- 2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 20th June, 1977, but the hearings having been adjourned at the parties' requests, the final hearing took place on 12th May and 11th and 18th July, 1978 In addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions the parties called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath —

### AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 24th January, 1977, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 16th February, 1977, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

The Claimants have brought this dispute on behalf of their members who are claiming payment for overtime worked for the Respondents details of which are as given below —

The Court was told that the total claim amounted to Sh 9,583/55

The relavant clause in the parties' collective agreement on overtime is 17 (a) which reads —

"Payment for overtime in accordance with arrangements approved by the head of department, after normal working hours for officers in salary scales S N in Nairobi and I-N in Mombasa inclusive shall be paid as overtime, provided that such overtime has been specifically authorized in writing by the officer's section head"

The seven employees involved in this dispute are senior officers and their salaries and designations during the relevant period, 1e August, September and October, 1974, were as follows—

The Claimants have pleaded that in accordance with the relevant clause on overtime their members worked on the instructions of their Head of Department notwithstanding the fact that the overtime authorization forms had been signed by the Assistant Chief Revenue Officer as they maintained that he required these seven employees in his department to work overtime directly on the instructions of the then City Treasurer, S Mbugwa

There is no dispute that the Chief Revenue Officer, Moses M Wanjau, did not sign any overtime authorization forms and certificate of overtime worked, nor did he append his

signature to the computer pay roll sheet before all these documents were sent to the City Treasurer As a matter of fact, he came to know about these overtime claims much later after about three months when he received all these forms back from the City Treasurer with a note asking him to explain why he had not signed the claim forms

According to this witness it was his responsibility to sign the necessary documents in respect of overtime work for all the sub-sections under his section. He admitted, however, that on instructions of the Deputy City Treasurer he had written on 20th August, 1974, the following letter to his assistant —

'1973 Final Accounts Rates and Sundry Debts

Despite several reminders the necessary figures in respect of Rates and Sundry Debts have not yet been supplied to the Chief Accountant

This is a most unsatisfactory state of affairs and the Deputy City Treasurer would like to have a full explanation of the delay in writing

In the meantime he has directed that the officers concerned must work unpaid overtime and that they should not be allowed Saturday off until the balancing is completed"

There is no dispute on the fact that these employees did work overtime as per their claim and even the Chief Revenue Officer was aware of it but he explained that in accordance with the aforesaid letter they were not to be paid for such overtime

The reasons which the Respondents put forward for this was that these seven employees were either so careless in making entries in their ledgers that balancing them became impossible without having to spend a lot of duplicate time or they had simply neglected their duties when they were supposed to do, that is during their normal working hours

The Respondents further accused persons of having placed the Council's Debtor Accounts (in 1973 up to October, 1974) in such a state that effective debt collection was not possible

In these circumstances they submitted that the alleged overtime work was in fact unproductive work as time was spent re-doing work badly done before, or doing work which was not done during the time it was supposed to have been done

The Respondents also put forward the point that the financial year and accounting year for them is 1st January to 31st December The overtime claims related to the year 1973, and as required by regulation 229 of the Local Government Regulations the accounts should have been completed before 30th June, 1974 These employees did not complete their work as required and were given the whole of the month of July, 1974, to finish the work but they either ignored or refused to complete their work

On the aforesaid grounds the Respondents submitted that they could not entertain these claims

The Claimants have raised a couple of interesting points in support of their case which appeared to have considerable merit

To begin with it has been argued that these is no provision in the collective agreement whereby the Respondents have the right to require their employees to work unpaid overtime after normal working hours

Secondly they pointed out that if what the Respondents had put forward during the hearing through their written submissions and through their witnessess was true regarding the work performance of their members then clause 26 dealing with discipline should have been involved. This clause reads as follows—

"Where in the opinion of the head of department an officer has been guilty of an act or omission incompatible with the due and faithful discharge of his duties, the head of department shall either—

- (a) reprimand the officer in writing, a copy of which shall be placed on the officer's personal file,
- (b) recommend the withholding of increments within the provision of Rule 5 of this code, or
- (c) suspend the officer in accordance with Rule 27, and report thereon to the appropriate committee"

In addition to the above two main submissions the Claimants have put forward a few other arguments but they don't seem to have much validity in them. Their submission that the Assistant Chief Revenue Officer could sign the overtime authorization forms while the Chief Revenue Officer was on duty cannot be accepted by the Court although the Claimants did put forward a few documents in some other departments where on a few occasions overtime payment had been authorized by a person other than the head of the section. The Court cannot accept these documents to support the Claimants demand in

this respect because there may be other reasons why those payments were approved. These documents were not gone into thoroughly during the hearing because the Claimants had put them in during the final submissions.

The Court also rejects the Claimants' submission that the Assistant Chief Revenue Officer was an authorized signatory for certification of payments because a document which they put forward in support of this related to the Assistant Chief Revenue Officer when he was an Acting Executive Officer in 1971

The Claimants, however, made an interesting observation that the Respondents' annual accounts were usually prepared late and were almost never completed before 30th June of the following year as required under the relevant Local Government Regulations For instance the 1968–1970 and 1971 accounts were submitted in August of the following years and accounts for 1974 were submitted on 13th August, 1975 and for 1975 again in August, 1976 They added that the completion of all these accounts had entailed overtime work for which the employees were paid

The Court finds it established that whenever overtime work is necessary in the Revenue Section the Chief Revenue Officer approaches the City Treasurer for his approval The City Treasurer decides whether or not overtime is necessary and once he gives his approval then the Chief Revenue Officer authorizes the workers by signing the authorization form which is later on certified in respect of overtime worked Further the Chief Revenue Officer has to sign this form for all his subsections which are filled every day At the end of the month all the forms are put together and entered in the computer pay roll sheet which the Chief Revenue Officer has once again to endorse After this, the documents go to the City Treasurer for final approval

The Court has no doubt that the above procedure was not followed in respect of overtime worked which is the subject matter of this dispute but the fact remains that these employees did work overtime in respect of which they have raised this claim. The letter from the Chief Revenue Officer dated 20th August, 1974, which has been set out hereinabove clearly shows that these employees were asked to work overtime although it was directed that it should be unpaid overtime.

One of the Respondents' submissions was that they had been directed by the Ministry of Local Government to curtail overtime working as the overtime bill over the years has been tunning into millions of shillings. The Court, however, cannot agree that the way to achieve a reduction in this direction is to require employees to do unpaid overtime.

The Court cannot accept that the Respondents' action in requiring employees to do unpaid overtime is consistent with the parties' collective agreement. It is quite obvious that this move of requiring workers to do unpaid overtime was strictly speaking a punitive measure for them not to have completed their work during normal office hours. The Court is of the view that the Respondents erred in taking this sort of disciplinary action against their employees. The proper way to handle this matter was for the Respondents to invoke clause 26 on discipline when they found that the workers were not discharging their duties faithfully

The Court would like to add that it is no use for an employer to have all the relevant clauses regarding discipline, etc., in the

collective agreement if they are not to be used effectively not only to enforce discipline amongst the work force but also to ensure that they all do a full day's work for which they are paid The Court cannot allow an employer who having failed to utilize his rights under the collective agreement to penalize employees by such acts as to require them to do unpaid overtime work. The Court must find that the Respondents acted improperly in this regard.

On the other hand the employees in this dispute are fairly senior officers who should be fully aware of the relevant procedure for overtime work and the clauses of the collective agreement

The Court cannot accept the Claimants' submission that these persons did overtime work without knowing that it was unpaid overtime. The Court is satisfied that the Assistant Chief Revenue Officer and these persons knew very well that they were going to do this overtime work for which the Respondents were not going to pay them, otherwise why did they wait for about three months before forwarding their claims in respect of the overtime worked by them. This is indeed most unusual on the part of workers

The proper thing for the workers was to forward their overtime claims in accordance with the normal procedure and to expect the payment at the end of the first month during which they did overtime. If they had done so then they would have found out that they were doing unpaid overtime work and they could have then enlisted straightaway the help of the Claimants in resolving this mater in addition to refusing to do unpaid overtime work

All in all the Court has come to the conclusion that both the parties to this dispute have committed irregularities to a certain extent as far as overtime is concerned, the Respondents in violating the collective agreement as far as overtime work is concerned by requiring the employees to work unpaid overtime and the employees on their part for agreeing to do so and then waiting for three months before putting forward their claim

In these circumstances the Court has decided that both the parties should share the blame and the Court has decided that since these persons did do overtime work as alleged by them they should be entitled to half payment only The Court feels that by their conduct they have forfeited part of their claim and the Respondents should also realize that they cannot require their employees to do free overtime work. The Court hopes that in future if the need arises the Respondents will resort to the relevant clauses on discipline in their collective agreement to ensure that employees discharge their duties faithfully during normal office hours

The Court accordingly awards that the Respondents should pay the employees concerned half the total amount which they are claiming in respect of overtime work done by them
