CAUSE NO. 87 OF 1976

Parties: -

Kenya Chemical Workers' Union and

Nicholas Laboratories (E.A.) Limited

Issues in dispute:-

- Minimum rates of pay and general wage increases to all unionizable employees of the company.
- 2. Annual paid leave.
- 3. Leave travelling allowance.
- 4. Effective date of the agreement.
- 1. The Kenya Chemical Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Nicholas Laboratories (E.A.) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 18th day of March, 1977 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 3rd November, 1976 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 21st December along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute has arisen in the course of the revision of a collective agreement which the parties had voluntarily negotiated and signed on 17th July, 1974 which agreement was effective from 1st January, 1974 for a period of two years from that date.

The relevant clause on effective date and duration of agreement reads as follows:

"This agreement shall be effective as from the 1st day of January, 1974 and it shall remain in force for a period of two years. Thereafter the agreement shall continue in force until it is amended. Provided that the party desiring to amend it gives one month's notice in writing giving in detail the amendments so required."

The Claimants forwarded their demands for revising it to the Respondents on 15th December, 1975. The parties had the first meeting on 3rd March, 1976 followed by another meeting on 11th March. The parties prior to these two meetings made attempts to meet earlier but due to one reason or the other the meeting did not take place. During these meetings a large measure of agreement was reached between them and 15 items out of the 18 tabled were resolved.

The Claimants reported the dispute to the Minister for Labour on 26th March, 1976 and conciliation proceedings having failed to resolve this dispute it is now before the Court.

The Claimants were very critical of the Respondents in that they had failed to approach the negotiations seriously in that they had first made an offer of a wage increase of 7 per cent which offer they had later increased to 10 per cent for each year of a new two year agreement. The Claimants stated that the parties should be discouraged from using the Industrial Court as a forum for negotiations and that they should resort to the

Industrial Court only after failing to resolve their disputes through serious negotiations at the parties' own level and during conciliation.

The Claimants argued that there was no reason why the Respondents should pay wages any lower than their other three main competitors in the country i.e. Boots, Glaxo and Sterling International Ltd. which firms are in the same line of business and had to sell their goods in the same markets and had to import the same raw materials as the Respondents. These firms had minimum consolidated wages of Sh. 679/50, 596 and 550/15 as against the Respondents' current consolidated minimum wage of Sh. 425 p.m.

The Claimants also commented on the Guidelines issued by the Minister for Finance to the Industrial Court and argued that the Court should work out the compensation to be given to the workers by working out two thirds of the increase in cost of living that has taken place during the relevant period without first deducting the so called compensation which the workers may have received. The Claimants stated that from January 1974 to February 1977 the cost of living had gone up by 63.3 per cent and even if full 25 per cent which the workers had received in the previous two year agreement was deducted from this amount it still left 38.3 per cent which was due to the workers which unfortunately had again already eroded due to the latest increase in prices of consumer goods announced by the Government. These increases would amount to an 18.5 per cent although the Government statisticians maintain that the increase would be in the region of 9½ per cent only.

The Claimants strongly argued that the Respondents were paying their employees very low wages in this particular industry and as such it was the Court's duty to ensure that the workers were granted a wage which was above the subsistence level.

The Claimants asked the Court to reject the Respondents' claims of the loss of market and loss of profit in the absence of any documentary evidence. In any case they wanted the Respondents to produce the figures of their annual turnover of their products as the Claimants felt that the sale of their products had increased despite the loss of trade in Uganda and Tanzania.

Regarding the annual paid leave and leave travelling allowance the Claimants asked the Court to make an award on these two benefits in line with the agreement of Boots, and Glaxo which the Court had registered in order to bring uniformity in the industry.

On the effective date of the agreement the Claimants submitted that at the most they could be penalized only for one month which would mean that the effective date should be 15th January, 1976 as it was quite evident from the evidence produced that they had not delayed the matter in any way.

The Respondents reminded the Court that the 1974 agreement which was the subject matter of the current revision was freely negotiated by the parties and at that time they had taken into consideration the Respondents' competitors, the three firms mentioned hereinabove and their wage structures when they had agreed to wage increase of $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent for the first year and $12\frac{1}{2}$ per cent for the second year for all categories of their employees.

The Respondents pleaded that they had lost the Uganda market and more recently the Tanzania market. The Tanzania market accounted for about 30 per cent of the total sales. Moreover the price controller had rejected their application for a price increase of one of their main products Clear Tone cream. The Respondents submitted that a combination of all these factors including a big price increase in their raw materials which they imported had resulted in their sustaining a loss during their 1975/76 financial year. They produced balance sheet and accounts for the years ending 30th June, 1975 and 30th June, 1976 in support of their submission.

The Respondents stated that in Kenya there was a serious problem of unemployment and referred to a recent speech made by the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, in which the situation had been highlighted. They added that the trend in the level of employment in their firm since 1974 had been more or less static.

They asked the Court to endorse their offer of 10 per cent wage increase for each year and to reject the Claimants' demand on the wage increase and increase in annual paid leave as they were above the increases permitted under the Guidelines. On the question of leave travelling allowance they offered to increase it from Sh. 100 to Sh. 110 p.a.

On the effective date the Respondents stated that they should not be made to suffer for the delays which were caused solely by the Claimants as they felt that if a backdating as demanded was awarded this would only encourage the trade unions to delay negotiations so as to enable their members to reap large wage arrears to the detriment of their employers. The Respondents further raised a point of principle concerning interpretation of the Guidelines and they felt that any backdating of an agreement should be based on the rise in the cost of living from the date of the last revision of the parties' agreement to the effective date as it appeared to them that determining the wage increases on the latest cost of living at the time of hearing results in double compensation to the workers for the intervening period between the effective date and the hearing date when the next agreement comes up for negotiation.

They asked the Court to award the effective date to be the date of the award and the agreement to run for a period of two years from that date.

The Court notes that the minimum consolidated rates of pay including housing allowance in the 1974 agreement as negotiated between the parties are as follows-

Employees already in receipt of salary or wages in excess of the minimum of their respective Class/s or Grade/s shall receive a simple 12½ per cent wage increase effective from 1st January, 1974 and a further simple wage increase of 12½ per cent on 1st January, 1975 both based on the rates of pay that such individuals were getting as at 1st January, 1974."

During the negotiations the Claimants at the first meeting of 3rd March, 1976 had revised their proposal on this item to 39.9 per cent wage increase from 1st January, 1976 to cover 12 months and a further wage increase of 15 per cent for the next succeeding 12 months. The Respondents had offered 7½ per cent increase for the first year and a smillar increase for the second

At the next meeting on 11th March the Claimants revised their proposals as follows-

From 1st January, 1976 20 per cent increase From 1st January, 1977 15 per cent increase . . .

The Respondents did not improve on their offer of $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent for each year but during conciliation and in their written submission they have offered a 10 per cent increase for the first year and a similar increase for the second year.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions and taking into account the cost of living increases and other relevant factors and the Guidelines issued by the Minister of Finance and Economic Planning to the Industrial Court the Court awards the following wage increases.

1. Minimum rates of pay and general wage increases to all unionizable employees of the company

The Court awards that all the unionizable employees should be granted a general wage increase of 12½ per cent for the first year and another general wage increase of 15 per cent for the second year. The Court further rules that the minimum consolidated rates of pay as set out hereinabove should be increased by the same percentages.

2. Annual paid leave

(1) After the completion of 12 months' continuous service with the company an employee shall be entitled to 21 working days annual leave with full pay and after the completion of five years service an employee shall be entitled to 24 working days annual leave with full pay.

Other leave provisions to remain as they are at present.

3. Leave travelling allowance

The Court awards a leave travelling allowance of Sh. 150 p.a. 4. Effective date of the agreement

The Court was not persuaded by the Respondents that the Claimants have in any way delayed the processing of this dispute. The Court agrees with the Claimants that at the most they could be penalized for 15 days which would mean that the effective date would then be 15th January, 1976. This would indeed be imposing a great hardship on the workers in these days of inflation.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that the effective date of the agreement should be 1st February, 1976 and that it should remain in force for a period of two years from that date.
