The successful candidate will be responsible to the Head, Animal Production Division for the initiation of Beekeeping programmes and projects in rural areas, assisting in organizing groups for construction of bee-hives and looking for the markets of the honey; all matters relating to Bee Keeping project, demonstration research and training.

Senior Superintending Engineer (Building Services) (One Post)

Salary scale.—£2,712 to £3,540 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be Registered Electrical Engineers or Registered Mechanical Engineers and must be Members of the Institution of Engineers (Kenya) having at least eight (8) years experience in the design, installation, and maintenance of engineering services in most or all of the following:—

Hospitals, Airports, Water-Works, Public Buildings, Office and Conference Complexes, Educational Institutions, and large centralized Catering and Laundry Units.

- (b) Staff Management.
- (c) The formulation and direction of staff training policy.
- (d) Assisting in the formulation and execution of design, installation and maintenance policy in the Building Department.

Architectural Assistant Grade I (Three Posts) (Re-advertisement)

- (j) Must be able to analyse the prepared technical information required by a project team at each design stage.

DUTIES

To examine and check dimensions annotations and construction details on all drawings, and to ensure that such items conform to standards laid down by the Chief Architect. To prepare sheets of standard details for future use.

Kenya Management Staff Association
and

Grindlays Bank (International) (K) Ltd.

Issue in dispute:—

Wrongful termination of Peter G. Njendu.

1. The Kenya Management Staff Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Grindlays Bank International (K) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 18th and 19th January, 1979 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:

Claimant.—P. G. Njendu.

Respondents.—Mrs. Matilda E. Ockotch.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 30th March, 1978 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 16th November together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

P. G. Njendu was recruited by the Respondents from the University of Nairobi on 9th June, 1971. He had obtained a Bachelor of Commerce Degree. He was subsequently employed as Assistant Manager, Corporate Finance Division having started work as a trainee staff.

His services were terminated on 2nd August 1976. It was alleged that he had been absent without authority for nearly one month and as medical leave could only be authorized against a medical certificate setting out particulars of illness and period of absence medically justifiable the certificate which he had produced dated 12th July, 1976 recommended off duty for two days only. The Respondents informed him that his continuous unauthorized absence amounted to voluntary abandonment of employment and they deemed it to be such abandonment.

Mr. Njendu and some other members of the managerial staff had joined the Claimants in 1975 who were involved in securing recognition from the Respondents. Mr. Njendu was elected a shopsteward.

The Claimants took up the matter on behalf of Mr. Njendu and reported a dispute to the Minister for Labour after which an investigation was carried out. The Ministry recommended that

Mr. Njendu should have been given a more humane treatment by the Respondents more so taking into account the fact that he was a senior member of the management and had rendered five years' satisfactory service to them. It was recommended that he be paid six months salary in lieu of notice plus three months' salary as compensation for wrongful termination.

The Claimants who had originally put forward a demand for six months' salary in lieu of notice and 12 months' salary as compensation for wrongful termination indicated their willingness to accept the Ministry's recommendation and have asked the Court to uphold these recommendations and award that the Respondents should pay Mr. Njendu the following amount:—

The Claimants made allegations that Mr. Njendu had been victimized because of the active role which he was playing on their behalf as a member and a shopsteward and that on 20th March, 1976 the Respondents had called on Mr. Njendu and one Mr. Otieno to resign from the Claimants' membership. They alleged that as a result of these threats nine of their members wrote a letter to them asking them to keep their dispute on recognition in suspension indefinitely as the internal employer/employee relationship had improved.

The Claimants submitted that Mr. Njendu had been denied leave as he needed rest towards the end of May and beginning of June 1976. They accused the Respondents of having developed Mr. Njendu mental illness and severely criticized them for sending the termination letter to him while he was still at the Mathare Hospital.

The Respondents pleaded that during Mr. Njendu's five years' service with them his record was very poor indeed. He was continually absent from office without permission and they also listed other faults on his part details of which appear in their written submissions.

The Respondents clarified that Mr. Njendu had applied for one month's leave effective from 19th June, 1976 which was turned down as the Manager, Corporate Finance Division was proceeding on leave at the time and it was intended that Mr. Njendu would stand in for him while he was on leave. On 24th June, 1976 Mr. Njendu could not be seen in the office and on 25th June although he did not turn up the Assistant General Manager was informed that he had arranged to visit a client at Webuye on official assignment. He, however, did not consult the Assistant General Manager before making the journey. Mr. Njendu's explanation on this point was not accepted by the Respondents as they considered it to be unsatisfactory.

The Respondents further submitted that on 1st July Mr. Njendu handed in a letter to the Assistant Manager in which he informed him that he was not feeling well and that he was going to see a doctor. He was reminded to obtain a medical certificate and make a formal application for sick leave. Mr. Njendu thereafter did not appear in the office until 31st July, 1976 although on 5th July he put in his leave application which was turned down as it was not accompanied by a medical certificate.

The Respondents admitted that on 12th July a photo copy of the doctor's certificate was delivered to the General Manager but as the position became most unsatisfactory and all communications with Mr. Njendu had failed the Bank could no longer rely on him to work and therefore sent him the letter pointing out that he had abandoned his employment.

The Court has carefully considered the parties' submissions and the evidence given by their witnesses and finds that the following basic facts emerge in this dispute. To begin with Mr. Njendu seems to have had a reasonably satisfactory record of service. The defaults which had been listed by the Respondents could not be considered to be serious enough as otherwise the Respondents would have taken action against him at the material times.

Mr. Njendu became mentally sick between June and August 1976.

Mr. Njendu had applied for leave as he was not feeling well but his application was turned down as his Manager was on leave at the time. On 1st July he wrote to the Assistant General Manager that he was not feeling well and that he was seeing a doctor and on 5th July he applied for sick leave as he was advised but his application was turned down on the ground that

it was not accompanied by a medical certificate. The Respondents received a medical certificate dated 12th July 1976 recommending off duty for two days.

The above points having been established the Court has now to determine if the Respondents were aware that Mr. Njendu had been admitted to Mathare Hospital where he underwent treatment. Mr. Njendu started in his evidence that he was taken to the Mathare Hospital by his wife and parents in July 1976 and that after a short time he was released after having received treatment. He added that he received his letter of termination while he was at the Hospital and that the letter was brought to him by his wife who had received it from his neighbour who is working with the Respondents. She is Miss Rose Wakonyo. He said that it was brought to him at the Hospital between 8th August and 15th September, 1976.

The Court was given a medical certificate by Dr. P. D. Kanyuira dated 17th August 1976 in which it is stated as follows:—

"The above-mentioned is our in-patient admitted here on 8th August 1976 in acute illness. He is on treatment and is showing tremendous improvement. It is possible that in a few days' time he will be able to resume his duties. Thank you."

The Court is rather surprised at the Respondents' allegation that they did not know where to communicate with Mr. Njendu because the letter dated 2nd August 1976 was delivered at his house by Miss Wakonyo, another employee of the Bank. The Respondents could easily have written another letter to Mr. Njendu before serving him the final letter dated 2nd August, 1976.

The Court, however, finds that Mr. Njendu's family for reasons which are understandable did not communicate to the Respondents about Mr. Njendu having been admitted to Mathare Hospital or informed them that he was suffering from a mental disease. The Court must, however, take into consideration the fact that Mr. Njendu prior to suffering a complete mental breakdown perhaps due to complications of alcoholism had asked for leave to be granted and failing that had pleaded for sick leave. Dr. P. D. Kamau has confirmed that between June and September, 1976 Mr. Njendu consulted him and his colleagues on 1st and 12th July, and 2nd and 9th August, 1976 but he declined to divulge the nature of Mr. Njendu's illness without his express consent. The Court is satisfied that Mr. Njendu was heading for a mental breakdown at that time and eventually ended up in Mathare Hospital.

The Court finds this a very unfortunate case in which it is difficult to blame either side. Mr. Njendu during the material time i.e. June/August 1976 was mentally sick and was admitted to Mathare Hospital in August according to the certificate from the Hospital and the Respondents while being aware in July through Mr. Njendu's applications for leave, including medical leave, that he was not well could not have known that he was in such a serious state and was in Mathare Hospital as nobody informed them officially of where he was. The Respondents may or may not have been aware unofficially that he was in Hospital, probably they were, but this does not mean that they should not have been informed officially by someone on Mr. Njendu's behalf. The Court must emphasize that Mr. Njendu at that time was in a state of mental confusion and could hardly be expected to do the needful as his wife and parents had to take him to Mathare Hospital. It was up to his family to inform the Bank but as pointed out earlier they probably did not want to advertise that Mr. Njendu was mentally sick.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that Mr. Njendu's services should have been terminated in accordance with his contract of employment which provides for a six months' notice on either side but in view of the fact that Mr. Njendu was absent the whole of July without officially notifying the Bank of his whereabouts, the Court awards that he should get five months' salary in lieu of notice. The Court was told that at the material time he was earning Sh. 5,040 p.m. and the Respondents should therefore pay him a sum of Sh. 25,200 and the Court so awards. The Court directs the Bank to pay him this amount less any debt that Mr. Njendu owes to them.

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TO THE KENYA GAZETTE**

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the *Kenya Gazette, Supplements, etc.*:-

- (1) *Kenya Gazette* contains notices of a general nature and which do not affect legislation, and may be submitted direct to the Government Printer.
- (2) *Legislative Supplement* contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government, and must be submitted through the Office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) *Bill Supplement* contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—***Kenya Gazette***

D.41. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward *Gazette* notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
