## SIAYA TOWNSHIP

3. The lessee/grantee shall maintain the buildings and the drainage system in good repair and conditions to the satisfaction of the lessor.

4. No additions shall be made to the approved buildings without the prior consent in writing of the lessor.

5. The land shall only be used for one private residential house and the lessee shall throughout the term and to the satisfaction of the lessor, make substantial use of the land for such purposes. (No guest house).

- (f) Full details of both residential and/or commercial properties owned by the applicant in the Republic.

## General Conditions
