NOTICE is hereby given that Tana River Development Authority, a statutory authority established by the Tana River Development Authority Act, 1974, having its office at Central Bank Building, Haile Selassie Avenue, Nairobi, Kenya (hereinafter referred to as "the applicant"), will on the 3rd day of October, 1977, apply to the Ministry of Power and Communications or other Minister who for the time being shall be the Minister for the purposes of the above-mentioned Act for a Bulk Supply Licence authorizing the applicant during a period of fifty years from the date of commencement of the licence:—

- (a) To generate in such generating stations as the applicant may be authorized by the licence or otherwise from time to time to construct, erect, or operate within the area of supply hereinafter described electrical energy in such quantities and at such pressures as the applicant may from time to time require and determine.
- (b) To transmit within the said area of supply electrical energy in bulk in such quantities and at such pressures as the applicant may from time to time determine.

- (c) To supply within the said area of supply to the East African Power & Lighting Company, who have agreed with the applicant to take a supply of electrical energy from the applicant in bulk in such quantities, at such pressures, for such periods and subject to such terms and conditions as may from time to time be agreed upon by the applicant: provided always that the supply of electrical energy by the applicant under the licence shall be permissive with respect to the said area of supply.
- (d) To construct on the lands which have been acquired such generating station or generating stations as the applicant may from time to time require for the generation of electrical energy for the purposes of the licence or any of them as are hereinafter described.
- (e) To construct, maintain and operate all such other works and plant within the said area of supply as may in the opinion of the applicant be necessary or expedient for the purposes aforesaid or any of them.
- 2. The purpose for which the licence is required is to enable the applicant to generate and, transmit electrical energy and to acquire, purchase, construct, maintain and operate all such works and plant as aforesaid and to do all things and take all steps which may seem to it to be necessary, appropriate or expedient (including all ancillary acts and things whatsoever) in connection therewith.
- 3. The proposed area of supply is from the generating station to the Kamburu Switching Station.
- 4. The lands which the applicant has acquired consist of those portions of the lands situate in the Eastern Province of Kenya designated on the copy of Boundary Plan annexed hereto.
- 5. Generating Station.—The point within the lands referred to in the next preceding paragraph at which it is proposed that the applicant should be empowered to construct a generating station (together with any necessary switching stations) is situated on the Tana River about twelve kilometres upstream from the confluence with the River Thiba as shown on the copy of Boundary Plan.
- 6. The machinery proposed to be installed in the said generating stations is two generating sets each comprising a vertical axis variable pitch propellor Kaplan turbine driving a 20MW alternator with an output of 50 cycles per seond and 11kv. Each turbine will be complete with a governor, surge shaft and inlet gate. The power house will have a 100 ton electric overhead travelling crane and the power will pass to the transmission system by way of two 23.5 MVA 11/132 kv. transformers in an adjacent outdoor switching station. The power station will be provided with a small auxiliary set to maintain power station supplies in case of emergency.
- 7. It is intended that the machinery referred to in para. 6 above shall be regarded as available for service at all times.
- 8. Many hydro-electric stations throughout the world are equipped with this type of machinery and have operated successfully for many years.
- 9. - 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 16th and 17th June and 4th July, 1977 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 28th February, 1977 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 7th April, 1977 along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The last time the parties appeared before the Court was in Cause No. 64/75 when the issue in dispute was:

"Wage increase to compensate workers for the high cost of living.

In that dispute although there was a collective agreement in force giving the workers two increases of Sh. 48/75 each with effect from September 1974 and again from 1st September, 1975, the Court proceeded to award an additional wage increase of Sh. 34/40 p.m. with effect from 1st September, 1975 thus giving the workers a second year increase of Sh. 83/15 with effect from 1st September, 1975. The Court further expressed the view that when the collective agreement was revised this increase would be taken into consideration.

Now that the collective agreement has expired the Claimants have raised this major dispute and are asking for a wage increase of 35 per cent with effect from 1st September, 1976 and another wage increase of 35 per cent with effect from 1st September, 1977

In addition they have asked the Court to award the workers a housing allowance which would enable them to rent reasonable living accommodation and they stated that a sum of between Sh. 150 to Sh. 200 p.m. would be a fair assessment in this regard.

The Claimants also pointed out that the only practical alternative since it was not feasible to have the number of low income houses that are needed in the country in the near future, is to immediately increase the housing allowances (or wage rates) for workers and at the same time to provide more effective controls on rents which are charged.

In addition to the above two major items in this dispute the Claimants have also put forward demands on a number of fringe benefits which they claim have not been revised for the last eight years and in some cases even more than eight years.

The Claimants have taken this opportunity of putting forward their new proposed grading structure for the engineering industry and have suggested new rates for those grades because they feel that the job evaluation that was carried out nearly 15 years ago was totally out of date and not very much relevant to the present working conditions in the industry. The Claimants have proposed the reduction of the present eight non-clerical groups to five and the present clerical groups to be reduced from five to three and the introduction of a new supervisory grade for the charge hands, leading hand and serang. Moreover they have proposed that junior management below personnel managers should also be represented by them these being senior salesmen, senior clerks, accountants and storekeepers.

The Claimants demanded the following new rates for the new job structure-

The Claimants made a very detailed written submission in support of their aforesaid demands and put in the relevant comparable rates in the other industries supported by graphs and other material documents in support of their submissions.

The Claimants were very critical of the Respondents' members on the employment of casual workers by them and they alleged that this practice was increasing because the employers wanted to escape paying fringe benefits to their workers which they would have to if they employed people on monthly contracts.

The Claimants based their demands on the proposed wage increase on the cost of living increases and they maintained that they had not been fully compensated for same.

The Respondents on the other hand also made detailed submissions in reply to the Claimants' demands. They have vigorously opposed them on the ground that their workers have not been left behind at all as compared to the other workers in Kenya and apart from the few industries at the very top they considered themselves amongst those employers who paid their employees very well indeed.

The Respondents pleaded that their industry was going through a difficult period and that it was with great difficulty that they were preventing redundancies, leave aside the question of creating new jobs. They felt that the workers in their industry had been amply compensated keeping in view the security of their employment for the rise in the cost of living and that their offer of Sh. 19/50 was reasonable under the present economic situation of the country and the state of their industry.

The Respondents stated that from September 1974 to September 1976 there was a rise of 26.5 per cent in respect of lower and middle income groups. As against this rise employees in grade 8 received an increase of 18.95 per cent leaving a balance of 7.55 per cent, two thirds of which is 5.03 per cent to be spread over a period of two years.

Regarding the recommended increase of 6 per cent by the Government effective from 1st May, 1977 they left the matter with the Court to decide in the light of their submissions.

The Respondents strongly resisted the break up of a consilidated wage in order to give the workers a separate housing allowance and argued that the consolidated wage had been in operation inclusive of house allowance and leave travelling allowance since they had recognized the Claimants and they saw no reason why there should be any variation now in the system. They pointed out the benefits which employees have under the consolidated principle included enhanced—

- (a) Overtime payments.
- (b) N.S.S.F. contributions.
- (c) Provident fund contributions.
- (d) Retirement benefits.
- (e) Severance allowance to employees who become redundant.

The Respondents argued extensively on each and every item in dispute and submitted that their level of fringe benefits compared favourably with other industries in the country.

The Court very much appreciates the comprehensive written submissions made by the parties in this dispute and the verbal arguments which they tendered in support thereof during the hearing of this dispute.

This dispute involves according to the Respondents nearly 6,000 employees but according to the Claimants the total in employment was in the region of 4,115 with the Claimants stating that the total number of casual workers was over 3,500.

At the request of the Court, the Ministry of Labour's Employment Promotion Division carried out a detailed analysis of the parties' written submissions vis-a-vis the Guidelines and the Court along with the parties had the E.P.D. report before it during the hearing.

The Court will now deal with each of the items in dispute.

1. Preamble: scope of agreement

Under this issue the Claimants are seeking to raise the level of union representation but the Court has come to the conclusion that this sort of issue is part of the Recognition Agreement and as such it cannot be dealt with on a dispute emanating from the revision of a collective agreement. The Court would like to advise the Claimants that in case they want to pursue this matter then they should first seek an amendment to the Recognition Agreement and since the amendment to the Recognition Agreement is not an issue in dispute the Court has no alternative but to reject the Claimants' demand in this dispute. The Court would also like to point out that since the Industrial Relations Charter is being revised by the Government, COTU (K) and FKE they should await the outcome of that exercise which will no doubt go a long way in resolving this matter.

2. Definition of employee

Under this issue the Claimants' main concern is that quite a number of non-union members would benefit from the Court award secured through the Claimants' efforts without having subscribed even a shilling towards the union funds.

The Claimants alleged that these "free riders" were being encouraged by the Respondents as they gave them slightly more than the wage increase negotiated by the Claimants.

Unfortunately for the Claimants in the absence of necessary legislation on this point the Court cannot accede to their demand. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" clearly states that the dispute is between the Respondents and the Claimants who represent all unionizable employees. The Court accordingly rejects the Claimants' demand.

3. Job evaluation

The Court accepts the Claimants submission on this issue to be valid in that the current job evaluation was carried out some 15 years ago and there is no doubt that it is high time a fresh job evaluation was carried out in the engineering industry. The Standing Committee to which the Respondents referred is not the answer to a comprehensive job evaluation exercise.

The Court has, however, pointed out in the past that the Court would not like to involve itself in a job evaluation exercise as it would take months of Court's time and for this

reason the Court has recommended in the past and recommends again in this dispute that the parties should jointly embark on such an exercise with the assistance of an independent expert or a firm of consultants.

The Court hopes and expects the parties to complete the job evaluation exercise before the next revision of the collective agreement and the Court would like to add that once the new job grading structure is ready that would be the time for the parties to ask the Court in case they cannot do it themselves to fix the various rates for those grades for all the employees.

In view of this directive the Court does not intend to make any award on this issue in this dispute.

4. Wages: wage increase

The present wages with effect from 1st September, 1975 after the Court award in Cause No. 64/75 are as follows—

As stated above the current agreement between the parties expired on 31st August, 1976 and it was effective from 1st September, 1974. Since that date the wage earners cost of living has gone up by 43.4 per cent up to May 1977. The index increased by 35.1 per cent in respect of the middle income group. If two thirds of this figure is taken into account as required under Guideline (iv) the maximum compensation to which the workers would be entitled works out at 28.9 per cent and 23.4 per cent.

The E.P.D. report states that since employees affected by this dispute fall within the wage earners group as well as the middle income group they had used the average index for the two groups as an appropriate compromise.

On this basis the maximum ceiling for consumer price compensation applicable to the lowest paid group of employees amounts to 26.1 per cent and fully takes into account rents, transport costs, etc., and the recent price increases on some basic food commodities which had been specifically mentioned by the Claimants.

The Court feels that there is some merit in the Claimants' argument that the increases which were granted to them under the 1974 agreement and to some extent also on 1st September, 1975 were meant to compensate them for the loss of purchasing power for the period before September 1974 and threfore should not be taken into account to determine the scope for wages and salaries increases in this dispute.

The Court must, however, offset the increase which it had granted to the workers with effect from 1st September, 1975 which according to the E.P.D. report was 5 per cent which leaves the maximum price compensation ceiling of 21.1 per cent to be spread into equal instalments in terms of Guideline (iv).

The Court is satisfied that the 6 per cent wage increase which the Government has announced is part of this increase in the cost of living.

After careful consideration of all the submissions made by the parties and in accordance with Guidelines which are in force at present the Court awards the following wage increases:—

(a) All employees earning up to Sh. 691/55 and below are awarded a wage increase of Sh. 52/65 p.m. with effect from 1st September, 1976.

All these employees shall get a further wage increase of Sh. 52/65 p.m. with effect from 1st September, 1977.

(b) All those employees earning more than Sh. 691/55 are awarded a wage increase of Sh. 72/15 with effect from 1st September, 1976 and another increase of Sh. 72/15 with effect from 1st September, 1977.

The Court further directs that the existing wage rates for the various groups shall also go up by the aforesaid amounts on the dates specified.

The Court has carefully considered the Claimants' objections regarding the calculation of the workers' wages on hourly rates. The Court is satisfied that permanent employees are entitled to a monthly wage as awarded above. This wage may be paid at monthly, fortnightly or weekly intervals as agreed in arrears.

In view of this if the employers break down the monthly wage to hourly rates for ease of calculation and so long as the workers do not suffer any reduction in their wage emoluments and fringe benefits there need not be any objection to that.

5. Safari allowance

The Court awards that the existing clause should continue in force with the following amendment to the safari allowances:—

6. Shift differential

This issue was withdrawn by the Claimants.

7. Annual paid leave

The Court awards that the existing provisions on annual paid leave as amended by the latest Regulation of Wages (General) Order, 1977 should continue in force except in so far as employees with over six years of service are concerned who shall be entitled to 24 working days' annual paid leave.

8. Entitlement of redundant employees

The Court carefully considered the Claimants' demand on this issue but has decided to reject it. The existing provision should continue as it stands.

9. Retirement benefits and gratuity

The existing caluse is as follows:

- "(a) A gratuity for long service employees who are ineligible to join the Provident Fund scheme is to be calculated as follows:—
 - After 1 to 5 years service 1 week's pay for each completed year.
 - After 5 to 10 years service $1\frac{1}{2}$ week's pay for each completed year.
 - After 10 years service 2 week's pay for each completed year.
- (b) A gratuity for long service employees who joined the Provident Fund but due to age, do not qualify for such benefit and who have served many years with a company will be calculated in accordance with the following rules:—
- Employees who have already left the service of the Association shall not be deemed within the scope of this Agreement.
- The only service catered for under this agreement will be the service prior to July 1963 or when the individual company's Provident Fund was introduced.
- 3. The formula for calculating this payment shall be the same as that introduced by the Conciliation Agreement in respect of employees ineligible to join the Provident Fund (see (a) above).
- 4. The starting date would be 1st July, 1945,
- 5. An employee who is entitled to a benefit under the gratuity scheme as above should be entitled to it if he loses his employment for any reason other than on resignation or on disciplinary grounds."

The Claimants have demanded that clause b (5) of the aforesaid should be amended so that those employees who are entitled to a benefit under the gratuity scheme as above should not forfeit it when they resign.

The Court notes that the Respondents have opposed any change in this clause as the gratuity scheme has been frozen for the years 1945 to 1963.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has decided to amend clause b (5) as stated hereinabove to enable an employee who has completed fifteen years of service with the Respondents at the time he resigns to be paid his benefit in the frozen gratuity scheme for the years 1945 to 1963.

Accordingly clause b (5) should read follows:—

"An employee who is entitled to a benefit under the gratuity Scheme as above should be entitled to it if he loses his employment for any reason other than on resignation before completing fifteen years of service with his employer or on disciplinary grounds."

10. Promotion

This item was withdrawn by the Claimants.

11. Acting appointment

This item was also withrawn by the Claimants.

12. Housing allowance

So long as the Guidelines are in force the Court's hands are tied in increasing the total labour costs of an employer in the wider interest of the economy of the country on which depends the welfare of all sectors of the population.

Under the award on wages hereinabove the Court has given the workers the maximum increase as permitted in the Guidelines. If the Court had decided to accede to the Claimants' request to break up the consolidated wage and to award an increased house allowance then after having determined the housing element in the present consolidated wage by which figure the wage would have been reduced the Court would have had to decide how much from the permitted increase should have gone towards housing allowance leaving the remainder to increase the reduced wage.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that it would not be fair to the workers so long as the Guidelines are in force to break up a consolidated wage as the Count firmly believes in view of the restrictions on the permitted increases in the labour costs to an employer that such increases should be awarded on the wage as any increase on the wage would reflect an increase on several other fringe benefits like overtime payments N.S.S.F. contributions, provident fund contributions, retirement benefits and severance allowance for employees who become redundant.

The Court would like to emphasize that the present cost of living indices had taken into account the rent increases along with other items.

The Claimants have asked the Court to award the percentage of housing allowance. The Court construes this to mean that they want the Court to assess the housing element in the present consolidated wage. The Court was informed by the Employment Promotion Division that the Central Bureau of Statistics have embarked on research on this question and the Court has therefore decided to defer the assessment of the element of housing pending the findings of the Central Bureau of Statistics.

Having awarded a consolidated wage increase the Court rejects the Claimants' demand.

13. Leave travelling allowance

The Claimants have asked for this item to be introduced in the existing fringe benefits. The Respondents on the other hand have argued that way back in 1962 a leave allowance of Sh. 2/50 p.m. was consolidated into wages and as such it should not be reintroduced.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court is satisfied that the Claimants have made a case for the award of a leave travelling allowance to the Respondents' employees and the Court accordingly awards that in addition to the consolidated wage to which the workers are entitled which includes leave travelling allowance of Sh. 2/50 p.m. the workers should be entitled to an additional sum of Sh. 120 per year when they proceed on annual leave and the Court so awards.

14. Training

This item was withdrawn by the Claimants.

15. Temporary transfer

The Court awards that the present provision on this item should continue without any change.

16. Service award

This item was withdrawn by the Claimants.

17. Transport for employees

This item was withdrawn by the Claimants.

18. Welfare arrangements

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court rejects the Claimants' demand on this item.

19. Effective date and duration

The Claimants have asked for the effective date to be 1st September, 1976 and the Respondents want the Court to award the effective date to be the date of the Court award. Both parties are agreed that the duration period should be two years.

The Court rejects the Respondents' argument on this item and finds that there is no justification whatsoever in these days of high inflation to deprive the workers of a wage increase for nearly ten months and the Court accordingly awards the effective date should be 1st September, 1976 and the collective agreement should remain in force for a period of two years from that date.

Box 40632, Nairobi aforesaid, has been absolutely revoked and cancelled by me by a deed of revocation dated 28th day of June, 1977, and anything done or purported to be done by the said Chand Sarup Bhabuta at any time hereafter under or in pursuance of the said general power of attorney, will in no way be binding on me.
