1 The Tailors and Textiles Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Teita Estate (1972) Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 9th day of May, 1978, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 10th January, 1978, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 6th March along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

The Respondents bought the assets of African Ropes and Twines Ltd on 15th October, 1976, and engaged all the former employees of that company with effect from the date they bought the assets

The management of African Ropes and Twines Ltd paid all the terminal dues to their employees who are now in the employment of the Respondents The Court was told that these terminal benefits resulted in no employee receiving less than 100 per cent increase over the salaries they were getting at the time

The Claimants approached the Respondents for recognition on 9th February, 1977, and a recognition agreement was signed on 14th March Negotiations for a collective agreement commenced on 27th July and several meetings took place between the parties Most of the items were resolved but on the several

items remaining the Claimants reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour on 6th September, 1977 The parties, however, made further attempts to settle the dispute and agreed on a few more items but were not able to arrive at an amicable settlement on the three items now before the Court

The Respondents are paying their employees the following wages —

Machine attendants	375 p m
Drivers	459 p m
Junior Clerk	442 p m "

The Claimants have put forward very vigorous submissions on the issue of house allowance and they demanded that the Respondents should pay a house allowance of Sh 75 to all their employees for the first year instead of a wage increase and for the following year they want the workers to be given a 20 per cent wage increase These to be effective from 1st June, 1977

The Respondents on the other hand have pleaded that they are not in a position to meet any heavy labour costs at present because the twine industry was very much on the decline, so much so that they had stopped production about two months ago and had big stocks of unsold products which was costing them a lot of storage charges particularly down at Mombasa They pointed out that their industry was export oriented and the international market had been flooded with products from other countries There was a war going on in the sisal market with countries like Brazil, Tanzania and Mexico cutting each other The Respondents pointed out that in those countries the sisal industry is subsidized by the Government and they could undercut prices with little effect on their returns In these circumstances the Respondents found themselves to be in a most precarious financial position

The Court finds that the base for the purpose of calculating wage increase entitlements of the Respondents' employees should be October, 1976 From that date to March, 1978, the cost of living has increased by 24.8 per cent two thirds of which works out at 16.5 per cent

In view of this the Court finds that the Claimants' demands are very much on the high side and that under the Guidelines the maximum wage increase they can get is in the region of 16.5 per cent for two years

The Court has given anxious thought to the Claimants' demand that the first year's wage increase should be considered house allowance as they want to be able to tell their members that they had managed to get this benefit for them from the Respondents In view of the fact that this is the first agreement between these two parties and the Claimants wish that they should have a separate house allowance and are even prepared to accept an award on house allowance only for the first year with no salary increase, the Court has come to the conclusion that they should then get it because after all the Respondents will not be required to pay any more labour costs than what they can afford and provided they are within the Guidelines

The Court has very carefully considered the state of the Respondents' industry and has come to the conclusion that the workers should not get less than what they are entitled to under the Guidelines

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that —

1 All the Respondents' employees should get with effect from 1st October, 1977, a sum of Sh 55 p m by way of house allowance in addition to their salaries They will get no wage increase for the first year commencing 1st October, 1977

2 The Court awards that all the Respondents' unionisable employees should get a wage increase of Sh 65 p m with effect from 1st October, 1978

3 As stated above the effective date of the collective agreement should be 1st October, 1977 The Court has come to this conclusion because the Court cannot find either party responsible for any delay that may have occurred during negotiations

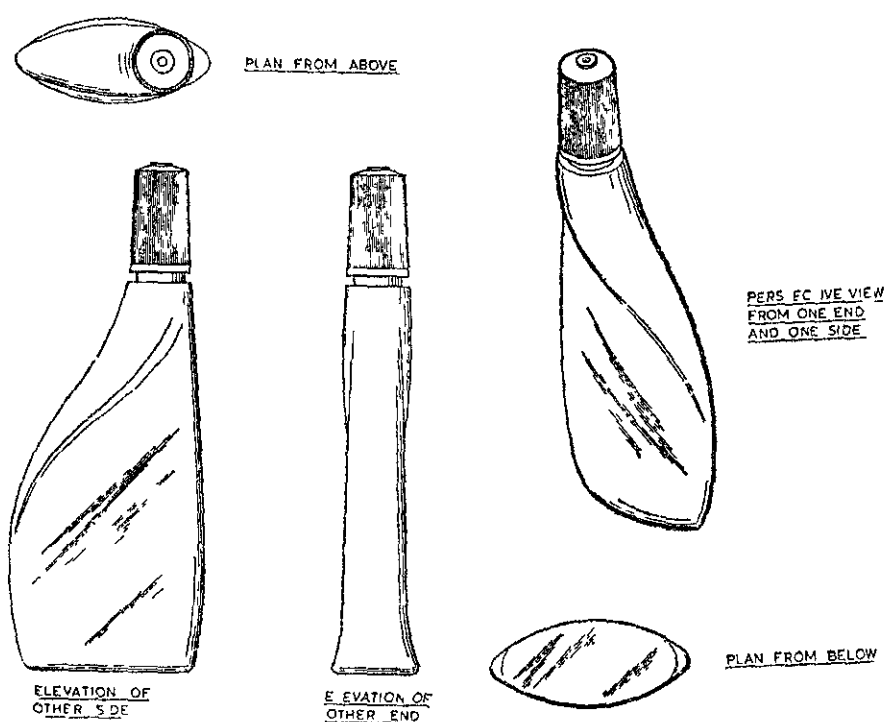

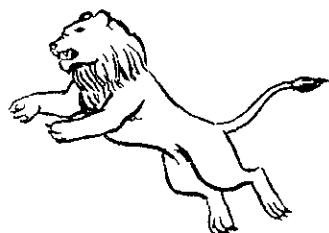

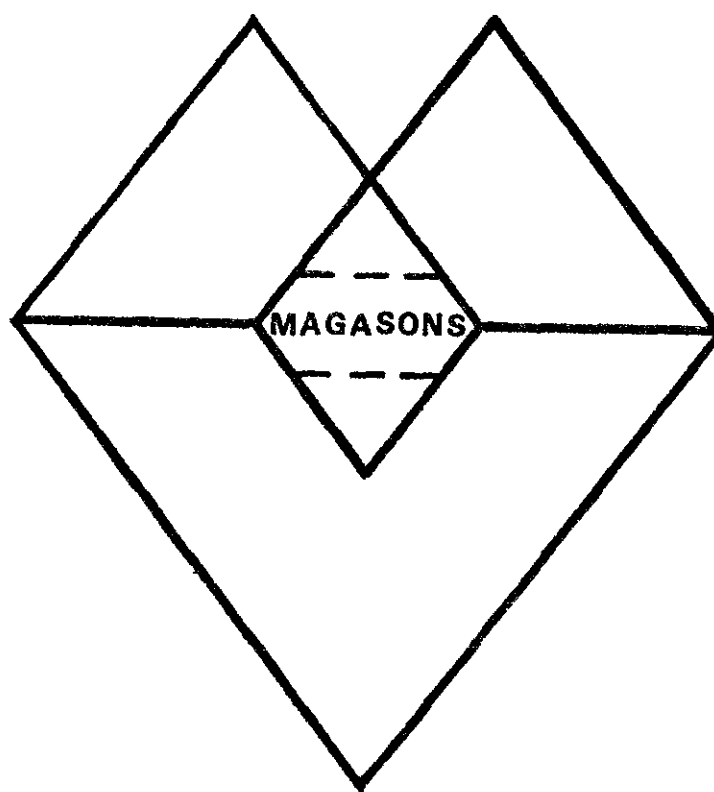
