THE GOVERNMENT LANDS ACT

(Cap. 280)

Unsurveyed Plots for Service Industry and Workshops, Kibera (Nairobi

THE Commissioner of Lands invites applications for plots in Kibera, Nairobi, for Service Industry and Workshops purposes as described in the Schedule hereto. A plan of the plots may be seen in the Lands Department, or may be obtained on payment of K.Sh. 10 from the Public Map Office, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi.

- 2. Applications must be sent to the Commissioner of Lands not later than noon 11th May, 1979.
- 3. Applicants must enclose with their applications a sum of K.Sh. 1,000 in cash or send a Postal Order, Money Order or Banker's Order made payable to Commissioner of Lands as deposit. No cheques will be accepted. The deposit will be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) If the applicant offered and takes up and pays for the plot within the period of 30 days as required by Condition No. 5 below the deposit will be credited to him.
 - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
 - (e) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 30 days, as required by Condition No. 5 below the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.
- 4. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating:—
 - (a) The amount of capital it is proposed to spend on the project.
 - (b) The amount of actual capital available for development with a banker's letter, or other evidence of financial status in support.
 - (c) The manner in which it is proposed to raise the balance of the capital required for development, if any.
 - (d) Full details of the proposed trade(s) should be submitted.
 - (e) Whether the applicant runs an established business or whether it is proposed to start a new business of self/ sublet premises.
 - (f) Whether the applicant owns any other plot in Nairobi.
- 5. The successful allottee of the plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 30 days of notification that his application has been successful, the stand premium and proportion of the annual rent together with survey, conveyancing, stamp duty and registration fees, contribution in lieu of rates and provision service charges. In default of payment within the specific time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allotment and the applicant shall have no claim to the plot.

General Conditions

- 1. The grant will be made under the Provision of the Government of Lands Act (Cap. 280) of the Laws of Kenya, and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 2. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in the letter of application and will be subject to the Special Conditions set out below.
- 3. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the issue of the Letter of Allotment.

Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and Local Authority. The Commissioner of Lands shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six months of the registration of the grant submit in triplicate to the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the position of the building and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings elevations and specifications of the buildings the lessee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the registration of the grant complete the erection of such buildings and constructions of the drainage system in conformity with such plans,

drawing elevations and specifications as mended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner of Land:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied by the Government Lands Act, if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this conditions, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands, or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or Commissioner of Lands in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the registration of the grant the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) any subsequent time prior or the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of the notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and buildings shall only be used for Service Industry and Workshops.
- 6. The buildings shall not cover a greater area of the land than that laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.
- 8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land without the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands.
- 9. The grantee shall not sell transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings hereon except with the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands no application for such consent (except in respect of the loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.
- 10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Land on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall, on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost, either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President of the Republic of Kenya in lieu thereof.
- 14. The President of the Republic of Kenya or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purposes shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains, of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.
- 15. The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual rental payable hereunder at the expiry of the 33rd and 66th years of the term hereby granted: such rent will be at the rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

RULING

Interpretation Application

The Court announced its award in the above dispute on 22nd July, 1977, and on the issue of wages: Wage increase, the Court made the following award:—

"(a) All employees earning up to Sh. 691/55 and below are awarded a wage increase of Sh. 52/65 p.m. with effect from 1st September, 1976.

All these employees shall get a further wage increase of Sh. 52/65 p.m. with effect from 1st September, 1977.

(b) All those employees earning more than Sh. 691/55 are awarded a wage increase of Sh. 72/15 with effect from 1st September, 1976, and another increase of Sh. 72/15 with effect from 1st September, 1977.

The Court further directs that the existing wage rates for the various groups shall also go up by the aforesaid amount on the dates specified."

The Claimants have made an application for interpretation of the Court award on 14th February, 1979, and have pointed out that some members of the Respondents' Association have refused to implement the aforesaid Court award in respect of a few employees who were earning Sh. 692/25 p.m. They pointed out that what the Respondents had done was to treat these employees as if they were earning Sh. 691/55 and therefore proceeded to give them an increase of Sh. 52/65 instead of their proper entitlement of a wage increase of Sh. 72/15 under the Court award.

The Claimants asked the Court to clarify this point which the Respondents had described as a technical difference of opinion.

The Respondents gave the historical background leading to the above dispute and the wage rates which were in force prior to the Court award in this dispute.

The Respondents particularly referred to Group 3 of the non-clerical grades and showed how Sh. 34/40 p.m. was added to the employees' wages of this particular group:—

The Respondents added that this was the result of the Court award in Cause No. 64/75 but unfortunately due to a clerical error on the part of the Respondents' secretariat, they had circularized the monthly wage of Group 3 to be Sh. 691/55 instead of Sh. 692/25.

The Respondents asked the Court to uphold the course of action taken by some members of their Association who had not only corrected the error of their secretariat showing Grade 3 as Sh. 691/55 but had in some cases rounded the figures to Sh. 692/25 being a figure divisible by 195, the monthly average working hours which gave an hourly rate of Sh. 3/55 for ease of calculation of overtime.

The Respondents asked the Court to uphold their interpretation that all employees in Grade 3 were entitled to Sh. 52/65 increase otherwise it would result in Grade 3 being sub-divided because those on the accurate rate of Sh. 692/25 would get an increase of Sh. 72/15 whilst those on the inaccurate wage of Sh. 691/55 would get an increase of Sh. 52/65.

The Court notes that out of some 6,000 workers affected by this Court award about 20 of them are aggrieved by the Respondents' interpretation or at least their grievance has come to light in that their monthly wage being Sh. 692/25 they had been given a wage increase of Sh. 52/65 instead of Sh. 72/15. Six of these workers are employed by African Marine and General Engineering Co. Ltd.

The Court appreciates the Respondents' motive that they have rounded up the wages of all workers by cts. 70 p.m. in order to make the figure divisible by 195 hours and also for ease of working out the overtime rates but the fact remains that the monthly wage of the workers or some of the workers in Group 3 had been Sh. 692/25 no doubt at the initiative of the Respondents themselves at the time the Court made its award.

The Respondents should have made this point clear to the Court during the hearing of the main dispute so that when the Court formulated its award it should have had this point before it. The Respondents not only failed to do this but also in their written submissions showed the wage rate for Group 3 to be Sh. 691/55 instead of Sh. 692/25.

The Court has in the past pointed out that the parties should take utmost care in their submissions to the Court and while working out the collective agreements so that later on they are not caught in a situation like this where they are pleading with the Court, in this case after the Court award had expired, that they had made a mistake in their written submissions. The Court award was effective from 1st September, 1976, and was to remain in force for a period of two years from that date.

In these circumstances the Court must reject the Respondents' interpretation of the Court award and since the Court award clearly state that those employees who were earning more than Sh. 691/55 should get a wage increase of Sh. 72/15 the Court directs that the Respondents should proceed to implement the

Court award in respect of such employees and give them this increase instead of Sh. 52/65 p.m.

As far as the Respondents' point that this would sub-divide Group 3 into two wage rates is concerned, the Court finds that this need not be so because employees in every group can have different wages because of various factors like merit increase, etc.

The Court accordingly upholds the Claimants' interpretation on this point.

The Court announced its award in the above dispute on 22nd June 1976 in which the Court after making certain important findings stated as follows in the last two paragraphs:

"The Court having made the above findings, directs the parties to get together under the chairmanship of the Chief Industrial Relations Officer, Ministry of Labour, and to go through the claim of each one of the persons involved and to adjust them in accordance with the Court's findings as made above as far as their grading and salaries are con-cerned. The Respondents are thereafter directed to pay the appropriate arrears to the employees affected without any further delay.

The Court further directs that the parties will be at liberty to move the Court in case of resolving any doubt in respect of any of these people involved in this dispute after they have applied their minds with the assistance of the Chief Industrial Relations Officer in making adjustments as aforesaid."

The matter is now before the Court because the Claimants have put forward submissions in which they are not accepting the calculations in respect of the claim of each one of the persons involved. They particularly object to the Chief Industrial Relations Officer's (hereinafter referred to as C.I.R.O.) refusal to compute the arrears due to these journalists beyond the period 31st March, 1974.

The Claimants have put forward written and verbal submissions in respect of their position and have put forward the following amounts which they claim are due to their members as a result of the Industrial Court award in this dispute:

They further explained that the above agreement was the result of a meeting between the Kenya Union of Journalists Standard/ Baraza chapel and their management and that subsequently on 28th July, 1976 the journalists involved had signed individual documents in respect of the implementation of this award.

The Respondents rejected the Claimants' figures as quoted hereinabove.

After a series of mentions of this dispute after the Court award was announced mainly at the behest of the Claimants the C.I.R.O. presented the parties with a 21 page report containing the adjustment made by him in accordance with the Court's findings as far as the grading and salaries are concerned and further showing the arrears due to them up to 31st March, 1974. The C.I.R.O. made a further report on 20th January, 1979 in respect of one journalist who was omitted from his original report.

The Court would like to state that the Claimants' figure which they claim to be the result of the implementation of the Court award are derived by implementing the Industrial Court awards in Cause Nos. 29/74 and 18/77 which affected the salaries of the journalists involved in this dispute.

The Court notes that the Claimants are in agreement at the manner in which the C.I.R.O. has applied the Court's findings but they disagree with the cut-off date as they feel that arrears should have been worked out right up to the end of last year.

The Claimants are also not happy at the C.I.R.O.'s ruling in respect of Jemimah Jesee, John Ndurya and Robert Okoth.

The Court would like to direct the parties' attention to the Notification of Dispute Form "A" where they have clearly stated that the Claimants represent the following classes of workers:

"Journalists (with titles covered in the agreement 1972 April to 1974, March 31) employed by the Standard/Baraza Newspapers."

The above is followed by the issues in dispute which are:

- "1. Grading and job categories
- 2. Seniority."

The Industrial Court award in Cause No. 29 of 1974 was announced on 4th September, 1974 and was effective from 1st April, 1974 until 31st March, 1976.

The Industrial Court award in Cause No. 18/77 was announced on 30th August, 1977 and was in force effective from 1st April, 1976 to 31st March, 1978.

In these circumstances the C.I.R.O. has adopted correct and proper approach in that he has established the position of each of these persons involved arising out of the 1972 collective agreement which was effective from April of that year to 31st March 1974 as far as the grading and the salary structure, after taking into account the anniversary increases. This he has done in accordance with the Court's findings.

The Court would like to make it clear that the Claimants are in the wrong in trying to force the Court to require the Respondents to pay arrears which they the Claimants have calculated having taken into account the Industrial Court awards in Cause Nos. 29/74 and 18/77. The implementation or non-implementation of these two awards is not the subject matter of the dispute in this cause. Otherwise the Court would be placed not only in an impossible position but would also be exceeding the jurisdiction conferred upon it in Cause No. 67 of 1975.

The Court has carefully studied the two reports of the C.I.R.O. would like to endorse them. The C.I.R.O. has acted under the Court directive and has come to his conclusions after going through the documentary evidence that was produced to him in respect of each of these journalists and the submissions made by the parties in respect of them.

The Court also accepts his findings as far as Jemimah Jesse, John Ndurya and Robert Okoth are concerned because he has come to these findings after studying the relevant documentary evidence.

Having made the above findings the Court would like to comment on the agreement which the Respondents made with the journalists concerned which agreement was arrived at their chapel level.

The Court must express its astonishment that the General Secretary of the Claimants was not involved at all in arriving at this agreement which surprisingly was signed by the Claimants' Chairman and the Assistant General Secretary. From the evidence that was produced during the hearing before the Court in resolving this matter the Court is satisfied that the General Secretary at the material time was in Nairobi.

The Respondents alone cannot be criticized for this as the persons who signed the agreement with them i.e. the Chairman and the Assistant General Secretary, who for reasons best known to themselves also decided to by-pass their General Secretary. These two top officials of the Claimants should also share the blame for this sort of manoeuvre to try to settle this matter at the chapel level when it had been vigorously pursued not only at the national level but also at the Industrial Court by the General Secretary.

The Court has carefully gone through this document and the other documents relating to it and finds that at best it can only be considered as a part payment towards the arrears due to these journalists. This agreement cannot be accepted to mean that these journalists accepted the arrears calculated at the chapel level to be their dues under this Industrial Court award in full and final settlement of their claims. Nowhere in any of these documents is it stated that these people had received these arrears in full and final settlement of their claims arising out of Cause No. 67/75.

The Court would like to add that the Respondents' contention that the Industrial Court awards are for a fixed period and the parties' position as established under them does not continue because it is overtaken by subsequent Industrial Court awards is not quite correct. The Industrial Court awards as far as salaries and fringe benefits are concerned generally raise their level and the subsequent Industrial Court awards are implemented by adding them on to the level of salaries and fringe benefits already achieved. So the benefits won by the workers as far as salaries and fringe benefits are concerned continue and are not cut-off on the expiry date of the Court award or the collective agreement as the case may be.

The result of this ruling of the Court is that the position of the journalists as far as their salaries and grading is concerned has been established up to 31st March, 1974 in accordance with the C.I.R.O.'s report copies of which are with both the parties. The arrears due to them are also specified therein which have been calculated up to 31st March, 1974.

The Court has made it clear that its awards in Cause Nos. 29/74 and 18/77 have to be implemented in respect of each of these journalists on the position, as far as salaries and

grading are concerned, established as at 31st March, 1974. The implementation of these two awards is a matter for the parties and the Court can see no reason why they should not be implemented properly by the parties themselves. It may well be that these journalists will be entitled to further arrears as a result of the implementation of these two subsequent awards because the Court has clearly indicated that the Respondents, contention in respect of non-accruing of the anniversary increases due to the journalists is clearly wrong. This matter of arrears under Cause Nos. 29/74 and 18/77, however, is not the subject matter of the dispute in Cause No. 67/75 and the Court therefore makes no order in respect thereto. The parties will examine their respective positions as far as the implementation of the Court awards in Cause Nos. 29/74 and 18/77 are concerned and then either resolve the matter at their own level or enlist the help of the Ministry of Labour and failing that they can come to the Industrial Court on this specific issue as a fresh dispute. The Court, however, sees no reason why the parties cannot effect the implementation of these two subsequent awards on the method and formula used by the C.I.R.O. which the Court has found to be in conformity with its award.

Finally the Court would like to conclude this award by stating that further to its findings which were announced on 22nd June, 1976 the Court accepts the report of the C.I.R.O. and makes an award in respect of each of these journalists concerned in the following terms as found by the C.I.R.O.

Henk I van der Laan

Mr. van der Laan was entitled for an increase of Sh. 125 p.m. on 12th June, 1972 and an anniversary increase of Sh. 125 p.m. on 12th June, 1973. He is entitled for payment of the arrears at the rate of Sh. 125 from 12th June, 1972 to 11th June, 1973 and Sh. 250 from 12th June, 1973 to 11th June, 1974. Therefore underpayment to him are:

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D-Kenya Gazette

D.41. (1) Communications for the Kenya Gazette should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
