6 Applicants must enclose with their applications their cash for Sh 400 as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows —

- If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plots within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him
- If the application is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be returned to him

General Conditions

1 The ordinary conditions applicable to township lease of this nature except as varied hereby, shall apply to this lease

3 The lease will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application and the name must be in full

4 The term of the lease will be for 33 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the allocation of the plot. And the term of the lease will be converted to 99 years in due course in cases where development is of high standard

Special Conditions

1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall addition or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specification previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the Local Authority. The Commissioner of Lands shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily

2 The lessee shall within six calendar months of the actual registration of the lease submit in triplicate to the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for disposing of sewage, surface and sullage water, drawings and specification of the buildings the lessee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the actual registration of the lease complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with plans, drawings, elevation and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act if default shall be made on the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this conditions it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re enter into and upon the land or any part thereof, in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner of Lands in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

3 The lessee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and conditions all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the lessee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the lessee's expense), accept a surrender of land comprised herein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the lessee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the lessee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. 5 Applicants must enclose with their applications their postal order or banker's order for K Sh 1,000 as a deposit, (N B—Personal cheques are not acceptable) which will be dealt with as follows —

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him
- (b) If the applicant is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him
- (c) If the application is successful but the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below of the general conditions, the Council may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

6 Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

1 The Domestic and Hotel Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Social Service League shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 30th day of November 1977 and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form A' dated 2nd October, 1976 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 6th October, 1977 along with the statutory certificates signed by the Labour Commissioner and the Minister for Labour

James Gachaga was appointed as a cleaner by the Respondents with effect from 5th October, 1967 although a formal letter of appointment was issued to him on 30th August, 1974

On 20th March, 1976 his services were summarily terminated for having committed an offence on 15th March, 1976 the details of which will be gone into hereinafter In his letter of termination it was also stated that he had already been issued with three warning letters previous to the offence committed on 15th March 1976

His dismissal was the subject matter of investigation by the Ministry of Labour and on 11th March 1977 the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, forwarded his findings and conclusion to the parties as follows

There is no dispute that prior to his dismissal Mr Gachaga had been issued with some warnings and the only thing that the union could say was that a member of the management had a personal grudge against Mr Gachaga For sure if there was any element of truth in the union's allegation then the union should have stepped into the matter prior to Mr Gachaga's dismissal and challenge the warnings issued to him There is no mention of such a step having

been taken by the union In the absence of that the warnings should be regarded as valid There is a provision for summary dismissal on the collective agreement negotiated between the parties and the reasons enumerated in this agreement are very similar to those which caused the dismissal of Mr Gachaga

Conclusion

After going through the submissions made by the parties I find the action taken by the management to be justified "

In the parties' collective agreement a warning procedure is laid out which requires that the first, second and third warnings will be recorded in the employee's employment record and the union's chief shopsteward or his assistant shall be informed and that a copy of the third warning shall be sent to the Nairobi branch secretary of the union

The first warning letter is dated 23rd January, 1975 in which Mr Gachaga is accused of having shown reluctance, laziness and at times disobedience to the doctor of X ray department Besides this it was pointed out that his time keeping had also been very irregular Mr Gachaga did not accept the accusations against him and gave his explanation and asked for the letter to be withdrawn He replied on 30th January, 1975

On 22nd May, 1975 he was issued with a second letter of warning in which it is stated

"We would also refer to the recent conversation between yourself, Messrs Mumo, Bramuel, Ben and the undersigned whereby we informed you that you had left your work and went out of the Hospital premises for your own purpose without informing anyone We consider this offence as gross negligence on your part "

There seems to be no reply to this letter although the Claimants submitted on his behalf that Mr Gachaga had gone out for his morning cup of tea at the nearest kiosk and that he had come back at 10 30 a m and was absent for half an hour only C R Pereira, the Executive Officer, had sent three persons to look for him during this time and when he came back he gave his explanation to Mr Pereira who refused to accept it

The third warning letter was issued to Mr Gachaga on 30th October, 1975 when it is alleged that he refused to clean the Board Room when he was asked to do so and it was recorded that he had again started to report late on duty

There appears to be no explanation either written or verbal to this warning letter

The incident that led to his summary dismissal took place on 15th March, 1976 when it was alleged that he was given two orders at 10 30 a.m. to collect small parcels from town but instead of collecting the parcels he delivered the orders and came back at 2 30 p.m. without collecting the goods which were required most urgently that afternoon.

The Claimants submitted that Mr Gachaga in addition to the delivery of the orders and the collection of the small parcels had been given to deliver some 95 letters to the Respondents' Board members and that he forgot to collect the orders from Taws Ltd which in any case he would have collected at 2 30 in the afternoon.

The Claimants further alleged that this was a case of hatred which the Executive Officer, Mr Pereira, had for Mr Gachaga and he had therefore picked up on very minor incidents in order to serve him with letters of warning. They stated that on one occasion Mr Pereira had said while rejecting Mr Gachaga's explanation, "You have become very lazy and you are not allowed to go for tea breaks because you are an office messenger."

The Claimants added on another occasion Mr Pereira is alleged to have said 'I have been hunting Mr Gachaga for a long time and now I have got him. I should dismiss his service and even if the company will not pay him his entitlements I will pay him my own money.'

These words are alleged to have been uttered by Mr Pereira during the last and the final incident when the chairman of the works committee had gone to see him about Mr Gachaga's suspension.

The Respondents maintained that they had strictly followed the warning procedure as laid down in the collective agreement and that all the warning letters were legitimate. They added that Mr Gachaga was a very unsatisfactory employee and the kind of gross negligence that he had shown on 15th March, 1976 when he had returned to the Hospital at 2 30 p.m. without the parcels which were urgently required by them could not be tolerated and he had been suspended from employment immediately pending the decision of the Management Committee.

The Respondents stated that his services had been terminated summarily on 20th March, 1976 for justifiable cause and he was paid for 20 days that he had worked in March 1976 along with 20 days proportionate housing allowance and pay in lieu of ten days prorata leave making a total of Sh 351 subject to deductions for N.S.S.F. and advance taken.

The Respondents submitted that the Claimants had resorted to telling lies in Court in order to build up a case for their member, and added that acts of gross negligence for one's duties can lead to not only material loss but could lead to loss of life or lives and no employer can be expected to condone such acts.

The Court gets an overall picture of an employee whose approach to his work was very casual but at the same time there seems to be a strong feeling on the part of the Executive Officer to get rid of him.

The Court notes that most of the warning letters were contested by Mr Gachaga and the second letter of warning which was issued to him on 22nd May, 1975 is very vague on certain important aspects like the time when Mr Gachaga is alleged to have left the Hospital and the time when he had reported back. In fact there is no mention of the time at all in the warning letter.

The Court has decided on the submissions made that this particular letter of warning was not justified. In view of this finding the Court has come to the conclusion that although Mr Gachaga did deserve a termination, summary dismissal was rather harsh.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that Mr Gachaga's dismissal should be reduced to normal termination and he should be given pay in lieu of notice and any other benefits to which he may be entitled in accordance with the parties' collective agreement.
