AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 3rd August, 1977, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 30th September, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The history of this dispute goes back to 1969 when as a result of the exodus of the non-Kenyans from the country many Africans were appointed to the posts formerly occupied by them. This happened in the Respondents' undertaking also with particular reference to the posts of Check Clerks.

The Claimants have alleged that these Check Clerks in fact are Section Heads but because of what is stated in the first paragraph the Respondents adopted a policy of lowering their status just because Africans had occupied these posts.

This matter simmered along and in 1971 the parties appeared before the Court in Cause No. 27 of 1971 in which the issues

in dispute were four—job title, probationery period on promotion, acting allowance and salary increase. During the hearing of that dispute the Claimants had introduced submissions relating to these Check Clerks working for the Respondents and the Court in its award stated that it was not clear whether the complaint in respect of Check Clerks was raised under the issue of probationary period on promotion or the issue of acting allowance. The Court further added that the most it could extract from the written and verbal submissions was that the Claimants maintained that these Check Clerks working for the Respondents should be declared to be on probation for promotion to Section Heads and the Court should rule that they are employees working in acting capacity as Section Heads; therefore they should be paid acting allowance in terms of the Claimants' demand under that issue. The Court directed that the parties should be able to go into the problem of these employees themselves.

It is obvious that the Claimants were pressing a demand for extra remuneration for these Check Clerks and they attempted in Cause No. 27 of 1971 to get them this extra remuneration by way of an acting allowance but for the reasons stated therein they did not succeed.

Following the aforesaid Court award the parties set up a sub-committee in 1972 consisting of their representatives. This sub-committee visited the Respondents' Kenyatta Avenue branch on a couple of occasions and it is not disputed that it was apparent that some confusion and misunderstanding was there as to the duties which Check Clerks and Section Heads are required to perform. This resulted in a few Check Clerks being promoted to Section Heads as a result of a subsequent examination by the Respondents of this matter in all their branches.

The Claimants, however, kept on pressing the Respondents on this matter and as a result on 28th May, 1973, their Staff Manager wrote a letter to the Claimants in which he wrote the following paragraph:—

"You made the point that prior to the October, 1969, revision certain posts were regarded as Section Head posts but they were now occupied by Check Clerks. You were reminded that in 1969 it became clear that to the bank that the ratio of staff who supervised the work of others, to clerks was too high, i.e. there were too many supervisory officials in relation to the number of clerks included in the approved establishments. All establishments were then examined and where necessary reduced establishment in the Section Head and Senior Grades were promulgated. The decision to make these changes was one which Management was, of course, entitled to take. The bank accepted that some confusion and misunderstanding had been apparent as to the duties which Check Clerks and Section Heads were required to perform. The position had however now been adjusted and all Check Clerks were required to perform only clerical duties under the supervision of staff of the minimum rank of Section Head."

The matter dragged on and was discussed at a Banks' Joint Negotiating Council meeting held in February/March, 1974. It is recorded in the minutes that the Claimants explained that this was a matter that had been outstanding for a long time and they recapitulated what had transpired and pointed out that it had been apparent to the sub-committee which had looked into the matter that Check Clerks were to all intents and purposes carrying out the duties of Section Heads. In view of this the Claimants demanded that all Check Clerks working for the Respondents should forthwith be promoted to Section Heads. The Kenya Bankers' Employers Association had maintained that as a result of an examination of all the Respondents' branches in October, 1969, they had reduced the number of staff who supervised the work of others as a ratio of this category of staff to clerks had been found to be too high. They stated that this decision concerned management only. They accepted that some confusion and misunderstanding was apparent in 1972 as to the duties that the Check Clerks and Section Heads were required to perform. As a result of further examination the matter had been adjusted and since then all Check Clerks and other clerks were required to perform only clerical duties under the supervision of staff of the minimum rank of Section Heads.

It is recorded in these minutes that the Respondents at that time employed 125 Check Clerks and they maintained that their duties were purely clerical and it would therefore be quite unreasonable and unjustified for them to be promoted to Section Heads as demanded by the Claimants.

There was no agreement on this issue which was deadlocked.

The next step in this dispute is the investigation carried out by the Ministry of Labour as a result of a dispute having been reported on the issue of Check Clerks by the Claimants soon after, the deadlock at the J.N.C. meeting. The findings and the recommendations of the Investigator were forwarded to the parties on 4th July, 1977, and these were as follows:—

"Findings-

A physical check by the investigator in three branches of the Bank at Nairobi (Kenyatta Avenue), Nyeri and Nakuru in company of representatives of the Union and Management was made in order to get a better picture of the issue in dispute.

The investigator had the opportunity in these branches of interviewing Check Clerks, Section Heads and other employees. In Nairobi, however, those interviewed seemed difficult and sort of concealed information which could have helped in the determination of the dispute. In the other branches which are smaller, a clearer distinction of the duties of the Check Clerks and those of Section Heads existed as confirmed by a Check Clerk and a Section Head at both Nyeri and Nakuru.

The Union are claiming that the Check Clerks and Section Heads are almost one and the same and that Check Clerks seem to be treated differently. On the other hand the Management maintain that Section Heads are senior than Check Clerks and do different duties. The crux of the matter lies in the duties of these two offices. While the Union has tried to prove their point they have not convincingly been able to show that Check Clerks also do supervise other employees and are responsible for sections in the bank. This is further supported by the Check Clerks interviewed who confirmed that they have still to refer to the Section Heads in cases of any confirmation and in their day-to-day duties.

Recommendation-

It is apparent that the jobs of Check Clerks and Section Heads are two different categories of jobs carrying different responsibilities. Mass promotion of Check Clerks to Section Heads as demanded by Union is therefore not recommended."

The Claimants are still not happy and have brought the dispute to the Court for a ruling.

During the hearing the Claimants in addition to relying on their submissions which they had put forward all along as set out hereinabove called witnesses and produced documentary evidence in order to prove that the Check Clerks were not clerks and did not perform clerical duties only but did the same work as Section Heads.

The Respondents on the other hand have substantially relied on the position which they had adopted at the J.N. C. meeting and added that if the Claimants' demand was met it would nearly double the number of Section Heads in their undertaking which was 171 in August, 1977. As against this the Check Clerks at the same time were 160.

The Respondents pointed out that the duties performed by the Check Clerks in their bank were the same which were carried out by Passing Clerks, Ledger Reference Clerks in the Kenya Commercial Bank and Barclays Bank but they did concede that these workers in these two banks did not check the work of other clerks but maintained that checking was clerical work.

The Respondents also drew the Court's attention to the fact that an award in favour of the Claimants would be creating a very dangerous precedent in respect of clerical staff and would definitely be discriminatory.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions, the evidence of witnesses called by the parties and the documents tendered in support thereof the Court has made the following findings:—

1. The problem of the Check Clerks in the Respondents' undertaking has been the subject matter of discussion from the time of the exodus of the non-Kenyans in 1969. The Court is satisfied that the Check Clerks had been in existence prior to 1969 and that they were not created when Africans were promoted to these posts.

There is also the fact that in 1972 the sub-committee that was set up by the parties found that some confusion and misunderstanding had arisen as to the duties which Check Clerks and Section Heads were required to perform. This clearly indicates that to a certain extent there was overlapping in the duties of these two categories of workers. The Court has noted that the Respondents promoted some 11 Check Clerks to be Section Heads after this review and hoped that would solve the problem. In fact they maintained that that was the end of the problem as far as they are concerned.

To a certain extent the Section Heads supervise and organize the work of their sections and they have also in some cases signing powers. They also check the work of their section. The Check Clerks on the other hand do not supervise or organize the work of other clerks but they certainly check the work of other clerks.

The duties of a Check Clerk include to verify the work done by others with the object of intercepting errors and detecting omissions. This part of their duty is additional to the duties being performed by the clerks. They are required to initial the work so checked and verified before it goes to the Section Head.

The Respondents' witness A. N. Maraga who is the Accountant at their Kenyatta Avenue branch stated that the Check Clerks complete the work of clerks in that if a clerk has prepared figures on a machine he/she will give the list with the cheques to a Check Clerk to see if he/she has missed any figures or had done the work correctly. If something missing is found both will agree and initial.

One of the Claimants' witnesses, S. I. Muthusi, who has been a Section Head since 1974 stated that even after his promotion he continued to perform exactly the same duties as before when he was a Check Clerk. He stated that his duties were checking in various sections and they did not change when he was promoted. He added there was not much difference between the duties of Section Heads and Check Clerks. He agreed, however, that a Check Clerk as a matter of formality, is under him but duty-wise he is not. He also conceded that he had "B" signing powers and the Check Clerks did not have these powers. Later he said "I am not aware I have "B" signing powers as there are no "A" or "B" signing officers in the bank."

From the above evidence and the evidence given by the other witnesses the Court is of the view that the Check Clerks do not perform the duties of Section Heads entirely in that they do not supervise and organize work in their sections which is done by the Section Heads.

2. The Court finds it to be a fact that the various courses organized by the Respondents for their staff are as follows:—

Probationers. Clerks N6-9.

S.B. Machine. Check Clerks.

Ledger Machine. Supervisory.

Junior Clerks. Accountants.

Tellers. Junior Managers.

The court was further informed that there are two types of Check Clerks Courses—Ledger Check Clerks Course and and General Check Clerk Course—and on both courses participants are instructed on roles and qualities of a good Check Clerk.

In the Respondents' Kenyatta Avenue branch which is their largest branch in the country, they have in their various departments 192 Clerks, 28 Check Clerks and 37 Section Heads. The breakdown is as follows:—

From the above breakdown the Court cannot see how Check Clerks can be considered to be mere clerks completing the work of other clerks in order to help them maintain the necessary speed in discharge of their duties.

There are Check Clerks in six sections and with the exception of General Ledgers where there are seven Clerks and two Check Clerks in other sections there are a good many number of Clerks and the ratio between the two is as follows:—

- 3 Check Clerks to 52 Clerks
- 4 Check Clerks to 24 Clerks
- 8 Check Clerks to 33 Clerks
- 4 Check Clerks to 17 Clerks
- 7 Check Clerks to 20 Clerks

Exception is General Ledgers where there are two Check Clerks to 7 Clerks.

It is obvious that the Check Clerks occupy a special position between the Clerks and the Section Heads.

3. The Respondents presented certain figures to the Court regarding the number of employees in the various categories in all the banks who are members of the Kenya Bankers' Employers Association. The Court has no reason to doubt the genuineness of these figures and accept them to be true.

The Respondents have, however, in line with their argument that Check Clerks are mere clerks performing clerical duties put them together with Passing Clerks although except for the Respondents' bank, the other banks do not have categories of Check Clerks.

The Respondents have maintained that the duties of Passing Clerks, Ledger Reference Clerks in the Kenya Commercial Bank and Barclays Bank are very similar to those of Check Clerks working for the Respondents but they do concede that they do not check the work of other clerks although they argue that checking the work is clerical work.

One is prompted to ask why don't the other banks have Check Clerks and the answer is to be found in Maraga's statement that penhaps in their bank they lay greater emphasis on checking the work, in other words they have sort of double checks.

In the Respondents' bank in February, 1974, there were 125 Check Clerks and 146 Section Heads and in August, 1977, there were 160 Check Clerks and 171 Section Heads.

The overall figures for the banking industry are 3,992 clerical staff (in which are included 441 Check Clerks and Passing Clerks) and 655 Section Heads.

The Court while noting that the Respondents have argued that the Respondents' Check Clerks and the Passing Clerks in the other banks should be taken together and treated as clerks, finds that the extra duties undertaken by the Check Clerks for which they are fully trained by the Respondents entitles them to be put in a category above that of clerks because the Passing Clerks in the other banks do not check the work of the other clerks.

4. The Respondents' fears that about 281 Passing Clerks and Ledger Reference Clerks in other banks would follow suit if the Check Clerks in the Respondents' undertaking were treated differently from the clerical staff are unfounded because according to their own submission the Passing Clerks and Ledger Reference Clerks in these banks do not check the work of other clerks and there is no evidence to show that special courses are mounted for them to enable them to check the work of other clerks as the Respondents do.

The Court has zome to the conclusion that the clerks when they are designated Check Clerks in fact got some sort of promotion in that they assume higher responsibilities and although one or two Check Clerks may have been assigned clerical duties that would be an exception to the general rule.

The Court can appreciate why the Claimants had way back in 1971 attempted to win the payment of acting allowance for Check Clerks because they felt that they were being trained to be promoted to Section Heads in due course. The Court is of the view notwithstanding that a clerk may be appointed to be a Section Head on exhibiting exceptional qualities, that the general rule appears to be that the Check Clerks are promoted to be Section Heads. This reinforces the Court's view that the Check Clerks are a special category of employees in-between the clerical ranks and the Section Heads.

- 5. The Court has carefully considered the Respondents' submission that the Check Clerks despite the fact that they check the work of others are mere clerks performing clerical duties. The Court, however, finds that the type of checking which the Check Clerks are required to undertake is above and different from the normal clerical checking. The checking done by the Check Clerks is more inclined towards the checking carried out by a Section Head. If the checking which they did was a routine clerical duty then the ratio of Check Clerks to Clerks would not be the same as set out hereinabove. There would be at least the same number of Check Clerks as to the Clerks if what they did was mere clerical duties and could be alternated with the other Clerks. The Court got a clear picture that the Check Clerks certify the work of the Clerks to be correct as they append their initials on all the work that goes up to the Section Head.
- 6. The Court finds that whereas a Section Head can attend a Check Clerks course it does not mean that both these categories of workers attend the same courses. There is, however, a clear distinction in the courses between clerks and those which

are purely meant for Check Clerks only. The Court has noted that the Respondents consider these Check Clerks courses to be part of courses for Clerical Staff but the Court does not agree with them that the Check Clerks do not perform duties which are superior and carry greater responsibility than those of other clerks.

Here it is significant to recall that the Respondents in their bank have had the category of Check Clerks well before 1969 and the Court believes they had created this special class of employees who were expected to perform duties of higher responsibility than Clerks but falling short of the supervisory grades like the Section Heads.

7. The Court finds that the Check Clerks do not perform the functions of the Section Heads in all respects and the Court agrees with the findings of the Ministry of Labour in this respect. Accordingly the Check Clerks are not entitled to be paid as Section Heads.

The Court, however, after careful consideration of all the submissions has come to the conclusion that the Check Clerks are in a special category of their own between the Clerks and the Section Heads and as such they are entitled to better remuneration than the Clerks.

8. It is a fact that in the past when several collective agreements had been negotiated and which had since expired the Claimants and the Respondents have had two salary scales only for Section Heads and for Clerical Staff. The latest of such collective agreements is effective from 1st April, 1977, for a period of two years. In these circumstances the Court finds that it would not be desirable to introduce another salary scale for the Check Clerks during the lifetime of the current collective agreement. The Court, however, finds that the Check Clerks are entitled to higher remuneration than the Clerks and awards that with effect from 1st April, 1978, all the Check Clerks should get Sh. 175 p.m. over and above their monthly remuneration. The parties will be at liberty if they so wish to work out a new scale for the Check Clerks on the expiry of the current collective agreement.

In making this award the Court has paid particular attention to the Respondents' plea that this could be a dangerous precedent but the Court having set out reasons for its award is of the view that if a category of workers are performing higher duties than the category in which they are placed then they are entitled to be paid higher.

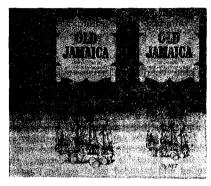
