- 6. Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
 - (b) If the application is unsuccessful, the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
 - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280) and the title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant
- 5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 460) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the Local Authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six calendar months of the actual registration of the grant submit in triplicate to the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for disposing of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the actual registration of the grant complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act, if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner of Lands in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE No. 4 of 1978

Parties :--

Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers and

Motor Trade & Allied Industries Employers Association Issue in dispute:—

Wage agreement to cover 6 per cent price increases.

INTERPRETATION APPLICATION RULING

The Court announced its award in the above dispute on 3rd April, 1978 and in the last paragraph the Court stated:

"After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that all the unionizable employees employed by the Respondents' members should get a special wage increase of Sh. 20 p.m. with effect from 1st May, 1977 in accordance with the Government directive. This increase is to be in addition to the increases which the workers are entitled under their current collective agreement."

The Claimants have made this interpretation application requesting the Court to rule that this Court award should also be applied to those employees in the motor indutsry who were in employment when the dispute was being processed but who had left the employment before the Court award was announced. They maintained that it is wrong to deprive a worker of any benefit which he had already earned before leaving employment.

The Claimants argued that the Court award was effective from 1st May, 1977 and in their opinion this meant that any employee who was in employment as at 1st May, 1977 was entitled to this increment awarded by the Court. This applied to all employees irrespective of the reasons for leaving their employment.

The Claimants added that certain employers in the motor industry had implemented the Court award according to their interpretation but a few of the major employers were refusing to do so.

The Respondents strongly resisted this interpretation on the ground that the Court award very clearly stated that it was in respect of employees employed by the Respondents' members and since the ex-employees could not be considered to be in employment the award could not apply to them. They added that if the Court had intended the ex-employees to benefit then the Court would have stated so.

The Respondents also referred to their previous disputes with the Claimants in which it had been clearly established that the Court awards were applicable only to employees currently in employment.

The Court would like to refer to section 10 (6) of the Trade Disputes Act which reads as follows:

"10 (6) Subject to the provisions of this section, an award shall, as from the date that the award has effect, be an implied term of every contract of employment between the employers and employees to whom the award relates, so that the rate of wages to be paid and the terms and conditions of employment to be observed under the contract shall be in accordance with the award until it is varied by a subsequent award, or by agreement."

It is clear from the above that the Court award becomes an implied term of every contract of employment between the employers and the employees to whom the award relates as from the date that the award has effect. Those workers who have left employment had no current contract of employment with the Respodents when the Court announced its award. Therefore the Court award cannot be an implied term of their contract. The Court award becomes an implied term of contract of employment only when there is a current contract of employment in force.

In addition to the aforesaid legal position the Court award was very clear in that it clearly stated that all the unionizable employees employed by the Respondents' members would get a special wage increase of Sh. 20 per month with effect from 1st May, 1977 in accordance with the Government directive. The Court did not mention anywhere that its award was applicable to those workers who might have left the employment.

After carefully considering the parties' submissions the Court finds that the Claimants' interpretation is not tenable either in law or on fact and the Court accordingly upholds the Respondents' interpretation of the Court award on this particular point.
