Category and level.—Professional category (P-5).

Duty station.—Kinshasa, Zaire.

Duties and responsibilities.—The functions of the Unesco Representative are essentially of an advisory and organizational but also for a representative nature. In accordance with the policy of decentralization, those functions which could be carried out in the field and not falling under the competence of Chief Technical Advisers (CTAs) or other field units are performed by the Unesco Representative. They are determined in each case according to the conditions prevailing in the countries of assignment and in agreement with their governments.

Under the authority of the Assistant Director-General for Co-operation for Development and External Relations, the incumbent will, subject to the agreement of the government concerned, assume the functions and responsibilities of Unesco Representative to the following countries: Burundi, Rwanda and Zaire. He will—

- (1) assist and advise and provide information to the appropriate government concerning the whole range of Unesco's programme capabilities (financed from regular budget as well as from extra-budgetary resources) and keep Headquarters informed of the needs of the countries he covers;
- (2) participate in the Organization's responsibility for the conceptualization, formulation and implementation of programmes and projects, irrespective of their funding sources;
- (3) assist the Resident Representatives of the United Nations Development Programme in performing their overall functions concerning programme-planning negotiations and advise them on all questions related to Unesco activities in their countries of assignment, in particular on Unesco's contribution to the country programming process, and participate in tripartite reviews of UNDP projects;
- (4) co-operate with representatives of United Nations programmes, organizations and Specialized Agencies and, if requested by the Government, maintain contacts with agents of bilateral and regional forms of assistance, in order to help the governments and the Resident Representatives to ensure co-ordination with Unesco activities.
- (5) maintain liaison, on behalf of the Organization, with the technical ministries, the central co-ordinating authority for international assistance and Unesco National Commissions, as well as with representatives of other international governmental organizations associated with Unesco's programmes;
- (6) arrange for such field activities as seminars, meetings, training courses, etc.;
- (7) undertake, upon request from Headquarters, programme support activities such as interviews, establishment of dossiers for personnel or fellows, follow-up on equipment matters or reports;
- (8) provide administrative oversight for all Unesco activities in the countries of assignment, using the administrative services of the offices of the Resident Representatives to the full;

- (9) report periodically to Headquarters on Unesco activities in the countries of assignment in accordance with Unesco Secretariat procedures;
- (10) undertake, in co-operation with the United Nations Information Centre, public information activities and assist in the Unesco Coupon Scheme;
- (11) act, as appropriate, on instructions from Unesco's Bureau of Personnel, keeping the governments informed of such activities;
- (12) deal with problems concerning regional institutions based in the countries in so far as they affect the relations between Unesco and the government concerned;
- (13) act as local public information officer and as such distribute press releases issued by Headquarters, forward to Headquarters press reviews and clippings of interest to Unesco, participate in radio and television programmes, show Unesco films to selected groups and organize visits by local media representatives to Unesco projects;
- (14) carry out such other assignments as may be directed by Headquarters in accordance with the general framework outlined above.

Qualifications and experience required:—

- (a) University degree or equivalent, and experience in the fields of education, science, culture or any other field of activity within Unesco's field of competence.
- (b) Wide knowledge of the culture, educational system and the administrative and political organizations of the countries of assignment.
- (c) Exercise of responsibilities in a national or international service specializing in one of the above-mentioned fields.
- (d) Excellent knowledge of French and ability to draft clearly in that language. Working knowledge of English desirable.

Duration of contract.—Initial period of two years starting as soon as possible after the closing date for the receipt of applications.

Salary and allowances.—Initial appointment will be at P-5 grade with a net annual salary equivalent to US\$26,299 per annum, 25 per cent payable in the currency of the duty station and the rest in a currency of the staff member's choice (\$24,298 if without dependants), plus the prescribed allowances, e.g. post adjustment, at present \$26,908 for staff members with dependants, \$24,945 for staff members without dependants, assignment allowance, at present the local equivalent of \$2,400 for staff members with dependants, \$1,900 for staff members without dependants, family allowances of \$450 for each dependent child (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable in respect of the first dependent child). 4. *Title.*—PROGRAMME SPECIALIST (Architect).

Post No.—ED-908.

Category and level.—Professional category (P-5).

Organizational location.—Educational Financing Division, Education Sector.

Duties and responsibilities.—The incumbent will work with the Co-operative Programme between Unesco and the World Bank. This programme was established in 1964 by formal agreement between the two institutions. Its main purpose is to promote the financing of education projects in developing countries that are members of both institutions. Specifically, Unesco and the Bank co-operate in the following fields—

- (a) assisting countries of common membership in the process of sector studies, identification and preparation of education projects;
- (b) appraisal of such projects;
- (c) supervision of implementation of projects;
- (d) final evaluation (project audit).

In the execution of this programme, the incumbent will participate primarily in the various missions required for the work indicated in (a) and occasionally in (b), (c) and (d).

The work to be done varies with the type of mission. The most frequent and important tasks are sector studies, identification and preparation. Sector studies and project identification

missions serve the same basic purpose of identifying priority areas and project items for external financing but with different degrees of detail and depth of study.

A sector study is the fullest of studies and should pay particular attention to long-term perspectives for educational development and pre-investment studies of particular aspects of types and/or levels of education to pave the way for further external financing. A project identification mission concentrates more on an analysis of the government's proposals for educational development, with a view to making recommendations for alternative approaches if necessary, and identifying project items suitable for external financing. Both sector studies and project identification required a period of inquiry in the country and analysis at Headquarters to prepare a report.

Mission members study a government's development plan, its educational policies and long-term objectives, analyse trends in enrolments, unit costs, graduation, possibilities of employment or further education. Based on these studies they make recommendations on alternative policies or immediate measures for improvement of the education and training system and propose projects suitable for educational reform and development.

Project preparation as the next stage involves detailed study and description of each project item in terms of location and size, curriculum, teacher supply, schedule of accommodation and as reliable a cost estimate as possible of both capital and recurrent costs of the project. The document is written in the country and will constitute its formal request for a loan or credit.

Members of the Division are expected to travel at least four months a year and work as a team consisting usually of four to five specialists. They may also be required to participate in Bank appraisal or economic survey missions involving studies similar to the above though with greater emphasis on economic and financial aspects. They may also be required to participate in supervision missions or in a final project audit.

While under the administrative supervision of the Director of the Division, the incumbent is responsible for the professional content of his work. Questions arising during project preparation are settled in collaboration with team members, on the spot. They decide as a team on projects identified, subject to revision after a discussion with their colleagues in the Division and other interested sectors in the Secretariat. He may with sufficient experience, be called upon to act as mission leader.

The incumbent will occasionally be involved in sector surveys but his main work is project preparation. This requires an overall investigation concerning educational building, furniture and equipment in the country, including existing organizational and administrative aspects, building characteristics, situation of building industry, school mapping and inventory, cost study, etc. It also implies specifically for project preparation work; visits to existing school and other facilities to be expanded by the project, visits to sites for construction or preparation of criteria for choice of sites, drawing up schedule of accommodation on the basis of the requirements set by the education specialists, presentation of reliable cost estimates for the project items and of the implementation schedule.

The incumbent may be called upon to assist the local authorities in the preparation stage, following new procedures for preparatory work for projects to be financed by the Bank which involve development of plans, programmes and design prior to the effectiveness of the loan. He may also be called upon to assist the local authorities during the implementation stage, mainly on organization and management.

Sector survey work generally requires two to three weeks' mission in the country, while project preparation work may be completed during a single mission of four to five weeks, but may also be spread out over a longer period of time with more frequent but shorter missions.

Qualifications and experience required:—

- (a) Maturity, breadth and variety of experience in school construction over a period of more than five years, having passed through successively more difficult and responsible assignments.
- (b) University degree (or equivalent) in architecture. Familiar with theoretical concepts of educational finance and administration.
- (c) Ability to work co-operatively with different cultural and ethnic groups. Experience in an international organization will be regarded as an asset.
- (d) Fluent in English, French or Spanish with a good working knowledge, including ability to draft in, of at least one of the other two languages.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the authority of the Chief of the Expenditure Control Division, the incumbent will be in charge of the Contracts and Claims Section, as well as supervising the Travel Section.

These duties will require him to ensure the satisfactory operation of these two Sections and to exercise strict control over the obligation, liquidation and payment of all expenditures by the Organization, with the exception of the salaries and allowances of staff members.

To this end, he will be required more specifically—

- (1) to supervise the obligation of funds and the terms of agreements and contracts relating thereto, in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Organization and the regulations applying to each of the related Programmes and Funds;
- (2) in instances where funds are obligated under the responsibility of the Programme Sectors, Services and Bureaux, to check these or have them checked *a posteriori* by staff of the two Sections;
- (3) to study and submit with relevant comments to the Chief of the Division proposed obligations which raise problems of principle beyond his competence;
- (4) to examine the validity of requests for payment, to issue orders to pay in the light of the requirements of the cash availability of the Organization;
- (5) to audit financial statements provided by the Computer Service so as to make any necessary corrections;
- (6) at the request of the Chief of the Division, to study the financial and administrative provisions and procedures relating to the Section's activities and to submit concrete proposals with a view to achieving improved control of obligations simplifying working methods and adapting them to the general evolution of the administration of UNESCO, with special reference to improved accounting methods with the introduction of computerization;

IT IS notified for general information that this year's Proficiency Examination for Clerical Officers will be held on 13th and 14th December, 1979 in accordance with the Personnel Circular No. 10 of 5th December, 1973.

2. SCHEME OF THE EXAMINATION

The examination will consist of the following eleven (11) subjects seven (7) of which will be taken by all candidates and the remaining four (4) will be optional subjects from which each candidate will be required to choose only one of them related to his/her normal official duties, making a total of eight (8) subjects to be taken by each candidate:—

Paper I.—General Paper (3 hours).

(This Paper will consist of four separate papers.)

- (a) English Language (1 hour).
- (b) Organization and Functions of Government.
- (c) Current Affairs (40 minutes).
- (d) Elementary Economics (40 minutes).

Paper II.—Civil Service Regulations (2 hours).

Paper III.—Clerical Procedures (2½ hours).

Part I.—(Compulsory for all candidates).

- (a) Office Practice (½ hour).
- (b) Business Calculations (½ hour).

**Part II.—(Any one subject only related to officer's duties).
(Optional)**

- (a) Accounts (1½ hours) or
- (b) Stores (1½ hours) or
- (c) Personnel (1½ hours) or
- (d) General Office Services (1½ hours).

3. ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER

The requirements for Clerical Officer (Civil Servants only) to qualify for sitting for the Proficiency examination are as follows:—

- (a) That those in Job Group D are required to complete at least four (4) years in the grade before entering for the examination.
- (b) Those Clerical Officers who were appointed at a starting salary of £471 per annum and above by virtue of their educational qualification or approved experience may enter the examination after completion of two (2) years' service.
- (c) Junior Clerical Officers who have been promoted to Job Group D are required to complete at least two years in this Grade before qualifying.
- (d) Storemen Grade III qualify for the examination in the same manner as Junior Clerical Officers.

4. CONDITIONS FOR OBTAINING A PASS

Every candidate will be required to enter and pass in all the three main papers at one and the same sitting. No partial passes will be allowed.

5. EXAMINATION REGISTRATION FEES

Every candidate entering this examination will be required to pay a Registration Fee of K.Sh. 10 only for the whole examination. The Registration fee, which will be non-refundable, will be payable to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, Nairobi, in either Crossed Inland Money Order, Postal Order or cash. Personal cheques will not be accepted.

6. ENTRY FORMS

The candidates must complete and submit the examination entry forms in triplicate as set out at "Appendix" to this Circular Letter, copies of which can be reproduced and cyclostyled by each Ministry/Department, as required, and the completed entry forms, duly certified correct by the candidates' Chief Personnel Officer/P.F. and E.O. and accompanied by the Registration fee of K.Sh. 10 per candidate, should be submitted to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, National Housing Corporation House, Aga Khan Walk, off Harambee Avenue, P.O. Box 30095, Nairobi, so as to reach him on or before Wednesday, 31st October, 1979. Late entries and/or incomplete, uncertified or wrongly completed entry forms and entries not accompanied by the correct Registration fee, will automatically be rejected. It is the responsibility of the certifying officer to check and satisfy himself that the information given is correct and that the officer is what he claims to be. Officers who sit and pass the examination while they are not eligible will automatically be disqualified. Provincial Personnel Officers are required to forward all entry forms to the officers' parent ministries to be certified by their Chief Personnel Officers or the P.F. and E.O. Forms sent direct to this Commission from the Provinces will not be accepted.

7. EXAMINATION CENTRES

The examination will be held in all Provinces at Mombasa, Nyeri, Embu, Nairobi, Nakuru, Kakamega, Kisumu and Garissa centres. The actual examination venue at each Provincial Centre will be notified to the candidates in due course.

8. GENERAL CONDUCT OF THE EXAMINATION

Candidates will not be allowed to consult any books, files, notes, magazines, etc., during the examination. Any infringement of this rule will result in immediate disqualification from the whole examination, and may also lead to disciplinary action being taken against the offenders. Examination papers and stationery will be supplied by this office to the Provincial Education Officers who will be in-charge of the Examination Centres, and who will be responsible for the distribution of the papers and stationery to the candidates at their centres. Appointment of invigilators, arrangement of the examination venues, and return to this office of the candidates' answer scripts when the examination is concluded, as directed by the Public Service Commission of Kenya, will be the responsibility of the Provincial Education Officers.

9. FINAL DECISION

The decision of the Public Service Commission of Kenya will be final in all matters related to this examination.

- (e) Individual applicants must quote their identity card numbers and their nationality.
- (f) In case of companies, names of directors must be included and a photostat copy of the company's registration certificate.

The successful allottee of a plot to pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 30 days of notification that his/her/their application has/have been successful, the stand premium, initial annual rent with conveyancing, stamp duty, survey and registration fees, provisional service charges if any. 2. In addition to No. 1 above the 14 employees shall be paid by the Respondents their terminal benefits which shall include their Provident Fund benefits and cash in lieu of any earned leave not taken by them.

Wrongful dismissal of Joseph Ngugi and Francis Muchiri.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Factory Guards Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. In the first instant the hearing was fixed for 12th June, 1979, but the Claimants failed to submit their memorandum in time and the hearing had to be postponed.

The parties were then heard in Nairobi on 26th July and 31st August, 1979, and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:—

Claimants:

Francis Muchiri.
Joseph Ngugi.

Respondents:

Roy Robertson.
Joseph R. Wambua.
Richard Mwaniki.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 23rd November, 1978, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 9th April, 1979, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The aforesaid two employees served the Respondents for the following periods:—

J. Ngugi: Employed on 14th August, 1974—services terminated on 29th May, 1978.

F. Muchiri: Started working for the Respondents on 18th July, 1975—services terminated on 29th May, 1978.

Both of them were given one month's pay in lieu of notice in addition to their other dues including leave pay.

They suffered a termination because on the night of 26th May, 1978, they are alleged to have committed a gross misconduct when they were on duty along with another employee R. Mwaniki. On that night Mr. Muchiri was the driver and was responsible for driving the vehicle KRQ 276. Assistant controller Ngugi was in charge of the patrol that night. Inspector Richard Mwaniki who usually conducted his rounds on a motor-cycle was in KRQ 276 that night as his motor-cycle was in for repairs.

It is not disputed or denied that at about 1.30 a.m. in the morning of that night vehicle KRQ 276 was involved in an accident with the result that it cost the Respondents over Sh. 5,000 to repair it. This amount was not recoverable from the insurance company due to the excess clause.

The Respondents' general manager, Roy Robertson, carried out an investigation and as a result came to the conclusion that all three of them had committed a gross misconduct in that the vehicle was driven by Richard Mwaniki although Muchiri was the driver who should not have let anyone else drive the vehicle. Assistant controller Ngugi being in charge of the patrol should have taken appropriate steps to stop Mwaniki from driving the vehicle and was therefore equally responsible for the misconduct.

The Claimants took up the matter on behalf of Messrs. Ngugi and Muchiri and the dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour. The Investigator came to the conclusion that both of them should not have been punished for an offence which they had not committed as the vehicle at the time was being driven by Mwaniki. The Ministry recommended that both of them should be reinstated to their jobs without loss of any benefits and they should be paid their salaries for the time they had been out of employment.

The Claimants have during the hearing relied more or less on the same reasoning as the Investigator and further pleaded that Mwaniki had started driving the vehicle without the permission of Muchiri who had stopped the vehicle for a moment to fix a carton in the front window on the passenger side. They stated that while Muchiri was out Mwaniki had jumped in the driver's seat and had started driving and Muchiri had to scramble on it. After a few hundred yards the accident had occurred when Mwaniki was not able to control the vehicle. They added that neither Muchiri nor Ngugi were in a position to stop the action of Mwaniki.

Mr. Mwaniki gave evidence on behalf of the Respondents and stated that at about 1.30 a.m. on the night in question Mr. Muchiri asked him to assist him by driving as he was feeling sleepy. During this time Mr. Ngugi was sleeping at the back in the car. This is quite contrary to what Mr. Muchiri stated on oath which has been mentioned earlier on.

The Court has now to decide which of the two versions is true. The Court notes that the accident had taken place near Kileleshwa Police Station and that there was also a public telephone call box near about. Further the VHF in the vehicle was found to be in working order in the morning as Mr. Wambua, the Respondents' controller, was able to communicate with the head office in the morning when he visited the site of the accident through the radio in car KRQ 276. Mr. Muchiri has stated that they could not ring the head office about the accident because the VHF was damaged. He is clearly not telling the truth on this score.

Mr. Mwaniki stated that all three of them after the accident had decided not to go to the police and to sleep in the car and that Muchiri had told him that he, Muchiri, would be responsible for the damages since he was in-charge of the vehicle. The Court has carefully noted that Mr. Mwaniki came to give evidence on behalf of the Respondents and the Court has therefore treated his evidence with great caution. The Court, however, finds that Mwaniki's evidence is more consistent with the true state of affairs than that of Muchiri and Ngugi. One reason which has led the Court to this conclusion is that both Ngugi and Mwaniki had made a false report in the OB at the head office at 6.20 a.m. on 26th May. They made the following entry:—

"Breakdown: Ngugi and Insp. Mwaniki return back to the office from check up area three and report the following breakdown at about 2 p.m. along Ring Road Kileleshwa Road; the motor vehicle KRQ 276 got puncture both the rear left and front tyre and the vehicle swerved on left side hit the edge of the road and damaged left side mudguard only. We could not inform the office because communication was difficult."

The Court can see no valid reason why a false report should have been made by Ngugi if what Muchiri alleged was true. The Court is also not inclined to believe that Muchiri went to the police station soon after the accident during the night. The Claimants did not produce any evidence to support this.

The Court finds that the Ministry of Labour Investigator had overlooked the important factor of accountability of both Muchiri who was the driver in-charge of the vehicle and Ngugi, the assistant controller, who was in-charge of the patrol that night in this accident which caused the Respondents a loss of over Sh. 5,000.

After careful consideration of all the submissions and the evidence given by the parties' witnesses the Court is satisfied that both Ngugi and Muchiri had committed a serious misconduct and therefore deserved termination. The Court notes with appreciation that the Respondents gave them a normal termination instead of summary dismissal. The Claimants' demand is rejected.

Issue in dispute:—

Refusal by the management to pay the salary difference between his grade and the lower grade I.E.A. and B to S.K. Munyaka.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Wellcome Kenya Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The hearing was first fixed for 17th July but at the Claimants' request it was adjourned to 14th August, 1979.

The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 14th day of August, 1979 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Claimants also called Mr. Munyaka to give evidence on oath during the hearing.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 5th March, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 5th June together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

S. K. Munyaka started working for the Respondents in 1971 as a statistics clerk at a consolidated salary of K.Sh. 12,000 per annum. His salary progressed as follows:

During the hearing Mr. Munyaka denied that he received the increase of K£72 p.a. in 1972. The Respondents on checking records have confirmed that what Mr. Munyaka stated is true.

The Respondents stated that Mr. Munyaka used to get salary increases fairly regularly and when he became a union member he received salary increases thereafter in accordance with the collective agreement signed from time to time between them and the Claimants.

It is not disputed that Mr. Munyaka from the date he joined the Respondents up to 31st December, 1976 was in grade "B" and with effect from 1st January, 1977 he was promoted to grade "A" on the basis of length of service.

The Claimants' demand is that Mr. Munyaka should be paid difference in the rates between grades "B" and "A" from the date he was promoted to grade "A" i.e. with effect from 1st January, 1977 up to April, 1979 when his services were terminated. They maintained that if he was not given this salary difference then his promotion would be meaningless.

The Respondents on the other hand maintained that Mr. Munyaka had always received salary far in excess of his grade and that although he was promoted to grade "A" there had been no increase in the responsibilities of the job and no change in the grading of job in the collective agreement.

The Respondents gave the following comparison between Mr. Munyaka's monthly salaries compared with the collective agreement rates for grades C, B and A during the years 1977 and 1978:

The Court notes that the collective agreement relevant to this dispute had a provision in the clause covering consolidated wages and salaries stating that employees earning above the minimum rates set out for the various grades as at 31st December, 1976 shall be entitled to 10 per cent increase with effect from 1st January, 1977 and another 10 per cent on the resultant amount with effect from 1st January, 1978. From the above comparative table there is no doubt that Mr. Munyaka was earning more than the rate for his grades and he was therefore entitled to 10 per cent increase for the years 1977 and 1978. This apparently he has been granted. The Court has carefully considered the points made by the Claimants that at one time Mr. Munyaka acted as the manager of statistics department and that the K.Sh. 500 salary increase which was given to him in January 1973 was to compensate him for the cost of transport to Kabete, lunch at Kabete and other inconveniences. These points, however, are really not relevant to this dispute. They were intended to elicit the Court's sympathy, if anything, to Mr. Munyaka's claim.

The Court having found that Mr. Munyaka received the salary increases in accordance with the collective agreement in force at the material time must reject the Claimants' demand on his behalf. The Court must, however, state that Mr. Munyaka is entitled to K£72 which the Respondents concede are due to him for the salary increase that was granted to him for the year 1972 but which was not paid. The Court rules that the Respondents must pay him that amount forthwith.

Pre-Cast Concrete Manufacturers' Group of F.K.E.

Issue in dispute:—

Refusal by the group to negotiate or insert transportation clause in the collective agreement signed between the union and the group.

1. The Kenya Building, Construction, Civil Engineering & Allied Trades Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Pre-Cast Concrete Manufacturers' Group of the Federation of Kenya Employers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 23rd day of August, 1979 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 2nd April, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 19th June together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties have in force a collective agreement signed in January, 1978 for a period of two years. They are both agreed that the issue in dispute was left outstanding by them when they concluded the collective agreement.

The Claimants' demand is that those of the Respondents' employees who are not housed in the factory premises should be provided with transport from their homes to their places of work. They submitted that the Respondents' factories were situated in remote areas and it was expensive for the workers to report to work and return home. Since the workers' wages averaged about K.Sh. 500 p.m. they could not afford the cost of transport.

The Claimants also stressed that the Respondents had over the years since 1968 always adopted the terms and conditions of employment as negotiated between the Claimants and the building industry as they were sister industries. They referred to clause 26 of their collective agreement with the Kenya Association of Building & Civil Engineering Contractors currently in force which provided on the subject of transportation as follow:

"Employees shall be provided by the employer with reasonable and adequate healthful means of transport from an agreed point to their working place and from their working place to an agreed point."

The Claimants also pointed out that in the new building industry agreement there were eight new clauses all of which the Respondents adopted but for some reason decided not to adopt the transportation clause.

The Respondents have very strongly resisted this demand and pointed out that in the collective agreement which expired at the end of February 1978 the clause on effective date and duration read as follows:

"The effective date shall be the date of implementation of the agreement between K.A.B.C.E.C. and E.A.F.B. and C.W. Union namely 1st March, 1976 and shall remain in force for a period of 24 months.

Should the current agreement between the said Association and the union be amended, altered or revised then a new agreement shall be renegotiated between the parties to this agreement and the effective date of the agreement to concluded between the parties to this agreement shall be that of the agreement between Kenya Association of Building & Civil Engineering Contractors and E.A. Federation of Building & Construction Workers' Union."

The Respondents emphasized that from the above it was clear that the change was to be negotiated between the parties and that the change so negotiated and agreed upon was to be effected as from the date of the agreement between the Association and the Claimants.

The Respondents pointed out that they were a service industry to the building industry and their economics and methods of operation were different. They could see no justification for providing transport to their employees to come to work which they maintained was the workers' own responsibility.

The Respondents added that this would be a very expensive exercise and would require each of their members to raise at least K.Sh. 300,000 for the purchase of a vehicle in addition to employing an extra driver and provision for running expenses of not less than K.Sh. 40,000 per annum. The Respondents stated that majority of their employees who were not housed within the factory premises stayed in areas such as Kariobangi, Baba Dogo properties in Ruaraka and Dandora which are very close to their places of work.

The Court has very carefully considered the Claimants' demand and is satisfied that there is no question of an automatic adoption by the Respondents of the Claimants' collective agreement with the building industry. The Claimants and the Respondents are required to, and have indeed in the past, negotiated their own collective agreements although most of the terms and conditions of employment are the same as the building industry. In view of this the Respondents are well within their rights to refuse to adopt the transportation clause in the building industry collective agreement.

The Court has also considered the Claimants' plea that the workers should be provided with transport to and from their places of work but the Court finds no merit in this demand. There is hardly any work beyond the normal working day and the Court accepts the Respondents' submission that when on

rare occasions they require their employees to work up to 8 or 8.30 p.m. then they do transport the workers back to their homes.

The Court notes that 50 per cent of the Respondents' workforce is housed in the factory areas.

In view of the aforesaid points the Court rejects the Claimants' demand as what the Claimants really are asking for is bus fare which in any case is part of the wages.

CAUSE No. 38 OF 1979

Parties:—

Kenya Engineering Workers' Union
and
Stainless Steel Products Ltd.

Issue in dispute:—

Redundancy clause (f) paragraph (e).

1. The Kenya Engineering Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Stainless Steel Products shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 7th day of September, 1979 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 9th May, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 21st July, 1979 together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

In all the parties' collective agreements since 1968 they had incorporated a redundancy clause 12 with sub-clause (f) reading as follows:

"(f) paragraph (e) above will also apply to any employee who resigns from service after serving for a continuous period of five years."

All the other sub-clauses deal strictly with the said matter of redundancy, principles to be applied and the amount of severance pay along with the notice period.

The Respondents while initially accepting the retention of sub-clause (f) in clause 12 of redundancy want it to be deleted as they feel that resignation cannot under any circumstances be called redundancy. They took up this point when they were revising the collective agreement between them which expired on 30th April, 1978.

The Claimants have very strongly resisted the deletion of this sub-clause because they maintain that this is a very important benefit which they had won for their members over the years and would not be prepared under any circumstances to see it deleted. They asked the Court to rule that this sub-clause be retained in the new collective agreement or the Respondents should buy out this benefit. In other words they submit that since technically all the workers are entitled to this benefit if they all resigned, it should be paid out to them so that this clause would then disappear.

During conciliation of this dispute the Conciliator recorded that the Respondents accepted the request of buying out this clause but suggested that accrued benefits should be incorporated into retirement benefits when employees attained retirement age and that the employees would automatically forfeit the benefit if they got dismissed on gross misconduct. These conditions were not acceptable to the Claimants.

The Respondents produced evidence to justify their fears that the employees would start resigning in order to collect their benefits under this clause by stating that 15 employees after they had qualified for this benefit had resigned between 31st January, 1975 and 2nd January, 1979. The Respondents stated that this was not desirable as it encouraged trained workers to leave their employment with the result that it was disadvantageous to the Respondents. They added that it was not a fair labour practice that the workers should resign in order to collect this benefit and then come back for re-employment.

The Court has carefully considered the pros and cons of this dispute and whereas it appreciates that it would be extremely unfair to deprive the workers of a benefit that their trade union has won for them over the years it is also very unfair that the Respondents should be deprived of the services of their qualified people just because they want to take advantage of this benefit by resigning. The Court must protest the Respondents against a wholesale abrupt departure of their workers.

The Court finds that the parties were thinking along the right lines no doubt at the instigation of the Conciliator appointed by the Ministry of Labour in that the Respondents should buy out this benefit once and for all.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that the workers' benefit under clause (f) and (e) of the collective agreement should be worked out and frozen as at 30th April, 1978 in respect of those who have completed five years of service as at that date. It should be clearly understood that it will be paid to these employees when their services are terminated either through resignation, normal termination or for gross misconduct or for any other reason. The Court further directs that in the event of any of these employees wishing to leave the employment by resigning then such an employee wishing to leave the employment by resigning then such an employee must give three months' written notice to the Respondents in order to entitle him to this benefit.

The Respondents submitted a list of 17 employees who qualified for this benefit as at 30th April, 1978 and the Court directs that both the Claimants and the Respondents should check this list and finalize it.

The Court having made the above award rules that the workers' earned benefit having been secured, clausd 12 (f) should now be deleted from the collective agreement.

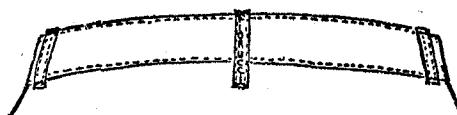
