3. The lessee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and conditions all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the lessee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they/is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the lessee's expense) accept a surrender of land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the lessee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land or (2) at any subsequent time to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the lessee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

THE TRUST LAND ACT (Cap. 288)

KUTUS AND WANGURU TOWNSHIPS—ALLIENATION OF VACANT PLOTS FOR RESIDENTIAL, COMMERCIAL AND LIGHT INDUSTRIAL PURPOSES

3. Applications should be submitted to the District Commissioner, Kirinyaga District, P.O. Box 1, Kerugoya, for the above plots.

4. Applications must be sent so as to reach the District Commissioner, Kirinyaga District, P.O. Box 1, Kerugoya, not later than noon on Monday, 17th April, 1978.

5. Applicants must enclose with their applications their postal order or banker's order for K.Sh. 1,000 as a deposit. (N.B.—Personal cheques are not acceptable) which will be dealt with as follows:—

- If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- If the applicant is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- If the application is successful but the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below of the general conditions, the Council may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

6. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

- the amount of capital it is proposed to spend on the project;
- the amount of actual capital available for development with a bankers letter or evidence of financial status in support;
- the manner in which it is proposed to raise the balance of the capital required for the development if any;
- full details of both residential and/or commercial properties owned by the applicant in the same township.

Ordinary Conditions

1. The Ordinary Conditions applicable to Township Grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.

2. The grant will be made under the provisions of Trust Land Act (Cap. 288) of the Laws of Kenya, and the title will be registered under the Registered Land Act (Cap. 300).

3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.

4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.

5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Clerk to Council, within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and a proportion of annual rent, together with the legal fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 400) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per centum of the stand premium and annual rent).

In default of payment within the specified period, the Council may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

10. The allottee shall be responsible for all rates, taxes, charges or duties of whatever description that may be levied, imposed or charged by the Government or any Local Government Authority upon the land or buildings.

13. The buildings shall not cover more area of the land as may be laid down by the Local Authority, in its by-laws.

NOTICE is hereby given that any person who has grounds of opposition to the registration of any of the trade marks advertised herein according to the classes may, within 60 days from the date of this Gazette, lodge notice of opposition on Form T.M. No. 6 (in duplicate) together with a fee of Sh. 50.

Notice is also hereby given that official objection will be taken under rule 21 (3) to all applications in which the specification claims all the goods included in any class unless the Registrar is satisfied that the claim is justified by the use of the mark which the applicant has made, or intends to make if and when it is registered. Where an applicant considers that a claim in respect of all the goods included in a class can be justified it will save unnecessary delay in examining applications if a claim is filed simultaneously with the application, accompanied in appropriate cases by supporting documents.

The period for lodging notice of opposition may be extended by the Registrar as he thinks fit and upon such terms as he may direct. Any request for such extension should be made to the Registrar so as to reach him before the expiry of the period allowed.

Formal opposition should not be lodged until after reasonable notice has been given by letter to the applicant for registration so as to afford him any opportunity of withdrawing his application before the expense of preparing the notice of opposition is incurred. Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an opponent for an order for costs if the opposition is uncontested by the applicant.

Where it is stated in the advertisement of the applicant that the mark, upon its registration, is to be limited to certain colours, the colours are, as far as possible, indicated in the accompanying representations of the mark in the usual heraldic manner.
