Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 as a deposit made payable to the Commissioner of Lands which will be dealt with as follows:—

- If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within the period of 14 days as required by Condition No. 4 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within the period of 14 days as required by Condition No. 4 below, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

2. Applicants must in their applications state if they own any plots in Kaloleni area giving details of plot numbers and whether these are developed or not. Failure to disclose this information may result in the application being disqualified.

3. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating the amount of capital it is proposed to spend on the project with a banker's letter or other evidence of financial status in support.

4. Each allottee of the plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been successful, the stand premium and proportion of the annual rental together with survey, conveyancing, stamp duty, registration fees and provisional assessment for roads and drains charges. In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no claim to the plot.

General Conditions

1. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Trust Land Act (Cap. 288 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).

And a system of drainage for disposals of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof have been approved in writing by the County Council (to be submitted in triplicate to the County Council).

3. No additions shall be made to the buildings without the prior consent in writing of the County Council.

4. The land and buildings shall only be used for shops, offices and flats and the grantee shall throughout the term and to the satisfaction of the local authority make substantial use of the land and buildings for such purpose.

5. The land shall not be subdivided.

6. The grantee shall not alienate the land or part thereof by sale, charge, transfer of possession, sublease, bequest or otherwise, howsoever without the previous consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands and no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 1 has been performed.

7. The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land or such lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.

8. The grantee shall pay all sums that may from time to time be demanded by the local authority in respect of the cost of construction, maintaining, improving and renewing all roads, drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land.

9. The grantee shall be responsible for the payment of all taxes, charges or duties of whatever description that may be levied, imposed or charged by the County Council or Government upon the land and buildings.

10. The grantee shall on receipt of notice in writing in that behalf from the County Council forthwith adequately fence or hedge the land and shall thereafter maintain such fence or hedge to the satisfaction of the County Council.

11. The County Council or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone and telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the lessee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignment of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

12. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein the grantee shall on receipt of six months' notice in writing in that behalf, surrender all or any part of the land required for public purposes without payment of any compensation save in respect of such of the approved buildings as may have to be evacuated or demolished.

1. The Kenya Management Staff Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and E.A. External Telecommunications Co. Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 18th October and 6th December, 1976 and 18th and 19th May, 1977 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:—

Claimants.—M. W. Odera.

Respondents:—

Z. E. Ramogo.

M. Macharia.

O. Ambuko.

M. Ouma.

B. A. Onyango.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 15th June, 1976 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 20th August, 1976 along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

M. W. Odera who was employed by the Respondents as a security officer since May 1971 was suspended from duty with effect from 20th December, 1973 pending more detailed investigations by the Respondents into an incident involving Mr. Odera in the evening of 7th November, 1973. His services were terminated on 25th February, 1974 and the terminal benefits granted to him were as follows:—

"(a) His monthly remuneration up to and including 28th February, 1974.

(b) His contribution to the Company's pension fund less any deductions as laid down in the Rules.

(c) His leave pay of any outstanding leave on his credit up to and including 28th February, 1974."

On 1st March, 1974 the Claimants stepped in on his behalf claiming that he had been wrongfully dismissed and the matter was reported to the Minister for Labour.

The dispute was investigated by an official of the Ministry of Labour and on 4th June, 1976 the Permanent Secretary forwarded his report to the parties with the following conclusion—

"From the submission of both parties one is left in no doubt that Mr. Odera was found in his office with a woman in very compromising circumstances. It is noteworthy that Mr. Odera was instrumental to the dismissal of another employee for a similar offence.

In the circumstances one cannot find any reason for Mr. Odera to expect different treatment. Mr. Odera in my opinion abused the function of his job and the management action is considered to be proper. The management, however, should have acted more swiftly."

The incident which led to the dismissal of Mr. Odera is alleged to have taken place on 7th November, 1973 at or about 7 p.m. when a Securicor night watchman spotted a woman in Mr. Odera's office and saw Mr. Odera locking the door from inside and switching off the light. This security guard informed another night watchman employed by the Respondents about this. This man knocked at Mr. Odera's door a couple of times and eliciting no response went up to the office of the assistant branch manager who came down with the master key and opened Mr. Odera's office door. Mr. Odera was found naked except for a vest and when the door opened it is alleged that he ran from a small sofa in his office towards his table. A woman who is alleged to have been naked except for a transparent chemise was lying on the sofa and when these people entered in she crouched. The assistant branch manager, Mr. Onyango, asked Mr. Odera to report to him upstairs and it is not disputed by either party that the woman was not held or detained.

The alleged incident was seen by four persons who all gave evidence during the hearing.

The Claimants' stand is that Mr. Odera has been framed in an imaginary incident which in fact never took place and the whole story had been cooked up in order to get rid of him from the Respondents' services.

Their main grounds for this contention are that if such an incident had in fact taken place then why was the woman in question not detained and handed over to the police along with Mr. Odera for committing such an act in a public place. Further the Respondents had not proved at all in the absence of any expert evidence that Mr. Odera had committed adultery.

The Claimants referred the Court to three different statements made in the Respondents' written submission where it is alleged that Mr. Odera "was actually playing sex in his office", "had been through an immoral act", and "had committed an obscene act".

The Claimants argued that this showed that the Respondents were not sure of what allegation to level against Mr. Odera because no such incident had taken place. They called Mr.

Odera to give evidence on oath and Mr. Odera while denying the aforesaid incident alleged that he had been victimized because he had failed to co-operate with the Respondents' general manager to recruit into employment people recommended by him who were interested in football and who were members of a certain club in Nairobi of which the general manager was desirous of becoming the chairman.

Mr. Odera also made an allegation that he had once on 5th October, 1973 been asked to stay on duty after 1800 hours by the general manager because he wanted him to do a job for him. While he was waiting the general manager's wife had come and gone up. After a few moments the lift came down and the general manager's secretary, one Miss Rosemary Akinyi came out and told him that there was a fight going on up there. Upon hearing this Mr. Odera went up in the lift and saw Mr. and Mrs. Ramogo pushing each other and Mr. Odera was asked to take his wife to the police station. Mr. Odera was reluctant to do so but asked her to go down. Mr. Odera said that since that day he felt that his position was in danger.

The Claimants have further put out that because in 1971 Mr. Oyuga, who was a brother-in-law of the then assistant branch manager Mr. Onyango, had been dismissed for similar offence on the recommendation of Mr. Odera he, Mr. Odera, had suffered a wrongful dismissal because of that incident.

The Claimants referred the Court to several discrepancies in the evidence of the Respondents' witnesses in support of their argument that they were all testifying about a cooked up incident. The Court will refer to these discrepancies in due course hereinafter in the award.

The Claimants stated that as a result of this incident and because the Respondents had posted his letter of dismissal to his home which was seen by his wife, the wife had left the marital home with the result that Mr. Odera's domestic life had suffered a great setback.

The Claimants also tabled a statement by R. R. Tsumah, a senior security officer, and referred to certain paragraphs in that statement particularly the following paragraphs in the background—

"The security network shows that this habit is not the first time it has taken place on the 11th floor or other offices in Exelcoms House. Noteworthy point however is the same night guard has always been on duty.

To give an opinion, the securicor guard cannot be acclaimed beyond reproach as far as his duties at Exelcoms House is concerned and is most unreliable. He either spends most of his time sleeping or possibly has something in common with those engaged in these activities. His allowing the couple to go to the 12th floor leaves reasonable doubt whether he can be trusted on this issue of the couple having had sexual intercourse on the 11th floor.

The act of having sexual intercourse in itself on the 11th floor should be borne in mind that it is not the Security Department's concern but the Management's problem. The Security Department is merely interested in submitting to the Management a fully investigated case without recommendation of any sort as to what is to be done."

The Claimants stated that in this incident which had taken place in 1971 the woman involved had been detained and asked to make a statement and they wondered why in the above incident Mr. Odera the woman had been allowed to go.

The Respondents while reiterating that the aforesaid incident was absolutely true stated that Mr. Odera had resorted to character assassination of the general manager and Mr. Onyango in order to get his revenge for the fate that he had suffered.

The Respondents stated that they had not taken any criminal action against Mr. Odera but had dealt with the matter on disciplinary grounds involving one of their employees. As such, there was no need to prove beyond reasonable doubt the commission of the actual act of adultery. They stated that they may have used three different phrases regarding what had taken place in Mr. Odera's room but it was sufficient to indicate that he had indulged in gross misconduct with a woman in his office.

The Respondents referred the Court to two letters dated 17th December, 1973 and 15th March, 1974 which Mr. Odera had written regarding his dismissal. They referred to the following two paragraphs in these letters—

"I have witnesses to state that between 1800 hours and 2000 hours on the 7th November, 1973 I was with them somewhere which is not my office, this is to clear the point which is alleged that . . ."

"I did not have a woman in my office as alleged. I was not in my office at 7.05 p.m. as stated. I had reported off duty and that I was with other friends somewhere else which was not my office. I have two gentlemen to whom we were with who are my witnesses."

The Respondents pointed out that in Court Mr. Odero had stated in cross-examination that he was at his home with his wife and they had two female visitors. The Respondents referred to the obvious contradictions in the aforesaid letters and in Mr. Odero's evidence in Court. In any case the Respondents asked why Mr. Odero had not been able to bring any witnesses to show that he was not at his office at the material time.

The Respondents also called the general manager, Mr. Ramogo, to give evidence on oath. Mr. Ramogo denied the allegations made against him by Mr. Odero and stated that Miss Akinyi had resigned in May 1973 from the Respondent's employment and the alleged incident referred to by Mr. Odero in his evidence dated 5th October 1973 could not therefore have taken place and Mr. Odero was clearly telling lies. Mr. Ramogo further explained that he had already held the position of chairman of the football club mentioned by Mr. Odero and that now he was a patron of that club and there was no need for him to regain the chairmanship. So obviously Mr. Odero was again telling lies. Mr. Ramogo further stated that he had once as a first step in the recruitment of an employee asked Mr. Odero to give his views regarding the suitability of a certain person for recruitment for employment. He said this was a normal practice.

The Respondents called four other witnesses who all gave their versions of what they had seen in the evening of 7th November, 1973 involving Mr. Odero and the woman.

M. Macharia, the Securicor guard stated that he came on duty at 5.30 p.m. as it was his habit to report for duty earlier than the required time and he looked for his chair on which he usually sits and as he was looking for his chair he saw Mr. Odero coming out of his office and asked him about his chair. Thereupon Mr. Odero went back to his office and brought out the chair and when the door was open Macharia looked inside and he saw a woman there. He then started doing his rounds and heard the click when Mr. Odero locked the door from inside and to his knowledge the woman was still there. When he saw the lights go off he told about the matter to the Respondents' night watchman, O. Ambuko, who was also doing his rounds. Ambuko had then knocked at the door but since Mr. Odero did not open it, Ambuko ran to the branch manager's office upstairs. Macharia stated that he was at the door all the time and after some time Ambuko came back with Mr. Onyango who had the master key and he also saw one Mr. Ouma there. Mr. Onyango opened the door of Mr. Odero's office and Ambuko switched on the light. He then saw that Mr. Odero was naked and the woman was also naked lying on the sofa. She was wearing some flimsy garment and her body could be seen and Mr. Odero had nothing on except a vest.

Mr. Ambuko stated more or less the same and in reply to a question in cross-examination that how is it possible that with all this commotion going on Mr. Odero had not thought it fit to put on his clothes and allowed himself to be caught naked, stated that every person has his own mental faculties and that Mr. Odero was too much engrossed in the act to have heard the noise and was therefore caught red handed.

Mr. Ouma stated that he had come from a football practice and had entered the building with a view to going for a wash up when he saw Mr. Onyango and Mr. Ambuko coming down the stairs heading towards Mr. Odero's office and he had joined them. He also confirmed what the other witnesses had stated what they saw in the room when the door was opened by Mr. Onyango.

Mr. Onyango stated that he was approached by Mr. Ambuko and Mr. Ouma who reported that a man had got into his office with a woman and had locked himself in. He had asked them to go and check and ask the man to come out. They had gone down but came back again and reported that there was no response to the knocking on the door. He had then gone down with the master key and confirmed what other witnesses had stated was going on. He further stated that he asked Mr. Odero to come up to his office but he did not ask the woman to be detained or to come up. Mr. Odero had asked him to forgive him as it was human to err. Mr. Odero had further offered him to settle the matter in the Luo tradition. Mr. Onyango had however told him that the matter was serious and it had to go to the senior management. He stated he did not feel the necessity to detain the woman because they had all seen what had happened.

The Respondents asked the Court to find in their favour and to reject the Claimants' demand.

The Court has carefully considered the discrepancies in the evidence of the Respondents' witnesses, the more important of these being that there is some difference in the time when the alleged incident is alleged to have taken place as given by the Respondents' witnesses particularly Messrs. M. Macharia and O. Ambuko.

There is a further discrepancy in the evidence of Mr. Onyango and Mr. Ouma in that Mr. Ouma says that he met Mr. Onyango and another person coming down the stairs and he went with them when they were going to Mr. Odero's office. Mr. Onyango on the other hand says that Mr. Ouma along with another person came to his office upstairs to call him.

The Claimants also have a point worthy of consideration in that from the first knocking at the door of Mr. Odero's office by Ambuko on a report made to him by Macharia and the subsequent commotion and further knockings on the door that Mr. Odero and his companion should have been found almost naked when the door was opened by Mr. Onyango with a master key.

On this particular point the Court was rather impressed by Ambuko's comment which was "everybody has his own mental faculties and perhaps Mr. Odero was too much engrossed in enjoying the act". There is also another aspect which was put forward by the Respondents in this regard and that is that the offices at the Respondents' building are almost sound proof.

Regarding the discrepancy on the timing between Macharia and Ambuko the Court finds that that discrepancy is not serious at all when it is considered in the light of the evidence as a whole given by these two persons. The Court finds that both these persons were speaking the truth and that the difference in the times given by them can be attributed more to their lack of precise information on this point rather than to an attempt to tell lies.

Out of the evidence of Mr. Onyango and Mr. Ouma the Court is inclined to believe Mr. Ouma's evidence when he says that he saw Mr. Onyango and another person coming down the staircase. Mr. Onyango obviously on this point was completely mistaken.

The Court is satisfied that between 6.30 p.m. and some minutes past 7 Mr. Odero was found in his office with a female companion in a compromising position. The incident is alleged to have taken place as described by the various eye witnesses and is not a figment of their imagination or a cooked up story. Mr. Odero was found naked except for a vest with a woman who was also almost naked and it is quite obvious that they were indulging in some sort of sexual activity.

Mr. Odero was found in this rather unfortunate position in his office after he had signed off for that particular day. He was at the time off duty.

The Court has now to make a finding whether Mr. Odero has been guilty of misconduct under the aforesaid circumstances.

There are certain features in this dispute about which the Court is not entirely happy. The first one being that although Mr. Odero was found to be committing an act of indiscipline in "company" premises on 7th November, 1973 he was not suspended from duty until 20th December, 1973. Secondly Mr. Onyango in his report to the general manager stated that he had recommended that Mr. Odero should be dismissed because in 1971 a Mr. Oyuga had also been dismissed over the same offence with recommendations of Mr. Odero. The Court wonders what action the Respondents would have deemed to be fit in case of Mr. Odero if Mr. Oyuga had not been dismissed in the past on Mr. Odero's recommendation.

The Court is not at all happy at the Respondents' conduct at the manner in which they sent the letter of his termination to his home address at Siaya which letter fell in the hands of his wife with the result that she has left him and the children and gone to her parents' house.

The Court has no doubt that Mr. Odero is guilty of an offence which warrants the termination of his service. The Court, however, does not find that he deserved a summary dismissal and the Court accordingly awards that he should be given one month's salary in lieu of notice in addition to what the Respondents have offered him vide their letter of 25th February, 1974 when his services were terminated with immediate effect. The Court accordingly awards that the Respondents pay Mr. Odero an additional sum of Sh. 2,000 being his one month's salary in lieu of notice as per his contract of employment.

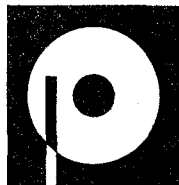
