IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred to me under section 17 (5) (b) of the Price Control Act, Cap 504, Laws of Kenya I Benard Matu Makanga, in my capacity as Deputy Price Controller responsible for Trans Nzoia District, do hereby issue the following orders to be observed and complied with by all traders and commission agents operating business (s) or connected with the supply of price-controlled goods or services within Trans Nzoia District —

(1) Every trader or commission agent of price-controlled goods—

(a) shall, at the time of sale, supply to every purchaser from him of goods in wholesale quantities an original invoice containing the following particulars

(i) the name and address of the purchaser,

(ii) the plot number, name of trading centre/town name-style under which the business is conducted and other sufficient particulars of the area where the purchaser intends to carry out the sale or disposal of the price regulated goods,

(iii) the name and address (to include plot number, town and name-style under which the business is conducted) of the seller,

(iv) the date of the sale

(v) the net quantity of the goods sold,

(vi) a description sufficiently exact to identify the goods purchased

(vii) the price or charges charged therefore showing any authorized transport charge (if applicable) separately,

(b) shall retain in his records a duplicate copy of such invoice

(2) Every commission agent of Kenya National Trading Co-operation (KNTC) or agent of any other similar Government-recognized or appointed co-operation, or manufacturer or producer or any trader, or other person, or any class of trader, or persons who receive and supply price-controlled goods shall maintain a register of his dealings in price controlled goods or price-controlled services, and shall make such entries as to

include date and sufficient description of the goods received and the manner of disposal of such goods. Such register shall be preserved for a period of not less than six months after the date of the last entry therein.

- (3) Every trader, commission agent, forwarding agent or other person supplying any price controlled goods or rendering any price-controlled services shall make written returns to the Deputy Price Controller, Trans Nzoia District whenever called upon to do so.

Any person who refuses or delays or fails to comply with any of the aforesaid orders, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or to both such fine and such imprisonment.

1 The Mombasa Dockworkers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Cargo Handling Services Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 3rd, 4th and 5th May, 1978, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 19th January, 1978, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 27th January along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

The Claimants who represent 8,017 unionisable dockworkers forwarded their demands to the Respondents in May, 1977, for wage increases and in addition demanded that the employers should provide free houses or give house allowance to all the dockworkers represented by them

The parties met for negotiations through the Joint Industrial Council for the dock industry. Several meetings of the JIC were held and it is recorded in the minutes of a meeting held on 29th August, 1977, that the Claimants demand wage increases and house allowance for the various categories of employees. The wage increase demanded ranged between 25 per cent at the lowest to 10 per cent at the highest with the demand for house allowance being 40 per cent and 30 per cent respectively. The Respondents offered wage increases from 12 per cent to 4 per cent and stated that they would pay no house allowance.

At another meeting of the JIC on 23rd September, 1977, the demands were discussed further. At this meeting the Claimants' General Secretary is clearly recorded as having stated that as far as house allowance was concerned the only alternative was to go to Court. The parties then proceeded to finalize their negotiations on the wage increases and eventually the following wage increases were agreed —

- "(a) Group I—award 18 per cent, 16 per cent to be awarded in the first year, 2 per cent to be awarded in the second year
- (b) Group II—award 14 per cent, 12 per cent to be awarded in the first year, 2 per cent to be awarded in the second year
- (c) Group III—award 10 per cent, 8 per cent to be awarded in the first year, 2 per cent to be awarded in the second year
- (d) Group IV—no change "

The parties were then in disagreement over the effective date with the Claimants demanding it to be 1st May, 1977, and the Respondents offering 1st July, 1977

The matter then ended up with the Ministry of Labour as a trade dispute on the following two issues

- "1 Effective date on implementation of the recently negotiated agreement
- 2 The Union's demand that the Management should provide free housing accommodation for their workers or be paid house allowance in lieu "

A conciliation panel consisting of J Othieno, Permanent Secretary for Labour as chairman, with T K B Mbathi and A A Adongo as members, was set up to conciliate on the dispute

On 15th November, 1977, the Minister for Labour, James Nyamweya, personally informed the parties in writing that he endorsed the conclusions of the panel as far as the first issue was concerned that the effective date of the new negotiated salaries be 1st May, 1977

On the second issue, which is the subject matter of the dispute, he had this to say —

"The union submitted that the company does lease houses from the Municipal Council for the accommodation of the workers except that it does not subsidize the rent and the union's request was that it should do this. In the previous

agreements, housing had not featured as an item for negotiation, but in view of the high rents now charged, the union wished this item to be specifically negotiated

The Management on their part submitted that for a number of years wages paid to the union members included housing element. To support their case reference was made to Industrial Court Award in Cause No 15 of 1970 which states as follows —

"The Court has come to the conclusion that housing allowance should not be introduced as a separate item at all and that the past practice of paying workers a consolidated wage should continue. The Court has taken into consideration in assessing the wage increase to the workers the very strong submissions which were made by the claimant on the issue of house allowance "

The panel considered this issue and came to the conclusion that the new salaries which have recently been negotiated between the parties contain the housing element and there was no case for any additional separate housing allowance as demanded by the union. I accept the conclusions of the panel and I so endorse

In endorsing the conclusions of the panel I would like to mention that if the union wishes to have a new salary structure in which house allowance in future becomes a separate item, then it should make proposals in connexion with the next demand for a new salary structure, which show basic wage separately and house allowance separately. The proposals for the new salary structure could then be the subject of negotiation between the parties

With the above conclusions I consider that the dispute between the parties will be resolved on this basis "

The parties accepted the first recommendation of the Minister and the dispute on the effective date was settled and the second issue is now before the Court

The Court had the benefit of comprehensive written and verbal submissions by both the parties in this major dispute which not only affects some 8,000 dockworkers but has financial implications of great magnitude as the additional cost of the Claimants' demand in this issue as it stands based on the basic pay as at 1st May, 1977, would be Sh 4,130,803 per month. It is inevitable, even if the Claimants' demand was considerably reduced, that the additional cost to the Respondents if an award is made in favour of the Claimants would be enormous. The Claimants did make it clear that their original demands on house allowance of 40 per cent and 30 per cent were subject to negotiation and that there was no question of the Claimants adopting an inflexible and rigid attitude

The Court has given deep consideration to the submissions made by the parties which need not be repeated in the award

The Court would like to recall that in the collective agreement of 1969 binding the Claimants and the then Mombasa branch of the Respondents the following clause appears on the subject of housing —

"Housing The company does not provide housing, the provision of which is the responsibility of the employee concerned and salaries and wages are deemed to include an element for housing "

The parties appeared before the Industrial Court in Cause No 15 of 1970 and in the award made by the Court in that dispute the Court had this to say on the matter of house allowance —

"The Court has come to the conclusion that house allowance should not be introduced as a separate item at present and that the past practice of paying workers a consolidated wage should continue. The Court has taken into consideration, in assessing the wage increase to the workers, the very strong submissions which were made by the Claimants on the issue of house allowance "

The next important development which is relevant to this dispute is the collective agreement between the Respondents, the Claimants and NUTA which, as far as the Claimants were concerned, took effect from 1st January, 1974. This agreement completed the unification into a single agreement of the separate terms and conditions of service and provisions of collective agreements in Mombasa and Tanzania branches for Respondents' unionisable employees at Grade B III and below. In this agreement the parties provided as follows on housing —

"Housing The company does not provide housing, the provision of which is the responsibility of the employees "

The Claimants have largely relied on the changed economic situation of the country since last eight years which according to them is now resulting in great hardship being suffered by their members as far as housing was concerned

In support of this they had also referred to the Employment Act, 1976, particularly section 9 which reads —

"9 Every employer shall at all times, at his own expense, provide reasonable housing accommodation for each of his employees either at or near to the place of employment, or shall pay to the employee such sufficient sum, as rent, in addition to his wages or salary, as will enable such employee to obtain reasonable accommodation

Provided that if, by reason of the conditions of employment, and wages payable, any person is placed at a disadvantage by the application of this section, the Minister may, by notice in the Gazette, exclude the application of this section to such person and such person shall instead be dealt with as shall be specified in such notice"

The Claimants added that this was a clear indication of what the country wanted and that there could be no doubt that an employer should either house his employees or pay them sufficient sum as rent in addition to their wages or salary that will enable them to obtain reasonable accommodation

The Court must, however point out to the Claimants that the Minister for Labour through L.N. 65, dated 20th April, 1976, has made Regulations stating that section 9 of the Employment Act shall not apply to an employee—

"(a) whose contract of service contains a provision which consolidates as part of his basic wage or salary an element intended to be used by him as rent or which is otherwise intended to enable him to provide himself with housing accommodation, or

(b) whose contract of service is the subject matter of or is otherwise covered by a collective agreement, or

(c) whose average monthly wage or salary is Sh 2,000 or more"

The inference is obvious from those Regulations that if a worker is getting a basic wage or salary in which is consolidated a housing element or his terms and conditions are covered by a collective agreement then it is up to the parties concerned to embark upon appropriate negotiations

There is nothing, however, to prevent the trade unions through COTU making representations to the Minister for Labour for abrogating part of these Regulations. It is up to them to convince the Minister and if they succeed then section 9 would become fully applicable

The Court, however, has to decide this dispute in the light of the parties' own previous collective agreements and the provisions contained in the Employment Act, 1976, and the Regulations made thereunder after taking into consideration the important submissions made by both sides

The parties' collective agreements show an interesting change between the years 1969 and 1974 in that in the 1969 agreement it is clearly stated that the dockworkers' salaries and wages are deemed to include an element of housing whereas in the 1974 agreement the words "concerned and salaries and wages are deemed to include an element of housing" are deleted

This deletion clearly shows that the parties at that stage agreed and took a step in the direction of the Claimants' demands over all these years that house allowance should be paid to the dockworkers as a separate item in addition to wages and salaries. Otherwise why were words which clearly indicated that the salaries and wages contained a housing element deleted? If nothing else, it was certainly indicative of a subtle change and a pointer in the direction of things to come, i.e. a demand by the Claimants for payment of a separate housing allowance

The fact, however, remains that the parties agreed at that time that the Respondents were neither to provide a free house to the dockworkers nor to give them any house allowance. In other words it is implied in the collective agreement that a part of the wage and salary is to go towards the payment of rent for housing accommodation. There is, however, nothing on record to show what percentage of the wage and salary was to be considered towards this purpose

The Court would now like to refer to its award in Cause No 15 of 1970. The Court would like to stress the words "at present" in its comment on the question of house allowance being introduced as a separate item. The Court did not use the words that "it has come to the conclusion that house allowance should not be introduced as a separate item at all". Unfortunately the Minister for Labour in his letter to the parties which has been quoted hereinabove and in which he quoted the relevant part of the Court award in Cause No 15 of 1970 has used the words "at all" instead of "at present". The Court has no doubt that the error in these words must have had a lot of influence on the conciliation panel and the Minister himself. There is a world of difference between to say "house

allowance should not be introduced as a separate item at present" and "house allowance should not be introduced as a separate item at all"

The Court in its award in Cause No 15 of 1970 clearly gave the Claimants the right to raise that demand again as and when it was appropriate

The Court award was followed by the parties' collective agreement of 1974 in which the words relating to housing element were dropped as stated hereinabove

This historical development on the question of the Claimants' demand for a separate house allowance has led the Court to the conclusion that if the Court is satisfied with and is swayed by the Claimants' arguments on this particular issue then there is nothing to inhibit the Court from finding that workers are entitled to press their demand for a separate house allowance and to proceed to make an award thereon

The Court must now apply its mind to the restrictions placed by the Guidelines on the workers' demand during the revision of the collective agreement

The Respondents have argued that after giving the wage and salary increases effective from 1st May, 1977, the level of compensation permissible under Guideline (iv) has been fully utilized and that it leaves no further room for additional compensation. The Respondents stated that two-thirds of the cost of living increase between April, 1975 and April, 1977, was 13.03 per cent or 6.5 per cent per annum. As against this they had given wage increases as follows —

Group	First year	Second year
I	16%	2%
II	12%	2%
III	8%	2%
IV	6% for two years	

The Claimants on the other hand have argued that since April, 1975, up to April, 1977, the Wage Earners and Middle Income Group cost of living has gone up by 23.9 per cent and 19 per cent respectively two thirds of which amount to about 16 per cent and 12.7 per cent. The Claimants argued that they were therefore undercompensated even under the Guidelines to an extent of about 3 per cent

The Court notes that the Claimants did submit during the hearing that they had intentionally not sought full compensation due to them under the Guidelines because they wanted to leave something to be granted to them by way of house allowance

The Court would like to add that the Respondents went ahead and concluded the wage and salary deal with the Claimants in the full knowledge that the Claimants were very seriously pursuing their demand for a separate house allowance in addition to an increase in wages and salaries. It was surely up to them to take care that they were not caught in a situation in which they find themselves now where, according to them, they have fully compensated the workers but find that there is a major dispute on their hands in which the workers are vigorously fighting for the payment of a separate house allowance in addition to the wages and salaries already agreed

The Respondents have understandably laid great emphasis on their financial position during the hearing. The Court has noted that the Kenya Ports Authority pay the Respondents for their services at fixed rates which are revised from time to time. The Respondents are being paid by the Kenya Ports Authority on the basis of 1974 rates. The Respondents appear to agree with the Claimants' submission that the rates that were agreed in 1975/76 between the then E.A. Cargo Handling Services and the then E.A. Harbours Corporation were not implemented in Kenya although they were implemented in Tanzania. The Claimants pointed out that as a result of those rates being implemented in Tanzania the Respondents' counterpart there had a surplus of 60 million Shillings as against the projected surplus put forward by the Respondents at the end of the year of Sh 3,343,960

As per the information submitted by the Respondents to the Court the Respondents received their revenue on the basis of tonnage they handle plus miscellaneous port services. The Kenya Ports Authority also get their revenue on the basis of the tonnage handled from which they have to meet their operating expenses such as payment of cargo handling services and development of the Port to accommodate more ships and to meet their recurrent expenditure. The Respondents added that it was erroneous for the Claimants to contend that funds were available from them or the Kenya Ports Authority to meet any additional expenditure on the labour costs

The Court was not told why the 1975/76 rates were not implemented in Kenya whereas because of their implementation in Tanzania there appears to be a surplus of 60 million Shillings in that country as per the information submitted to the Court by the Claimants

The Court is fully aware that the Kenya Ports Authority revenue is based on tariffs which are charged on the public and that if these tariffs are increased then there will be an inevitable cost of living rise. The Government will be forced to increase tariffs for which the consumers will eventually have to pay

The Court has to very carefully balance all these extremely important points against the demand which has been put forward by the Claimants before coming to any conclusion

The Court fully realizes the important role that the dockworkers play in the economy of Kenya and how essential and important it is that there should be industrial peace at the docks. There is no denying the fact that dock work is really arduous and where and whenever possible not only the working conditions of the dockworkers must be alleviated but also improvement should be made in their living conditions. Indeed this is applicable to all the workers in the country and the Court has always, in formulating its awards in economic disputes, kept these most important objectives in mind. The workers should enjoy a higher standard of living commensurate with the development of the country and the harsh economic realities

The Court has fully taken into account the Minister for Labour's recommendation in which he has asked the Claimants that if they wish to have a new salary structure in which house allowance in future becomes a separate item then they should make proposals in connection with the next demand for a new salary structure which shows basic wage separately and house allowance separately. The Minister felt the proposals for the new salary structure can then be subject of negotiation between the parties

After careful consideration of all the submissions and in view of the historical background to the dispute and the way it has evolved, the Court has come to the conclusion that the dockworkers are entitled to a separate house allowance now because they have indeed strived for this benefit for nearly eight years and have indeed been patient all these years. The Court is satisfied that conditions have changed dramatically since 1970 when the Court rejected the Claimants' demand by using the words that "the Court has come to the conclusion that house allowance should not be introduced as a separate item at present". The Court further finds that house allowance should be introduced as a separate item now and the Claimants should not wait till May, 1979. The question of housing is a burning issue as far as the workers in the country are concerned and the trade union movement is naturally committed to fighting on behalf of the workers for provision of free houses or allowance in lieu thereof but this fight has to be carried out within the economic constraints of not only the industry concerned but that of the country as a whole

The important thing which the workers should realize is that an employer can afford only a certain increase by way of labour costs during any given period and if their purpose for putting forward claims for separate house allowance is in the hope that they will get double increases, i.e. one of wages and the other one on house allowance, then they must realize that this cannot be so

This is more so as long as the Guidelines issued by the Minister for Finance are in force and the Court's hands are tied in that it cannot make an award which is clearly in contravention of the Government directives

The Court having found that up to 30th April, 1977, the workers were paid wages and salaries on the understanding that it was their responsibility to find their own housing it would not be fair to the Respondents if the Court does not assess the housing element in these wages and salaries. After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court rules that 15 per cent of the current wages and salaries are to be deemed to be the housing element. The Court, however, does not intend to deconsolidate this 15 per cent housing element from the present wages and salaries

Having made the above rulings the Court awards, since it has found that dockworkers are indeed suffering a great hardship as far as their housing is concerned, that they should be paid a separate house allowance in addition to the wages and salaries which have been agreed between the parties and which are effective from 1st May, 1977

After careful consideration of all the submissions and having taken into account the Guidelines the Court has come to the

conclusion that the dockworkers should be paid a house allowance of Sh 30 p.m. with effect from 1st July, 1978, in addition to their wages and salaries which contain a housing element of 15 per cent

The Court has not awarded any backdating of its award because of the very weighty financial arguments which had been put forward by the Respondents and in fact the Court has given them time in which to organize their finances in order to meet the cost of the Court award which is Sh 30 per month separate house allowance for each of the 8,017 dockworkers amounting to Sh 240,000 per month

The Court would like to re-emphasize its policy that each dispute before the Court is judged on its own special merits and any award made by the Court cannot be taken for granted to be a precedent as such. Each and every claim is decided taking into account the historical background of that particular dispute, the nature of the industry involved, the level of remuneration achieved by the workers, the financial viability of the enterprise and a host of other very relevant points

Issue in dispute —

Six per cent wage increase

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Security Services Group of F K E shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 17th, 18th and 19th May, 1978 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Respondents also called the following witnesses to give evidence during the hearing —

P M Kithome

C Phillips

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 30th January, 1978 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 10th March along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

The Respondents represent a group of six security firms in the country although at one time they had a seventh member also who, however, opted out in November 1977. The Respondents employ approximately 5,496 persons who will be affected by the award in this dispute

The parties signed a collective agreement on 29th January, 1977 which came into effect from 1st January, 1977 for a duration of two years. This agreement will expire on 31st December, 1978

The consolidated wages per month and wage increases as laid down in this agreement are as follows —

Provided that

- (i) The above scales refer to Nairobi and Mombasa only. In respect of other areas Sh 29 will be increased to their present grade rates for 1st year and Sh 30 for 2nd year.
- (ii) Existing employees who may not benefit from the above scales shall be entitled to a wage increase of not less than Sh 29 p.m. on top of their personal rates with effect from 1st January, 1977 and to a further increase of Sh 30 with effect from 1st January, 1978."

The Government issued a directive on 18th May, 1977 which stated as far as the private sector was concerned

"The Private Sector

The cost of living index for Nairobi rose by 5.9 per cent and 5.7 per cent for lower and middle income groups respectively, arising out of the increases in food prices announced in March 1977. In the light of the above, collective agreements which were entered into between employers and unions before March 1977 and which did not take account of the March price increases should be renegotiated to reflect increases of up to 6 per cent by which cost of living index rose during that month in respect of lower and middle income groups, that is, those who earn less than Sh 1,400 p.m. It is stressed, however, that these increases are not automatic and will have to be negotiated between the parties. It should also be noted that this increase does not affect the right of trade unions and employers to negotiate, in the normal manner, their collective agreements, covering all personnel to whom their collective agreements relate, based on the rise in the cost of living since the collective agreements were last negotiated."

Since the parties' collective agreement had been entered into before March 1977 they embarked on negotiations for wage increases as a result of the said Government directive. A meeting took place on 16th June, 1977 which was attended by seven representatives on behalf of the Respondents and five representatives from the Claimants' side. An Executive Officer from the Federation of Kenya Employers acted as the chairman of this meeting.

The minutes of this meeting which were not challenged by either side read as follows

"Agenda

To consider wage increases as a result of the Government Directive on Re-negotiation of Collective Agreements and Minimum Wages

After a lengthy discussion, the parties agreed that

- 1 The wages be increased by Sh 26 p.m. effective 1st May, 1977
- 2 The arrears as a result of this Agreement be paid to the employees by end of August 1977
- 3 The Chairman to draft the Supplementary Agreement to be signed by the parties on 21st June, 1977 at 9.30 a.m. at the F.K.E.s offices."

Subsequently differences arose between the parties mainly because the Respondents put forward their own interpretation of what they had agreed at the meeting of 16th June. The Claimants' General Secretary met with an accident which delayed matters further and the parties eventually met on 3rd October, 1977 apparently to discuss a supplementary collective agreement.

At this meeting the Respondents put forward their position by using the words

- "1 Each employee was to be granted an increase of Sh 26 p.m. with effect from 1st May, 1977
- 2 The increases which are to be given in January 1978 as per principal agreement will be reduced by the sum of Sh 26 mentioned above
- 3 In view of the fact that the non members of the Group in the industry do pay relatively low wages, the Group was not prepared to give full increases in January 1978 as specified in the principal agreement."

The Claimants' stand was that they had no intention of changing the agreement which they had made with the Respondents on 16th June which was that the workers were entitled to a Sh 26 increase per month and that the increases due to the workers in January 1978 under the collective agreement are not to be interfered with by this increase of Sh 26.

The parties are now before the Court for a 6 per cent increase as indicated in the Government directive of 18th May, 1977,

The Claimants have submitted that the agreement arrived at with the Respondents on 16th June, 1977 did not contain the conditions which the Respondents later on tried to introduce and which were only afterthoughts. The Claimants insisted that the Sh 26 p.m. increase which they had agreed was to be in addition to the increases to which the workers were entitled under their collective agreement with the Respondents.

The Respondents on the other hand stated that it was understood by them and the Claimants that the Sh 26 increase was to be set off against the increase of Sh 30 p.m. due to the workers with effect from 1st January, 1978 and the fact that this did not appear in the minutes of 16th June was due to a mistake on the part of the person who drafted those minutes.

The Respondents also put forward submissions covering the financial implications if the Claimants' demands were upheld by the Court.

The Court must say that it is not at all impressed by the Respondents' explanation as to why very vital and extremely important points as far as they were concerned were not clearly recorded as having been put forward by them during the meeting of 16th June, 1977. Their spokesman stated that he had made a mistake. The Court does not believe that. The Court also does not believe the evidence of the Respondents' witness P. M. Kithome as he appeared to have very sketchy, if any, knowledge of the Government directive, which was the subject matter of negotiation on 16th June, 1977. The Court was not impressed by his evidence.

The Court notes that this witness agreed that the Respondents' appendix 5 was a correct record of the minutes of the meeting held on 16th June, 1977 and the Respondents' second witness, C. Phillips, stated in his evidence that the points regarding the set off of Sh 26 against the Sh 30 increase due to the workers on 1st January, 1978 was a very vital point and if it had been discussed it should have appeared in the minutes. He added that he had raised this point after having seen appendix 5 and wanted to know what effect it had on the collective agreement.

From the evidence before it, the Court has no hesitation in coming to the conclusion that the parties' agreement made on 16th June, 1977 is very clear and there is no ambiguity at all on what the parties intended. Therefore there is no question of any interpretation of that agreement being required. The parties agreed on 16th June that the wages be increased by Sh 26 p.m. effective from 1st May, 1977 and that the arrears as a result of this agreement be paid to the employees by end of August 1977.

The Court is equally satisfied that the Respondents are now trying to wriggle out of this very clear agreement which they made with the Claimants on 16th June by introducing the condition that the increase of Sh 30 which was due to the workers in January 1978 under the collective agreement will be reduced by a sum of Sh 26 which they agreed to give on 16th June 1977.

It is very unfortunate, but it is the Respondents' own fault, that they did not make this vital point as far as they are concerned, at the meeting of 16th June and for not sending top level members of management at this meeting where a decision was to be made which would have such colossal financial implications for them. The Court has repeatedly pointed out to the parties to the collective agreements that the economic disputes should receive the attention of the top most management and the top most union officials during negotiations and if either side takes the risk of sending junior officials to these meetings then they do so at their own risk and if things go wrong then they have no one to blame but themselves.

The evidence of Mr. Phillips clearly highlighted the financial implications as far as one of the Respondents' members Securicor (K) Ltd is concerned. He told the Court that the increases of Sh 26 for Nairobi and Mombasa and Sh 10 for other areas in May 1977 increased the Securicor's wage bill by Sh 600,000 and Sh 150,000 respectively. He further added that if his company was forced to pay to every employee Sh 26 effective 1st May, 1977 and Sh 30 from 1st January, 1978 then the company will have to find additional Sh 500,000 to meet their wage bill. He added that this would leave the Securicor with no alternative but to close some of the company's operations up-country.

From the above extract of Mr. Phillip's evidence it is clear what was at stake as far as financial implications are concerned during the negotiations at the meeting of 16th June, 1977. Yet the Securicor's representative at the meeting was one J. A. Okanga (who the Court understands was their Personnel Manager but has since left their employment) who along with other Respondents' representatives went ahead under the chairmanship of an Executive Officer of F.K.E. to make an agreement with the Claimants which as already stated above increased the wages by Sh 26 p.m. effective from 1st May, 1977 without any conditions as there is no reference at all to a different rate having

been negotiated for places other than Nairobi and Mombasa or that this amount was to be set off against the Sh 30 increase on which the workers are entitled under the collective agreement on 1st January, 1978

All the financial difficulties which the Respondents' are putting forward now should have been put forward to the Claimants at the time of the meeting of 16th June, 1977, and in fact the Claimants' General Secretary repeatedly stressed the point that the Respondents should have if they were serious about this point come forward during the meeting with all the relevant documentary evidence to show and convince the Claimants about their financial difficulties

The Court has ruled in several disputes on this issue of wage compensation to the workers as a result of the March, 1977, price increases as a result of the Government directive of May, 1977, that these price increases were a new development in the whole economic situation of the country and if the Court was satisfied that the collective agreement between the parties had not taken into account the March, 1977, price increases then the workers were entitled to a compensation of up to 6 per cent

The Court would like to point out that in the Government directive there is no mention of such compensation being set off against the workers' entitlements by way of wage increases under the collective agreement. In fact the F K E's own circular to its members makes no mention of such a set off. If the Respondents' plea for a set off was accepted then the whole exercise of compensating workers for the March, 1977, increases would be of no consequence

The Government directive envisaged and allowed renegotiation of the collective agreements which had been signed prior to March, 1977, and this is exactly what the Respondents and the Claimants proceeded to do on 16th June, 1977. The Court finds that as a result of these renegotiations the workers were awarded a special wage increase of Sh 26 with effect from 1st May, 1977, and that such an increase was not to be set off against the workers' wage increase of Sh 30 p.m. with effect from 1st January, 1978

The Court would like to comment on the Respondents' submission that the Court award in Cause No 85 of 1976 should be followed in this dispute. The Court is not prepared to do so because the facts and circumstances of that dispute and this dispute are totally different. In 1976 the Claimants and the Respondents did not renegotiate the Court award with the result that the Court award was amended by the relevant legislation which followed the Presidential decree. In this case the parties themselves embarked on renegotiations and came to an agreement granting Sh 26 wage increase to the workers without making any reference whatsoever to the workers' other entitlements under the collective agreement. This time the parties not only renegotiated but the Court finds that they actually came to an agreement at the meeting of 16th June, 1977, out of which the Respondents are now trying to back out by introducing other conditions like the set off and workers outside Nairobi and Mombasa being granted Sh 10 p.m. wage increase only

The Court has also given anxious thought to the Respondents' plea that the award should not be retroactive as that will not only subject the Respondents to a heavy financial burden but will also render them completely noncompetitive in this marginal industry where only less than 10 per cent is organized and are covered by a collective agreement. Further because the Respondents by virtue of the security business cannot charge their clients retroactively

On this point Mr Phillips stated in his evidence that the cost of the collective agreement had been worked out and had been passed to the customers. The Court fails to understand why they did not take appropriate steps if it was necessary to pass on the additional cost to their customers soon after agreeing to a wage increase of Sh 26 p.m. on 16th June, 1977. It was clearly agreed that the workers would be paid their arrears by the end of August, 1977. The Court wonders why the Respondents asked for time up to August, 1977, to pay the arrears as a result of the agreement which they reached on 16th June, 1977

The issue in dispute is 6 per cent wage increase and the Court after careful consideration of all the submissions finds that the parties agreed on 16th June, 1977, that the workers should receive Sh 26 increase per month with effect from 1st May, 1977, as a result of the Government directive requiring the private sector in agreements negotiated prior to March, 1977, to be renegotiated reflecting a wage increase of up to 6 per cent and the Court further finds that this wage increase was a special increase without any conditions and that the Respondents are in the wrong in trying to set it off against the workers' wage increase of Sh 30 p.m. due to them on 1st January, 1978

The Court further finds that this wage increase of Sh 26 p.m. was not restricted to employees in Nairobi and Mombasa only but was applicable to all the employees all over Kenya

The Court accordingly awards that all the Respondents' unionisable employees are entitled to a Sh 26 per month wage increase with effect from 1st May, 1977, and that in addition to this they are also entitled to their wage increase of Sh 30 per month with effect from 1st January, 1978

Finally the Court would like to state that when the collective agreement which is due to expire on 31st December, 1978, is revised, the parties will no doubt take into account the compensation for the cost of living increases which the workers have received during its lifetime including the Sh 26 special wage increase per month along with other relevant points in accordance with the Guidelines prevailing at that time
