Dismissal of Peter Oyoo.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Habib Bank Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 23rd January and 27th and 28th February, 1979, and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:—

Claimant.—Peter Oyoo.

Respondents:—

V. A. Bukhari.
A. G. Bhujwalla.
K. Mahmood.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 28th June, 1978, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 24th October together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Peter Oyoo was engaged by the Bank on 1st August, 1970, as a clerk and was dismissed on 3rd March, 1977. The reason for his dismissal was that he was alleged to have misappropriated a sum of Sh. 154 belonging to the Respondents and was therefore instantly dismissed under clause 4 (a) (i) of the collective agreement.

The facts leading up to this dispute are that one A. G. Bhujwalla, a Mombasa businessman, went to the Respondents on 11th February, 1977, for opening Letters of Credit. Since Bhujwalla was not a regular customer of the Bank Abbas Brothers gave the necessary guarantee on his behalf.

On 14th February he visited the Bank again and signed the necessary application forms and was then sent by Khalid, the Sub Manager, to Oyoo and was told that he would finalize the whole thing.

The total charges for the opening of Letters of Credit amounted to Sh. 184 but on Bhujwalla complaining to Oyoo

that they appeared to be higher than the other banks Oyoo reduced the charges to Sh. 154 which Bhujwalla paid to him. He then left the Bank. On 22nd February, Bhujwalla telephoned the Respondents asking them to send him the copies of letters of credit but was told that since he had not paid the charges the copies had not been sent to him. He told the Sub Manager that he paid the charges the same day, i.e. 14th February to Oyoo and he then went along to the Bank where he gave a written statement.

Oyoo was called by the Sub Manager and shown Bhujwalla's written statement and on page 2 Oyoo wrote the following words on the bottom left hand side:—

"I Peter Oyoo clearly state that Bhujwalla lent me Sh. 155 and I promised him that I will refund him by the end of the month 22nd February, 1977, signed Peter Oyoo."

Bhujwalla promptly denied this allegation in writing and further clarified that he had given Oyoo Sh. 155 in notes: one of Sh. 100, two of Sh. 20, one of Sh. 10 and one of Sh. 5 and Oyoo had refunded him Sh. 1 in silver.

It is not disputed that in the statement of Letters of Credit between the period 12th February to 21st February, 1977, there are four entries each of Sh. 46 in respect of the Letters of Credit of Bhujwalla guaranteed by Abbas Brothers but this amount was not received by the Bank.

The Claimants have put forward the submission that the Respondents have victimized Oyoo because he was the Secretary of the Central Staff Committee and in that capacity he had organized a petition to the Office of the Vice-President on certain employment grievances and renewals of work permits. They further allege that the day his services were terminated he was scheduled to hold a meeting with the management in the afternoon to discuss the dismissal of G. Mazerah and that the management in order to avoid those discussions decided to get rid of him.

Oyoo while giving evidence stated that on 15th February he had gone to the shop of Bhujwalla and had asked him to lend him Sh. 155 which he promised to return before the end of the month. He said that Bhujwalla came to the Bank on 25th February and went to his table and he returned him his Sh. 155 and that when he was returning this money the Sub Manager saw him and called Bhujwalla to his office and they had a private consultation there. This was in the morning and in the afternoon the Sub Manager brought to him a blank foolscap sheet and told him to write how Bhujwalla had lent him some money without the permission of the Bank. Oyoo further said that the Sub Manager told him not to write the date and to write at the bottom of the paper which he did in good faith.

Bhujwalla who was called to give evidence by the Respondents stated that Oyoo was not known to him prior to 14th February when he was sent to Oyoo by the Sub Manager to finalize the matter of Letters of Credit. He said it was not true that he had lent money to Oyoo whom he had not known before that date. He also confirmed that it is not true that Oyoo was given a blank sheet of paper by the Sub Manager and told to write at the bottom.

The Court has very carefully considered the submissions given by the parties and the evidence called by them. The Court finds that the Claimants have not by any means proved that the Respondents had conspired with Bhujwalla on this transaction in order to get rid of Oyoo from the Bank. The Court found Bhujwalla who is an elderly businessman in Mombasa since last 13 years (prior to which he was doing business in Dar es Salaam) to be a straightforward and truthful witness. The Court can find no reason why Bhujwalla should involve himself in such a serious matter so as to facilitate the Respondents to get rid of one of their employees. Bhujwalla was not even a regular customer of the Respondents. The Court has come to the conclusion that Bhujwalla's version is the correct version of the whole incident. It is inconceivable that a man like Oyoo would agree to write on a blank piece of paper at the bottom as he, Oyoo, claimed in his evidence. The Court has no doubt that Oyoo received Sh. 154 on behalf of the Bank from Bhujwalla and he failed to pay the Bank that money. The Sub Manager told the Court that the Bank had not been able to recover this money from anyone.

The Court finds Oyoo's evidence on this incident to be unsatisfactory and it is obvious that he is trying to cover up his gross misconduct by saying that Bhujwalla had lent him this money.

The Court has also applied its mind to the Claimants' submission that Oyoo had been victimized for his trade union activities but the Court is satisfied that that is not so and that the reason why Oyoo suffered a dismissal is because he misappropriated Sh. 154 which was given to him on behalf of the Bank by Bhujwalla when he opened the Letters of Credit.

The only point on which the Court would like to fault the Respondents is that they decided to dismiss Oyoo on the day when he was to discuss the dismissal of Mazerah with them. The Respondents' Manager Bukhari said that it was just a coincidence as they had completed their investigations on that day and had decided to dismiss him. The Claimants have naturally played a lot on this point and the Court has also very carefully considered its implications but has come to the conclusion that this one point by itself cannot lessen the gravity of Oyoo's gross misconduct in pocketing the money which he received on behalf of the Bank.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that Claimants' demand for Oyoo's reinstatement and for payment of full salary between the period of his dismissal and his reinstatement should fail and the Court accordingly rejects the Claimants' demand.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE No. 55 OF 1978

Parties:—

Railways and Harbours Union (K)

and

Kenya Ports Authority

Issue in dispute:—

Refusal and/or failure by the Harbours to pay A. A. Tumbo the relevant allowance for special/additional duties as provided for in paragraph 3 clause (b) of the staff Circular No. 5 of 1974.

1. The Railways and Harbours Union (K) shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Ports Authority shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 21st day of February, 1979 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 29th September, 1978 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 16th November together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

A. A. Tumbo was the Personnel Officer with the Respondents in 1975/1976. The Court was told that since the end of last year he has been promoted to Senior Personnel Officer.

In 1975 he was responsible for industrial relations and welfare matters at the Port of Mombasa in Job Scale H.8. It should be noted that at that time Job Scale H.7 did not exist and the Court was told that it has not been created even now, so the next higher grade was H.6 which was occupied by the Port Personnel Officer.

It is not disputed that on 20th January, 1975 Mr. Tumbo was asked to assist the Port Personnel Officer in all matters pertaining to personnel, welfare and industrial relations. The Respondents while denying to some extent that Mr. Tumbo had performed any special additional duties had accepted that Mr. Tumbo was requested to carry out certain duties within his area of responsibilities and these included:—

"1. Answering for the Port Personnel Officer whenever the Port Personnel Officer was away from station.

2. Attending certain meetings in the Port on behalf of the Port Personnel Officer whenever the Port Personnel Officer was occupied with other pressing duties.

3. Sitting in the Selection's Committee for interviewing subordinate staff.

4. Processing employment of casual labour at the Port of Mombasa."

Mr. Tumbo performed these duties for 21 months and applied for the payment of duty allowance or at least any allowance to compensate him for the work he was rendering to the Corporation.

The Respondents paid Mr. Tumbo Sh. 196 p.m. duty allowance on the strength of Staff Circular No. 5 of 1974. The Respondents explained that Mr. Tumbo's salary in 1975 at Grade H.8 was Sh. 2,795 p.m. whilst the salary at the lowest point of Grade H.7 in those departments where the grade was established was Sh. 3,075 p.m. This meant that if the Grade H.7 job had been established in the Personnel Department and Mr. Tumbo had been required to do full duties of such a job he would have qualified for an acting allowance of K.Sh. 280 p.m. instead of K.Sh. 196 which they had paid him as duty allowance and which they maintained he did not even deserve in terms of the ruling from their Headquarters.

The Claimants have submitted that in dealing with the claim of Mr. Tumbo the Respondents had deliberately side-tracked the right procedure and had thereby violated the substantive right of their member. They criticized the Respondents for not treating all their employees equally under the established rules. Mr. Tumbo had as a result lost approximately K.Sh. 23,000.

The Claimants emphasized that the Respondents made Mr. Tumbo do the work of two senior officers by requiring him to do additional duties—one his own substantive work and the other that of a higher officer. In these circumstances it was only but fair that he should get his entitlement of a special duty allowance of 50 per cent of the initial salary of his substantive grade. They pointed out that instead of paying two salaries the Respondents would be getting away by paying only one and a half salary. They also referred the Court to other cases where special duty allowance had been paid particularly in Dar-es-Salaam and where in each case the maximum permissible duty allowance of 5 per cent was given to the workers involved.

The Claimants further stated that Mr. Tumbo had performed the duties of the Port Personnel Officer as he the Port Personnel Officer had been assigned some other special duties at that time. They emphasized that Mr. Tumbo performed all the functions as a deputy to the Port Personnel Officer.

The Claimants submitted that the Court should uphold their contention that the correct procedure that should have been used in the determination of the payment of duty allowance to Mr. Tumbo falls squarely within clause 3 (b) of Staff Circular No. 5 of 1974 and that the Court should order the Respondents to pay Mr. Tumbo duty allowance at the rate of 50 per cent of the initial salary of his grade at the time the payment was due and owing to him.

The Court notes that in a memo on the subject of payment of duty allowance to Mr. Tumbo dated 26th June, 1976 the Port Personnel Officer wrote as follows:—

"Attached please find an application addressed to you by Mr. Tumbo in connexion with the payment of duty allowance for consideration.

As known to your goodself in the past Mr. Tumbo was entirely responsible for industrial relations matters and did not deal with any other personnel functions. However, since last year because of the additional responsibilities shouldered on me in connexion with the various projects it has been necessary for me to revise the duties of Mr. Tumbo, whereby he now works as a deputy to myself and is responsible for all personnel functions including his previous function of industrial relations. In view of this I consider that Mr. Tumbo should be adequately compensated for carrying out additional functions which were not part and parcel of his previous duties.

I therefore recommend that he be paid duty allowance of the difference between his substantive salary and the minimum starting salary of H.7 in order to compensate him for the additional responsibilities."

The Court is satisfied that Mr. Tumbo during the material time did perform special and additional duties and that the Respondents are certainly wrong in saying that these duties were part of his area of responsibilities as laid down in his job description. The Respondents, however, chose to pay him in accordance with the last paragraph of the above memo.

In the set up that was existing at the material time and even now, Job Scale H.7 is just not there, so if Mr. Tumbo had been given an acting appointment then he would have acted in Job Scale H.6. As a matter of fact the Respondents did give the Court details of the two previous occasions when Mr. Tumbo had acted as Port Personnel Officer in 1975 and was paid K.Sh. 523/15 and K.Sh. 790/30 as acting allowance. He was, however, this time not asked to act in the place of Port Personnel Officer and instead was given the special and additional duties mentioned hereinabove which were outside and above his job description.

The Respondents have raised the point that in the previous cases where duty allowance had been paid the Headquarters

had ruled that to be unlawful and irregular payments. The Respondents referred the Court to Administrative Rules section E.2 (a) which states:—

"A duty allowance may at the discretion of the General Manager, be granted to an employee in respect of the performance of special duties."

They also referred the Court to Staff Circular No. 8 of 1970 which among other things stated that:—

"A number of requests which do not deserve consideration for the payment of such allowance in terms of the Circular letter Est. 1/6 of 21st June, 1967 issued by the then General Manager East African Railways and Harbours have been received and it is ostensible that recommending officers ignore the fact that duty allowance could not be substituted for acting allowance."

The Court has already found that Mr. Tumbo was not asked to act in any superior officer's place therefore the payment of the acting allowance does not arise. It is quite clear that his claim lies under Staff Circular No. 5 of 1974 in para 3 (b) which reads:—

"Where an officer is called upon to perform special or additional duties, duty allowance payable shall not exceed 50 per cent of the initial salary of his substantial grade. No duty allowance shall be payable to an officer carrying additional duties of a lower graded post than his substantive grade."

The Respondents have grudgingly admitted this point which is evident from the fact that they paid Mr. Tumbo a duty allowance of K.Sh. 196 p.m. The real dispute, therefore, is on the quantum of the duty allowance which should have been paid to Mr. Tumbo. The Respondents' Deputy Director General in turning down Mr. Tumbo's appeal stated as follows:—

"Reading through your appeal I have found that all the cases you have quoted are of staff in Dar es Salaam. Further investigations have revealed that some of the payments were questioned by the Chief Personnel Officer and were termed illegal. I am unable to find out what action was consequently taken by the Director General. I have also looked at Staff Circular No. 5 of 1974 and it is clearly stated that duty allowance shall not exceed 75 per cent of the acting allowance. The paragraph you have picked up i.e. paragraph 2 clause (b) was inserted in this circular to control the misuse of duty allowance as it dealt, then, with officers who were required to act in positions which were two or more grades higher than their own. Under the circumstances I have no alternative but to accept the decision already conveyed to you by the Principal Personnel Officer."

The Court finds that clause 3 (b) is not subject to the limitation of 75 per cent of the acting allowance payable to the officer qualified for same. Indeed 3 (b) appears to have been included in this circular specifically for cases like that of Mr. Tumbo.

The Court is satisfied that the payment of K.Sh. 196 p.m. to Mr. Tumbo for the special and additional duties which he performed during the 21 months is the result of a discretion which has been exercised by the Respondents unreasonably if not in bad faith. The Court is aware that it should not normally interfere with matters of discretion but because the Court is of the view and has come to the conclusion that in Mr. Tumbo's case the discretion was exercised most unreasonably the Court has decided to interfere with it as otherwise a person would be deprived of his right and reasonable entitlement.

The Court finds that the Respondents' method of working out the duty allowance which they have paid to Mr. Tumbo basing it as if he had acted in an imaginary higher grade i.e. H.7 which does not exist, is not sound. They should have instead proceeded to assess the duty allowance keeping in view the extra and additional duties which Mr. Tumbo had been required to do and perform.

The Court finds there to be a lot of merit in the Claimants' request to the Court that if the Court made an award in their favour but left the calculation of the duty allowance payable to Mr. Tumbo in the hands of the Respondents then the ends of justice would be defeated. The Court has therefore decided to assess the duty allowance that should be paid to Mr. Tumbo under Staff Circular No. 5 of 1974 clause 3 (b).

The Court has carefully studied the job description of Mr. Tumbo's substantive job and the extra duties that he was required to do in addition to his own job and after careful consideration of all the submissions the Court assesses Mr. Tumbo's duty allowance at K.Sh. 588 p.m. and since he has already been paid K.Sh. 196 p.m. the Court awards that he should be

paid the balance of K.Sh. 392 p.m. for the period of 21 months during which he performed the special and additional duties.

Issue in dispute:—

Withdrawal of higher wage benefits and rights from Paul Nyiwa.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Breweries Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 22nd day of February, 1979, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 18th September, 1978, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 27th November, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

Paul Nyiwa started working for the Respondents on 15th February, 1973, as a driver in Scale "C" at a salary of Sh. 615 p.m.

In August, 1973, he acted as a driver in the position of one J. Elijah who was in Scale "F" and was on leave at the time. Elijah was eventually posted to Transporting Section.

It is not denied that Nyiwa was paid acting allowance for the month of August, 1973.

Nyiwa then started making representations to be confirmed in the position of Elijah in Scale "F" since he was performing his duties and it is not disputed either that except for the month of August, 1973, he was then not paid any acting allowance for the subsequent months and nor was he promoted to Scale "F".

The shopstewards then took up the matter on his behalf and Nyiwa's immediate superiors made representations to the Manager of Personnel Services that Nyiwa should be promoted to Scale "F". These recommendations were turned down.

The Respondents clarified that Nyiwa's immediate superiors were asked to confirm whether the recommended promotions were on merit but they said that it was not so and that the recommendation had been made under the mistaken impression that the barley bulk load driver was graded in job Scale "F". The Maltings Manager then asked the personnel department to ignore his recommendation.

The Respondents admitted that Nyiwa was paid acting allowance for the month of August, 1973, but added that it was an error which was realized after the payment had been made and they decided not to recover the difference from him since he had acted for one month only.

The Court notes that the wages applicable to the relevant scales have progressively been adjusted as follows:—

In the foregoing circumstances the Claimants have asked the Court that Nyiwa should be paid acting allowance from September, 1973, to date as he should be deemed to have acted in place of Elijah who was in Grade "F" and further the Court should order that Nyiwa should be promoted to Scale "F" as recommended by the Malting Plant Manager and the Personnel Officer.

Although the Claimants gave about 12 names of drivers who have been promoted to Scale "F" the collective agreement between the parties clearly states that Scale "F" is reserved for Merit Upgradings.

The Court is satisfied that according to the parties' Job Evaluation and resultant Job Classification there is no drivers job in Scale "F" which is reserved quite clearly for merit upgradings only. Elijah was in this scale purely on merit and it is completely wrong for Nyiwa to expect to be promoted to Scale "F" because he is now doing Elijah's former job.

The Court notes that Nyiwa advanced to Scale "E" with effect from 1st February, 1974, and as is clear from the aforesaid progression of the relevant scales his salary has been accordingly adjusted.

The Court would like to clearly emphasise that it will refuse to take over the managerial functions like deciding on the merit upgradings of the employees. It is impossible for the Court to decide on the merit of any worker. It is strictly within the province of the management to do so.

The Court would like to add that Nyiwa had been misguided and misadvised no doubt by the shopstewards that he could ask to be promoted to Scale "F" which in the collective agreement is clearly listed as being reserved for merit upgradings.

The Court has no doubt that if Nyiwa continues to perform his work to the satisfaction of the Respondents he will come up for consideration for promotion to Scale "F" on merit in due course.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court rejects the Claimants' demand on behalf of Nyiwa.

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IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the *Kenya Gazette, Supplements, etc.*:-

- (1) *Kenya Gazette* contains notices of a general nature and which do not affect legislation, and may be submitted direct to the Government Printer.
- (2) *Legislative Supplement* contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government, and must be submitted through the Office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) *Bill Supplement* contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D-

Kenya Gazette

D.41. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward *Gazette* notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.

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
