AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 15th October, 1977, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 10th January, 1978, along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner

William Muganda worked for the Respondents as a fitter from February, 1962 to 11th January, 1977, when his services were terminated on the grounds that he had committed the serious offence of abandoning work and being absent from work from 14th December, 1976 to 11th January, 1977, without just cause He was accordingly advised of his immediate dismissal At the time of his dismissal his basic salary was Sh 797 plus a house allowance of Sh 100

The Respondents do not dispute the fact that Muganda through all these years of employment with them had committed no misconduct and had a clean record. All the witnesses confirmed this and stated that he was a good and efficient worker.

On 7th December, 1976, Muganda reported for duty as usual at the Respondents' Nakuru branch where he had worked all the years. He found a letter on a table in the workshop which contained instructions that he had been permanently transferred to Eldoret Creamery with immediate effect and he was advised to call at the Nakuru factory accountant's office to collect his December advance plus disturbance allowance. He was required to report to the Factory Manager, Eldoret, on 14th December, 1976, 8 a m

According to Muganda he explained to the Nakuru Manager, Kyallo, that his wife was seriously sick in hospital and he could not go on transfer just then The Manager, however, told him that he had to go Muganda made further representations to the Manager who did not give in and then he approached the Factory Manager, Nalitembe who, however, did not know anything about the transfer Muganda claims that he then went to Eldoret on the same day and met the Eldoret Manager, Bondo, who told him that he had not heard anything of the transfer either so he came back to Nakuru

Muganda then approached the shopsteward to help him because of his wife's sickness. He wanted the transfer to be deferred until his wife had recovered Kyallo was again approached by the shopsteward and Muganda who, however, insisted that he must go to Eldoret Muganda then came down to Nairobi to see the Peisonnel Manager who advised him to discuss the matter with Nakuru, although Muganda had brought a letter from the hospital in respect of his wife's sickness

Muganda then came back to Nakuru but Kyallo was adamant and stated there was nothing he could do After this Muganda approached the Claimants' branch secretary who made an attempt to see Kyallo but he would not speak to them It is alleged that Kyallo locked himself inside his office. The headquarters were then alerted about this matter who then took up the representations on behalf of Muganda

Muganda in the meantime wanted the National Hospital Insurance Fund card and was told that it had been sent to Eldoret and he proceeded there on 15th December At Eldoret he was told that the card was not there and he had to come back Since he was desperately in need of this card in order to secure the release of his wife from the hospital he enlisted the help of an advocate

The Claimants' headquarters contacted the Personnel Manager in Nairobi who told them that the matter was entirely in the hands of the Nakuru Branch Manager It is alleged that Kyallo refused to see the Claimants' officials from Nairobi when they went up to see him saying that he had already told the shop-stewards what he had to say on this matter

Muganda alleged that on 21st December, when he wanted to see the Factory Manager, Nalitembe, Kyallo had caught him by the neck and had pushed him out with a kick and had also called the watchman

On 22nd December, 1976, the Claimants' Deputy Secretary-General wrote a letter to the Respondents' Personnel Manager who at that time was acting in this position, and in that letter after setting out the record of events he appealed for sympathy and humanity on the question of Muganda's transfer and also requested that Kyallo be restrained from acting in a manner which was likely to cause industrial unrest on such straight forward matters

There is no record of any reply from the Personnel Manager to this letter until 3rd January, 1977, in which the management stated that Muganda had two options at his disposal both of

which were made very clear to him by their Nakuru Manager and these were —

"1 He could have transferred his family to Eldoret as there are Government hospitals there as well

2 In accordance with clause 11 of the collective agreement, he could have applied for compassionate leave, and in fact, his case falls squarely within this clause"

The Personnel Manager further advised the Claimants that the Eldoret Manager had been instructed to issue a letter of dismissal to Muganda if he had not yet reported for work

On Muganda's dismissal the Claimants reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour and an investigation was carried out with the result that on 21st September, 1977, the Chief Industrial Relations Officer forwarded the following finding and recommendations to the parties to form the basis for the settlement of this dispute —

It is the Management's pierogative to transfer an employee when and where necessary The Management gave a transfer to Muganda to take effect from 14th December, 1976

It has been submitted that Muganda appealed with the Management to reconsider the question of transfer since he had a sick wife in the hospital He is said to have requested that his transfer be deferred until his wife recovered. It has been accepted by both parties that it is true that Mrs. Muganda was in the hospital between 28th October and 17th December, 1976. It is therefore not fair for the Management to state that this was an excuse brought by Muganda in order not to be transferred.

The Management gave Muganda two alternatives, one, to transfer his family to Eldoret where his wife would continue her treatment or to apply for compassionate leave as provided in Clause II of the collective agreement Since Mrs Muganda had been admitted as from 28th October, 1976, I do not consider it would have been advisable for her to be transferred while still attending treatment as an in-patient On the question of compassion leave, if Muganda had applied for the same, it would have been necessary for the Management to make alternative arrangements until such a time that he could resume duty. The argument advanced therefore, that milk is perishable product is much weakened.

With the above in mind and considering the fact that Muganda has a clean record as nothing adverse has been advanced against him so far, it is my opinion that instead of dismissing Muganda his transfer should have been deferred

I find the dismissal to be wrongful and recommend that Muganda be reinstated without any loss of service and pay"

During the hearing the Claimants have maintained that the management had shown complete disregard to the welfare of one of its long service employees and his family in ordering him to go on transfer to Eldoret while his wife was seriously sick in the Nakuru District Hospital

The Claimants further accused the Respondents of displaying complete ignorance of industrial relations matters and cited the conduct of Kyallo, the Nakuru Branch Manager who locked him self in his office rather than see the trade union officials and also the Personnel Manager who although he had given instructions for the transfer later on stated that he had nothing to do with it and the matter was entirely in the hands of Kyallo

The Claimants pointed out how Muganda had been pushed from one office to another from Nakuru to Nairobi to Eldoret to plead for the deferment of his transfer and also while trying to locate his NHIF card

The Claimants maintained that Muganda had been victimized by Kyallo because Muganda had refused to go and do some private work of laying some pipes at Kyallo's plot in Nakuru

The Claimants asked for Muganda's reinstatement without loss of any benefits

The Respondents stated that the Claimants had magnified Muganda's wife's illness unnecessarily in order to divert attention from the simple fact that this was a case where an employee had refused to accept transfer which was a normal transfer in the course of running the Respondents' activities because Muganda was running in Nakuru a matatu and also owned plots which he had rented out

The Respondents further submitted that in any case there was no reason for Muganda not to report for duty at Eldoret after 17th December, 1976, when his wife was discharged from the hospital until 11th January, when the Respondents having given him enough time decided to take action in terminating his services

The Respondents' Branch Manager at Nakuru denied that he had kicked out Muganda from the Nakuru factory or that he had locked himself in his office in order to avoid meeting union officials. He did, however, state that he did not see the necessity of discussing the matter of Muganda's dismissal with the union officials because he, Muganda, had been transferred to Eldotet

The Respondents stressed that under the collective agreement Muganda could have applied for compassionate leave or taken his annual leave and alleged that he was advised to do so but he had presented his employers with a fate accompli in a matter involving a transfer Muganda was insisting that the Respondents must defer his transfer or he would not report on duty and stubbornly stayed at home with his wife and children from 17th December, 1976 to 11th January, 1977

For the aforesaid reasons the Respondents asked the Court to find that their action was proper and justified

In this dispute the Court finds that a long service employee who in the words of the management is a competent and efficient fitter and has had no previous warnings found himself faced with a letter of transfer on the morning of 7th December, 1976, without any prior intimation of any kind of an impending transfer

The Respondents' Eldoret Branch Manager stated while giving evidence that the Personnel Manager had not consulted him on the matter of these transfers and that after he received the memo on these transfers he looked forward to receiving an additional fitter at Eldoret as he did not want to lose a fitter he had at Eldoret because of the expansion programme that was in progress at the time This witness clearly contradicted the evidence of the Personnel Manager who said that he had discussed the transfer with the respective Branch Managers

The Court is satisfied that the Nakuru Branch Manager was aware at all material times particularly from 7th December, 1976, that Muganda's wife was seriously sick in the Nakuru District Hospital The Court finds the Nakuiu Branch Manager, Kyallo's conduct in this whole dispute, to say the least, most strange This is a case where an employee who had worked at the Nakuru Branch for nearly 14 years was being asked from 7th December, particularly at a time when his wife was seriously sick in the hospital, to make arrangements to proceed on transfer to Eldoret by 14th December Kyallo's attitude after Muganda, the shopstewards, the Nakuru branch officials and the union national officials had come into the picture leaves a lot to be desired He exhibited a scant knowledge of the basic fundamentals of the industrial relations system. The Court believes the Claimants' allegation that Kyallo avoided meeting them and was in a very great hurry to wash his hands completely of this affair.

The Court would like to point out that on 7th December, Muganda had been given instructions ie his transfer and he had immediately made representations on the grounds which have already been set out hereinabove that he would like the transfer to be deferred. So the Nakuru Branch Manager and the Respondents' Personnel Manager knew perfectly well that Muganda had not accepted the transfer and therefore to all intents and purposes he was, until such time as he had reported for duty at Eldoret, still under the Nakuru Branch. In these circumstances the Court must criticize the Nakuru Branch Manager for having ordered off Muganda from the Nakuru factory and the Court believes Muganda when he says that Kyallo literally kicked him out of the factory and this incident nearly caused a strike

The Court finds the conduct of the Personnel Manager also to have been very arbitrary in this matter. He was the person who had after consultations with the two Branch Managers formally issued the transfer directives and yet when Muganda saw him in Nanobi he told him that the matter was not in his hands but was in the hands of the Nakuru Manager. Not only this, but he is alleged to have said the same to the Claimants' Deputy Secretary-General also as is clearly recorded in a letter sent to him on 22nd December, 1976, by Mugalla This point was not refuted by the Personnel Manager in his reply of 31d January, 1977

The Court further finds that Muganda was at no time officially told by anyone from the management side that he had the option of either applying for compassionate leave or his annual leave. The Court cannot believe that he was given these options because either they wanted an additional fitter at Eldoret urgently or Muganda was expected to change places with the fitter who was in Eldoret. So it is highly unlikely that the Respondents would have given him the option of proceeding on leave

Under all the circumstances Muganda's plea for a deferment of his transfer was reasonable because that would have enabled him to continue with his work at the Nakuru factory while at the same time his wife would have had the opportunity of recuperating

The Respondents have raised the point that why did Muganda not proceed to Eldoret on 17th December and where was he during the period from that date up to 11th January, 1977? The Court finds it amply proved from the evidence that right from 7th December, 1976, and more particularly after the middle of December, Muganda's transfer was the subject matter of discussions between the Claimants and the Respondents Muganda had for obvious reasons not been able to accept the transfer to Eldoret and the Nakuru Branch Manager did not want to see his face in the Nakuru factory and yet to all intents and purposes Muganda should have remained the responsibility of the Nakuru Branch So if in these circum stances Muganda stayed at home not knowing what to do and awarted the result of the representations being made on his behalf, he did not commit any serious default. The Respon dents themselves in fact paid him for the whole month of December

The Court has come to the conclusion that the Respondents' approach to this whole matter was completely devoid of humanism which is so very essential and has assumed tremendous importance particularly of late in the field of employer/employee relationship It is indeed a sad state of affairs where at this time in Kenya an employee is meted out the sort of treatment that Muganda got at the hands of the Respondents

The Court expects that when such a long service employee who has worked in one place for nearly 14 years is to be transferred, the management should, to begin with discuss the matter with him as a person having lived in a place for such a long time cannot easily be uprooted in a matter of seven days. After such preliminary discussions the Respondents should then have looked further into the matter. Transfers are indeed management prerogative but this prerogative has got to be exercised in a sensible and responsible manner after taking into consideration all the human factors involved. The management cannot get away just by saying that the welfare of an employee's wife and children is not their responsibility.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that Muganda had not broken the terms and conditions of service agreement by committing the serious offence of abandoning his work or that he was absent from duty from 14th December to 11th January without just cause To highlight the Respondents' serious errors in this matter the Court would like to point out that Muganda's services were purported to have been terminated by the Eldoret Branch Manager where he had not reported for duty and who probably was not even aware of what was going on between Muganda and the Nakuru Branch and the national office The Court finds that Muganda has suffered a wrongful dismissal and awards that he should be reinstated to his job with effect from 10th April, 1978, without any loss of service provided that the Respondents shall have the right to post him at a place of their choosing The Court further awards that Muganda should be paid 12 months' salary and house allowance by way of compensation for the wrongful dismissal that he has suffered

In conclusion the Court while making an award in favour of Muganda as stated above must criticize and caution the Claimants from making statements on behalf of their members without taking proper instructions on those matters as this resulted in the Claimants having made a false statement in a letter dated 22nd December, 1976, to the Respondents' Personnel Manager which fortunately for them, in the Court's view, did not have any strong bearing on the dispute otherwise they could easily have done a lot of harm to their own case. The Court hopes that such conduct will not be repeated by them in future The Court would like to add that the Claimants at the commencement of the hearing asked for that particular portion to be deleted from their letter but such deletion does not alter the fact that prior to the commencement of the hearing their letter contained false information on a particular point

- 1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Baragwi Farmers' Co operative Society Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents
- 2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 10th and 23rd March, 1978, and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence during the hearing —

Claimants —G Ngechu

Respondents -H R Chiuti

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 11th November, 1977, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 24th January, 1978, along with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner

This is an unfortunate case in that a rather long service employee with a clean record and who was even praised by his employers, the Respondents, finds himself out of the job of a watchman with the Respondents

G Ngechu had worked for the Respondents from August, 1966, until 7th April, 1975 What happened on 7th April, 1975, is the subject matter of the dispute as immediately prior to that date he was on leave and was to resume duty on 6th April, 1975 Apparently he had been transferred to Kianyaga factory which he did not like The reason he did not want to be transferred to the said factory was because he felt that things are stolen during the day time and he as a watchman during the night would be blamed and held responsible. On 7th April he in fact wrote a letter asking to be transferred from the factory to another place but was told by the Respondents that he being a good and efficient watchman was expected to improve the situation regarding thefts and losses from the Kianyaga factory

Apparently after his request was refused he returned the weapons which had been issued to him by the Respondents and also some other property and informed the factory manager that he will not be returning for work from 7th April

Ngechu maintains that he was told by the Respondents' Secretary that he should go home and wait and he therefore feels that his services have been wrongfully terminated

The Respondents on the other hand have submitted that the behaviour of Ngechu in refusing to work at a place where he was assigned by the Respondents and then returning the weapons that had been issued to him and abandoning his duties clearly showed that he had deserted from his place of work and had therefore dismissed himself

The Respondents added that they wanted Ngechu as he was a good and efficient watchman to work for them but under the circumstances they were left with no choice by Ngechu just walking out from his employment and they could therefore not accept him back in employment

This dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and the following findings and recommendation were conveyed to the parties by the Chief Industrial Relations Officer on 26th September, 1977 —

Findings—

Personal investigation by the investigator revealed that Ngechu did actually apply for a transfer from Kianyaga Factory where he was working on 7th April, 1975, he had come from his annual leave A reply dated the same date 7th April was given, directing that he continue working at the same place since his good services were appreciated there

On 18th April, 1975, the Factory Manager had written to the Secretary of the Society informing him that Ngechu had returned to him all the Factory Watchman's kit because he did not want to work at the factory any more, he wanted a transfer It is noted the Secretary wrote back to the Factory Manager demanding to know why Ngechu did not cont nue work at the factory The Factory Manager wrote back and said that —

'On resuming his duties on 4th April, Ngechu had heard that there were some chemicals that had got lost in the factory, because of this he would not work in that factory and only wanted a transfer to another place'

On 23rd June, 1975 the Secretary of the Society wrote to Ngechu to appear before him and the Chairman of the Society so as to explain why he had refused to work and what problems he had, Ngechu failed to go It was explained by the management that when he failed to turn up for the hearing they were left with no alternative but to terminate his services

From the submissions it appears that Ngechu errored in that he wrote to the Secretary of the Society requesting for a transfer, after he got a negative answer he did not wait to petition further, instead he only absented himself from his duties

It is also noted that after when Ngechu was called for further hearing before the Chairman and Secretary of the Society he failed to go and did not bother to even go later

Apparently once Ngechu was denied a transfer by the Management he appears to have absented himself from his duties, the Management could not have gone without another night watchman

In view of the above, I find the termination of Ngechu's services as fair, nowever, noting the unclear circumstances which led him to ask for a transfer and also his long recommendable services, I find a dismissal too harsh

Recommendations-

I recommend that the dismissal be turned into a normal termination and that he be paid his terminal benefits"

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has no hesitation in coming to the conclusion that Ngechu's behaviour left the Respondents with no alternative but to consider that he had himself abandoned his work and was no longer interested in his post

Ngechu clearly was in the wrong in trying to dictate to the Respondents as to the place where he would like to work and the Court would like to state that whereas it is prepared to protect the workers' at all times it does not mean that the workers can with impunity disregard the obligations that are placed on them by virtue of their employment. An employer has the right to organize and manage his business operations in the manner he deems fit and in this particular case the Respondents wanted Ngechu who was a good and efficient watchman to help them in reducing the number of thefts and losses from their Kiarjaga factory but Ngechu refused to obey his instructions and instead decided to walk out

The Court feels that the fact that Ngechu had also started a butchery nearby in partnership with two other persons may well have been the reason which prompted him to act in the manner he did

The Court accordingly rejects the Claimants' demand for compensation to be paid to Ngechu for the alleged wrongful dismissal
