THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO 6 OF 1978

Parties —

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and
Impala Glass Industries Ltd

Issue in dispute—

General wages increase of 6 per cent effective from 1st May, 1977, as directed by the Government

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Impala Glass Industries Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 21st day of March, 1978 and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 7th October, 1977 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 25th January, 1978, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

The dispute has arisen because of the Claimants' demand made on the Respondents for a wage increase of 6 per cent effective from 1st May, 1977, as a result of the Government Directive following the Presidential announcement of May Day 1977 which reads —

Private sector

All agreements which have been entered into between employers and unions before March, 1977, and which did not take account of price increases which took place during that month should be opened for renegotiation to reflect increases of up to 6 per cent. The renegotiated increases should take effect from 1st May, 1977 and should cover only those earning up to Sh 1,400 p.m.

It should be noted that wage increases in the private sector are not automatic and will have to be negotiated between the parties

The parties have enjoyed good relationship and have concluded two collective agreements without recourse to the Industrial Court. One was signed on 23rd May, 1973, and another on 21st July, 1976. The last agreement is effective from 1st June, 1976, and under it the workers received a 15 per cent wage increase from 1st June, 1976, and another increase of 10 per cent with effect from 1st June, 1977.

The gist of the dispute is that the Respondents answer to the Claimants' demand of a 6 per cent wage increase over and above those contained in the collective agreement is that the two wage increases of 15 per cent and 10 per cent respectively have taken account of the March, 1977, price increases. The Respondents therefore feel that they have fully compensated their employees and no further increase should be awarded until after the expiry of the current collective agreement on 31st May, 1978.

To begin with the Court would like to emphasize that it is quite clear that the March, 1977, price increases were a new development in the whole economic situation of the country and the Court therefore cannot accept the Respondents' submission that when they had signed the current collective agreement on 21st July, 1976, they had taken into account the March, 1977, price increases. They could not have done so because no one at that time expected or anticipated such a major increase in the price of certain basic commodities.

The Court would like to recall that prior to the 1976 agreement the wage earners' cost of living index had gone up by 62.9 per cent between the period 1st May, 1973 to July, 1976, and two thirds of which is 41.9 per cent which was the maximum compensation the Guidelines allow. As against this the workers were given wage increases amounting to 26.6 per cent during the two-year period.

The Court has no doubt that the Respondents' interpretation of the Government directive issued subsequently to the Presidential announcement is not quite correct. The Court has to determine whether or not the current collective agreement in force had taken account of price increases which took place in March, 1977, and in this particular case the Court is satisfied that it did not. The Court therefore finds the Claimants are entitled to ask for a renegotiation of the current collective agreement to reflect increases of up to 6 per cent.

The Court would like to add that these increases are by no means automatic and have to be negotiated hence the words 'to reflect increases of up to 6 per cent'.

The Court has taken into consideration the fact that the Respondents' financial position just now does not show any profits and that they have increased the employment in their undertaking from 25 workers in 1968 to 60 workers in 1977.

The Court is constrained to comment on the Claimants' approach to the negotiations in this dispute in that they not only sent junior officials to the meetings on such an important item but also did not maintain continuity of representation by changing representatives from one meeting to another. The Court would like to emphasize that it is very much in the interest of the parties that they should send persons who are highly skilled and trained in the complex art of collective bargaining during negotiations otherwise their interest can quite easily suffer.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that all the Respondents' employees should get a wage increase of 3 per cent with effect from 1st May, 1977, over and above the increments to which they are entitled under the current collective agreement. The 3 per cent increase is to be on their wages as at 30th April, 1977.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations

Particular attention should be paid to the following points —

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

Kenya Gazette

D 41 (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect
