Experience in horticultural research and running a research station would be a definite advantage.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Director of Research for the implementation of National Horticultural Research activities, the overall direction of the National Horticultural Research Station, Thika and its substations. He will be stationed at the National Horticultural Research Station, Thika.

Assistant Director of Agriculture (Crop Research) (One Post) (No. 288/77)

Salary scale.—£2,712 to £3,540 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a B.Sc. degree in Agriculture plus an M.Sc. or Ph.D. degree in plant breeding agronomy or related science.

They should have at least five years' experience in planning, implementing research projects and directing interdisciplinary research programmes. Evidence of original research and scientific publication is required. Experience in running a large research station would be a definite advantage.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Director of Research on matters relating to basic research in the fields of plant breeding, agronomy and plant physiology, soil science and dry land farming research programmes; studying and reviewing all on-going research programmes, identifying constraints and preparing related development projects. He will be stationed at the Headquarters, Nairobi.

Senior Research Officer (Maize Breeding) (One Post) (No. 289/77)

Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a B.Sc. degree in Agriculture or post-graduate qualifications in plant Breeding and genetics at the M.Sc. or Ph.D. level. They should also have at least three years' experience in planning and implementing plant breeding projects. Evidence of ability to publish scientific papers is required.

Experience in running a research station would be a definite advantage.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Director, National Agricultural Research Station, Kitale, for technical matters relating to maize breeding genetics including inservice training and supervision of research workers. He will be involved in implementing one of the regional maize improvement programmes. He will be stationed at the National Agricultural Research Station, Kitale.

Senior Research Officer (Cotton Research) (One Post) (No. 290/77)

Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a B.Sc. degree in Agriculture or post-graduate qualifications in plant breeding, agronomy or entomology, at an M.Sc. or Ph.D. level. They should have three years' experience in planning and conducting crop production research. Experience in Cotton Production and running a research station would be a definite advantage.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Director of Research for the overall direction of the National Cotton Research Programme; inservice training and supervision of research workers. He will be directly involved in Cotton research in the field of his specialization. He will be stationed at the Cotton Research Station, Kibos.

Senior Research Officer (Animal Production) (One Post) (No. 291/77)

Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a B.Sc. degree plus a post-graduate qualification in Animal production or genetics at the M.Sc. or Ph.D. level. They should have three years' experience in animal production research. Evidence or demonstrated ability in planning and conducting research and publishing scientific research papers will be required.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Director, National Animal Husbandry Research Station, Naivasha for technical direction of one of the major national animal production research programmes, and inservice training and supervision of research workers within his area of specialization. He will be stationed at Naivasha.

Senior Research Officer (Crop Production) (One Post) (No. 292/77)

Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should possess a B.Sc. degree in Agriculture plus a post-graduate qualification in plant breeding or agronomy at the M.Sc. or Ph.D. level. They should have at least three years' experience in planning and conducting research. Running a large research project would be a definite advantage.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Director of Research for all technical and administrative matters related to either the national pasture species and forage improvement and seed production programmes or overall direction of regional agricultural station, Kitale or Nyanza Agricultural Research Station, Kisii.

Applicants should possess the East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent, with at least three years' practical experience in duties related to commerce or other similar fields. Preference will be given to candidates with considerable experience and knowledge of the Government Commercial and trade policy. Possession of the Royal Society of Arts Stage II or III in Book-keeping, Accountancy or successful completion of an Executive Course either at the Kenya Institute of Administration or at the Government Training Institute, Maseno, would be an added advantage.

Senior Clerical Officer (Two Posts) (No. 296/77)

Salary scale.—£642 to £900 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be civil servants of East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent with a minimum of five years satisfactory and appropriate clerical experience within the grade of which at least two years must be in the grade of Higher Clerical Officer. Applicants must have done and passed the Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers.

A sound knowledge of Government Regulations and ability to control staff and conduct correspondence is essential.

Applicants must be mature civil servants with not less than five years' experience in a responsible position. They should have passed the final examination of a recognized professional accounting body but applicants who have passed the intermediate examination of a recognized professional accounting body and/or who have had several years' experience of the Education Grant-in-Aid Rules related to the maintained and assisted schools may be considered. The successful candidate will be required, besides performing audit duties, to give advice and guidance to Headmasters/Principals of Boards of Governors' institutions and Provincial Education Officers on the preparation and submission of estimates and the introduction of a uniform system of accounting at educational institutions. He will be posted to the Headquarters in Nairobi, and will be required to travel extensively throughout Kenya in the course of his duties.

Auditor Grade II (Three Posts) (No. 198/77)

Salary scale.—£1,446 to £1,938 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be of East African Certificate of Education Standard. They should have at least passed the Intermediate stage of a recognized professional accountancy body or hold a degree of an approved University with Accountancy and/or Auditing as a major field of study, and have at least three years' experience in auditing. Applicants not in possession of the above requirements but who have had several years' experience in the control of finance and accounts of Maintained and Assisted Institutions will be also considered.

The successful candidates will be directed in their work from the Ministry's Headquarters and be posted to Provinces, where they will be expected to conduct correspondence with educational institutions and prepare Balance Sheets and Income and Expenditure Accounts. In addition they will be required to assist Heads of Educational Institutions to resolve problems in connexion with Finance, Accounts and Estimates.

Applicants should be civil servants with considerable experience in all areas of personnel work and must have shown ability and merit in the performance of their duties over a period of at least three years in the grade of Personnel Officer I. They should be in possession of a recognized professional qualification in Personnel Management and/or must have completed Personnel Management Course for Senior Officers.

Successful candidates will be required either to head a Personnel Unit of a Ministry or to work as general line assistant to a Chief Personnel Officer.

Lecturer Grade I (One Post) (No. 301/77)

Applicants must possess a Master's degree in Social Work or Social Psychology and must have had teaching experience as well as experience of work in a social agency. The successful candidate will be required to teach Human Growth and Development and an Introductory Course in Social Sciences to Social Workers, Probation Officers and Community Development Trainees at the Kenya Institute of Administration, to conduct seminars and tutorials within the Development of Social Development, and to co-ordinate the Psychiatric Social Work sequence of the curriculum. In addition, he is required to organize study visits and arrange student's field placements, and to supervise students in the course of their field practice.

Lecturer Grade I (One Post) (No. 302/77)

Salary scale.—£1,734 to £2,334 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must possess a Master's degree in a Social Science, and should ideally be able to offer a combination of Psychology and Management/Administration. He is required to teach psychology-based-management subjects to middle and senior level management and administration courses at the Kenya Institute of Administration and must possess a good personality and the ability to interact, in classroom and seminar situations, with very senior officers from both the civil service and the private sector. He is expected to organize senior courses within the Department of Public Administration, and to undertake considerable administrative responsibilities in connexion with them. Superintendent (Buildings) (Four Posts) (No. 304/77)

Salary scale.—£1,446 to £1,938 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must possess the East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent.

They must have passed an approved apprenticeship test or completed training in an approved and recognized building trade, and must have passed the Building Technician Certificate from the Kenya Polytechnic or its equivalent, followed by at least 6 years practical experience 4 of which must have been in a supervisory capacity.

They must have administrative ability.

They must possess relevant experience and knowledge of the following:—

- (a) Administration of Government Buildings.
- (b) Administration and supervision of Building Contracts.
- (c) Thorough knowledge of Government Regulations and procedures related to buildings, stores, staff and financial control.
- (d) Ability to read and interpret Architect's drawings, structural Engineer's drawings, Electrical and Mechanical Engineer's drawings.

- (j) Knowledge of water supplies and Civil Engineering Works (Roads) would be an added advantage.

2. Plans of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or at the office of the Council, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3, post free.

3. Applications should be submitted to the District Commissioner, P.O. Box 1921, Kisumu, for the plots at Ahero.

4. Applications must be sent so as to reach the District Commissioner, P.O. Box 1921, Kisumu, not later than noon on 17th October, 1977.

5. Applicants must enclose with their applications, their postal order, or banker's order, for Sh. 1,000 (personal cheques are not acceptable), as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- (c) If the application is successful but the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below of the General Conditions, the Council may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

6. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

- (a) the amount of capital it is proposed to spend on the project;
- (b) the amount of actual capital available for development with a banker's letter or other evidence of financial status in support;
- (c) the manner in which it is proposed to raise the balance of the capital required for the development if any;
- (d) full details of both residential and/or commercial properties owned by the applicant in the same market.

Ordinary Conditions

1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature, except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.

2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Trust Land Act (Cap. 288) of the Laws of Kenya, and the title will be registered under the Registration of Titles Act.

3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.

4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.

5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Clerk to Council, within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and a proportion of annual rent, together with the legal fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 400) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per centum of the stand premium and annual rent).

In default of payment within the specified period, the council may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

1. The grantee shall complete the erection of approved buildings on the land within 24 months of the commencement of the term.

2. The erection of buildings shall not be commenced until plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for disposing of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof have been approved in writing by the lessor and by any authority whose approval is required by law. Such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications shall be submitted for approval in triplicate.

3. The grantee shall maintain the buildings and the drainage system in good repair and conditions to the satisfaction of the grantor.

4. No additions shall be made to the approved buildings without the prior consent in writing of the grantor.

5. The land shall only be used for shops, offices and flats and the grantee shall throughout the term and to the satisfaction of the grantor, make substantial use of the land for such purposes.

6. The land shall not be used in any manner which the grantor considers to be dangerous or offensive to the public or the neighbourhood.

7. The land shall not be subdivided.

8. The land shall not be charged, sublet or subleased or transferred without the prior consent of the grantor in writing. No application of or such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 1 has been performed.

9. The grantee shall pay all sums that may from time to time be demanded by the grantor in respect of the cost of construction, maintaining, repairing, improving and renewing all roads, drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land.

10. The grantee shall be responsible for all rates, taxes, charges or duties of whatever description that may be levied, imposed or charged by the Government or any local authority upon the land or the buildings.

11. The grantee shall on receipt of notice in writing in that behalf from the grantor forthwith adequately fence or hedge the land and shall thereafter maintain such fence or hedge to the satisfaction of the grantor.

12. The grantor or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purposes shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone and telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions either overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

13. The buildings shall not cover more than 75 per cent of the area of the land if used for shops and/or office purposes only or such lesser area of the land as may be laid down by the Local Authority in its By-laws, and not more than 50 per cent of the area of the land if used for combined purposes of shops, offices and flats, or such lesser area as may be laid down by the Local Authority in its By-laws.

14. The grantor reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th years of the term hereby granted. Such rentals will be at the rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

Dismissal of Francis Kiruja.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Meru Central Farmers Co-operative Union Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 24th March, 19th April, 11th and 12th July and 23rd August, 1977 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:—

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 28th June, 1976 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 20th January, 1977 along with the statutory certificate signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Francis Kiruja started working for the Respondents as a secretary with effect from 1st October, 1970. Prior to that he had been working for the Meru Farmers Co-operative Union Ltd. which later split up.

It is not disputed that Mr. Kiruja has had extensive training in the co-operative management after having been sponsored by the Respondents for that purpose in addition to which he has also attended and taken part in many seminars on the co-operative movement.

In 1974 Mr. Kiruja had stood for election for a seat on the Meru Municipal Council and was successful after defeating F. Murugu who was the Mayor of Meru. In January 1975 Mr. Murugu was the personnel officer with the Respondents.

On 1st March, 1975 Mr. Kiruja was served with a letter of termination of service which read as follows:—

"The Management Committee of this Union under its Minute No. 26/75 (a) of 28th February, 1975 directed me to write to you and inform you that your services as the Secretary of Ntima Farmers Co-operative Society Ltd. are terminated with effect from 1st March, 1975.

The Committee decided that you will be paid one month's salary in lieu of notice."

Mr. Kiruja although an employee of the Respondents during the aforesaid period had been seconded to the Ntima Farmers Co-operative Society Ltd. as a secretary/manager and as a result of the salary increases he received during the years of service with the Respondents his salary at the time of the termination of his service was Sh. 1,400 p.m.

The Management Committee of the Respondents at its meeting of 28th February, 1975 when the above decision was taken to terminate Mr. Kiruja's services had before it a memorandum from some farmers of Ntima Society who had signed themselves "exploited members of Ntima Farmers Co-operative Society" and they were ten in number. It also had a letter which its general manager had written to Mr. Kiruja on 20th January, 1975 in which reference is made to salary advances to himself and other graded and ungraded employees of the Ntima Society. A report by B. Mbaka, an employee of the Co-operative Department, as a result of an investigation carried out by him concerning the financial affairs of the Ntima Society was also considered. Finally a letter dated 26th February, 1975 from the Chairman of the Ntima Society was also before the Committee.

The Claimants took up the matter on behalf of Mr. Kiruja and got in touch with the Respondents on 17th March, 1975 and were informed by the Respondents' general manager that Mr. Kiruja had been dismissed summarily for gross misconduct. On 7th August, 1975 the Claimants reported a trade dispute on the wrongful termination of service of Mr. Kiruja to the Minister for Labour. An official investigation was carried out and on 4th May, 1976, the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, forwarded the following findings and recommendation to the parties as a basis for the settlement of this dispute:—

"During the seven years of service Mr. Kiruja rendered to his employer, he seems to have pleased his employer for which he and not others was sent for training overseas. His salary too was advanced from Sh. 633 to Sh. 1,400 p.m.

Among all the Secretary/Managers the employer had, Mr. Kiruja had the highest on-the-job qualifications. The employer submits that Mr. Kiruja was irresponsible in his duties, inefficient and negligent; for this his services were terminated.

From the employer's submission one is given to understand that the mistakes of Mr. Kiruja were not a one-day affair but committed over a long period; but there does not seem to have been any mistake-correction by the employer. If Mr. Kiruja was irresponsible, inefficient and negligent it would have been reasonable for all purposes, to caution him of his shortcomings; he should have been warned; he should have been given a chance to reconsider his responsibility.

In view of the above, I find Mr. Kiruja had his services wrongfully terminated; Mr. Kiruja should have been warned about his irresponsibility, inefficiency and negligence. In recommendation, I find Mr. Kiruja should be reinstated or be paid compensation for the loss of his job. Compensation should be three months' salary in addition to his terminal benefits."

The Claimants during the hearing stressed that Mr. Kiruja's services had been terminated for political reasons as he had defeated the former Mayor of Meru who in early 1975 was the personnel officer of the Respondents. Later Mr. Kiruja did not support the Respondents' vice-chairman who was contesting a parliamentary seat.

They drew the Court's attention to the fact that during Mr. Kiruja's seven years' service first with the Meru Farmers Co-operative Union and then with the Respondents he had not been served with any letters of warning.

Regarding all the other allegations that he had given salary advances without the approval of the general manager, that he had cashed his own cheques, that he had failed to keep proper accounting books and proper records, given advances to farmers without due authority, loss of stores and failing to keep with his work the Claimants had this to say.

Mr. Kiruja could not make any payment either to himself or to anyone else without the authority and signatures of the chairman and treasurer along with his own signature. Therefore it followed that the Ntima Society had authorized the salary advances which in any case did not exceed one month's salary.

Mr. Kiruja had cashed a personal cheque of Sh. 50 but that money had been paid as the cheque had been honoured. In any case the treasurer/cashier was the one who had cashed the cheque.

On the rest of the allegations the Claimants maintained that it was up to the Respondents to prove all of them. As far as they were concerned Mr. Kiruja had not defaulted at all in that respect.

The Respondents on the other had vigorously submitted that Mr. Kiruja by virtue of being secretary/manager of the Ntima Society had a great responsibility in ensuring that the affairs of the Society were run and conducted strictly in accordance with the Co-operative Societies Act, and the Co-operative Societies Rules. They maintained that it was the function and the responsibility of Mr. Kiruja to ensure that the Ntima Management Society did not pass resolutions or act in a manner which was inconsistent and in contravention of the relevant regulations.

The Respondents referred to the various appendices in their written submission particularly to two reports by Mr. Mbaka dated 20th January, 1974 and 13th February, 1974 in which certain irregularities have been exposed for which the Respondents blame Mr. Kiruja. These are as follows.

The Chairman of Ntima Society, Mr. Ringera, had received advances against his coffee crop without taking into account the total loan outstanding in his account with the result that he was unable to repay Sh. 4,448.45. The advance payment voucher had not been forwarded to the banking section for deduction during the payout. Mr. Mbaka found that Mr. Ringera owed the Society a sum of Sh. 8,438.45 as at 20th January, 1974 while other members had been able to repay their advances.

The salary advances to Mr. Kiruja of Sh. 1,400 and other five graded employees totalling in all Sh. 4,510 are also mentioned. There is also an allegation that a sum of Sh. 1,525 had been advanced to some other employees and there was no arrangement as to the recovery of this amount.

Mr. Mbaka made the following comments and conclusion:—

"Comments

1. The way in which cash is handled in this Society is highly questionable as the facts stand in No. 1 to 3.
2. The Chairman of this Society is milking Society's economy indirectly by giving himself advances which are never recovered.
3. There is need to call urgent Society's Management Committee to discuss the affairs of this Society concerning financial control.
4. The Chief Accountant summon the Secretary to answer why he is advancing salaries to his Staff without his knowledge still incurring Capital expenditure without his consent.

Conclusion

By failing to submit the Advance Voucher of Sh. 3,000 to the Banking Section so as the Advance could be recovered during coffee payout, it shows very clearly that there are a lot of things hidden at the Society's level."

In the other report Mr. Mbaka stated that a sum of Sh. 22,921.50 had been collected after selling coffee seedlings in November 1974 but only a sum of Sh. 7,302 had been banked with the balance having been spent without the authority of the District Co-operative Officer.

Mr. Mbaka also refers to an incident regarding a lorry and illegal coffee advances and to a "Stuart" engine.

The Respondents referred the Court to rule 34 (1) and 35 (1) of the Co-operative Societies Rules 1969, L.N. 175 and added that Mr. Kiruja was made responsible and accountable under section 38 of Ntima Society's by-laws for the day to day efficient management of the Society as required by rule 34 (1).

The Respondents maintained that they had established gross neglect of duty on the part of Mr. Kiruja through their documentary and verbal evidence which justified termination of Mr. Kiruja's services. Finally they stated that Mr. Kiruja was employed to run the Ntima Society which he nearly succeeded in ruining.

The Court has noted that the Ntima Society was not happy at the decision of the Respondents in sacking their secretary/manager, Mr. Kiruja, and in fact made representations to the Respondents disagreeing with the ruling by the Respondents' Management Committee made at its meeting of 28th February, 1975 and advocated Mr. Kiruja's reinstatement with minimum delay. This is all very interesting because the chairman of Ntima Society, Mr. Ringera, who obviously was a direct party and involved in all the alleged malpractices on the part of Mr. Kiruja had on 17th November, 1973 privately written against Mr. Kiruja to the Respondents' general manager as there is no record of that letter in the Ntima Society's files. Mr. Ringera made serious allegations against Mr. Kiruja in that letter and informed the Respondents' general manager that it was the feeling of the Ntima Society's Management Committee that Mr. Kiruja should be dismissed instantly. In the same letter Mr. Ringera wrote that on second thoughts the Ntima Society preferred Mr. Kiruja to be transferred to some other place and another person should be sent as the secretary to their society.

The Court is satisfied that Mr. Ringera with the active assistance of Mr. Kiruja had benefited from the Society by obtaining loans which were not repaid from the monies due to Mr. Ringera. The benefits to Mr. Ringera from this are obvious. Mr. Kiruja on the other had also taken full advantage of this sort of arrangement with the chairman of the Society in helping himself to a salary advance of Sh. 1,400 and obtaining salary advances for other five graded employees to the total extent of Sh. 4,510. The arrangement regarding these advances was that they were recoverable in ten monthly instalments at the Society's level whereas the graded employees are paid their salaries by the Respondents and in any case they cannot be advanced salary beyond one month. If these salary advances are to be construed as loans to these employees, who the Claimants alleged were also members of the Society, even then they are unauthorized.

The Court gets a clear picture of what was going on in the Ntima Society in that the chairman, Mr. Ringera, was benefiting as a result of Mr. Kiruja completely overlooking the provisions of the Co-operative Societies Act and Co-operative Societies Rules for some advantage to himself. The Court has applied its mind to the Claimants' contention that Mr. Kiruja had no option but to obey the instructions of the Ntima Society as conveyed to him by the chairman but the Court must point out

that Mr. Kiruja as a result of all the training that he had received in the co-operative movement and in the management of its affairs knew fully well or ought to have known that in certain very vital aspects he was allowing the Ntima Society to function outside the Regulations. Mr. Kiruja cannot escape his responsibility in this regard as he being the secretary/manager was supposed to ensure that the farmers who comprise the Ntima Society operated within the legal provisions regarding the co-operative movement. The Court is satisfied that Mr. Kiruja clearly defaulted in this respect particularly in not ensuring that the money realized from the coffee seedlings was promptly banked in the Society's account and that the loan advanced to the chairman was recovered when monies were due to him from the Society. Further he had no business to advance himself and five other graded employees money either by way of a loan or a salary advance from the Society's funds as all the graded employees got their salaries from the Respondents.

The Court finds it most surprising that despite the memorandum from the ten so-called exploited members of the Ntima Society, Mr. Ringera and a number of other members of the Management Committee were re-elected. So obviously the exploited members were in the minority. The fact, however, remains that whatever prompted an investigation into the affairs of the Ntima Society it has revealed certain irregularities some of them pretty serious and other being minor. Mr. Kiruja with all his experience and length of service was certainly capable of avoiding them and in case of undue pressure from Mr. Ringera, the chairman of the Ntima Society, or any other Management Committee member, he could have referred the matter to the Respondents but there is no evidence at all of his having done so.

It is the relationship between Mr. Ringera and Mr. Kiruja that is mainly the reason why these malpractices at the Ntima Society continued for such a long time.

The Court, however, must also find that the Respondents in a way were also partly responsible for this state of affairs in that if they had carried out regular checks as they are required to do then they would have found these defaults much earlier.

The Court finds it rather unfortunate that the Respondents terminated Mr. Kiruja's services before the Respondents' accountant had carried out his inspection as a result of a decision taken at a meeting of 28th February, 1975.

The Court finds that the Respondents were rather confused on whether Mr. Kiruja was to be summarily dismissed for gross misconduct as claimed by them or that his services were to be terminated by giving him the required notice as laid down in his letter of appointment. In the event the Respondents while claiming that they had summarily dismissed Mr. Kiruja gave him one month's salary in lieu of notice whereas paragraph 3 of Mr. Kiruja's letter of appointment reads as follows:—

"This appointment can be terminated at any time by three months' notice on either side or payment of equivalent salary in lieu of notice except in the case of gross incompetence, dishonesty or misconduct, when you are liable to instant dismissal."

The Claimants' allegation that Mr. Kiruja was victimized because of his political success against the personnel officer of the Respondents at best can be considered a "red herring" in the backdrop of all the circumstances of this dispute and the Court does not find that the Claimants have succeeded in proving this allegation.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that Mr. Kiruja did deserve a termination of service but the Respondents did not intend to hand out a summary dismissal to him. Instead they wanted him to suffer a normal termination. In these circumstances and after careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that Mr. Kiruja should be given another two months' salary in lieu of notice in addition to the one month's salary already offered by the Respondents in order to bring his termination under paragraph three of his letter of appointment.

The Court directs that the three months' notice for termination of Mr. Kiruja's services should be effective from 1st April, 1975 which would mean that he should be paid salary for the month of March in addition to three months' salary in lieu of notice.

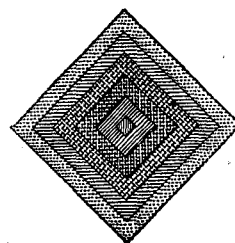

Applications for registration in Part A of the Register are shown with the official number unaccompanied by any letter. Applications for Part B are distinguished by the letter B prefixed to the official number.

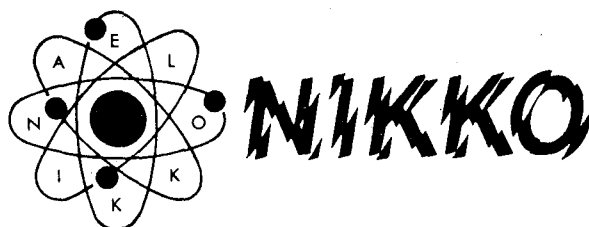
