Background.—Lembaga Instrumentasi Nasional (LIN) is one of the institutes comprising the Indonesian Institute of Science (LIPI). It is responsible for activities in the following fields:—

- (a) The establishment of local facilities for the repair and calibration of scientific and industrial instruments.
- (b) The training of technicians to carry out the above functions.

- (c) The establishment and system management of a national network of calibration and the development of its capabilities.
- (d) The establishment of internationally traceable national physical standards.
- (e) The local design and development of scientific and industrial instruments to answer the needs of the country.
- (f) Industrial liaison and consultancy services aimed at ascertaining needs and promoting local instrument manufacture.
- (g) Medium batch production of selected instruments in immediate demand, prior to their quantity production by Indonesian manufacturers.

Since 1973, LIN has benefited from UNESCO/UNDP projects INS/72/434 and INS/74/017, which have made possible a dramatic improvement in LIN's capabilities in every sphere of its activities. LIN has gained national recognition and has been selected as one of the institutes to be located in the new science city (PUSPIPEK) to be set up at Serpong in 1982, leaving only minor repair, calibration and other service facilities in Bandung for the support of local institutes and industry.

But in the meantime the institute is to be expanded on the existing site, with the construction of new buildings and the setting up of foundry, batch production and quality control facilities. In 1982, these facilities will be transferred to the much larger and more appropriate buildings at Serpong, whilst most of the buildings at Bandung will be occupied by other institutes of LIPI.

The expansion of LIN's capabilities will, as from 1979 be assisted by a 2 million DM bilateral aid programme financed by the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany.

The present project is aimed principally at supporting LIN's activities in the fields (c), (e), (f) and (g) above.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 28th October, 1977, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 12th February, 1979, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

J. Orawo started working for the Respondents on 1st March, 1971, as a store clerk and by October, 1977, he had risen to the position of Perpetual Inventory Controller drawing a monthly salary of Sh. 2,000. His services were terminated on 18th October, 1977.

The dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and on 18th October, 1978, the Permanent Secretary forwarded the Ministry's findings and recommendation to the parties in the following terms:—

~ "Findings.—It was established that Mr. Orawo in his position as a Perpetual Inventory Controller was capable of using the subordinate staff he used to supervise to obtain spares through unauthorized means. It was also found that this is exactly what he attempted to do but fortunately he did not succeed. In his signed statement he admitted that he visited the work place and saw Mr. Owiti. His coming to the work place on Saturday which was his day to be off duty is a clear evidence against him that he had come to collect something from Mr. Owiti. His case is also weakened by the fact that his accomplice, Mr. Onyango, whose services were also terminated, admitted through his union that he gave Sh. 200 to Mr. Owiti. He was given every chance to be heard and in fact before he was terminated his case was reviewed by a panel of Senior Executives.

Recommendations.—The offence committed by the claimant who was a senior member constituted gross misconduct; termination of his services was therefore justified. He should therefore be advised to collect his dues which the management offered to pay him."

The Claimants having rejected the Ministry's findings and recommendation allege that the Investigator had decided to omit some very relevant facts and evidence which the Claimants had submitted for the reasons best known to the Investigator.

The Court notes that Mr. Orawo received rapid promotions as a result of which he was promoted to the post of Perpetual Inventory Controller with effect from 1st August, 1976. M. J. Beardmore, the Respondents' Parts Manager, had advised Mr. Orawo of this promotion and his duties and responsibilities in a confidential memo on 29th June, 1976.

The incident that led to Mr. Orawo's sacking is alleged to have taken place on Friday, 14th October, 1977, at about 5 p.m.

It is alleged that Mr. Orawo accompanied by one Mr. E. Onyango attempted to defraud the Respondents by obtaining spares from the cage counter instead of from the sales counter in contravention of the established procedures. The allegation against him is that he ordered the spares that he wanted and told Mr. Onyango to pay Sh. 200 to Mr. Owiti, the clerk in charge of the cage and that he, Mr. Orawo then added another Sh. 30 making a total of Sh. 230. The items were a carburetor and thrust bearing of a Datsun car and he is alleged to have dictated to the staff inside the cage the part numbers. He had also arranged that these spare parts should be made ready for him to collect and he came for them at 1 p.m. the following day which was a Saturday and on which day Mr. Orawo was

off duty. Mr. Owiti, however, had not succumbed to the temptation and instead had reported the matter to the Warehouse Manager, Mr. Mbachu.

On Monday, Mr. Orawo was summoned in the Personnel Manager's office where he found Mr. Beardmore and Mr. Mbachu and was confronted with the said allegation against him and his services were thereafter terminated.

The Claimants have submitted that this is all a cooked up story as Mr. Beardmore who did not like Africans had wanted to sack Mr. Orawo.

In addition to this Mr. Orawo, while denying completely the above incident, stated that he had asked on Monday, 17th October, for proof of this allegation against him but it was not produced and that Mr. Beardmore had produced only Sh. 30 from his pocket claiming that money to be Mr. Orawo's. He completely denied the allegations made against him in Respondents' written submission in appendices A, B and C which are the statements of Mr. Owiti, Mr. Musonye and Mr. Onyango. Mr. Orawo further put forward the reason for this cooked up story against him to be the grudge which both Mr. Beardmore and Mr. Mbachu held against him because he had sent the reconciliation report direct to the Financial Director and the Chief Accountant. Further the dead spares had been removed to one other firm by both Mr. Beardmore and Mr. Mbachu in a lorry and this fact had come to the knowledge of the Financial Director.

The Respondents emphasized that nobody bore any grudge against Mr. Orawo and the simple fact was that he had abused the trust that they had placed in him by giving him such an important position as the Perpetual Inventory Controller where he was supposed to prevent frauds and loss of company's spare parts. The Respondents stated that they were suffering a huge loss as a result of spare parts being stolen from their warehouse.

The Respondents called Mr. W. Owiti and Mr. A. Musonye to give evidence on oath but E. Onyango was not called as his whereabouts were not known.

The Respondents also strongly refuted the uncalled for criticism of Mr. Beardmore and added that it was Mr. Beardmore who was instrumental in the appointment of Mr. Orawo as the Perpetual Inventory Controller.

In addition to the written and verbal submissions of the parties the Court had the benefit of the evidence given by the various witnesses. Mr. Orawo has denied that the incident ever took place and says it is a cooked up story in order to get rid of him. At the same time he could tell of no grudge that Mr. Owiti and Mr. Musonye had against him.

Both Mr. Owiti and Mr. Musonye while giving evidence corroborated each other about this incident and while there are one or two discrepancies in their evidence the Court finds them to be minor and not serious enough to warrant drawing a conclusion that they had told lies and had narrated an imaginary incident in order to frame Mr. Orawo. The Court is of the view that these minor discrepancies lend credence to their evidence because if the Claimants' allegation that they had been coached in order to tell this story was true then there would be little chance of any discrepancies.

The Court can find no reason why these two employees, namely Mr. Owiti and Mr. Musonye, should tell lies on oath in order to get a fellow worker sacked when there is no evidence of any grudge or *fitina* between them. The Court has carefully considered what Mr. Orawo said in evidence regarding the disposal of dead spares by Mr. Beardmore and Mr. Mbachu but has come to the conclusion that this is only an after-thought on the part of Mr. Orawo because at no stage of all these proceedings leading up to the Industrial Court hearing had Mr. Orawo mentioned about Messrs. Beardmore and Mbachu having a grudge against him because of the dead spares incident or for any other matter. He has not mentioned any such grudge even in his statement.

After carefully weighing the evidence of all witnesses the Court has no hesitation in finding that Messrs. Owiti and Musonye are telling the truth. The Court would like to record that had it not been for the honesty of Mr. Owiti in reporting Mr. Orawo's approach for giving him spares worth over Sh. 1000 for a mere Sh. 320 the Respondents would indeed have suffered this loss and it would certainly have encouraged more of such illicit deals.

The Court would like to emphasize that workers who are proved to be dishonest to their employers should expect no mercy from the Court. Were the Court to condone such behaviour on the part of dishonest workers then it would be a disservice to the country. The Court feels that Mr. Orawo having been assigned a position of such high responsibility as the Perpetual Inventory Controller has indeed abused the trust

that the Respondents placed in him. This, to say the least, is indeed a gross misconduct in that he attempted to defraud the company.

After careful consideration of all the submissions and the evidence the Court has come to the conclusion that the Respondents' action in dismissing Mr. Orawo was justified and the Claimants' demand must accordingly fail.

Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

Kenya Gazette

D.41. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.
