#### THE TRADE DISPUTES ACT

(Cap. 234)

ORDER UNDER SECTION 36-COLLECTION OF TRADE UNION DUES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 36 of the Trade Disputes Act, the Minister for Labour hereby orders every employer who employs not less than five members of the Mombasa Dockworkers' Union to—

- (a) deduct every month—
  - (i) the sum of ten shillings from the wages of all workers who are on staff terms and conditions of service; and
  - (ii) the sum of seven shillings from the wages of the workers who are on manual grade terms and conditions of service,

in respect of trade union dues from the wages of each of his employees who is a member of that union;

- (b) pay eighty-five per cent of the total sums so deducted in any month not later than the tenth day of the following month, by crossed cheque payable into the account of the Mombasa Dockworkers' Union at the Barclays Bank of Kenya Limited, Nkrumah Road, Mombasa;
- (c) pay fifteen per cent of that total sum deducted in any month, not later than the tenth day of the following month, by crossed cheque made payable into the account of the Central Organization of Trade Unions (Kenya) Account No. 140793-7, Barclays Bank of Kenya Limited, Mama Ngina Street, P.O. Box 30011, Nairobi;
- (d) notify in writing the Registrar of Trade Unions at the end of each month of the total amount of any payments made into the accounts of that trade union and of that organization in that month.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 36 (2) of the Act, the order made under Gazette Notice No. 1934 of 7th July, 1978, is hereby revoked.

Civil servant applicants should complete Forms PSC. 2A triplicate (submitting the original through their Heads of Departments) and Cards PSC. 25 and 25A. Other applicants should complete Forms PSC. 2 in triplicate and Cards PSC. 24 and PSC. 24A.

These documents are obtainable either from the Secretary Common other Government offices.

#### Note

Incremental credits will be granted to successful candidates who are not civil servants for approved previous experience provided the maximum salary is not exceeded. They will also be eligible for benefits and privileges enjoyed by civil servants in accordance with existing Government Regulations.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Health:

Occupational Therapist Grade II (Two Posts) (No. 574/78)

Salary scale.—£1,170 o £1,554 p.a. PENSIONABLE of AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be serving officers who have completed at three (3) years course in Occupational Therapy at the Medical Training Centre or its equivalent. They must have at least served for minimum period of three (3) years in the grade of Occupational Therapist III.

The successful candidates will be required to provide Occupational Therapy services at Kenyatta National Hospital, Mathari Hospital or at any of the Provincial Hospitals.

Nutritionist Grade I (Five Posts) (No. 575/78)

Salary scale.—£1,446 to £1,938 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be in possession of at least a university degree in Nutrition or in Home Economic Majoring in Nutrition, or equivalent training.

In addition, they must have served for at least three years (3) in position requiring either teaching of Nutrition or implementation of Nutrition programmes or both at Nutrition Grade II level.

The posts are at Provincial and District levels, or teaching Institutions of the Ministry of Health.

Public Health Officer Grade II (Four Posts) (No. 576/78)

Salary scale.—£1,170 to £1,554 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be in possession of statutory qualifications and must be serving officers with a minimum of three years approved practical experience in the grade of Public Health Officer III. Any other relevant additional qualification would be advantageous.

Public Health Technician Grade I (Twelve Posts)
(No. 577/78)

Salary scale.—£642 to £900 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be in possession of Public Health Technicians certificate issued at the Medical Training Centre Nairobi or its equivalent. They must be serving officers with a minimum of three years' approved practical experience in the grade of Public Health Technician II. Any other relevant additional qualification would be advantageous.

Senior Tailor (One Post) (No. 578/78)

Salary scale.—£642 to £900 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be experienced tailors and should possess a Government National Trade Test Certificate Grade I or its equivalent. Serving officers must have served for at least three years at Job Group "E". Ability to supervise staff is essential.

The successful candidate will be required to make students' uniform and other uniforms as may be required by the Principal and will be posted to Medical Training Centre, Nairobi. He/she will be required to demonstrate measuring, cutting and stitching a uniform.

Tailor Grade I (One Post) (No. 579/78)

Salary scale.—£531 to £744 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be experienced serving officers and should possess a Government 'National' Trade Test Certificate I or its equivalent and must have served for at least four years as Tailor Grade II Job Group "D".

The successful candidate will be required to make students' uniform under the supervision of a Senior Tailor. He/she will be required to demonstrate measuring, cutting and stitching a uniform.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Works:

Senior Architectural Assistant (Two Posts) (No. 580/78)

Salary scale.—£1,734 to £2,334 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be in possession of the East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent. They must have passed the Higher Technician Certificate in Building and Civil Engineering or its equivalent and must have served for eight years minimum practical experience in an Architectural office.

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They should possess Bachelor of Arts (Architectural Studies) of the University of Nairobi. In both cases applicants must be able to take rough sketches and working them up to finished working drawings, and should be able to prepare production drawings for various Public Buildings, e.g. offices, schools, hospitals, etc. They should be able to analyse the prepared technical information required by a project team at each design stage.

Applicants should also have knowledge of the following:-

- (i) the work of the Quantity Surveyor, Electrical Engineer and Structural Engineer.
- (ii) they must be acquainted with practices and procedures applicable in the Building Industry.

Duties include supervision, co-ordination of, and organizing scheduling of work for Architectural Draughtsmen grade I, II, and III, and trainees and to ensure flow of materials and work on group sectional level.

Architectural Assistant Grade I (Three Posts) (No. 581/78)

Salary scale.—£1,446 to £1,938 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREBMENT.

Applicants must be in possession of the East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent. They must have passed the Ordinary Diploma in Building and Civil Engineering from the Kenya Polytechnic or any other recognized Institution and must have a minimum of four years' practical experience in drawing office as well as thorough knowledge of the following:—

- (a) taking rough sketches and working them up to finished working drawings.
- (b) knowledge of building construction.
- (c) be acquainted with practices and procedures applicable in the Building Industry.
- (d) preparation of site reports.
- (e) model making and presentation drawing including perspectives.

Architectural Assistant Grade II (Eight Posts) (No. 582/78)

Salary scale.—£1,170 to £1,554 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be in possession of the East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent. They must have passed the Ordinary Diploma in Building and Civil Engineering from the Kenya Polytechnic or any other recognized Institution and must have a minimum of four years' practical experience in drawing office as well as thorough knowledge of the following:—

- (a) taking rough sketches and working them up to finished working drawings.
- (b) knowledge of Building construction.
- (c) be acquainted with practices and procedures applicable in the Building Industry.
- (d) prepartion of site reports.
- (e) model making and presentation drawings including perspectives.
- (f) knowledge of the work of the Quantity Surveyor: Electrical Engineer and Structural Engineer.
- (g) must be able to prepare production drawings for various Public Buildings such as offices, schools, hospitals, etc.

They must have passed or been exempted from the Intermediate of Architectural Association of Kenya, or the Intermediate Examination of East African Institute Architects or Intermediate of R.I.E.A. or have passed E.A. (Architectural Studies) of the University of Nairobi.

Duties include preparing drawings showing outline scheme, design drawings, working drawings, detail drawings, specifications, notes and schedules for all types of buildings to ensure that Engineer's and other specialist drawings conform with Architect's drawings.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Housing and Social Services: Senior Housing Officer (Housing Section) (One Post) (No. 583/78)

Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must hold at least a good first degree in either Architecture, Building or Land Economics plus at least five years of relevant working experience in Job Group "K" if in Government Service or equivalent if in private sector. Preference will be given to those who have had post-graduate training in the fields of urban development and project planning.

The Senior Housing Planner, as the head of the Housing Planning and Projects Division of the Department of Housing, will be responsible for co-ordinating and supervising the work of several professional officers in the Division. He will, in addition, be charged with the following duties:—

- (a) Advising on the formulation of National Housing Policies.
- (b) Formulation of National Housing programmes within the framework of National Development plans.
- (c) Determining the short and long-term physical, financial and organizational requirements of such programmes.
- (d) Preparation of housing projects for financial by various donor agencies.
- (e) Co-ordinating the implementation of National Housing programmes.
- (f) Monitoring and evaluation of National Housing programmes.

Archivist Grade 1 (Research on Oral Tradition and Linguistics) (One Post) (No. 584/78)

Salary scale.—£1,734 to £2,334 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be graduates or equivalent from a recognized university. Preference will be given to applicants with M.A. degree with experience or a Ph. D. in such fields as: Anthropology, Sociology, Political Science, Public Administration, Law, Pre-history, Musicology, Linguistics, Ethnography, Fine Arts, etc. The applicant must be creative, dynamic and imaginative and capable of working with elderly people and different ethnic groups.

Duties.—The successful candidate will be in charge of finding ways and means of supplementing non-written and written documents through oral traditions and linguistics. He or she will be responsible for collecting information pertaining to oral history, music, dance and rhythm, folk-role, oral literature, legends, rituals, thoughts and sayings, symbolic languages, ethnic vernacular and linguistic analysis. All of which will be compiled and published and preserved for posterity and for use in schools, colleges, theatres, mass media and other institutions of higher learning.

Archivist Grade I (Documentation and Information Centre)
(One Post) (No. 585/78)

Salary scale.—£1,734 to £2,334 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be gradutes of a recognized university or equivalent and must have a Diploma/Certificate in Archival Science, Information and Documentation or Library Studies or a post-graduate degree. The applicants must have several years of relevant experience specializing on the subjects with disciplines such as: mathematics and statistics, General Science, Law. Business Administration, Public Administration and Politics, Sociology. Knowledge of Computer Science will be useful in executing the responsibilities of the post.

Duties.—The successful candidate will be responsible for planning, evaluating, analysis and linguistics, translating, documenting reports, paper, journals and advising on efficient systems for information retrieval. As well he or she will be in charge of

making abstracts, summaries and indexes of documents within the Documentation and Information Centre and Archives. He/she will also prepare and disseminate information, bibliography abstracts, past and present and particularly for current publications, research completed and in progress. He or she will also be expected to assist in developing automated methods for information processing and to liaise with regional and international information net-works where relevant to our national needs, etc.

Archivist Grade I (Record Management) (One Post)
(No. 586/78)

Salary scale.—£1,734 to £2,334 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be gradutes from a credited university or equivalent and should have post-graduate degree or Diploma/Certificate in Archival studies. They should have at least three years proven experience in archival science in such areas as record management and analysis, Archives administration, theory and practice, research, etc. and must be capable to administer and direct creatively because this programme will contribute tremendously in the economic and effectiveness in our Government.

Duties.—The successful candidate will be responsible for the efficient administration and operation of the Record Management Programmes. He/she will be in charge of co-ordinating inspectorate teams on record activities in Government Departments, Ministries and the Parastatal Bodies, and advise on ways and means of conserving records: codification: of creating, retention and disposition schedules.

He or she will in addition be expected to carry out in-service and formal training programmes both in the National Archives and in the Departments, Ministries and Parastatal or other interested bodies. He/she will also assist in the establishment of Provincial Record Management Centres in the Republic of Kenya.

Sports Officer Grade II (Social Services Department)
(One Post) (No. 587/78)

Salary scale.—£1,170 to £1,554 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be between 25 and 45 years of age and must be of East African Certificate of Education standard or its equivalent. Applicants with a P1 teachers certificate with proven experience of at least five years in organization and administration of sports will be considered. Preference will be given to applicants in possession of a diploma in Physical Education or an equivalent qualification from a comparable Institution. A sound knowledge of sports regulations and ability to conduct courses and training is essential.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Agriculture:

Senior Range Officer (Two Posts) (No. 588/78)

Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be graduates in Agriculture specializing in Range Science—from a recognized university with at least five years experience in range management or related work, two years of which must be at Range Officer Grade I. A relevant post-graduate qualification would be a definite advantage. They should indicate their interest either in Group Ranch Development or Grazing Block Development.

The successful candidates will be responsible to the Head, Range Management Division for the co-ordination and evaluation of all activities related to either Group Ranches or Grazing Blocks, ensuring production of acceptable development plans and implementation of such plans in the respective development areas in co-operation with other agencies involved in the Livestock Development Project.

Range Officer Grade I (One Post) (No. 589/78)

Salary scale.—£1,734 to £2,334 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be graduates in Agricultural Economics from a recognized university with at least three years' working experience involving economic analysis (including herd projections, production coefficients and financial projections) of ranches or other large scale livestock farming. They should also be knowledgeable and experienced in ranching activities in Kenya. A relevant post-graduate qualification would be an added advantage.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the Head, Range Management Division for all economic aspects connected with range/ranch development plans and the livestock Development project as a whole.

VACANCIES-PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION-(Contd.)

Assistant Range Officer Grade II (Ten Posts) (No. 590/78)

Salary scale.—£1,170 to £1,554 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be serving officers in possession of a diploma in either Range Management or Animal Husbandry from a recognized Institution with at least three years service at the Assistant Range Officer III/Assistant Animal Husbandry Officer III level in essentially pastoral areas of Kenya range land. Consideration will also be given to applicants working in fields closely related to range management and development.

The successful candidates will work in Range Management Extention services and will participate in the preparation of ranch development plans and in the implementation of such plans. They will be posted to various Districts in the Coast, Rift Valley, Eastern and North-Eastern Provinces.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Water Development;

Superintending Engineer (Mechanical) (One Post) (No. 591/78) Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be graduates in mechanical Engineering from a recognized university or an equivalent qualification and must have been registered by the Kenya Engineers Registration Board. They must have had five years' satisfactory post-graduate experience in Mechanical Engineering, three of which must have been in a responsible supervisory position related to operations and maintenance of vehicles and heavy tractors. Proven ability in administration and organization is necessary as the successful candidate will head the mechanical maintenance Division of the Water Department and have country-wide responsibilities.

Library Assistant Grade II (One Post) (No. 592/78)

Salary scale.—£531 to £744 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants should be in possession of the East African Certificate of Education and must have worked for at least two years in a library of an accepted size and must have subsequently attended a library course and been awarded the certificate of librarianship of the East African School of Librarianship or its equivalent. They must have been confirmed in their appointments.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Lands and Settlement:

Survey Assistant Grade II (Fifteen Posts) (No. 593/78)

Salary scale.—£1,170 to £1,554 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be civil servants who have had formal training in Land Surveying and should hold Land Survey Technician Diploma from a recognized institution or the Survey of Kenya Occupational Test Grade I certificate or their equivalent. They must in addition have served as Survey Assistants Grade III for at least three years after qualification. Applicants who do not have the above qualifications but have served for at least 17 years with merit and ability in Surveying will also be considered. They should have a thorough knowledge of all kinds of theodolite work and related computations and adjustments including triangulation, traversing and tacheometry, survey work from aerial photographs, interpretation and identification of photo control points, geodetic levelling and preparation of contour plans.

The successful candidates will be required to carry out cadastral topographical and adjudication surveys, to control and supervise a field team or a section of comparable size such as District Survey Office and to take charge of sizeable amount of Survey Equipment and stores.

Executive Assistant (Labour, Stores and Transport Officer) (Two Posts) (No. 594/78)

Salary scale.—£864 to £1,212 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be civil servants of School Certificate of Education standard or its equivalent with a minimum of eight (8) years satisfactory clerical experience of which at least three years must be in the grade of Senior Clerical Officer.

The successful candidates will be in charge of sizeable labour force and should therefore be mature in outlook and be acquainted with Government Regulations regarding personnel matters. A knowledge of Government Accounting procedure as well as successful completion of an Executive Course at either Kenya Institute of Adminstration Kabete or Government Training Institute, Maseno will be advantageous. A pass in the Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers is mandatory.

Executive Assistant (Liaison Officer) (One Post) (No. 595/78) Salary scale.—£864 to £1,212 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be civil servants of East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent with a minimum of eight years satisfatory clerical experience, three years of which must be in the grade of a Senior Clerical Officer. They must have had at least three years in dealing with change advices on land transfer and be able to keep a proper sequence of registration advices. They must also be conversant with the methods of appointment of Land rent after subdivision. They should also have elementary knowledge of Land administration matters such as subdivision of land, maintaining land rent records and the working relationship between Registration and Land Administration Divisions.

Ability to conduct correspondence with the members of the public and control of Junior Staff is essential. A pass in the Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers is mandatory.

Executive Assistant (Registry) (One Post) (No. 596/78)

Salary scale.—£864 to £1,212 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be civil servants of East African Certificate of Education or its equivalent with a minimum of eight (8) satisfactory experience within the Clerical Officer cadre, three years of which must be in the grade of Senior Clerical Officer. They must have a thorough knowledge of Government Regulations and office routine. Ability to control staff in a large Registry effectively and conduct correspondence is essential. Preference will be given to applicants who have at least five years satisfactory experience of work in a Registry. A pass in Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officer is mandatory.

Senior Clerical Officer (Three Posts) (No. 597/78)

Salary scale.—£642 to £900 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be civil servants of the East African Certificate of Education standard or its equivalent with at least five years practical clerical experience two years of which must be in the grade of Higher Clerical Officer. They should have a bias in Accounts work. Ability to control staff and conduct correspondence independently is essential. They should be conversant with Government Regulations. A pass in Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers with accounts option is mandatory. Preference will be given to applicants who have passed Accounts Cleark National Certificate Stage II.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Labour:

Superintending Engineer (Roads) (National Youth Service) (One Post) (No. 598/78)

Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be mature and professionally qualified civil Engineers (Roads) holding university degree or Diploma recognized by the Kenya Institute of Engineers and Registration Board or its equivalent. They should be registered Engineers who have had several years of post-qualification and practical experience in design construction and maintenance of roads and bridges,

Duties will include planning, co-ordination, supervision, administration, and appraisal and progress evaluation of projects carried out by the National Youth Service, financial control and costing of various operations, construction and maintenance of roads. Therefore, applicants should be familiar with both hand and mechanized methods of road maintenance for gravel and bituminized roads including care and use of plant and vehicles. They should also be conversant with the regulations and requirements for the registration of graduate engineers to be able to identify the training needs for and practical guidance of young engineers, fresh from the university.

Senior Labour Officer (Two Posts) (No. 599/78)

Salary scale.—£2,154 to £2,820 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be civil servants who have thorough knowledge of Labour Administration as well as industrial relations. They must be capable of keeping pace with the rapid changes taking place in the field of Labour administration. They should also have the administrative ability necessary for the control and supervision of several Labour Officers and their functions including Personnel and financial control.




