- 1. The Kenya Engineering Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and City Engineering Works (K) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The case was originally fixed for hearing on 4th October, 1979, but as the Claimants failed to submit their memorandum in time the hearing had to be rescheduled with the result that the dispute was heard on 15th November, 1979, during which the parties relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Minister for Labour forwarded this dispute to the Court on 17th July, 1979, in accordance with section 7A of the Trade Dispute Act. The Court, however, received this notification from the Minister with the statutory certificate from the Labour Commissioner on 31st July.

The parties had entered into a collective agreement on 27th January, 1976, effective from 1st January, 1976, and ending on 31st December, 1977.

The Claimants forwarded their demands for revising this rather simple and straightforward agreement on 6th September, 1977, and the parties met on 9th March, 1978, to negotiate on and consider the proposals which the Claimants had made for revising it. On wages and job classification the parties' position was as follows:—

"Wages:

The company proposed Sh. 75 for first year and Sh. 75 for the second year. The union proposed Sh. 81 for the first year and Sh. 81 for the second year.

The company proposed a minimum wage of Sh. 430. The union proposed Sh. 520 minimum. This item was left in abeyance for further discussion.

Job classification:

It was agreed that the company and union should embark on job classification after the signing of this agreement. This will be effected after the expiry of this agreement."

Thereafter the matter dragged on and the Claimants reported a dispute to the Minister for Labour on 15th May, 1978, on 33 items. A Conciliator was appointed and the parties eventually were deadlocked on the issues which are set out hereinabove.

It is most unfortunate that the Respondents did not sign the Notification of Dispute Form "A" for referring this dispute to the Court with the result that its settlement has been delayed considerably. After the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act of 1979 was passed the Minister had to use his powers to refer this dispute to the Court.

The main features of this dispute are the inordinate delay which was caused by the Respondents for finalizing it, the plea of the Respondents on their financial difficulties and the Respondents' written intimation to the Ministry on 30th May, 1979, that they would close their factory on 31st August. All these do not augur well as far as industrial relations between the parties are concerned.

The Employment Promotion Division carried out an exhaustive and comprehensive investigation in this dispute at the request of the Court and the report was before the Court and the parties during the hearing.

The Court notes that cost of living changes between January 1976 to December 1977 would give the workers a wage increase of 20 per cent under the 1978 Guidelines giving an acceptable annual wage increase of 10 per cent.

The Employment Promotion Division also report as follows:-

"The Respondents have strongly objected to any wage increase or improvement in other terms and conditions of service citing heavy financial losses in 1978 as reflected in declining profit margins (see table 3). The Respondents attribute these financial losses to installation of the Dandora complex which needs modernizing fixed capital; inaccessibility to both Tanzanian and Ugandan markets where the former (i.e. Tanzania part of the E.A. Posts & Telecommunication) fetched Sh. 270,000 and Sh. 569,109 for 1976 and 1977 respectively; and above all, the increasing prices for their raw materials indicated in Table 4. In view of the above observation the Respondents have strongly argued that they are financially unable to accede to the Claimants' demand for a wage increase of 30 per cent, monthly housing allowance increase of Sh. 100 and leave travelling allowance increase of Sh. 40 all put together adding up to Sh. 48,891 or 55.2 per cent in terms of the total monthly labour costs. From the foregoing observations, any improvements in fringe benefits like overalls and laundering, training and welfare arrangements would most likely aggravate the Respondents' financial position to the extent and scope which was not possible for us to estimate."

The Respondents, however, during the hearing submitted that they could not afford any expensive fringe benefits but would consider paying a reasonable wage increase and maintained that the Claimants were pushing them too hard and they could not afford the Claimants' demands and they might close.

The Court notes that the Respondents admitted that they made profits in 1976/77 to the tune of Sh. 800,000 and Sh. 900,000 but from the middle of 1978 the situation had changed dramatically and they now claim that they are losing Sh. 100,000 per month.

The Respondents' total labour force is as follows:-

Light industry in Busia road industrial area .. 80 workers

Heavy industry in Dandora 165 workers.

The Claimants have demanded a wage increase of 30 per cent and another 30 per cent for the second year.

After careful consideration of all the submissions made by the parties and the report of the E.P.D. and the Guidelines, the Court makes the following awards:—

1. General wage increases

The Court awards that the Respondents give the following wage increases to their unionisable employees:

- (i) Sh. 75 with effect from 1st January, 1978 on the employees wages as at 31st December, 1977.
- (ii) Sh. 75 wage increase with effect from 1st January, 1979, on the employees wages at at 31st December, 1978.
- (iii) Sh. 50 wage increase with effect from 1st January, 1980, on the employees wages as at 31st December, 1979.

2. Job classification

8. Promotion

9. Acting appointment

All these issues are interlinked and go together with the issue of job classification. The parties have made no attempt whatsoever to carry out a job classification and the Court has decided to direct the parties to embark on this exercise, if need be with the assistance of an outside expert, as it is very much in the interest of the Respondents themselves that they should try to establish their industry on more scientific basis. The Court would not like to give the parties the time limit but hopes that they will be able to complete it before the next revision of the collective agreement.

3. Hours of work

The Court can see no reason to change the existing provision on this item.

4. Safari allowance

There is no evidence before the Court to show that any workers employed by the Respondents go on safari. The Court can see no justification for making an award on this item just now. This demand is rejected.

5. Shift differential.

The parties themselves had left this item in abeyance and the Court would like them first of all to apply their minds to this matter before the next revision of the collective agreement. The Court has also taken into account the financial difficulties through which the Respondents are going. So the Court has decided to make no award on this item.

6. Overalls and laundering of uniforms

The Court makes the following award:-

- (a) All employees excluding office staff will be provided with two pairs of overalls per annum,
- (b) Overalls shall remain the property of the company and the employees will be required to hand to the company such clothing (and shoes in case of mill employees) when new ones are issued.
- (c) Employees will pay for the cost of clothing or shoes damaged or lost due to their negligence or carelessness.
- (d) Every employee provided with overalls shall be provided with one bar of soap every month for the purposes of keeping his overalls clean as is expected by the company.

7. Redundancy

The Court makes the following award:

- (a) In the event of redundancy the company shall inform the union of the reasons and the extent of the intended redundancy.
- (b) The principle of "last in, first out" shall be followed in the particular category of employees affected subject to all other factors such as skill, ability, relative merit and reliability being equal.
- (c) The redundant employees shall be entitled to one month's notice or one month's wages in lieu of notice.
- (d) Any leave due to any employee deckared redundant shall be paid for in cash.
- (e) Any employee declared redundant shall be entitled to severance pay at the rate of 14 days' pay for each completed year of service.

10. Housing allowance

The Court has carefully considered this item but in view of the Respondents' financial difficulties the Court has decided that the consolidated wage will continue.

11. Leave travelling allowance

The Court awards that after each period of 12 months' continuous service with the company an employee shall be entitled when proceeding on annual leave to a leave travelling allowance of K.Sh. 90. This item is to be effective from 1st January, 1979.

12. Training

13. Welfare arrangements

The Court while rejecting these demands would strongly advise the Respondents to look into these matters seriously as in the long run any steps taken by them in these directions would benefit them and it would be in their own interest to start planning them now.

14. Effective date and duration

The Court notes that the Employment Promotion Division have reported that the Claiman'ts had indicated to them that they would not object to a duration period of three years due to the prolonged delay in reaching an agreement. The Court accordingly awards that the effective date of the agreement should be 1st January, 1978 and that it should remain in force for a period of three years from that date.

In conclusion the Court would like to strongly advise, particularly the Respondents, that they should establish as a matter of urgency effective communication with the Claimants as the industrial relations in their undertaking are generally poor. They must look urgently into this aspect. The Court would also like to add that it is very much in the interest of the employer as that of the workers that trade disputes relating to salary and wage increases and fringe benefits should be settled as early as possible. The Respondents in this case delayed the submission of the dispute for settlement by the Industrial Court for a long time and the Court hopes that in future they will not do so. It is only because of the new powers vested in the Minister for Labour under section 7a of the Trade Disputes Act that the dispute was referred to the Industrial Court.

The Court would like to emphasize that under the present

conditions prevalent in the country whereby the workers have been asked not to resort to strike action and their wage and other claims are subjected to Guidelines the Court would not like to deprive the workers of their wage increases for even a month after the expiry of the previous collective agreement.

- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Bankers (Employers) Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 12th, 13th and 14th November, 1979 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 31st July, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 13th September together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties' previous collective agreement was effective from 1st April, 1977 and was for a period of two years from that date. This dispute has resulted as the parties had not been able to agree on the items stated hereinabove either at their own level or with the assistance of the Ministry of Labour when revising the said collective agreement.

The parties are agreed that the duration period should be two years and they have also agreed to a wage reopener clause after one year. The Court was told that agreement had been reached on the wage and salary increases whereby section heads and clerical staff are to receive an increase of 15 per cent and the subordinate staff are to receive an increase of 16.5 per cent. This represents the bank employees' entitlement under the Guidelines.

1. Effective date

The Claimants demand that the effective date should be 1st March, 1979 with the Respondents being very firm on it to be 1st April, 1979.

There is no doubt that right from 1963 the parties have always had the effective date to be 1st March except in 1977 when because of the special circumstances due to the Presidential decree the parties agreed the effective date to be 1st April. So the 1975/1977 agreement remained in force for a period of 25 months and the Court is of the view that the workers are entitled to ask for rectifying the situation so that the past practice of so many years on the effective date can be restored.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court feels that the Claimants having agreed to the duration period of two years have placed the Court in considerable difficulty over this issue as granting effective date one month before the expiry date of the previous agreement would be most improper. The Court feels that the parties should consider if the duration period of the ext agreement should be 23 months.

To do anything otherwise would be tantamount to breaking the parties' own agreement which was effective from 1st April, 1977 for a period of two years from that date. In these circumstances the Court awards that this collective agreement should be effective from 1st April, 1979.

2. Probation period

On this issue the disagreement is only on the remuneration that an employee should get when he or she is promoted as the parties have reached agreement on the acting allowances etc. that are to be paid.

The Court finds that the Claimants have made a good case for getting an award on this issue as at present when an employee is promoted he often gets a negligible amount of monetary reward. After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that when an employee is promoted he or she should be placed on a notch which would give the employee an increase of not less than the difference in the scales of that particular category.

3. Termination of employment

On this issue the Claimants have failed to convince the Court that the current provisions on this item are working unfairly against the bank employees. The present clause is simple and straightforward and the Court is of the view that it should not be tampered with. The Court also does not consider that there should be any change in the warning system as at present and the Claimants' demand on this issue is accordingly rejected.

4. Granting and withholding of annual increment

There is no dispute as such on this item except that it is linked with issue No. 19 relating to length of scales and efficiency bars. So the Court will tackle this under issue No. 19.

5. Long service increment

The Claimants have pressed for substitution of sliding scales in place of long service increments for technical and subordinate staff. The Respondents have resisted this demand very strongly.

The Court rejects the Claimants' demand as the present system with the long service increment has been in force for many years and the Claimants failed to persuade the Court to discard it. Moreover there is a wage reopener clause after one year. This demand is accordingly rejected.

6. Local leave

On this issue the Claimants have succeeded in persuading the Court to vary the existing clause and the Court awards that the clerical staff up to 10 years' service or up to 30 years of age should get a local leave of 24 working days and that the technical and subordinate staff up to 10 years' service should also get 24 working days' local leave. All the other provisions on this item should remain as before.

7. Local leave allowance

The Respondents have offered to increase these allowances as follows: -

"Section heads by K.Sh. 75 to K.Sh. 1,050.

Clerical Staff by K.Sh. 50 to K.Sh. 725 and K.Sh. 925.

Technical and subordinate staff by K.Sh. 25 to K.Sh. 300 to K.Sh. 325."

The Claimants have demanded a uniform local leave allowance of one month's salary without categorization.

The Court awards that the local leave allowance should be increased as follows:—

- (a) Section heads: from K.Sh. 975 p.a. to K.Sh. 1,200 p.a.
- (b) Clerical staff: up to 10 years' service K.Sh. 675 to K.Sh. 900.

10 years' service and over-from K.Sh. 875 to K.Sh. 1,100.

(c) Technical and subordinate staff: up to five years' service—K.Sh. 275 to K.Sh. 350.

Five years' service and over: K.Sh. 300 to K.Sh. 375.

8. Hours of work

The Claimants have asked the Court to award that the banks in Kenya should start a five day working week of 35 hours. The Court finds that there is no merit in this demand as it up to the banks to decide on how many days they want to work in a week. The Court also rejects the Claimants' demand for reducing the number of working hours per week.

9. Overtime

The Court can see no reason to interfere with the present clause but the practice of giving time off during working hours in respect of overtime worked by the employees instead of paying them overtime should be discontinued forthwith. The employees who have worked overtime should be paid money in respect of that work and not given time off.

10. Allowance for mobile staff

The Claimants have demanded that this item should be replaced by a simple meal allowance and that when an employee is required to work during meal times he should be given a meal allowance. This should be irrespective of whether the employee is away from his normal place of work or not and would include employees on safari, mobile staff and those sent to agency of a bank and those working late on the two peak (closing) periods of the year.

The Respondents have asked the Court to let the present arrangement under which they pay a lunch allowance of K.Sh. 12/50 and no supper allowance, to continue.

The Court awards that the lunch allowance being paid at present should be increased to K.Sh. 25 and in addition to this the banks must pay a supper allowance of K.Sh. 30 to their employees only when they work late at night during half yearly and year end closing of the books. The Claimants' all other demands on this item are rejected.

11. Computer inconvenience allowance

Under this item the Respondents have offered to increase this allowance as follows:—

		K.Sh.
"Section heads		300 p.m.
Clerical Staff		250 p.m.
Technical and subordinate sta	ıff	150 p.m.".

The Claimants have accepted the increases but have refused to accept the change in title "shift/computer/airport agencies inconvenience allowance."

The Respondents have also offered an additional allowance for breakfast K.Sh. 10, lunch K.Sh. 12/50, supper K.Sh. 15 which is being paid at the moment.

The Court rejects the Respondents' attempt to merge the computer sections with airport agencies and directs that these two should be kept separate.

12. Compassionate leave

There is a very minor dispute on this issue on whether the employee should decide if the compassionate leave is deducted from his paid leave or is to be taken as unpaid leave. The Court awards that once the employer decides to grant the compassionate leave in accordance with the existing provisions then it should be up to the employee to decide if it is to be deducted from the paid leave or if it is to be unpaid.

Acting allowance

The dispute under this item relates to the copy typists when they act as secretaries and the head messengers when they act as caretakers.

The Court awards that a copy typist acting as a secretary should get an acting allowance of K.Sh. 300 and a head messenger acting as a caretaker should get an acting allowance of K.Sh. 500.

14. Transfers

The Claimants have demanded that the employer should give one extra month's salary to the employee for the first three months of transfer or the employer should foot the hotel bill (full board) for the employee and his family for the three months of transfer.

The Respondents have strongly resisted this demand.

The Court awards that the existing provision on permanent transfer should be amended so that an employee shall be paid a distrubance allowance amounting to two months' basic salary that he is earning at the time that the transfer takes place. All other provisions to remain as at present.

15. Transport

The Court rejects the Claimants' demand on this item and directs that the present arrangement should continue.

16. Uniforms

This is a comparatively new clause and the Court is not able to accept the Claimants' demand that the Respondents should not control their members on matters of design, material and cost. The Court can see no merit in this and the Claimants' demand is accordingly rejected.

17. Airport agencies

The Court rules that there should be no change and it should stay as at present.

18. Deconsolidation of wages

The Claimants withdrew this demand.

19. Length of scales and efficiency bars

The Court awards that the clerical scales should be lengthened from 15 to 18 years and those of section heads from 12 to 15 years.

The Court further awards that the efficiency bars should remain as they are at present,

The Respondents have asked for a new clause in respect of check clerks as follows:—

"In the event that a check clerk ceases to work as a check clerk and reverts to clerical duties he will retain his existing salary but revert to the clerical scale on which he will remain until he is either promoted and becomes a check clerk again,"

The Court has decided to reject this derrand made but the

The Court has decided to reject this demand made by the Respondents.


