- (b) To assist in the preparation of documents required for meetings dealing with cultural activities in the region.
- (c) To contribute to the preparation of reports and publications on these activities.

Qualifications and experience required

- (a) University degree in a subject related to culture; some knowledge of the cultures of Latin America and the Caribbean.
- (b) Experience of methods of work at the international level an asset.

(c) Very good knowledge of Spanish; good knowledge of one of the working language of the Secretariat (English, French) and adequate knowledge of the other.

Duties and responsibilities

- (a) Plan and supervise the execution of the programme of the Division of Earth Sciences in accordance with the appropriate resolutions of the General Conference of Unesco.
- (b) Undertake consultations with competent national authorities, as approriate, in connexion with the objectives, structure and execution of the Division's programme.
- (c) Establish and maintain contacts with the United Nations and other international agencies, in matters concerning the earth sciences, in order to ensure the necessary coordination and co-operation with them.

- (e) Represent, if requested, the Director-General of Unesco on the Board of the International Geological Correlation Programme.
- (f) Ensure the necessary co-ordination of the Division's activities with those of other Divisions and Sectors of the Unesco Secretariat, particularly with respect to activities related to geological hazards.
- (g) Be responsible in general for the smooth organization of the work of the Divison and the effective execution of the work assigned to it; this may include taking direct responsibility for the execution of certain activities on sections of the programme, as required.

Qualifications and experience required

- (a) University doctorate or its equivalent in geology, geophysics or geochemistry.
- (b) Wide experience of field and/or laboratory research preferably related to geological hazards (earthquakes, volcanic eruptions).
- (c) Proven administrative ability, preferably in a university, governmental or international organization.
- (d) Experience of international scientific relations at governmental and/or non-governmental level.
- (e) Fluency in written and spoken English or French, with a good working knowledge of the other language; knowledge of Arabic, Russian or Spanish would be an advantage.

- (d) Evaluating and editing manuscripts of the above-mentioned translations.

- (e) Establishing and maintaining relations with publishers in the English-speaking world and contracting with such publishers for the publication of translated works, in collaboration with PUB as required.
- (f) Reading samples of proofs of the resultant publications, making recommendations as to layout, jacket design, Unesco notice, binding, etc., and writing descriptive materials for premotional purposes.
- (g) Collaborating with other units of the Secretariat in the use of communication media, and generally contributing to activities lending to the wider circulation of representative works of world literature.
- (h) Such other related duties as may be assigned.

Qualifications and experience required

- (a) Post-graduate qualification, or equivalent experience, in literary/linguistic studies.
- (b) Wide-ranging interest in the field of literature, several years' experience in work connected with publishing and a good knowledge of publishing practices in the Englishspeaking world.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the Kenya Gazette, Supplements, etc.:—

- (1) Kenya Gazette contains notices of a general nature and which do not affect legislation, and may be submitted direct to the Government Printer.
- (2) Legislative Supplement contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government, and must be submitted through the Office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) Bill Supplement contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Ascembly only.
- (4) Act Supplement contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D-

Kenya Gazette

- D.41. (1) Communications for the Kenya Gazette should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.
- (2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
