July, 1974 vigorously denied that he had been victimized for his trade union activities by joining the Claimants and fighting for their recognition by the Respondents in his capacity as a shopsteward.

The Respondents stated that the had decided that the post of the Chief Accountant in their undertaking would be Africanized and as such they had decided to give additional responsibilities to Mr. Nyagah who was senior to Mr. Mwangi and who they thought was the right material to get promotion in due course. With this in view they had directed all the other staff to take their instructions from Mr. Nyagah but unfortunately Mr. Mwangi did not like this and was very upset.

The Respondents stated that Mr. Nyagah had prepared a daily work schedule which had been approved by Mr. Aikman, the Chief Accountant, and on 2nd October, 1975 after Mr. Mwangi had discussed this matter with the Managing Director he had written the following letter to him-

"I refer to your comment and our verbal conversation on 1st October, 1975 in your office and would be interested to hear from you at your earliest the following before you give

- 1. Why should I be supervised by B. M. Nyaga and for the last $1\frac{1}{2}$ year he was not supervising me?
- 2. Does it mean that I can't do my work without a Supervisor and what kind of work I can't do.
- 3. What is the work of the Chief Accountant?

Hoping to hear from you soon."

The Respondents further explained that Mr. Mwangi was given two letters of warning between the period 10th and 15th October with another letter already having been written to him on 9th October. These letters were served on Mr. Mwangi because he had refused to carry out the instructions given to him by Mr. Nyagah.

The Respondents through their four witnesses proved the following statement by all four of them and which appeared as an appendix to their submission:

"On the 18th day of November, 1975 Paul N. Mwangi was asked by Mr. Nyagah before 5 p.m. to fill in the 10 o'clock file with the cash paid on that day but he refused. On being questioned by Mr. Cadwallader he said that he is not prepared to take any instructions from Mr. Nyagah.

We confirm that the above statement was made by Mr. P. N. Mwangi in my presence.

The Respondents asked the Court to find that their action under the circumstances was proper and Mr. Mwangi's termination should be upheld.

The Court finds that the Claimants have tried to take advantage of the struggle that was going on between them and the Respondents on the question of their recognition in order to prove that Mr. Mwangi had been victimized for his trade union activities on their behalf. The fact of the matter is that while on the one hand the Claimants were seeking recognition from the Respondents after having enrolled about twelve of the Respondents' employees into their membership Mr. Mwangi was also very upset at finding that a fellow worker, Mr. Nyagah, had been promoted above him. He displayed his dissatisfaction by refusing to obey instructions given to him by Mr. Nyagah which had finally culminated in the incident of 18th November, 1975.

The Court cannot accept at all the Claimants' assertion that there was a conspiracy on the part of the management to build up a story of Mr. Mwangi's refusal to obey Mr. Nyagah's instructions in order to get rid of him. The Court is satisfied that Mr. Mwangi did refuse to obey instructions given to him by Mr. Nyagah as alleged by the Respondents because if there was any question of victimization of the workers for having joined the Claimants then surely the Respondents would have picked on Mr. Nyagah also who was also an active member of the Claimants and who had written a letter showing his open support for the Claimants to the Managing Director on 28th July, 1976. This was the time when the Managing Director had given his own personal views to their employees on the advantages and disadvantages of junior management joining a trade union. In view of this the Court is not prepared to accept the Claimants' allegation that Mr. Mwangi had been victimized for his trade union activities.

During the hearing the Court noticed that the Claimants were very critical of the Respondents for not recognizing them and their attitude in this respect is understandable but unfortunately they allowed themselves to be clouded by this matter and were not able to see in its proper light the shortcomings and failings of Mwangi who during the material times was engaged in his own personal rivalry with Mr. Nyagah.

The Respondents also raised the question of whether or not Mr. Mwangi could be a member of the Claimants but that again is a matter on which the Court is not inclined to go into in this dispute. If they have any complaints regarding the enrol-ment by the Claimants into their membership of some of their employees who they feel could not belong to them then they

should make their representations to the Deputy Registrar of Trade Unions as invited by him in a letter dated 26th January, 1977 addressed to the Federation of Kenya Employers.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that the Ministry of Labour Investigator either seriously misled himself on the issue in dispute or he was not presented with full evidence particularly regarding the incident of 18th November, 1975 when Mr. Mwangi refused to obey instructions given to him by Mr. Nyagah. The Court notes that the Claimants had based their demand for three-month compensation for wrongful termination of Mr. Mwangi as recommended by the Ministry of Labour in addition to his other terminal benefits.

The Court has also carefully considered the point made by the Claimants regarding the dates on which Mr. Nyagah was given supervisory duties but the Court feels that at the material time Mr. Nyagah was Mr. Mwangi's superior and Mr. Mwangi had been aware of it along with the other staff in the accounts department.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court rejects the Claimants' demand.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the Kenya Gazette, Supplements, etc.—

- (1) Kenya Gazette contains notices of a general nature and which do not affect legislation, and may be submitted direct to the Government Printer.
- (2) Legislative Supplement contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government, and must be submitted through the Office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) Bill Supplement contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) Act Supplement contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D-Kenya Gazette

D.41. (1) Communications for the Kenya Gazette should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
