(Cap. 288)

#### SIAYA TOWNSHIP

Provided notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280) if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this conditions it shall be lawful by him on behalf of the County Council to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the County Council in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The lessee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the County Council that he is unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that in such notice as aforesaid shall be given.

- (a) Within 12 months of the actual registration of the title, the County Council shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or,

#### GOD ABUORO TOWNSHIP

THE Commissioner of Lands invites applications for the alienation of plots in the above town described in the Schedule hereto. A plan of the plots may be seen in the Public Map Office, Lands Building, City Square, or obtained therefrom on payment of Sh. 10.

- 2. Applications may be sent so as to reach the Clerk to the Council, P.O. Box 86, Kisumu, not later than noon on 11th June, 1979, and should not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi.
- 3. Applicants must enclose with their applications a bank cheque, postal order, money order or cash for Sh. 1,000 made payable to the Commissioner of Lands as deposit, personal cheques will not be accepted. The deposit will be dealt with as follows:—
- (a) Credited to a successful applicant.
- (b) Refunded to an unsuccessful applicant.
- (c) Forfeited if a successful applicant fails to pay within 30 days of the offer of a plot from the date of the letter of allotment, and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.
- 4. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating:—
  - (a) The amount of capital available for the purchase of the plot.
  - (b) The amount of capital available for the development of the plot. Attach bankers statement of his/her account, letter or any other evidence of financial status in support.
  - (c) The manner in which it is proposed to raise the balance required for development if any.
  - (d) Full details of both residential or commercial properties owned by the applicant in this town.
  - (e) Individual applicants must quote their identity card numbers and their nationalities.
  - (f) In case of companies, names of directors must be included and a photostat of the company's registration certificate.
- 5. The successful allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 30 days of notification that his/her/their application has been successful, the stand premium, initial annual rent with conveyancing, stamp duty, survey and registration fees provisional service charges if any. In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands shall cancel the allocation of the plot and the allottee shall have no claim to the plot or the deposit paid on application.

#### General Conditions

- 1. The grant/lease will be made under the provision of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281) or the Registered Land Act (Cap. 300) as the case may be.
- 2. The grant/lease will be issued in the name(s) of the allottee(s) as given in the letter of application and will be subject to Special Conditions set out below.
- 3. The term of the grant/lease will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the issue of the letter of allotment.

#### Special Conditions

1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Local Authority. The Local Authority shall not give approval unless it is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

The lessee/grantee shall within six calendar months of the actual registration of the lease/grant submit in triplicate to the Local Authority plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawing, elevations and specifications of the buildings, the lessee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the actual registration of the grant/lease complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevation and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Local Authority:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied by the Trust Land Act (Cap. 288) if

default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the County Council or any person authorized by the County Council to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the County Council in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The lessee/grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the lessee/grantee give notice in writing to the County Council that they/she/it, is unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the County Council shall (at the lessee/grantees expenses accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given within twelve months of the commencement of the term, the County Council shall refund to the lessee/grantee fifty per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the County Council shall refund to the lessee/grantee five per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and the buildings shall only be used for see Schedule (excluding sale of petrol and motor oils).
- 6. The buildings shall not cover more than .... per centum of the area of land hereby allocated or such lesser area as may be laid down by the Local Authority in its by-laws.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Local Authority considers to be dangerous or offensive.

The lessee/grantee shall pay to the Local Authority on demand such sums as the Local Authority may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 11. The lessee/grantee shall from time to time pay to the Local Authority on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Local Authority may assess.
- 12. Should the Local Authority at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the lessee/grantee shall pay to the Local Authority on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Local Authority may assess.
- 13. The lessee/grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the Local Authority or the County Council in lieu thereof.
- 14. The County Council or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have assess to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and lessee/grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes of telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

- 15. The County Council reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable hereunder after the expirations of the thirty-third and sixty-sixth year of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at the rate of four per centum of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Country Council.
- 16. Notwishstanding anything to the contrary contained herein or implied by the said Government Lands Act, the grantee shall on receipt of six months' notice in writing in that behalf surrender all or any part of the land required for public purposes without payment of any compensation save in respect of such of the approved buildings as may have to be evacuated or demolished.

(a) A licence to authorize the generation of electrical energy and the construction of a generating station at Olkaria.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Kenya Power Company Limited, a limited liability company having its registered office at Electricity House, Harambee Avenue, Nairobi, Kenya (hereinafter called "the applicant"), will, on the 26th day of July, 1979, pursuant to the provisions of section 130 and 135 of the Electric Power Act, apply to the Minister for Power and Communications for a licence to generate electrical energy and to construct a generating station at Olkaria near Lake Naivasha in the Nakuru District.

The purpose for which the licence is required is to enable the applicant to supply electrical energy in bulk to authorized distributors for the purpose of general supply. The generating station and associated works will be located on public land

L.R. No. 1790/R South of Lake Naivasha and West of Hell's Gate in the District of Nakuru. The generating machinery will comprise two steam turbine generators each of 15 MW capacity, a cooling water pond, two forced-draught cooling towers and an outdoor substation containing transformers and switchgear. Steam will be supplied to the plant through pipelines from a number of wells drilled in the area around the station, and surplus water will be infiltrated into the ground in a number of fenced ponds.

All works and machinery will conform to the specifications given in the appropriate British Standards or other equivalent standards.

When commissioned, the proposed generating station will operate continuously or as may be required by the applicant.

Similar generating stations do not exist in Kenya, but geothermal power stations do exist in Italy, New Zealand, the U.S.A. and many other countries.


