PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION OF KENYA VACANCIES

APPLICATIONS are invited for the posts shown below. Completed application forms should reach the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, P.O. Box 30095, Nairobi, on or before 16th June, 1977.

Civil servants should complete Forms PSC. 2a in triplicate (submitting the original through their Heads of Departments) and Cards PSC. 25 and 25a. Other applicants should complete Forms PSC. 2 in triplicate and Cards PSC. 24 and 24a.

These documents are obtainable either from the Secretary or from other Government offices.

Originals of certificates and similar documents should not be submitted unless specifically asked for.

Note

Incremental credits will be granted to successful candidates who are not civil servants for approved previous experience provided the maximum salary is not exceeded. They will also be eligible for benefits and privileges enjoyed by civil servants in accordance with existing Government Regulations.

Vacancy in the Ministry of Agriculture:

Head of Livestock Marketing Division (One Post) (No. 115/77)
Salary scale.—£2,514 to £3,036 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be graduates in Animal Production, or a closely related discipline, and have had not less than five years' post-graduate experience at least three years of which must have been in the field of livestock marketing at a senior level. The Livestock Marketing Division's field stations for the most part comprise extensive units of rangelands, and thus experience in range-management is also desirable.

Applicants must be mature and of very considerable administrative experience, and be capable of supervising a large number of both technical and administrative staff. The Division is currently undergoing many drastic changes in its policies and approaches to marketing issues, and the successful candidate will thus be expected to be adaptable in his approach to his overall responsibilities. Additionally an expansion programme is presently being implemented with the assistance of a small multi-disciplinary team of foreign personnel, which programme adds emphasis to the need for maturity and calls for a reasonable capacity of delegation.

The Head of Division is responsible to the Director of Agriculture for the implementation and administration of agreed policies and development programmes pertaining to livestock marketing, and will be expected, as the occasion requires, to initiate plans for new development projects and to make recommendations as to overall policy in pursuance both of providing an improved service to rangeland livestock producers and enhanced efficiency within the Division.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Education:

Senior Education Officer (One Post) (No. 116/77)

Salary scale.—£2,010 to £2,514 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be trained graduates from recognized universities or possess approved equivalent professional qualifications and must have proven experience in educational administrations either as Education Officers or Heads of Institutions with the ability to plan and organize curriculum at the Secondary or Secondary Vocational levels of Secondary Education. They must in addition be proficient in estimating and controlling expenditure as well as being able to evaluate and supervise the work of large numbers of academic/technical and non-academic staff. In addition candidates must be conversant with the present-day plans and problems of education as a whole.

Successful candidate will be posted anywhere in Kenya although initially he/she will be posted to the Ministry's Head Office, Nairobi.

Education Officer (One Post) (No. 117/77)

Salary scale.—£1,614 to £2,082 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be trained graduates in education and must have at least five years' proved experience in educational administration as Education Officers preferably in the area of administration of international educational programmes. In addition, they must be conversant with the present-day plans and problems of education as a whole.

Successful candidate will be posted anywhere in Kenya although initially he/she will be posted at the Ministry's Head Office. Nairobi.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Co-operative Development:

Lecturer Grade 1 (Coffee Factory Management Course) (One Post) (No. 118/77)

Salary scale.—£1,614 to £2,082 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a degree in Mechanical, Civil or Agricultural Engineering or its equivalent from a recognized university. The applicants should preferably have field experience of about two years on coffee management, coffee processing or in the Technical Extension Service in the Coffee Industry in Kenya, as at present carried out by the Ministry of Agriculture.

The successful candidate must be able to teach all technical aspects in the Coffee Factory Management and arrange field training besides initiating the preparation, improvement and production of study materials. He will also be required to participate in extra-curricula activities of the college in addition to organizing and conducting courses.

Teaching experience will be an added advantage.

Lecturer Grade II (One Post) (No. 119/77)

Salary scale.—£1,350 to £1,794 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess the following qualifications:—

- (a) a degree in Graphic Arts or Fine Arts, or a degree in Education from a recognized university. Applicants should have served for at least three (3) years after completing their studies; or
- (b) a diploma in Lithography from a recognized technical institution, and should have successfully worked for at least two (2) years after his studies;
- (c) an SI Science Training, and a successful completion of at least three (3) years in training/educational institutions.
- In all cases, applicants must show evidence of—
- the ability to work diligently and conscientiously without supervision;
- (2) familiarity with electrical machines;
- (3) familiarity with the basics of Graphic Arts procedures;
- (4) the ability to supervise and organize work systems in a machine workshop;
- (5) the ability to do editorial and layout work.

Applicants who show evidence of knowledge in accounts and the ability to use IBM Selectric Typewriter will have an added advantage.

Initially the successful candidate will be posted at the Cooperative College of Kenya to work at the Production Department. His duties will include:—

- (i) Layout and editorial work for printing materials.
- (ii) Producing TVA in liaison with the College Teaching Departments, when and as necessary.
- (iii) Assist the Head of the Production Department in routine administrative matters as assigned.
- (iv) Create new ideas in the production of Co-operative Education materials when called upon to do so or in conjunction with those involved in Co-operative Education.
- (v) Participate in College activities related to Co-operative Education when and as required by the College.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Finance and Planning:

District Revenue Officer I (Three Posts) (No. 120/77)

Salary scale.—£1,350 to £1,794 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be civil servants of preferably East African Certificate of Education or above with a minimum of at least three years as an Executive Officer Grade II. They should have a knowledge of commercial as well as Government Accounts and be conversant with Kenya Revenue Laws. District executive experience is essential.

Vacancies in the National Assembly:

Caterer (One Post) (No. 121/77)

Salary scale.—£1,086 to £1,446 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a minimum of East African Certificate of Education and in addition be in possession of a Certificate in Catering or possession of a Diploma in Hotel Management.

The post carries responsibility to run a kitchen, a bar and a dining room and organization of Government receptions. It calls for dedication and ability for effective costing and control of foodstuff, drinks and stores and efficient billing system; the ability to control staff, tact and dignity in dealing with people. Applicants must be of mature age.

Hansard Reporter Grade I (One Post) (No. 122/77)

Salary scale.—£804 to £1,086 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants will be required to have served for a period of not less than (2) two years at the level of Hansard Reporter II. In addition they must have demonstrated the ability to cover all the proceedings of the National Assembly and its Select Committees without supervision.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Health:

Inspector of Drugs Grade II (Two Posts) (No. 123/77)

Salary scale:—£1,086 to £1,446 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should preferably be civil servants of East African Certificate of Education standard or its equivalent with considerable experience of at least five years' police or similar enforcement work at or above inspectorate level, or at Assistant Hospital Superintendent's level. A good knowledge of investigation, collection of evidence and court prosecution procedure is essential, as is ability to learn and apply the laws of Kenya.

A technical knowledge of drugs would be an advantage. The successful candidates will initially be posted to the Ministry of Health Headquarters for a period of familiarization before being posted to enforce drug laws in any province within the Republic.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Works:

Senior Clerical Officer (Twelve Posts) (No. 124/77) Salary scale.—£594 to £834 p.a.

Applicants must be serving Higher Clerical Officers with a minimum of five years' satisfactory performance in the accountancy field. They must have served as Higher Clerical Officers for at least two years and must have passed the Government's Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers. Trainee Vacancies in the Ministry of Co-operative Development: Assistant Co-operative Officer (Trainee) (Thirty Posts) (No. 125/77)

Applicants must possess East African Advanced Certificate of Education or its equivalent with at least a Principal pass in either Mathematics or Economics. They must also possess East

African Certificate of Education with at least five credits two of which must be in English and Mathematics.

The successful candidates will undergo a two years' course at the Co-operative College of Kenya leading to a Diploma in Co-operative Management and Administration. The training will also include periods of practical field training.

During the training period the trainees will be paid a fixed training allowance of Sh. 665 per month from which they will have to pay messing charges which now stand at Sh. 320 per month. During periods of field training the trainees will be paid a fixed allowance of Sh. 965 per month from which they are supposed to meet all their expenses.

On successful completion of the course they will be appointed as Assistant Co-operative Officers in Job Group G (£804 to £1,086 p.a.)

Co-operative Assistant (Trainee) (Twenty-five Posts) (No. 126/77)

Applicants must possess East African Certificate of Education with a credit in either Mathematics or Accountacy or Commerce or Economics plus a credit in English Language. The successful candidates will undergo a two-year course which includes periods of residential training at the Co-operative College of Kenya and practical field training. While in training they will be paid fixed allowance of K.Sh. 520 per month if accommodated at the Co-operative College or K.Sh. 820 per month if living in privately rented accommodation. They will pay messing charges which now stand at K.Sh. 320 per month if they stay at the College. On successful completion of the course which leads to certificate in Co-operative Administration, the trainees will be appointed as Co-operative Assistant, Job Group F (£594 to £834) per annum.

Trainee Vacancy in the Office of the President (Government Chemist):

Laboratory Technologist (Trainee) (One Post) (No. 127/77)

Applicants should hold the East African Certificate of Education with two credits in Science subjects, one of which should be physical science and chemistry. Alternatively, they should hold the Advanced East African Certificate of Education with at least a pass in chemistry. The successful applicant will be trained in the chemical analysis of foods, drugs, water, industrial materials and in forensic science.

Training Conditions

- (i) The training period will normally be for three years.

This allowance will be inclusive of house allowance. The first six months of training will be a period of trial during which the training may be terminated by either party.
- (iii) On successful completion of the training, the trainee will be eligible for appointment on probationary terms of service to the grade of Laboratory Technician III (Job Group G) on salary scale £804 to £1,086 per annum.

Fringe Benefits

Trainee shall be entitled to the following fringe benefits:-

- (i) Accommodation allowance at the rate of K.Sh. 15 per night when travelling on duty away from permanent station and make his own arrangements for boarding and lodging provided he does not stay with a Government officer.
- (ii) Free medical treatment in a Government Hospital for himself only but not to members of his family.
- (iii) Free transport whilst travelling to join the course and also when travelling on vacation leave.
- (iv) Free stationery/books and protective clothing or uniform where the nature of training makes it necessary, provided the recommendation of Head of Training Institution/ Training Officer has been obtained.
- (v) 14 days annual vacation leave.

Issue in dispute.—Clerical grading.

- 1. The Transport and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Rent A Car Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 2nd March and 20th April, 1977, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 1st October, 1976, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 22nd December, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The Claimants are claiming a sum of Sh. 34,614/85 which they allege are arrears due to their five members Messrs. Julius Okeno, Geoffrey Wanga, John Obinda, Mutisya Keli and K. Kimani, four of whom, according to the Claimants, instead of being put in grade 8 were put in grades 5 and 6 and one instead of 7 was put in 5. The aforesaid amount represents the underpayment of salaries to these persons with effect from September, 1973 to March, 1977.

The breakdown of the claim is as follows:-

The Claimants further claim a sum of Sh. 2,035/50 each on behalf of Mr. Keli and Mr. Okeno as they claim that these persons have been acting in capacities higher than their own.

The itemized details of the claim appear in the Claimants' submission.

The Claimants stated that way back in 1973, on 24th August, M. P. Castellano had specified the duties of all the accounting staff in the Respondents' undertaking and they relied on those duties in maintaining that the nature of the work performed by the aforesaid members entitle them to grade 8 with effect from 1st September, 1973. As against this the Respondents had placed them in the following grades:—

The Claimants, however, conceded that they did not take up the claim on behalf of their members until August, 1975, when they came to know that their members had suffered as a result of wrong grading by the Respondents.

The Respondents strongly submitted that the Claimants' claim was totally misconceived as it was just not possible in a small department of seven people comprising the chief accountant and his assistant and five clerks to grade all the five clerks in grade 8. They stated that these five persons did not do similar duties or duties with the same responsibility and that each one did a different job requiring different skills and different requirement.

The Respondents stated that the job description which appears as Appendix A to the current collective agreement between the parties which is effective from 1st September, 1976, for a period of 24 months was agreed in 1973 and has not been altered since then. They were satisfied that they had properly graded the five employees after the 1973 agreement had been implemented taking into account the duties performed by them and the job descriptions for the various grades as agreed between the parties.

The Respondents added that in order to further remove any doubt on their grading they had asked a private firm of management consultants to evaluate individual gradings of these five clerks and the report from these consultants supported and confirmed the Respondents' grading and in their opinion the grading of the five clerks in the Respondents' accounts department was in agreement with the grades established and accepted by the Claimants.

The Court has noted the Claimants' point that they were not a party in any way to the investigation carried out by the management consultants engaged by the Respondents in this

The Court would like to record that the parties entered into a collective agreement effective from 1st September, 1973, for a period of 18 months and in that agreement they agreed to the following clerical grades under group (vii):-

Attached to that agreement is the job description for the various clerical grades which remains undisturbed to date.

The Court has very carefully compared the duties as specified by Mr. Castellano on 24th August, 1973, for the five persons involved in this dispute with the aforesaid descriptions for clerical grades 5 to 8. The Court has also taken into consideration the duties which these persons are alleged to be performing according to the Respondents and the views expressed by the management consultants engaged by the Respondents to go into this matter.

The Court notes that the salary scales of these five persons progressed as follows:--

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has arrived at the following findings.

By direct comparison between the duties set out in the Castellano job descriptions and those set out in the collective agreement none of the Claimants' clerks in this dispute carried out the range of grade VIII duties.

The Court finds, however, that by reference to the documents produced certain adjustments are justified to the grades during the years September, 1973 to March, 1977, and these are dealt with individually as follows:-

K. Kimani-Payroll Clerk

To be placed in grade VII. He has been paid at the rate of Sh. 1,075 since 3rd September, 1973, which is higher than the ruling grade VII rate of Sh. 995 and has continued to be paid a higher rate than the grade VII scale plus 15 per cent (September, 1975) and 10 per cent (September, 1976). He is therefore not entitled to an increased payment.

J. Okeno-Receivables Clerk

To be placed in grade VII. As he has been paid at the rate of Sh. 900 from September, 1973 to June, 1974, as against the grade VII rate Sh. 995 he is entitled to Sh. 95 × 10 months = Sh. 950. From July, 1974, he has been paid higher than the ruling grade VII and has continued at a more favourable rate than grade VII plus 15 per cent and 10 per cent. He is therefore entitled to Sh. 950.

G. Wanga-General Clerk/Later Payables Clerk

To be placed in grade V from September, 1973. As he has been paid at the rate of Sh. 650 from September, 1973 to June, 1974, as against the grade V rate of Sh. 710 he is entitled to Sh. 60×10 months = Sh. 600. He was then paid Sh. 700 from July, 1974 to April, 1975, and is further entitled to Sh. 10×10 months = Sh. 100. From May, 1975, he should have been promoted to grade VI as payables clerk. His salary at that time was Sh. 800 from May, 1975 to August, 1975. He is therefore entitled to Sh. 80×4 months = Sh. 320. From September, 1975, he was paid Sh. 920 which taking into consideration the 15 per cent increase is Sh. 1012. He is due consideration the 15 per cent increase is Sh. 1,012. He is due another Sh. 92 × 12 months = Sh. 1,104. In September, 1976, his salary was increased to Sh. 1,012 which taking into account the 10 per cent increase amounts to Sh. 1,113; he is entitled to a further Sh. 101×7 . He is therefore entitled in all to Sh. 1,727.

K. Mutisya-Machine Operator

To be placed in grade VI from September, 1973. As he has been paid at the rate of Sh. 800 from September, 1973. As he has been paid at the rate of Sh. 800 from September, 1973 to June, 1974, as against the grade VI rate of Sh. 880 he is entitled to Sh. 80×10 months = Sh. 800. From July, 1974, he has been paid higher than the ruling grade VI rate and has continued at a more favourable rate than grade VI plus 15 per cent and 10 per cent. He is therefore entitled to Sh. 800.

J. Obinda-Auditor/Later Supervisor

For the two months September and October, 1973, he was paid at Sh. 900 as against the ruling grade VII rate of Sh. 995, for those two months he is entitled to Sh. 95 \times 2 months = Sh. 190. From then on until he became a supervisor in November, 1975, he was above the grade VII rate.
