Termination of services of Messrs. Goeffre N. Mahungu, Phillip K. Gitahi and Jeremiah N. Kiiti.

1. The Kenya Management Staff Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenatoo Transport Co. Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 13th and 14th June, 1979 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:

Claimants:—

Jeremiah N. Kiiti.
Phillip K. Gitahi.

Respondent.—Gabriel Ndungu.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 5th January, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on

9th April together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute originally was in respect of three persons as stated hereinabove but on 18th April, 1979 G. N. Mahungu wrote to the Claimants with copy to the Court that having considered seriously his own affairs and repute he wished to withdraw from the dispute. He accordingly confirmed his withdrawal and stated that he was no longer an interested party in it. Accordingly the dispute proceeded in respect of the remaining two persons.

Both Mr. Kiiti and Mr. Gitahi are former policemen and both had attained the rank of inspector. Mr. Kiiti was employed by the Respondents in February 1974 as a security officer with a monthly salary of K.Sh. 1,650 and Mr. Gitahi started working for the Respondents in March 1974 as a security officer at a salary of K.Sh. 2,275 p.m. Both of them completed their probation successfully but had their services terminated on 24th March, 1977. Their letters of termination pointed out that the company had incurred heavy losses through theft and although they were security officers they had not been able to investigate a single case to fruitful conclusion. It was further pointed out that:

"While we continue to incur heavier losses as is evident currently, and no positive result is expected from you, it becomes more expensive to retain you in the service of the company. It has therefore been decided that your services be terminated forthwith.

You will be paid a month's salary in lieu of notice together with any other terminal benefits which may be due to you. You will also be required to pay in full any debts you may be owing the company as at to date."

The Claimants took up the matter on their behalf and the dispute ended up with the Ministry of Labour. After investigation the Ministry's recommendation was that the action by the Respondents in terminating the services of these security officers was justified.

Mr. Kiiti was paid as follows:

1. Salary for up to and including 25th March, 1977.
2. Pay in lieu of one month's notice.
3. Pay in lieu of 34 days' leave.

His salary at the time of termination was £1,182 p.a."

Mr. Gitahi's terminal payment was as follows:

1. Salary for up to and including 25th March, 1977.
2. Pay in lieu of month's notice.
3. Pay in lieu of 29 days' leave.

His salary at the time of termination was £1,572 p.a."

The Claimants rejected the Ministry's finding and recommendation on the ground that the Investigator had not been given proper facts by the Respondents which resulted in a conclusion which was against their members. They added that they had requested the Investigator that he should summon both parties together with the persons involved so that the exact truth could be established but the Respondents had rejected the request.

The Claimants maintain that the services of their two members were dispensed with because the Respondents believed that both of them were involved in the loss of coffee which the Respondents were handling from Kampala to Mombasa. They added that there was absolutely no proof to back up this allegation or suspicion.

The Respondents submitted that on or about 14th March, 1977 a driver Gabriel Ndungu reported to the General Manager that Kiiti and Gitahi were trying to persuade him and his co-driver to agree to an arrangement whereby the coffee loaded on vehicle No. KIPJ 739/ZA 441 was to be stolen during transit between Nairobi and Mombasa and sold dishonestly to some coffee dealers who were known to the security officers i.e. Kiiti and Gitahi. Following this report the General Manager had asked both of them to make written statements which they did. Thereafter the management having been satisfied that both of them had a plan to steal the coffee, which was in transit, for their own personal benefits decided to terminate their services.

The Respondents made the point that as hauliers they are contractually responsible for the safety of the goods as long as such goods are in their custody i.e. during transit. Therefore any form of misconduct on the part of their employees which may result in loss of goods cannot be taken or treated lightly because it will automatically render the Respondents liable. They asked the Court to find that their action in terminating the services of these two employees was fair and justifiable.

During the hearing both Mr. Kiiti and Mr. Gitahi gave evidence on oath and the Respondents called driver Gabriel Ndungu to give evidence.

It is common ground in the evidence of these three persons that Ndungu was approached by these two security officers at the time with a proposal that coffee should be stolen while in transit from Nairobi to Mombasa. The driver reported the matter to the General Manager. However both Mr. Kiiti and Gitahi maintained that a plan had been hatched between Mr. Kiiti and the Commercial Manager and the Company Secretary to try to find out through the Respondents' drivers who the buyers of the stolen coffee or their representatives were and that it was in furtherance of this plan that they had approached the driver and made a proposal to him about stealing coffee while in transit. They explained that their purpose was to get at the buyer of the stolen coffee in this manner.

The above in brief is the story that was given to the Court by Mr. Kiiti and Gitahi and the Court has to decide if in fact they are telling the truth about this alleged plan.

The Court is satisfied that G. Ndungu has told the truth. He stated that Mr. Kiiti had called him and the other driver to his office and Mr. Gitahi was also there. Kiiti had explained to him how he had got an order for the coffee to be purchased on the way to Mombasa. Kiiti told him that he would be given K.Sh. 100,000. Both Kiiti and Gitahi had also told him how they would take him home in another vehicle with K.Sh. 100,000 before coffee was sold. After that the lorry with coffee would be taken to Mombasa and on the way the buyers of coffee would be waiting for them. Mr. Ndungu would be tied to a tree and the other driver would be cut slightly and he would run away. These people would then take the lorry. Mr. Ndungu added that Kiiti was to follow. Mr. Ndungu left them saying that he would think about it and went straight to the General Manager where he made a report about this matter.

The Court finds it most surprising that both Mr. Kiiti and Mr. Gitahi when asked by the General Manager to make a statement on the report made to him by Mr. Ndungu while making written statements made no mention at all of any plan which Mr. Kiiti had made with the Commercial Manager and the Company Secretary. Not only this, but even the Claimants in their written submissions have not referred to any plan and even in their written submissions to the Investigator there is no mention of any such plan.

The Court believes that if what Mr. Kiiti has said about a plan to get at the buyers through the drivers was a reality then surely they would have at the first opportunity told the General Manager about it and they would have mentioned it in their statements. The Claimants' submissions to the Investigator and the Court would also have referred to it. The fact that they did not do so leaves the Court with only one conclusion and that is that it is a very clever afterthought and an ingenious way in which these two persons think they can persuade the Court to believe that their sackings were unjustified. The Court has no hesitation in rejecting their story.

The Court would like to make it clear that it has taken into account the testimonials which the Respondents issued to these two persons and also the fact that there is no mention of the real reason why both of them were sacked in their letters of termination. The Court must criticize the Respondents for not having stated the true reason in the letters of termination. This has no doubt prompted the Claimants to argue that their members were not at fault and were efficient workers. The Court, however, despite this omission in the letters of termination is absolutely satisfied that had it not been for the honesty of the driver, Mr. Ndungu, a serious attempt was in the offing to steal a big load of coffee in transit.

As far as the testimonials are concerned the Court notes that the Respondents stated that they had issued them as a matter of compassion.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that the Claimants' demand must fail and the Court accordingly rejects it.




