#### VACANCIES

#### Note

Incremental credits will be granted to successful candidates who are not civil servants for approved previous experience provided the maximum salary is not exceeded. They will also be eligible for benefits and privileges enjoyed by civil servants in accordance with existing Government Regulations.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Works:

Superintending Engineer (Mechanical) (Building Services)
(One Post) (No. 67/77)

Salary scale.—£2,010 to £2,514 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Candidates must be Registered Mechanical Engineers and must be Members of the Institution of Engineers (Kenya) having at least five (5) years' experience in the design, installation and maintenance of engineering services in most or all of the following:—

Hospitals, airports, water-works, office and conference complexes, educational institutions, public buildings and large centralized catering and laundry units.

#### VACANCIES—PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION—(Contd.)

Candidates must have had considerable administrative experience associated with engineering activities and must have the ability and personality to control and direct a group of professional engineers and technicians.

Duties.—The Superintending Engineer will be directly responsible both professionally and administratively to the Chief Electrical Engineer or to his deputy for one of the following:—

- (a) The design and installation of mechanical engineering services within Government buildings and institutions.
- (b) The installation and maintenance of mechanical engineering services within Government buildings and institutions, the technical direction of professional engineers and senior technicians heading maintenance sections in provincial maintenance groups, and the control and direction of the Chief Fire Prevention Officer, and the Boiler Inspector.

A particular responsibility of the Superintending Engineer will be the supervision of the in-service training of technicians and the personal guidance of Assistant Engineers.

Senior Building Programmer (One Post) (No. 68/77)

Salary scale.—K£1,614 to £2,082 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants require a University Degree in Architecture, Civil Engineering, Building Economics, Business Administration, Economics, Land Economics or a Higher National Diploma in Building and Civil Engineering. The successful candidate should have a good knowledge and experience in all aspects of the building industry including planning and design through contracting and construction stages. He must be able to express himself well in both written and spoken English.

The Senior Building Programmer shall be directly responsible to the Chief Superintending Architect to advise the Chief Architect and other senior management officers on the overall planning, control and implementation of the Annual Works Programme. He will co-ordinate, direct and supervise the work performed by the staff of the Forward Planning Group including two Building Development Officers and five Building Development Programmers. These responsibilities will be performed initially under the guidance and training provided by a team of experienced C.I.D.A. personnel. On completion of the training period this officer will direct the Forward Planning Group.

Superintendent (Mechanical) (Seven Posts) (No. 69/77)

Salary scale.—K£1,350 to £1,794 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Candidates should have served a recognized apprenticeship in Mechanical Engineering followed by several years' experience on heavy plant a part of which should have been in a senior supervisory capacity. They should have a knowledge of workshop costing, stores procedures, machine shop operation and general vehicle valuation. They should also have experience of maintenance and operation of heavy earthmoving equipment such as bulldozers, road rollers, air compressors and a knowledge of vehicles. Preference will be given to applicants with at least School Certificate standard of education.

Superintendent (Mechanical/Electrical) (One Post) (No. 70/77)

Salary scale.—K£1,350 to £1,794 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Candidates must be between twenty-five (25) and fourty-five (45) years of age and should be in possession of East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent. They must possess the City and Guilds Electrical Engineering Technician Certificate or its equivalent followed by at least five (5) years' practical experience, three (3) of which must have been in a supervisory position in one or more of the following:—

- (a) Preparation of design drawings, specifications and estimates for electrical installations in vehicles, plants, equipments and diesel generating sets.
- (b) Installation, operation and maintenance of electrical systems in vehicles, plants, equipments and electrical generating sets including HT and LT distribution services.

(c) The installation, operation and maintenance of refrigeration and air conditioning, plants, cookers, water heaters and general domestic appliances.

They must possess a thorough working knowledge of current regulations for high and low tension electrical installations. Preference will be given to those with a thorough knowledge of diesel and petrol engine maintenance. A knowledge of electronics will also be an advantage.

Draughtsman (Structural) Grade II (One Post) (No. 71/77)

Salary scale.—K£1,086 to £1,446 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Candidates should have the East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent. They should possess the City and Guilds Ordinary Diploma in Building or Civil Engineering, or recognized equivalent and should have had a minimum of two years' experience in a civil engineer's or architect's drawing office in the preparation of civil engineering works, including estate roads, car parks, sewage and surface water drainage schemes. Candidates without these qualifications who are already employed within the Ministry of Works who have had at least four years' experience on structural engineering and civil engineering drawing and detailing, including design of sewers and roads will be eligible for consideration for the post. Applicants must be neat and accurate draughtsmen capable of producing complete schemes for minor sewage disposal and road works. They should be capable of carrying out elementary surveying and levelling in relation to the preparation of such schemes.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Labour:

Senior Training Officer (Two Posts) (a) Mechanical, (b) Building (No. 72/77)

Salary scale.—K£1,614 to £2,082 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be in possession of a Higher Technical Diploma or equivalent in either Mechanical, Electrical or Building Engineering followed by at least three years' practical, industrial or teaching experience. Administrative or organizing experience in addition, will be an advantage.

Duties will include organizing and supervising all aspects of training in an Industrial Training Centre on both the administrative and technical sides. Advising employers on all matters relating to industrial training and effectively administering the provisions of the Industrial Training Act.

Vacancy in the Ministry of Natural Resources, Department of Mines and Geology:

Senior Inspector of Explosives (One Post) (No. 73/77)

Salary scale.—K£1,350 to £1,794 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be in possession of a diploma of technology from a recognized institution with a thorough understanding of commercial explosives or from those with other approved equivalent experience. Applicants must have served in the grade of Inspector of Explosives (Job Group "H") for a minimum of three years and must have demonstrated a thorough understanding of the Explosives Act and the Explosives (Blasting Explosives) Rules and have a high degree of dedication and responsibility.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Chief Inspector of Explosives and will be responsible for the coordination of the work of the Inspectors of Explosives presently based in Nairobi and Mombasa and will ensure the efficient functioning of the Explosives Inspectorate, the safety and security of commercial explosives and the administration of the Explosives Act and all matters relating to the import, export, transport, storage, use and all forms of handling of commercial explosives both administratively and in the field. He advises the public, quarry operators and other users of commercial explosives on the correct method and legal use of explosives and investigates accidents involving explosives. He will also carry out field inspections of quarries, all places where explosives are used and explosives magazines, etc.

#### VACANCIES-PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION-(Contd.)

Vacancies in the Ministry of Finance and Planning:

Science Secretary (Four Posts) (No. 74/77)

Salary scale.—K£2,010 to £2,514 or K£2,514 to £3,036 or K£2,928 to £3,540 (depending on qualifications and experience). PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

The candidate should be a graduate scientist with good knowledge and experience of his science in research and experimental development and/or the related scientific and technological activities, and interested in the application of his science to socio-economic development. He should have a minimum of five years' service in the relevant scientific fields.

Successful candidates will be responsible to the Secretary to the National Council for Science and Technology and their duties will include: Co-ordination and scientific evaluation of the working papers for the Council, recording and processing of the related committee work, preparation of technical papers, establishment of the scientific and potential of Kenya and its analysis, review of all scientific and technological activities, and liaison with those concerned in the Government, Higher Education and private sectors plus scientific community in general and such other activities as the Secretary to the Council may decide. The posts cover the scientific groups in the Natural and Physical Sciences, Agricultural and Allied Sciences, Industrial (Engineering and Technology) Sciences and Medical Sciences.

Planning Secretary (One Post) (No. 75/77)

Salary scale.—K£2,010 to £2,514 or K£2,514 to £3,036 or K£2,928 to £3,540 p.a. (depending on qualifications and experience). PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

The candidate should be a graduate scientist, with a working knowledge of social sciences and experience in data collection, processing and analysis. Experience in planning and operational research desirable, but not essential. He should have a minimum of five years' service in the relevant fields.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Secretary to the National Council for Science and Technology and his duties will include: Technical preparation of the overall planning documents for the National Science and Technology plan and its concomitant budget, management of the scientific and technological potential unit of the Secretariat and the development of its methodologies, recording and processing of the related committee-work, co-ordination plus scientific evaluation of working papers for the Council, review of the scientific and technological activities in the social sciences and liaison with those concerned in the Government, Higher Education and private sectors plus other activities as the Secretary to the Council may decide.

Administrative Officer (One Post) (No. 76/77)

Salary scale.—K£1,350 to £1,794 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

The candidate should have the qualification as normally required for the grade of administrative officer, including a university degree. The candidate should preferably have experience of Government administrative and financial procedures and administration on high level technical institutes is desirable.

#### THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 64 of 1976 (2)

Parties:-

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers

Issue in dispute:-

Termination of services of Mr. Joshua Odira Adongo.

1.The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Bank of Baroda shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 10th and 11th February and 1st March, 1977 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath—

Claimants: -

Mr. Joshua O. Odongo.

Respondents:-

Mr. A. V. Chavda.

Mr. P. O. Odera.

#### AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 9th July, 1976 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 16th August along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Mr. J. O. Adongo's services were terminated by Respondents on 29th April, 1975 in accordance with the provisions of clause 4 (d) of the collective agreement between the parties by payment of one month's salary in lieu of notice. Mr. Adongo had worked with the Respondents since August 1973 and at the time of his termination he was working as a paying out cashier, according to the Respondents for about twenty days but according to the Claimants he had worked in that position for fourteen days only.

Prior to that, however, he had worked as a receiving cashier for nearly a year.

The reason for the termination of his services is that on 26th April, 1975 which was a Saturday, he had paid out a sum of Sh. 120,000 to an unknown Asian on a forged withdrawal form from an acount from one of the Savings Bank Accounts. The Respondents alleged that on that particular Saturday whereas his normal requirement per day varied between Sh. 50,000 to Sh. 80,000 in order to cover his payments across the counter, he had requested the chief cashier to give him a large amount of cash Sh. 211,000. He requested that Sh. 180,000 out of this amount should be given to him in Sh. 100 notes. By about 10 a.m. although he had paid out only a sum of Sh. 9,545 against 22 instruments leaving him a balance of Sh. 201,455 he asked for and was given an additional amount of Sh. 30,000 before making payment against the forged withdrawal voucher for Sh. 120,000.

The Respondents alleged that the voucher against with Sh. 120,000 was paid by Mr. Adongo to a person, if there was any such person, was not received and processed by the authorized bank officials at any time on that Saturday morning or at any other time.

Mr. Adongo was arrested by the police and was charged for a criminal offence but was acquitted by a Resident Magistrate on 18th September, 1975.

The Claimants then took up the matter on his behalf and the dispute was investigated by a Labour Officer whose findings and recommendation were conveyed by the Chief Industrial Relations Officer on 17th June, 1976:—

"Findings

There is no dispute that the Bank sustained a substantial loss of Sh. 120,000. Mr. Adongo did not deny that he paid out the said sum of money to a customer on the 26th April, 1975. According to the Bank, a Mr. Sumant A. Desai who was a Bank's customer did not withdraw the stated sum of Sh. 120,000. In follows therefore, that Sh. 120,000 was paid through forgery. It is unfortunate for the Bank that the culprit escaped unidentified.

The reason why Mr. Adongo found it fit to pay out such a large amount without the presence of either the Accountant or the Manager against the Bank's regulation leaves much to be desired. Mr. Adongo was familiar with the Bank's procedure for payment of cash. In this case it appears that on

the material day or time, he did not take the necessary precautions in order to ensure that the money was paid to the right customer.

Recommendation

Having gone through the submissions from both parties I am satisfied that the action by the management to terminate the services of Mr. Adongo was reasonable and justified."

The Claimants were not happy with these findings and have brought the dispute to the Industrial Court mainly on the ground that since Mr. Adongo was acquitted by the Resident Magistrate it proved that the Respondents had not investigated properly the loss of Sh. 120,000 and were therefore wrong in terminating the services of Mr. Adongo.

The Claimants alleged that Mr. Adongo had not been properly trained by the Respondents before being entrusted with the job of a paying out cashier and that the procedure which he is alleged not to have followed in fact was not even followed by the members of the management themselves particularly in that the management had not implemented the disc system as was required in the standing instructions to staff working in cash department. Further the manager and the accountant instead of giving their approvals under their full signatures had opted for a system of initials only. In these circumstances Mr. Adongo having received a voucher in the normal manner there was nothing to indicate to him at the time that it was forged or that there was something irregular about it.

The Claimants made much play about a payment of Sh. 119,000 a couple of days earlier by Mr. Adongo to one Mr. Patel across the counter and cited this particular incident in support of their argument that Mr. Adongo had not been told that such large amounts had to be paid to customers either in the manager's or the accountant's office and not across the counter

The Respondents stated that Mr. Adongo had been given the instructions given to staff working in the cash department by the chief cashier who confirmed in Court on oath that he had done so and that accordingly Mr. Adongo was aware of the procedure for cash payments as follows:—

- "1. That withdrawal voucher should have been first posted to the debit of the customer's account or the ledger keeper ought to have certified adequacy of the balance in the account by writing the word "O.K." at the top of the withdrawal voucher under his initials in case it was not posted before payment;
- It should have been entered in the Savings Bank Department's payment scroll and sent to him with the scroll;
- Pass book of the relative account ought to have been made and sent with the withdrawal voucher;
- As the amount involved was large, payment should have been made in the Manager's office or on the Accountant's table under their supervision;
- 5. The customer should have been properly identified before payment was made to him."

The Respondents stated that the payment of Sh. 119,000 to one Mr. Patel was made across the counter as Mr. Patel was ma hurry, and pointed out that the manager, Mr. Chavda, was standing very near to Mr. Adongo supervising the payment of this amount. Mr. Chavda confirmed this on oath.

The Court notes that under instructions to staff working in cash department under the heading of "payment of cash" paragraph 10 reads as follows:—

"All payments for Sh. 10,000 and over should be notified to the Chief Cashier and such payments should be made under the supervision of the Chief Cashier or the Cashier In-Charge. The Chief Cashier should initial the relative entry in the Cashier's Payment Scroll."

Moreover, these instructions confirm the procedure as put forward by the Respondents for paying out of amounts from savings banks as set out hereinabove.

There is no doubt that if the management had paid a little more attention to the unusual behaviour of Mr. Adongo on that Saturday morning they might have prevented the loss of Sh. 120,000. The chief cashier admitted that he found it rather strange that Mr. Adongo should request for cash far above his normal requirement of between Sh. 50,000 to Sh. 80,000 and further that he asked for Sh. 180,000 out of the amount demanded by him in Sh. 100 notes. Further by about 10 a.m. he was given another Sh. 30,000. These two things are suspicious enough if somebody had been attentive but unfortunately no action was taken by the management to keep Mr. Adongo under surveillance. This does not however, along with non-implementation of the standing instructions in a couple of respects as stated above, absolve Mr. Adongo from discharging his duties honestly with due and proper care.

The Court is satisfied that the voucher against which Mr. Adongo claims to have paid out the sum of Sh. 120,000 across the counter to an Asian was forged as it bore a forged signature of Mr. S. A. Desai and forged initials of the accountant and the manager. There is another error on that voucher where instead of Sh. 120,000 being written only Sh. 12,000 are written.

The Court is satisfied that Mr. Adongo was aware of the procedure in respect of withdrawals from Savings Bank Accounts in that a seven days' notice was necessary and that the relevant pass book had to accompany the withdrawal form.

The Court further finds that Mr. Adongo was aware or should have been aware of the instructions to staff working in cash department as he had been given a copy of the same

Even if the Court was to give Mr. Adongo the benefit of doubt that he could not have had any suspicion that the voucher in question was forged, the most serious omission on his part in the performance of his duties still remains that he paid out such a large sum of Sh. 120,000 in cash across the counter to a person without properly establishing his identity.

The Court finds that the fact that one payment of Sh. 119,000 was paid across the counter to a customer did not mean that all such big payments were paid across the counter. The Court accepts the explanation of the manager regarding this particular transaction and is satisfied that the standing instructions as conveyed to staff working in cash department were that all payments for such large amounts are generally made in the manager's or the accountant's office. The large payments are between Sh. 25,000 to Sh. 30,000 and above.

The Court is fully aware that Mr. Adongo was acquitted of a criminal offence in respect of this incident and the Court is not sitting as a Court of appeal on the Resident Magistrate's judgement. The Court is simply concerned to determine whether or not Mr. Adongo performed his duties honestly with proper and due care and in accordance with the standing instructions and procedure.

The Court would also like to make it clear that despite the spate of frauds and forgeries that are taking place in the banking industry resulting in the loss of millions of shillings the Court applies its mind very carefully to the case of each person whose dispute comes before it in order to determine and find out if that person was really involved in any manner in the loss of alleged amounts due to his negligence or gross carelessness.

In this particular case after a careful consideration of all the submissions and the evidence given by the witnesses the Court is satisfied that Mr. Adongo did not perform his duties properly and that he was indeed grossly careless which resulted in the Respondents losing a sum of Sh. 120,000. The Court has carefully considered the Claimants' plea that the benefit of doubt should be given to Mr. Adongo and that he should be reinstated and given the maximum compensation under the Trade Disputes Act. The Court, however, has no doubt over this matter and is fully convinced that Mr. Adongo was guilty of gross carelessness on Saturday 26th April, 1975 in the performance of his duties as a result of which his employers lost such a big amount. The Court accordingly rejects the Claimants' demand and finds that Mr. Adongo's services were properly terminated.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE No. 83 of 1976

Parties:

Cooper Motor Corporation (K) Ltd.

Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers

Issue in dispute:-

Proposed redundancy of 20 employees of Cooper Motor Corporation (K) Limited.

1. Cooper Motor Corporation (K) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 23rd day of February, 1977 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Claimants called Mr. A. H. Beddoes to give evidence on oath.

#### AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 24th September, 1976 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 27th November, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute has stemmed from the Claimants' desire to declare 15 of their employees redundant although originally they had requested the Respondents to agree to proposed redundancies of 20 of their employees. The Claimants stated that they had found jobs for five of the original 20 leaving 15 whom they wish to declare redundant as they have no work for them.

This dispute is connected with the take over by the Claimants of the sales and repair division of Leyland Albion (E.A.) Ltd. in July 1974. The Claimants informed the Court that the total number of employees of Leyland Albion (E.A.) Ltd. was 118 who were all paid their redundancy benefits by Leyland Albion (E.A.) Ltd. From the date the Claimants took them over they became their employees and continued to work in the old Leyland Albion (E.A.) Ltd. premises in Nairobi. On completion of the Claimants' heavy commercial vehicle part of the complex in March, 1976, all these employees were transferred to the Claimants' workshop at Chepkerio Road. It then became apparent to the Claimants after they had assessed their staff requirements that they would have to carry out redundancies in the region of 35 to 40. However, after a further reorganization they reduced these redundancies to 20 out of which they have absorbed another five leaving 15 in respect of whom they are seeking the Court's approval to declare them redundant.

The Claimants called their service director, Mr. A. H. Beddoes, to give evidence on oath and Mr. Beddoes explained how the necessity to declare these 15 employees redundant had arisen. He confirmed the facts as stated hereinabove and added that although they were very much concerned with the unemployment situation in the country unfortunately there were just no jobs for these 15 employees. He stated that at present their employees in their Chepkerio Road workshop on an average had an idle time to an extent of 4 per cent of the available time on the workshop floor and if all their undertakings in the whole country were taken into account then the idle time was 28 per cent. This was due to lack of work in their workshops because of the severe competition they had to encounter at the hands of what he called "bamboo" garages. He accepted, however, that the redundancies were not necessitated due to any financial difficulties.

The Respondents very strongly resisted this application by stating that it should not be difficult for one of the largest organizations in the motor industry to find jobs for 15 of their employees. They reminded the Court that the Guidelines which have been issued by the Minister for Finance to the Industrial Court were intended to help create new jobs and whereas the employers took full advantage of the Guidelines restricting wage increases they did not respond by creating new jobs and instead thought of ways and means of reducing the existing number of people in their employment.

The Respondents asked the Court to note that the Claimants have between the period November, 1972 to February, 1973 declared nearly 202 of their employees redundant for various reasons. They added that the Claimants should now be told that they could not carry on declaring their workers redundant.

The Respondents pointed out that the Claimants have at no time asked for this redundancy exercise on financial grounds as they enjoy a very healthy state of profits and their quotations on Stock Exchange were amongst the highest in the country.

The Respondents warned that the biggest security risk in the country at present was unemployment and unless something was done to stop it, it would be difficult to know where it might all end.

The Respondents informed the Court that the Claimants had since last four or five years dispensed with their watchmen and given their duties to Securicor Guards to whom they paid far more than they used to pay their own watchmen.

The Court appreciates that the 15 employees in respect of whom the Claimants are seeking approval to declare redundant are part of the 118 employees whom the Claimants took over from Leyland Albion (E.A.) Ltd. when they acquired their sales and repair division. But the fact remains that from or about July, 1974 they are all Claimants' employees and their length of service with them in the case of majority of these workers involved is between 2 and  $2\frac{1}{2}$  years; there is only one who has got one year's service. Out of the 15 workers involved six are watchmen, five are mechanics and four are assistant mechanics.

Although the Claimants stated that the redundancy problem accasioned by their taking over part of Leyland Albion (E.A.) Ltd. operations also affected five senior executive management staff it emerged during the hearing through the evidence of Mr. Beddoes that 3 of them had resigned and left the country and the other two had been transferred to Leyland Albion assembly plant at Thika. So in fact the axe of redundancy did not fall on the management at all.

The Court has stated in the past that when workers lose their jobs it is a very unpleasant fact of life for obvious reasons and the Court has to be very careful before approving any redundancies. The Court wants to be fully satisfied that the redundancies would in the long run be in the interest of the undertaking and that they are fully necessary before giving its approval.

The Court is satisfied that the duties of watchmen since last three or four years have been performed by Securicor Guards which Mr. Beddoes stated was mainly due to administrative reasons and that the six watchmen involved in this dispute had really no work to do and they were just hanging about with the Securicor Guards, remaining idle all the time.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has decided to give approval to the redundancies of six watchmen only. The application to declare five mechanics and four assistant mechanics redundant is not approved and is rejected.

The aforesaid employees in respect of whom approval has been given should be declared redundant in accordance with the relevant provisions of the collective agreement between the parties and they should be given all their dues and entitlement as specified therein.
