AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 31st May, 1978, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 14th July together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

The parties had a collective agreement effective from 1st January, 1975, for a period of 24 months and the Claimants forwarded their proposals to the Respondents for revising it which were the subject matter of negotiations between the parties from January, 1977 to 13th December, 1977, when the last negotiating meeting was held

Under the previous collective agreement five categories of employees are listed as shown hereunder with the rates of pay per month consolidated in respect thereof

The Claimants have used the same pattern in their proposals and in addition to asking for the rate of pay per month to be increased are also demanding a general increment of 30 per cent to each employee for the first year and another 30 per cent increase for the second year on the employees' wages/salaries

The Court was very surprised to learn during the hearing that as a matter of fact the Claimants were looking after the interest of 15 workers only all of whom are within the first three categories. The Claimants conceded this point and added that no air hostesses or clerical staff were their members

The dispute before the Court therefore is in respect of workers who are involved in loading and unloading the Respondents' one aircraft when it is at the Mombasa Airport three times a week. The Respondents pointed out that their employees worked only 12 hours per week and they felt that for this reason they did not qualify for consideration of any increase in their wages leave aside the demand for 30 per cent as proposed by the Claimants. The Court notes that the number of working hours as specified in the collective agreement are 42 to be spread over not more than six days of the week

The Respondents while admitting that financially they are viable as they are engaged in the transportation of tourists to Kenya from Europe quite frankly stated that if they found the employment of these 15 employees to be expensive then they could quite easily hire the necessary labour from the Kenya Airways. They emphasized that they could not at present increase their operations in order to create more work for these employees

The Claimants have of course based their demand on the cost of living increase and they reject the Respondents' contention that the workers should not be granted any increase just because they do only 12 hours per week. They maintained that their members were in regular employment with the Respondents and had suffered from the effects of inflation like anyone else in the country

The Court notes that if as expected the parties had concluded an agreement by early 1977 then the relevant movement in the cost of living indices would have been from 1st January, 1975, up to 31st December, 1976. This would reflect an increase of 26.1 per cent and as per Guideline (iv) (a) two-third of this is 17.4 per cent

In addition to this there was a Government directive of 6 per cent wage increase in early 1977 which would have given the workers a maximum compensation amounting to 23.4 per cent

The Court feels that the Respondents were not right in the approach in this dispute. The fact that these workers have continued to be employed by them first in Nairobi and then in Mombasa for some five or six years, cannot be entirely due to altruistic reasons. The fact that although the workers under the collective agreement are required to do 42 hours per week but do only 12 hours is not good enough reason to deprive them of at least compensation for the cost of living increases permissible under the Guidelines. The workers are willing to do 42 hours per week but unfortunately for the Respondents they are not able to provide them with that much work

The Court has seriously considered the threat by the Respondents that they can quite easily declare all these workers redundant and hire the necessary labour from the Kenya Airways but notwithstanding this threat the Court has decided that the workers are entitled to, and as such should be given, a wage increase. If and when the Respondents decide to declare their employees redundant then they will have to apply to the Court for the necessary approval and will have to fully justify the intended redundancy

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that all the Respondents' employees, other than the clerical staff and air hostesses, should get a wage increase of 12 per cent with effect from 1st January 1977, on the wages which they were getting on that date and further that they should get another wage increase of 12 per cent on their wages as at 1st January, 1978

The Court must point out that in the absence of effective date being an issue in dispute the Court had no alternative but to make its award from the parties' own agreed effective date of 1st January, 1977

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Medical Research Centre shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties appeared before the Court on 10th January, 10th March, 6th April, 8th and 22nd May, 12th June, 5th July, 2nd and 10th August, 7th and 29th September, 1978, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Respondents also called Dr. Hanegraaf to give evidence during the hearing

AWARD

3 The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 14th March, 1977, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 17th October, 1977, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner

As stated above, the parties had 23 issues in dispute but when they appeared before the Court on 10th January, 1978, the Court after hearing the parties made the following Order —

"The Court is satisfied that there have been no negotiations on the 23 issues in dispute. Parties should embark upon serious negotiations on each and every item listed in the Notification of Dispute Form "A" under the chairmanship of the Chief Industrial Relations Officer or his nominee and produce minutes of such meetings to the Court showing the items agreed and those where deadlock is recorded. On receiving that report the Court shall take further steps to initiate and conclude the hearing. Further mention on 10th March, 1978, at 10 a.m."

On 10th March the parties informed the Court that about 19 issues had been resolved by then and only a few items remained and as a result, with the parties' consent, the Court ordered further submissions in respect of the remaining items in dispute. The hearing was fixed for 18th and 19th April, 1978. The Claimants having failed to submit their memo in time the parties were given further time for submitting their written submissions and the hearing was fixed for 22nd and 23rd May, 1978

On 8th May, 1978, the Respondents applied to the Court for striking out that part of the Claimants' amended submission which appeared under the general heading "racial discrimination" as they felt that the allegations had no foundation whatsoever and were scandalous, frivolous and vexatious. The Court

after hearing the parties on this application made the following Order and proceeded to delete certain sections from the Claimants' memo —

'Racial discrimination/Africanization are not issues in dispute, therefore arguments/submissions on these matters will not be allowed except to the extent where it can justifiably be considered as an argument in support of the six issues in dispute'

On 22nd May, the Claimants applied for further adjournment which was granted and on 12th June, they applied for another adjournment as the Court was informed that they had settled the issues of working hours and overtime also and that further meetings were scheduled to discuss the remaining issues. After two further mentions on 5th July and 2nd August the hearing proceeded on 10th August, 7th September and 29th September, 1978, on the issues of wages, effective date and retirement, all other issues having been settled at the parties' own level and through the assistance of the Ministry of Labour Conciliator and the Employment Promotion Division officials.

As a result of all the aforesaid efforts the gap between the parties has been considerably narrowed on the remaining issues.

The Respondents are a research institute which has come into being as a result of collaboration between the Government of the Netherlands and the Kenya Government. This Institute was established and is maintained entirely by the Netherlands Government.

The Court was told that the Respondents are a bilateral project between two sovereign states namely the Netherlands and the Republic of Kenya covering medical research and that the Centre was not a commercial enterprise.

It is not disputed that right from the establishment of the Institute the Kenya Government personnel policy had been applied to its Kenya staff members as it was anticipated that the Kenya Government would eventually take over the Centre's activities. The recent developments are a pointer in this direction and the Respondents' Director informed the Court that it has been agreed with the Kenya Government that the Institute's autonomous nature would gradually be replaced by a joint programme between the two governments with the final responsibility resting with the Kenya Organization. So there is a distinct possibility that the Respondents' employees would be absorbed in the Ministry of Health and would then officially be within the Civil Service scales.

The Respondents' terms and conditions of employment for their employees have been based on the Kenya Government Code of Regulations and the Civil Service scales in force from time to time. In addition, they have set up a non-contributory provident fund scheme which the Court was told provided quite a few generous benefits to the contributors.

It is also not disputed that all the salary increases in 1975 and 1977 and the housing benefits which were reviewed for the civil servants were also granted to the Respondents' employees.

As stated above the dispute has now narrowed down to a point where the Claimants are demanding that the special allowance which the Respondents are giving their employees which at the moment is Sh 50 and which the Respondents have offered to increase to Sh 200 p.m. to all employees should be consolidated into the existing basic salaries.

The Respondents have resisted this step because they feel that they would not be able to meet this extra financial burden. They are, however, prepared to continue paying this special allowance as a special item apart from the basic salaries.

The EPD analysis reveals that the impact of the consolidation of the above offer in terms of the additional labour costs would be as follows —

(1) The direct additional cost of Provident Fund amounts to Sh 25,920 p.a. representing an increase of 2.2 per

cent, i.e. 70 members by 12 months by (— by Sh 200)

is equal to Sh 25,920 p.a.

(2) The direct additional cost for annual leave allowance based on the already agreed rates amount to Sh 4,000 p.a. representing an increase of 0.3 per cent.

(3) The indirect additional cost in respect of acting allowance, disturbance allowance, hardship allowance and overtime allowance amount to approximately Sh 5,000 to Sh 6,000 p.a. representing an increase of between 0.4 and 0.5 per cent.

Thus the total additional labour costs per annum amount to approximately Sh 36,000 representing an increase of about 3 per cent on the present wage bill. Our analysis indicates that Sh 200 unconsolidated is equal to Sh 170 consolidated 'special allowance' into the basic salaries. This means that the extra costs for consolidating the 'special allowance' amount to Sh 30 p.m. per employee. In other words the same cost effects are obtained either by awarding Sh 200 unconsolidated or Sh 170 consolidated provided that the composition of the workforce remain the same."

The Court has carefully considered the various aspects of this dispute and concurs with the EPD's statement that the consolidation of the special allowance would result in considerable change in the structure of the basic salary scales as in force in the Respondents' undertaking.

The Court cannot overlook the fact that there is a special role which the Respondents are playing in the development of medical research in this country through an arrangement which is being entirely financed by the Netherlands Government and that they are paying their employees remuneration on the basis of the Kenya Civil Service. Further that there is almost a certainty that in the very near future the Respondents' employees would be absorbed in the Ministry of Health and would thus be officially bound by the Civil Service Scales and Code of Regulations.

The parties' final position in this dispute was as follows —

The Claimants accepted the Respondents' offer to a general uniform increase from the present Sh 50 to Sh 200 p.m. for all employees provided that the offer is backdated to 1st January, 1978, and consolidated into the existing basic salaries.

The Respondents on the other hand accepted as effective date of the agreement 1st January, 1978 (from the previous date of 1st July, 1978, suggested by EPD) provided that their offer as stated in the previous paragraph is not incorporated (consolidated) into the basic wage scales due to direct and indirect cost implications of the consolidation.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that the Respondents should increase the present special allowance of Sh 50 which they pay to all their employees per month to Sh 200 per month and that this special allowance should not be consolidated into the existing basic salaries. Keeping in view the possibility that the Respondents' employees will be absorbed in the Civil Service the Court further rules that as and when they are absorbed in the Civil Service this special allowance of Sh 200 per month should be considered as part of the employees' salaries for the purpose of conversion on to the Civil Service scales.

The Court further awards that the Respondents should pay this special allowance to all their employees with effect from 1st January, 1978.

As far as the issue of retirement benefits is concerned the Court is satisfied that the non-contributory provident fund which the Respondents have set up for their employees is strictly governed by the terms of the provident fund deed and such this item is non-negotiable and the Court therefore does not intend to make any order sought under this issue by the Claimants.

Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an opponent for an order for costs if the opposition is uncontested by the applicant.

Where it is stated in the advertisement of the applicant that the mark, upon its registration, is to be limited to certain colours, the colours are, as far as possible, indicated in the accompanying representations of the mark in the usual heraldic manner.

Representations of the marks advertised herein can be seen at the Trade Marks Registry, State Law Office, Nairobi.

Applications for registration in Part A of the Register are shown with the official number unaccompanied by any letter. Applications for Part B are distinguished by the letter B prefixed to the official number.





- (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of the paper and should be typed on one side of the paper. The copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations

Particular attention should be paid to the following points —

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

Kenya Gazette

D 41 (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week the publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect

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
