- (e) whether the applicant runs an established business or whether it is proposed to start a new business or sell/sublet premises,
- (f) whether the applicant owns any other industrial plot in Nairobi.

5 The successful allottee of the plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 30 days of notification that his application has been successful, the stand premium and proportion of the annual rent together with survey, conveyancing stamp duty and registration fees, contribution in lieu of rates and provision service charges. In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allotment and the applicant shall have no claim to the plot.

General Conditions

1 The grant will be made under the provision of the Government Lands Act (Cap 280) of the Laws of Kenya, and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap 281).

2 The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in the letter of application and will be subject to the Special Conditions set out below.

3 The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the issue of the letter of allotment.

Special Conditions

1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and Local Authority. The Commissioner of Lands shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2 The grantee shall within six months of the registration of the grant submit in triplicate to the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands, plans (including block plans showing the position of the building and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water) drawings elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes

to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the registration of the grant complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner.

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied by the Government Lands Act, if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or Commissioner of Lands in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they/is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein.

Provided further that if such a notice as aforesaid shall be given, (1) within 12 months of the registration of the grant the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee fifty per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of the notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

5 The land and buildings shall only be used for light industrial purposes with ancillary offices and stores.

6 Accommodation not exceeding 100 sq ft may be provided for a caretaker or night watchman.

7 The buildings shall not cover a greater area of the land than that laid down by the Local Authority in its by-laws.

8 The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.

9 The grantee shall not subdivide the land without the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands.

10 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands, no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed.

11 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall, on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost, either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

12 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads, and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.

13 Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

14 The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President of the Republic of Kenya in lieu thereof.

15 The President of the Republic of Kenya or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purposes shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground and the grantee shall not interfere with any existing alignments of mains or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

16 The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual rental payable hereunder at the expiry of the 33rd and 66th years of the term hereby granted such rent will be at the rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands

Interpretation Application

RULING

THE Court announced its award in the above dispute on 19th July and awarded that Ojiem should be paid six months' salary by way of compensation for the wrongful dismissal that he had suffered at the hands of the Respondents

The Respondents forwarded a cheque for Sh 7,710 representing Ojiem's six months' salary but the Claimants insist that in addition to the compensation awarded by the Court he is also entitled to the terminal benefits which the Respondents had originally offered to him as follows —

The Claimants have submitted that the above terminal benefits are Ojiem's lawful entitlements and are therefore not covered by the compensation awarded by the Court. They relied on the relevant sections of the Employment Act and the Trade Disputes Act in support of their application in asking the Court to uphold their interpretation of the Court award.

The Respondents on the other hand emphasized that the award was so clear that an interpretation was not necessary. They pointed out that the Court award of six months' compensation to Ojiem had fully compensated him for the days he was out of employment which were approximately six months, i.e. 6th November, 1976 to 10th May, 1977.

The Court would like to draw the Claimants' attention to the following paragraph which appears in its award —

"The Claimants have asked for a deterrent award against the Respondents for having sided with one faction of the union against the other but the Court is not inclined to give in to their request on those lines for the simple reason that since 11th May, 1977, Ojiem started earning a sum of Sh 2,050 p.m. after being given an important job by the Claimants in their own organization and since February this year his salary has gone up to Sh 2,800."

It is obvious that the Court intended Ojiem to get salary for the period he was unemployed and if the Claimants' interpretation regarding additional payment of two months in lieu of notice is to be accepted then it would mean that he is being paid for the time when he had already secured another employment where he is getting a higher salary than what he was earning from the Respondents. Had the Court intended Ojiem to also get two months' salary in lieu of notice in addition to six months' compensation then the Court could have clearly stated so.

The Court must therefore reject the Claimants' interpretation as far as the additional two months' salary in lieu of notice is concerned. The fact that the Respondents had offered to pay this amount to Ojiem prior to the hearing of the dispute does not affect the position. The Court award was made after having considered all these points which were so exhaustively put forward during the hearing.

Regarding the other two items the Court finds that they are validly due to Ojiem and relates to the period of his employment with the Respondents. He is certainly entitled to the days worked in November, 1976, and for the leave which he had earned which the Court was told were the left-overs from his annual leaves from the previous years. The Court rules that the Respondents should pay him for these items.

In view of the fact that Ojiem had come back from leave in September, 1976, and had exhausted all his leave travelling allowance the Court finds that he is not entitled to any leave allowance as claimed by the Claimants.

The Court hereby directs the Respondents to pay Ojiem the following amount in addition to the six months' compensation which they have already paid —

The Court must emphasize once again that the parties should not try to make use of interpretation applications either to increase or decrease the awards made by the Court as the Court always sets out its awards in clear and simple language so as to avoid any misunderstandings. In this application the Claimants have tried to get an additional two months through this interpretation application and the Respondents on their part have tried to deny them the lawful entitlements of Ojiem with the result that they had to come back to the Court for an interpretation of the Court award which was very clear.

Issue in dispute —

Present wages structure which is consolidated to be deconsolidated

1 The Transport & Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Rent A Car Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 4th day of September, 1978 and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 31st May, 1978 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 8th July along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

The parties' collective agreement which was effective from 1st September, 1975 for a period of two years has expired and the Claimants have put forward a demand that the present consolidated salaries being paid to their members by the Respondents should be deconsolidated prior to the revision of the collective agreement. What the Claimants really want is to break up the existing wage so as to reflect a separate item of house allowance

The Claimants have put forward a demand that all their members should be paid a sum of Sh 500 p.m. each by way of house allowance in order to enable them to live in moderately decent houses

In addition to highlighting the social aspects of overcrowded living conditions the Claimants very strongly submitted that the present rates for the various grades in the collective agreement are far below than some rural transport companies in the country, who in addition paid a separate house allowance to all their employees

The Claimants also referred to the movement in the cost of living indices during the period under review in order to bolster their demand for a separate house allowance

The Respondents pointed out that since their recognition of the Claimants and the collective agreements which had been negotiated way back from 1st September, 1969, they had always operated on the principle of a consolidated wage inclusive of a housing element

The Respondents argued that employers had made arrangements with the trade unions regarding the matter of house allowance as it suited the special conditions and merits of their industries with the result that some paid a separate house allowance while the others paid a consolidated wage. The Respondents added that they were opposed to deconsolidation of the existing wages as it would seriously reduce the workers' benefits like overtime and retirement

The Court has expressed its views on this sensitive issue of house allowance and deconsolidation of a consolidated wage structure in several disputes in the past. The Court has made it very clear that each dispute would be judged on its own special and peculiar merits

In the Respondents' undertaking the Court notes that the workers every month earn a substantial amount of overtime which would certainly be seriously affected were the Court to split up the present wage structure to reflect a separate house allowance. Even if the Claimants do not appreciate this point the Court is certain that that arrangement would not be acceptable to the workers

The main reason why the Claimants want a separate house allowance in addition to wages is to gain more money for their members. This is an accepted tactic in collective bargaining but in Kenya so long as the Guidelines are in force the Claimants must realize that there is a limit beyond which the Court cannot make an award on items in the collective agreements which involve financial burden on the employer. In these circumstances the Claimants would not be able to succeed in getting more money and that certainly is their intention by putting forward a demand for each of their members to be paid a house allowance of Sh 500 p.m. This demand as it stands is certainly well beyond the ceiling laid down by the Guidelines

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that for the time being the Claimants should be content to have a clearly defined housing element in their consolidated wage and the Court has decided to award that the present consolidated wage structure should be deemed to include a housing element which the Court assesses at 15 per cent

The Court would like to bring it to the notice of the Claimants that since 1971 increases in the rents are being taken into account in the computation of the cost of living increases along with other traditional items.

Unfortunately for the Claimants an increase in the rates for the various grades and a general increase are not issues in dispute before the Court. It may well be that they have a case for the upward revision of the existing rates and most of

their arguments which they put forward during the hearing of this dispute would certainly be very relevant in that exercise

The Court accordingly rejects the Claimants' demand for the deconsolidation of the consolidated wage structure but awards that 15 per cent in the wages should be deemed to be the housing element. Having made this award the Court directs the parties to enter into serious negotiations on the new wage rates and wage increases. The parties will find that the Court award in this dispute will go a long way in helping them to arrive at a satisfactory settlement regarding the wage issue

Issues in dispute —

- 1 Shift differential
- 2 Permanent transfer

1 The Kenya Engineering Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Engineering & Allied Industries Employers Association shall hereinafter be referred to as Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 13th day of September, 1978 and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 5th June, 1978 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 1st August along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

The parties had appeared before the Court in a major dispute in Cause No 25 of 1977 when there were 19 issues in dispute with shift differential appearing as item No 6. The issue of permanent transfer was not in dispute and the Respondents stated that the Claimants had not even included this particular item when they had reported the major dispute to the Minister for Labour on 32 items

During the hearing of Cause No 25/77 the Claimants informed the Court that the issue of shift differential had been withdrawn by them and the Court accordingly stated in its award that the issue of shift differential was withdrawn by the Claimants

Subsequently the Claimants tried through an interpretation application to inform the Court that what they had meant by withdrawing the item from the dispute before the Court was that they accepted the Respondents' offer on this particular item which they had made at a JIC meeting on 31st August 1977. The Court, however, refused to deal with this matter on an interpretation application

The Claimants have submitted that the Respondents should not be allowed to back out of the offers which they had made to them during the negotiations although a deadlock had been recorded on both these two items. The Claimants also added that the Respondents' attitude in this dispute would make their future negotiations very difficult as will force them to adopt a certain line of action during the forthcoming negotiations

The Respondents pointed out the danger in collective bargaining if the Claimants were allowed to succeed in this dispute in that it would be difficult for the employers generally to negotiate any agreement on a variety of interdependent claims for fringe benefits in the future since in evaluating their position on the later items under discussion the employers would be forced to take into account what they offered on earlier items even if in the course of negotiations the union had rejected such offers and withdrawn their claim on such items. The Respondents added that the union on their part will reject the

employers offers on earlier items withdrawing their claim on such items in order to encourage the employers to offer more on later items with a view to reaching agreement. Under such circumstances it would not be reasonable for the earlier offers to be revived by the union as forming part of the total agreement.

The Court has previously ruled in no uncertain terms that when a collective agreement is being revised then the parties should table all their demands at that time and if necessary get a final decision by the Industrial Court so that during the life time of the collective agreement both the parties are in a position to know where they stand in relation to wages/salaries and fringe benefits. The Court has not allowed fringe benefits to be brought up either afresh or for revision in piecemeal and after the main collective agreement has been revised. The Court does not intend to depart from this stand because it is one of the most important points in the whole system of collective bargaining which has developed in Kenya.

The Court was not informed why the issue of permanent transfer was not reported as an item in dispute to the Minister for Labour on 7th September, 1976 when the Claimants reported a dispute on 32 other items although the position on this particular issue between the parties was as follows —

"The employers proposed the payment of a disturbance allowance of up to Sh 600 to an employee who is transferred on a permanent basis subject to the production of receipts for expenses incurred by such employee. The union demanded a lump sum payment of Sh 1,350 to all employees on permanent transfer irrespective of the costs incurred by the employees. Deadlock recorded."

The Court cannot allow the Claimants to come forward now and say that they should get an award on the lines as proposed by the Respondents during negotiations because the parties had recorded deadlock on the item and further had not even reported it to the Minister for Labour as a dispute at that time.

Unfortunately for the Claimants they have again slipped up on the issue of shift differential because instead of asking the Court to make an award on the lines as proposed by the Respondents, that is, increasing the shift differential from 15 cts per hour to 20 cts per hour they simply asked the Court to withdraw the issue whereas at the JIC meeting of 31st August 1977 the following was minuted —

"The union reduced their original demand from 20 per cent to 17 per cent of the employees wages/salary for hours worked."

The employers agreed to increase the shift differential from 15 cts per hour to 20 cts per hour. Deadlock was recorded."

Here again a deadlock was recorded and under these circumstances the Court while having full sympathy with the Claimants cannot help them without creating a precedent which would have an undesirable effect on the process of collective bargaining in the country.

Fortunately for the Claimants they are about to embark on a fresh collective agreement as the previous award was effective from 1st September 1976 for a period of two years.

On the issue of shift differential since 1st September, 1976 the provision as it stood at that time has continued in force and the Claimants will no doubt now take the opportunity of tabling their demand for its revision.

The item of permanent transfer, the Court was told was a new item and the Claimants may if they so wish include this item also for inclusion in the next collective agreement and make their appropriate demands which will no doubt be discussed in accordance with the laid down machinery.

For the foregoing reasons the Court rejects the Claimants demand.
