THE TRADE DISPUTES ACT

(Cap. 234)

ORDER UNDER SECTION 36—COLLECTION OF TRADE UNION DUES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 36 of the Trade Disputes Act, the Minister for Labour has ordered that every employer who employs not less than five members of the Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union to—

- (a) deduct every month the sum of five shillings in respect of trade union dues from the wages of each of his employees who is a member of that trade union;
- (b) pay 85 per cent of the total of the sums so deducted in any month, not later than the third day from the date on which such wages were paid, by crossed cheque made payable to the account of the Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union at the National Bank of Kenya, P.O. Box 1013, Nakuru;
- (c) pay 15 per cent of the total of the sums so deducted in any month, not later than the tenth day of the following month, by crossed cheque made payable to the account of the Central Organization of Trade Union (Kenya), at Barclays Bank, Mama Ngina Street, P.O. 30011, Nairobi;
- (d) notify respectively, in writing, that trade union and that federation before the end of each month the total amount of all payments made to the account of that trade union and that federation respectively in that month; and
- (e) notify the Registrar of Trade Unions, in writing, before the end of each month the total amount of all payments made into the accounts of that union and that federation respectively in that month.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 36 (2) of the said act, the order notified by Gazette Notice No. 2684 of 1975 is hereby revoked.

1. Title.—FRENCH EDITOR.

Post No.—SC-239.

Category and level.—Professional category (P-3).

Organization location.—Publications Unit, Science Sector.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the higher authority of the Assistant Director-General for Science and the direct supervision of the Chief of the Unit, the incumbent is responsible for—

- (1) editing all the original French manuscripts of the Sector's non-periodical publications which are entrusted to him by the Chief of the Unit; checking statements which appear to be inaccurate or contradictory and correcting them in consultation with the Programme Specialist concerned; making appropriate changes in texts submitted to him, in the matter of grammar style, structure, balance and the like, having regard to the potential readership; improving the form and presentation of texts without distorting the author's ideas or intentions;
- (2) reading French translations of manuscripts of publications written in another language, in accordance with the same principles and for the same purpose;
- (3) seeing that the rules and directives applying to Unesco publications as regards general publications policy, programme provisions and budgetary resources are strictly observed in every case;
- (4) performing any other duties entrusted to him, in particular, helping to prepare and finalize the Sector's Publication Plans and to carry out those plans and giving advice and assistance to Programme Specialists responsible for publications projects.

Qualifications and experience required

- (1) University degree in science or technology, or its equivalent.
- (2) Excellent command of French. Good knowledge of English. A knowledge of other languages desirable.
- (3) Very wide cultural background. Good knowledge of the functioning of international organizations.
- (4) Ability to draft clearly and concisely in French.
- (5) Experience in editing or deading the manuscripts of scientific publications.

Salary and allowances.—Initial appointment will be at P-3 grade with a net salary equivalent to US \$18, (\$16,978 if without dependants) per annum, payable mainly in French francs, plus the prescribed annual allowances, e.g. post adjustment, at present \$15,257 for staff members with dependants, \$14,231 for staff members without dependants, family allowances of \$450 for each dependent child (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable in respect of the first dependent child). Organization location.—Bureau of the Budget.

Duties and responsibilities.—The incumbent assists the Director of the Bureau of the Budget in planning and directing the activities of the Bureau in relation to the Regular Programme, the United Nations Development Programme, the United Nations Fund for population activities, the United Nations Environment Programme, Funds-in-Trust arrangements and all programmes financed from extra-budgetary sources. He acts as Director of the Bureau in the Director's absence. Under the authority of the Director, he is responsible in particular for:

A. In the preparation of programmes and budgets

(1) Planning and organizing studies of general or methodological interest with a view to ensuring continuing improvement in budget techniques.

(2) In conjunction with the Bureau of studies and programming, assisting the Assistant Director-General for Studies and programming in preparing guide programme and budget including their form and presentation.

(3) Advising sectors, bureaux and units on the implementation of these guide-lines and techniques in the formulation of proposals for the draft programme and budget.

(4) Co-ordinating the work carried out by the Bureau, in particular as regards the analysis of proposals for the programme and budget submitted to the Director-General by sectors, bureaux and units.

(5) Co-ordinating the work of the Bureau of the budget in the development of the draft programme and budget submitted by the Director-General to the Executive Board and the General Conference.

B. In the execution of approved programmes and budgets

(6) Co-ordinating the work of finalizing approved programmes and budgets on the basis of the decisions taken by the General Conference.

(7) Preparing guide-lines for the execution of the approved programme and budget, and carrying out all the necessary studies for this purpose in association with the evaluation unit of the Bureau of Studies and Programming, the Bureau of the Comptroller and the Inspectorate-General.

(8) Formulating the advice to be given by the Bureau to the Director-General or Assistant Directors-General on the execution of the approved programme and budget.

(9) Analysing and formulating recommendations on Programme Activity Details (PADs) and amendments thereto submitted by sectors, bureaux and units for consideration by the Assistant Director-General, the Deputy Director-General and the Director-General; formulating recommendations on requests for the establishment of posts, travel on mission, publications, etc.

(10) Analysing, commenting and formulating recommendations as necessary on reports and documents submitted by sectors, bureaux and units to the Directorate, the Executive Board or the General Conference.

*C. Dealing with any other matters that may be assigned to him by the Director of the Bureau of the budget.**Qualifications and experience required*

(a) University degree in economics, business management or public administration, with specialization in planning and budgeting, or equivalent attainments.

(b) At least ten years' administrative experience in a post of responsibility and above all a thorough knowledge of the procedures followed by international organizations as regards budget theory and practice.

(c) Ability to speak French or English and to draft official documents in one of these languages, with a practical knowledge of the other working languages.

Duty station.—Addis Ababa.

Organizational Unit.—A joint ECA/UNIDO Industry Division has been set up within the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) to co-ordinate the industrial development activities of ECA and UNIDO in Africa. Increased emphasis is placed on studying the problem posed by the transfer and utilization of industrial techniques in Africa, the establishment of institutions which will ensure industrial research, training and financing, the strengthening of the link between agriculture and industry, the development of African enterprises and the creation of multinational African enterprises. The Economic Affairs Officer reports to the Chief of the Division.

Functions.—Draws up inventories of existing fleets, stocks of engineering products, and scientific equipment. Formulates policies and programmes for development of engineering, and assists in planning regional development of industry. Co-operates in design of a common technological policy for multinational basic industries. Identifies opportunities for promoting complementarity and specialization in specific industries. Promotes technology, policies and data banks relating to multinational basic industries. Identifies and evaluates opportunities for industrial forward and backward linkages. Carries out feasibility studies on specific engineering projects. Develops national capabilities in industrial project planning and analysis. Participates in preparation and implementation of workshops. Studies in selected African countries capabilities in industrial project design, evaluation and planning. 7. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.

8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the President no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE No. 15 OF 1978 (3)

Parties:—

Kenya Local Government Workers' Union
and
Kisumu Municipal Council

Issue in dispute:—

Premature retirement of Messrs. Okudo Okore, Christopher Bunge, Agalo Magweya.

1. The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Kisumu Municipal Council shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 9th February, 21st March and 18th July, 1979, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Respondents also called Dr. O. Olel to give evidence on oath.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 21st November, 1977, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 8th March, 1978, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The three persons involved in this dispute Messrs. O. Okore, C. Bunge and A. Magweya lost their jobs with the County Council when the Respondents' boundary was extended in 1972. The Respondents, however, employed them at that time.

In May, 1974, the Respondents decided to retire all employees who had attained 60 years in age. The heads of the various departments submitted the names of certain employees to the Respondents' Medical Officer of Health in order to determine their ages. The Medical Officer of Health, Dr. O. Olel, in all received 53 names and after conducting a medical examination on them certified that in his opinion 31 of them should be retired. Out of these 31 were the three persons whose dispute is now before the Court.

Mr. Okore from the Department of the Municipal Education Officer, was assessed at between 60-61 years. The age of Mr. Bunge from the Town Clerk's Department was assessed at 65-66 years and finally Mr. Magweya from the Town Engineer's Department was found to be 62-63 years old.

Acting on the Medical Officer's report the Respondents decided to retire the three of them in September, 1974, but on the Claimants' representations they extended the date to October, 1974, although the Claimants had asked for the retirement to be put off for six months.

The Claimants took up the matter on their behalf and reported the dispute to the Minister for Labour. The Ministry, however, recommended that the retirement of the three be upheld and this recommendation was conveyed to the parties on 14th October, 1977.

During the hearing the Claimants have stressed that the ages of these three persons can best be assessed by their identity cards which clearly show that at the time of their retirement in October, 1974, they were all below 60 years of age.

The Claimants further pointed out that the National Social Security Fund office in Nairobi had stated that they could not be paid their old age contributions because they had not attained the age of 55 years in October, 1974.

The Claimants also pleaded that the District Medical Officer of Health for Kisumu/Siaya had examined the three employees and confirmed that:—

Okudo Okore was 49 years old as at 12th November, 1974.

Agalo Magweya was 52 years old as at 12th November, 1974.

Christopher Bunge was 54 years old as at 12th November, 1974.

The Claimants asked the Court to presume that the District Medical Officer of Health's report on these three persons' ages was against the Respondents because the Respondents had failed to make available to the Court the report which they received from him.

The Claimants submitted that the burden of proof in this dispute was on the Respondents and it was up to the Respondents to challenge the identity cards and the authenticity of the Medical Officer of Health's report.

The Claimants asked the Court to find that the three of them should be paid their monthly salary for all the years up to the day of their forced retirement until they are 60 or to award any other relief.

The Respondents referred the Court to clause 20 in their relevant terms and conditions of employment in which it is clearly stated that where documentary evidence of an employee's age is unobtainable or inconclusive his assumed age will be determined by the Medical Officer of Health. The Respondents further pointed out that the amendment to this rule in the following terms was agreed between the parties on 23rd May, 1974:—

"20 (a) (ii) If the person concerned is not satisfied he shall be entitled to apply to the District Medical Officer of Health whose decision shall be final."

The Respondents stated that this amendment was not approved by the Minister for Local Government as required by Rule No. 2 of the Constitution of the National Joint Negotiating Council.

The Respondents stressed that reassessment of the ages of the above employees was not carried out by the Medical Officer of Health Kisumu/Siaya Districts and that he had not signed the reassessment report and did not sign the letter forwarding the report to the Respondents.

The Respondents called Dr. Odhiambo Olel to give evidence on oath and he explained how he had assessed the ages of three employees and the factors that he had taken into account.

The Court was not furnished with the report on the reassessment of the ages of these three persons which is alleged to have been made by the Medical Officer of Health, Kisumu/Siaya Districts. The only document that the Court saw was a letter dated 27th February, 1976, which is signed by one J. L. Odundo for the Medical Officer of Health and states that the report is sent under confidential cover as required by the Town Clerk and a copy of this letter was sent to the Provincial Medical Officer, Kisumu.

Dr. Olel in his evidence said that between 1970 and 1976 as far as he could remember there was no District Medical Officer for Kisumu/Siaya Districts and that a Public Health Officer was running the Districts.

The Court gave the parties an opportunity of trying to locate this report but they failed to find a copy of it in the Medical Department records relating to that District. On 21st June, 1979, the Medical Officer of Health, Kisumu District wrote as follows to the Claimants' Branch Secretary:—

"Premature retirement examination of Messrs. Okore, Magweya and Bunge.

Your letter of 18th June, 1979.

As already explained in this office letter No. GN. 10/79/56 of 24th April, 1979, the above-named Municipal employees' examination reports were sent to the then Acting Town Clerk under confidential cover copies of which were not retained in this office. Please note that these men were examined by a Medical Practitioner at the material time based at the Provincial General Hospital, Kisumu, but not the Medical Officer of Health, Kisumu/Siaya Districts. Furthermore, I can trace no record on our files indicative of the alleged dispute by the Municipal authorities."

The Investigator appointed by the Ministry of Labour stated that through his personal investigation he established that the Respondents' Medical Officer of Health was the first to carry out an age assessment examination of the three employees. The Investigator further stated that it was also found out that at the time the three employees were referred to the District Medical Officer of Health no qualified doctor was available and the person who did the reassessment was a medical assistant who is not a doctor. The reassessment report itself was not signed by the examining assistant but the Administrative Officer of the District Hospital, Mr. Odundo, who is not a medical practitioner.

From the above evidence the Court is satisfied that at the material time there was no District Medical Officer of Health running the Kisumu/Siaya Districts.

The Court is satisfied that the Respondents acted in conformity with the relevant clause on retirement in the terms and conditions of service for employees in the non-salaried grades which were valid at that time. Clause 20 reads as follows:—

"20. Termination of Employment—

(a) Retirement—

The normal retiring age is 60 years and unless an extension of service is mutually agreed beforehand, an employee's last day of service will be his 60th birthday and no notice of termination need be given by either the Council or the employee. Where documentary evidence of an employee's age is unobtainable or inconclusive his assumed age will be determined by the Medical Officer of Health and in such a

case the anniversary of his birthday shall be deemed to be 31st December. If in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health an employee is permanently incapable of carrying out his duties by reason of bodily or mental infirmity he may be retired from the service of the Council notwithstanding that he has not attained the normal retiring age."

On the evidence of Dr. Odhiambo Olel the Court is satisfied that he carried out a thorough examination of the three employees and that he is a qualified person to do so.

The Court has very grave doubts if the amendment to clause 20 referred to hereinabove was approved by the Minister for Local Government but even if it was approved the amendment clearly states that if the person concerned is not satisfied he shall be entitled to apply to the District Medical Officer of Health whose decision shall be final. This clearly shows that the burden of disproving the assessment carried out by the Medical Officer of Health rests on the person concerned, i.e. one who is to be retired. The Court finds that the Claimants have failed to discharge this burden of proof to the satisfaction of the Court.

The Court cannot accept that the identity cards should be used as a conclusive proof of a person's age because in these cards only the apparent age is stated. They therefore cannot be considered to be conclusive.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that the Claimants' demand of full payment of salary to all the three employees concerned until they attain the age of 60 years which amounts to over Sh. 80,000 must fail and the Court upholds the Respondents' action in retiring these three employees.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE No. 61 OF 1978

Parties:—

Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers
and
Wellcome Kenya Ltd.

Issue in dispute:—

Underpayments of wages.

RULING

Interpretation Application

The Court announced its award in the above dispute on 5th March, 1979, and stated as follows in the last paragraph in the award:—

"After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that the Respondents' employees were entitled to the 5 per cent increase effective from 1st June, 1974 to December, 1974, on their personal salaries and since the dispute relates only to this increase the Court rules that the parties should work out employees' arrears based on this ruling. In case the parties are not able to work out the arrears due to the Respondents' employees by virtue of this ruling the Court directs them to enlist the help of the Chief Industrial Relations Officer or his representative and the calculations done so should be considered to be the final dues of the employees concerned."

The parties have not been able to work out the arrears due to the employees concerned because the Claimants maintain that the 5 per cent increase which was awarded by the Court in this dispute became part and parcel of the employees' salaries and that any subsequent increases through the collective agreements had to be added on to the workers' salaries inclusive of this 5 per cent increase.

The Claimants added that the Respondents had treated this award as a sort of a bonus to the employees for the period between 31st May to 31st December, 1974, and they refused

to add the subsequent increases contained in the collective agreements to the workers' salaries inclusive of this 5 per cent increase.

The Respondents stated that they had worked out the arrears due to the employees concerned and had forwarded the details to the Claimants with copies to the Chief Industrial Relations Officer and the Executive Director of F.K.E. The Claimants had rejected these arrears.

The Respondents maintain that since the dispute related to only 5 per cent increase effective from 1st June to 31st December, 1974, the award did not extend to or affect the period beyond December, 1974.

The Respondents argued that if the Claimants wished to demand the arrears for the period beyond 31st December, 1974, they should do so by reporting the matter as a new trade dispute and that the Claimants should not be allowed to use an interpretation application as a short cut to their end.

The Court would like to refer to the advice which was given to the parties by the Chief Industrial Relations Officer which was based on the Industrial Court ruling in Cause No. 67/75. The Chief Industrial Relations Officer explained to the parties that although the 5 per cent increase in the dispute related to the period 1st June to 31st December, 1974, it did not mean that the said increase should be cut off at 31st December, 1974.

The Court would like to clarify that its awards as far as salaries and fringe benefits are concerned generally raise their levels and subsequent awards and the collective agreements are added on to the level of salaries and fringe benefits already achieved. So the benefits won by the workers as far as salaries and fringe benefits are concerned continue and are not cut off on the expiry date of the Court award or the collective agreement as the case may be.

It therefore follows that the 5 per cent wage increase which the Court ordered was to be added on to the salaries with effect from 1st June to 1st December, 1974, stays and is part and parcel of their salaries. Any subsequent wage increases which the parties have negotiated have got to be added on to the workers' salaries.

The Court would like to refer the parties to its last but one paragraph of the award which reads as follows:—

"The Court is satisfied that the Respondents' interpretation of this 5 per cent increase is inconsistent with the correct interpretation of the relevant clause and that the other members of the Association who have awarded this on the personal salaries of their employees have acted correctly. If what the Respondents allege to be the interpretation of clause 20 of the collective agreement then the proviso should have read that no employee shall get more than the minimum increase applicable to his or her grade and not less as is written therein. If the intention was not to cater for the red circle employees, i.e. those employees who have above the minimum rates for their grades, there was no need to have this proviso which would then appear to be redundant. This proviso means that 5 per cent increase which was effective from 1st June, 1974, was the entitlement of all employees on their personal salaries and it was not merely on the rates for the grades. The Court finds that the Respondents should have given this 5 per cent increase to all the employees in the various grades on their individual salaries."

The Court would like to point out to the parties that with its above ruling there should be no difficulty in working out the arrears due to the workers from 1st June, 1974, to date. It should be a simple mathematical exercise which the parties should be able to complete, if need be, with the help of an accountant and the Chief Industrial Relations Officer.

The Court would like to conclude this ruling by stating that if the parties cannot agree on the arrears which are due to the workers after 1st January, 1975, then the Claimants should report a fresh dispute on these claims. The Court would, however, add that unless the parties are determined to create more dispute there is really no reason why they should not be able to conclude this matter on the lines indicated by the Court in this ruling.

Notice is also hereby given that official objection will be taken under rule 21 (3) to all applications in which the specification claims all the goods included in any class unless the Registrar is satisfied that the claim is justified by the use of the mark which the applicant has made, or intends to make if and when it is registered. Where an applicant considers that a claim in respect of all the goods included in a class can be justified it will save unnecessary delay in examining applications if a claim is filed simultaneously with the application, accompanied in appropriate cases by supporting documents.

The period for lodging notice of opposition may be extended by the Registrar as he thinks fit and upon such terms as he may direct. Any request for such extension should be made to the Registrar so as to reach him before the expiry of the period allowed.

Formal opposition should not be lodged until after reasonable notice has been given by letter to the applicant for registration so as to afford him any opportunity of withdrawing his application before the expense of preparing the notice of opposition is incurred. Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an opponent for an order for costs if the opposition is uncontested by the applicant.

Where it is stated in the advertisement of the applicant that the mark, upon its registration, is to be limited to certain colours, the colours are, as far as possible, indicated in the accompanying representations of the mark in the usual heraldic manner.

- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

Kenya Gazette

D.41. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready.
