1. Title.—DEPUTY CHIEF of Buildings Division.

Post No.-GES-226.

Category and level.—Professional category (P-4).

Organizational location.—Bureau of General Services.

Duties and responsibilities.—The incumbent will assist the Chief of Division in the performance of his duties. In this capicity he will be responsible for the following tasks:

- (1) Participating in the planning, organization and supervision of the tasks entrusted to the Division's sections and units, and of the work of outside firms.
- (2) Assisting the Chief of Division in the preparation and implementation of building, conservation and remodelling projects in connexion with headquarters premises.
- (3) Ensuring the conservation and maintenance of buildings and the smooth running of technical installations at headquarters. Proposing the most economic and appropriate technical solutions as regards the Organization's needs in respect of air-conditioning, electricity, telephone, sound installations, etc., and submitting the relevant technical studies and reports to the Chief of Division.
- (4) Proposing suitable measures for ensuring the security and safety of the headquarters staff and buildings.
- (5) Maintaining liaison with the cleaning firms responsible for cleaning the premises, and supervising their work.
- (6) Planning and supervising the material preparation of conferences, exhibitions and official events. Organizing removals within headquarters, and carrying out any necessary reinstallation work.
- (7) Participating in the preparation of budget estimates and work plans, in the implementation of the administrative tasks assigned to the Division and the preparation of reports on activities.
- (8) When necessary, representing the Chief of Division at certain working meetings and replacing him when he is absent or not available.

Qualifications and experience required:

- (a) Engineering degree in building and public works, or the equivalent.
- (b) Considerable technical and administrative experience in the problems involved in the construction, management and maintenance of buildings and technical installations (air-conditioning, heating, electricity, telephone, sound, etc.), acquired in posts of increasing responsibility.

- (c) Ability to draft reports and draw up plans and estimates.
- (d) Very good knowledge of the two working languages of the Secretariat.

Salary and allowances.—Initial appointment will be at P-4 grade with a net salary equivalent to US\$21,756 (US\$20,209 if without dependants) per annum, payable mainly in French francs, plus the prescribed annual allowances, e.g. post-adjustment, at present US\$21,436 for staff members with dependants, US\$19,913 for staff members without dependants, family allowances of US\$450 for each dependent child (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable in respect of the first dependent child). These emoluments are normally exempt from all direct taxation. Income tax on such remuneration, if levied, is reimbursed in accordance with Staff Regulations and Rules.

2. Title.—REGIONAL POPULATION COMMUNICATION ADVISER.

Post No.-AS/AP/THA/SS/001.

Category and level.-Professional category (P-5).

Duty station.—Regional Population Communication Unit, Regional Office for Education in Asia and Oceania, Bangkok, Thailand.

Duties and responsibilities.—The post is designed to help meet Unesco's increasing responsibilities for the development of the communication components of projects and activities undertaken by various countries in the Asia region in support of their population/family planning programmes and to develop regional training, research and evaluation and promotional programmes. The Adviser will assist governments in the planning, development and implementation of population communication projects and will collaborate with agencies of the United Nations system (including the United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA)) and international non-governmental organizations in developing and implementing the co-ordinated population/family planning communication programmes in the region. To this end, the Adviser, under the supervision of the Director of the Regional Office for Education in Asia and Oceania shall—

- (a) assist governmental and non-governmental organizations and agencies of the United Nations system in the development of national population/family planning communication projects;
- (b) within the framework of the overall communication policies of the respective countries in the region, develop the capability and capacity of their respective programme and communication personnel to undertake training, research and media production activities in support of population/family planning programmes;
- (c) evaluate the effect of the programme projects undertaken under (a) and (b) above;
- (d) devise ways and means whereby population/family planning messages may be integrated in communication programmes in support of other projects for economic and social development;
- (e) develop regional training and research projects and promote activities for the diffusion of innovative approaches in population/family planning communication between countries of the region.

Qualifications and experience required:

- (a) University degree or equivalent.
- (b) Practical experience in the use of mass media with particular reference to population/family planning programmes.
- (c) Knowledge of population/family planning programmes in Asian countries.
- (d) Fluent English; working knowledge of French an asset.

Salary and allowances.—Initial appointment will be at P-5 grade with a net salary equivalent to US\$26,299 (US\$24,298 if without dependants) per annum, 25 per cent payable in the currency of the duty station and the rest in a currency of the staff member's choice, plus the prescribed annual allowances, e.g. post-adjustment, at present US\$5,033 for staff members with dependants, US\$4,650 for staff members without dependants, assignment allowance, at present the local equivalent of US\$2,400 for staff members with dependants, US\$1,900 for staff members without dependants; family allowances of US\$450 for each dependent child (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable in respect of the first dependent child). These emoluments are normally exempt from all direct taxation. Income tax on such remuneration, if levied, is reimbursed in accordance with Staff Regulations and Rules. Travel is provided

for the staff member and his family (spouse and recognized dependants). In addition, Unesco contributes towards the cost of installation at the duty station and to the education of dependent children. On separation from Unesco, a repatriation grant is paid.

Duration of contract.—Initial period of one year starting as soon as possible after the closing date for the receipt of applications.

3. Title -- DIRECTOR OF DIVISION.

Post No.-ED-209.

Category and level.—Director (D-1).

Organizational location.—Division of Higher Education and of Training of Educational Personnel.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the authority of the Assistant Director-General for Education, the incumbent will be responsible for formulating proposals for the preparation of the Organization's draft programme in higher education and the training of educational personnel and for carrying out the approved programme in these fields. He will also be responsible for ensuring, at the design stage of the programme and during its execution, the necessary co-ordination with the other divisions of the Education Sector and with the other sectors whose activities relate to these two fields. To this effect, he will—

- (1) direct, on both the intellectual and administrative level, the Division of Higher Education and of Training of Educational Personnel; and in particular
- (2) give directives to the members of the Division for the preparation and organization of studies, surveys, research, meetings and other programme activities which the Secretariat carries out by itself or in collaboration with other international organizations or national organizations or which it entrusts under contract to specialists or institutions:
- (3) personally ensure the proper functioning of the European Centre for Higher Education (CEPES) in Bucharest and of the Regional Centre for Higher Education in Latin America and the Caribbean (CRESAL) in Caracas;
- (4) ensure, through the intermediary of the Co-ordination and Evaluation Unit, the necessary co-operation in its fields of competence with the Regional Offices for Education, the International Bureau of Education (Geneva) and the International Institute for Educational Planning
- (5) ensure the necessary co-operation with the intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations which carry out activities in higher education or the training of educational personnel, and represent the Director-General at meetings held by those organizations;
- (6) act as chairman of the inter-sectoral committee for higher education and ensure its proper functioning;
- (7) supervise the technical aspects of co-operation with the United Nations University and, if required, represent the Director-General at certain meetings of the United Nations University and at the sessions of the University Council;
- (8) follow the application of the recommendation on the status of teachers and supervise the preparation, adoption and application of the conventions on the recognition of studies, diplomas and degrees in higher education;
- (9) ensure co-operation with member states in higher education and the training of educational personnel and carry out the projects foreseen in this respect in the regular programme and in the extra-budgetary programmes;
- (10) perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Assistant Director-General for Education.

Qualifications and experience required:

- (a) University degree.
- (b) Extensive experience in education, preferably in the fields of higher education or the training of educational personnel.
- (c) International experience would be very desirable.
- (d) Excellent knowledge of English or French and good working knowledge of the other; knowledge of another language would be an advantage.

Salary and allowances.—Initial appointment will be at D-1 grade, with a net salary equivalent to US\$29,245 (US\$26,931 if without dependants) per annum, payable mainly in French francs, plus the following prescribed annual allowances; postadjustment (which varies according to the cost of living), at

present US\$28,727 for staff members with dependants, US\$26,450 for staff members without dependants; family allowance of US\$450 for each dependent child (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable in respect of the first dependent child). These emoluments are, in principle, exempt from all direct taxation. Income tax on such remuneration, if levied, is reimbursed in accordance with the Staff Regulations and Rules.

4. Title.—PROGRAMME SPECIALIST.

Post No.-SC-304.

Category and level.-Professional Category (P-3).

Organizational location.—Division of Ecological Sciences.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the general supervision of the Director of the Division the incumbent shall:

- (1) Undertake the planning and execution of specific activities of the Man and Biosphere (MAB) Programme which the Division of Ecological Sciences.
- (2) Liaise with MAB committees in member states, and advise in the implementation of research and training activities in the field of ecological sciences.
- (3) Assist in the preparation of projects in training and research in the field of integrated approaches to land utilization, including both the natural and human aspects, especially in developing countries.
- (4) Assist in the preparation of international seminars or expert groups for specific MAB projects.
- (5) Assist in the preparation of the meetings of the Coordinating Council of the MAB Programme.
- (6) Assist in the planning and implementation of Unesco's programme of research and training for rational management of natural resources, including the collection and dissemination of scientific information.

Qualifications and experience required:

- (a) University degree in such fields as the biological or human sciences, geography, etc.
- (b) At least three years of scientific activity including field work, preferably in a developing country.
- (c) Good experience in administration of international scientific programmes.
- (d) Excellent knowledge of either English or French with a working knowledge of the other language.

Salary and allowances.—Initial appointment will be at P-3 grade with a net salary equivalent to US\$18,193 (US\$16,978 if without dependants) per annum, payable mainly in French francs, plus the prescribed annual allowances, e.g. post-adjustment, at present US\$17,987 for staff members with dependants, US\$16,777 for staff members without dependants, family allowances of US\$450 for each dependent child (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable in respect of the first dependent child). Issue in dispute-

Wrongful termination of Gabriel N. Nyanjui.

- 1. The Domestic & Hotel Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Family Planning Association of Kenya shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 17th October and the 27th November, 1979 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:

Claimants.—Gabriel Nyanjui.
Respondents.—Eratus Muteru.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated the 14th March, 1979, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on the 7th August, 1979, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Mr. Nyanjui started working for the Respondent on the 6th March, 1972, as a clerk/typist and on the 15th February, 1973, he was reappointed as clerk/storekeeper.

His services were terminated on the 26th September, 1977, when he had just come back from leave during which he got married. He was to resume duty on the 26th but came to work on the 27th September as during his leave period there was a public holiday.

The Claimants took up the matter on his behalf as he was their shopsteward and the dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour. The Ministry's findings and recommendation were conveyed to the parties on the 27th February, 1979 in the following terms:

"It is evident that the frustrations of the workers led them to join the union with Mr. Nyanjui as the elected shopsteward.

From the submissions there is no doubt that the management were completely opposed to the organization of their workers into the union. Mr. Nyanjui being in the centre of it all must have been regarded as the trouble-maker.

Mr. Nyanjui had his shortcomings as indicated in written warnings. It is more noted that some of them arose as a result of his duty as a shopsteward representing his members. In my opinion the possibility of Mr. Nyanjui being victimized due to his trade union activities cannot be ruled out. I therefore find the termination wrongful.

Recommendations:

I recommend that Mr. Nyanjui be paid his termination benefits and in addition three months' pay for wrongful termination."

In 1973 the Claimants embarked on recruiting the Respondents' employees into their membership with the result that check off forms were signed by the workers. On the 24th November, Mr. Nyanjui was elected the shopsteward. From then on there is evidence of a protracted struggle between the Claimants and the Respondents on the matter of recognition. Inevitably Mr. Nyanjui who was the Claimants' shopsteward figured prominently in this affair. The Court is satisfied that the delay in the union recognition was partly due to the Respondents' reluctance to do so due to their financial position as they depend on donations from international agencies and partly because at one stage the Respondents wanted to recognize the Claimants through the Kenya National Council of Social Services. Later on, however, they were advised by the Council that they should recognize the Claimants directly.

Between 1973 and 1977, E. Muteru, who is Respondents' administrative officer in charge of administration department, acted as the director on a couple of occasions, first in September/October, 1974, and then in 1977. The Court has gone through the very detailed appendices to the Respondents' submissions and finds that most of the allegations of negligence, absenteeism, shortcomings and warnings mainly due to Mr. Nyanjui's involvement in trade union affairs were handed out

during the period when Mr. Muteru was acting as the director. The Court notes that Mr. Muteru at one stage advocated a staff association to the workers as against their joining the Claimants. The relationship between Mr. Muteru and Mr. Nyanjui deteriorated from the time Mr. Nyanjui was elected the shopsteward and the Court is convinced that the Claimants' efforts to get recognition from the Respondents resulted in a personal struggle between these two persons. Some of the incidents for which Mr. Nyanjui was warned are very trivial and the incident of Sh. 2 stamp having been used instead of Sh. 3 one has been overplayed by the Respondents. There is no conclusive evidence of any fraud on the part of Mr. Nyanjui.

At the same time the Court finds that Mr. Nyanjui's election as a shopsteward obviously went to his head with the result that he started conducting himself in a rather aggressive manner and did not behave properly as was expected of an employee. This misbehaviour, however, did not amount to insubordination but obviously annoyed Mr. Muteru considerably.

The Court does not intend to analyse each and every incident that was referred to between Mr. Muteru and Mr. Nyanjui for the simple reason that they are not all that important. The Court, however, must say that Mr. Nyanjui did not play down his trade union activities pending recognition. He would have been well advised to do so.

The Claimants have asked the Court to find that Mr. Nyanjui was victimized for his trade union activities and to award his reinstatement along with payment of full wages for the whole period he has been out of employment plus other benefits. They maintained that there was no reason why the Ministry had not recommended in accordance with their prayer.

The Respondents on the other hand strongly submitted that they were never opposed to trade union activity and as such they had not victimized Mr. Nyanjui but had terminated his services because of flagrant disobedience, insubordination, gross misconduct in that he absented himself from work with no justifiable reason and engaged in activities intended to irritate his employer.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that the real reason for the termination of Mr. Nyanjui's services was his trade union activities and the Court therefore finds that he has suffered a wrongful termination. Unfortunately for Mr. Nyanjui, his behaviour after being elected as a shopsteward left a lot to be desired and this coupled with the various other allegations, though minon, which have been levelled against him has made the Court to rule that his reinstatement is not warranted. Furthermore, since the Respondents are not a profit-making organization the Court is not inclined to award a very heavy compensation either.

Under all these circumstances the Court while finding that Mr. Nyanjui has suffered a wrongful dismissal has come to the conclusion that the Ministry of Labour's recommendation in this dispute should be upheld. The Court accordingly awards that Mr. Nyanjui should be paid his full salary and house allowance for the month of September, 1977, one month's salary and house allowance in lieu of notice and all his contributions to the superannuation scheme and three months' salary and house allowance by way of compensation for the wrongful dismissal that he has suffered.

Overtime for banking staff.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kirinyaga District Co-operative Union Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 7th December, 1979, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated the 21st July, 1979, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on the 3rd October, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissionen.

The Claimants have brought this dispute against the Respondents on behalf of their 50 members who they allege have worked about 127,200 hours as overtime for the period between November, 1976 to October, 1978, in the Respondents' banking section.

They base their claim on the overtime clause in the parties' collective agreement which was effective from the 1st October, 1971, for a period of three years but has continued to be in force since then. This clause reads as follows:

"Overtime shall be worked only in exceptional circumstances and advance approval must be obtained in writing from the manager or from someone else who may be authorized by the manager. Any number of hours worked in excess of those laid down in paragraph 2 hereinbefore shall be paid for as overtime payment and calculated by dividing the basic monthly wage (exclusive of housing allowance or any other allowance or allowances) by—

- (a) in respect of watchmen by one three hundred and twelfth (312) of the employee's basic monthly wage;
- (b) in respect of all other employees by one one hundred ninety fifth (195) and thereafter by increasing the hourly rates as follows:
 - (i) For time worked in excess of the normal number of hours per week by one quarter of hourly rate.
 - (ii) For time worked on Sundays by one half of hourly rate.
 - (iii) For time worked on statutory public holidays by double hourly rate.

Provided locational managers, factory managers, supervisors and assistant managers shall be paid Sh. 60 flat rate every month and drivers Sh. 40 flat pay every month whether they worked overtime or not.

N.B.—Overtime worked shall be paid together with wages at the end of the month during which such overtime was worked or alternatively an employee may elect to be granted time off in lieu of overtime payment."

The Claimants allege that the Respondents have committed a serious breach of this clause in that instead of paying the workers the actual overtime which they had worked they had decided to pay each employee a sum of Sh. 70 per month by way of overtime. They indicated that they were prepared for this flat rate of Sh. 70 to be deducted from the workers' actual entitlement of their overtime claims under the aforesaid clause.

The Respondents admitted that they had started the system of paying a flat rate of Sh. 70 by way of overtime in the banking section without consulting or agreeing with the Claimants on this matter. They, however, pointed out that they were forced to adopt this method because the workers in the banking section had become very inefficient and lazy and often came to work slightly drunk in the afternoons. This resulted in the work not being finished during normal working hours and the workers had to work long hours by way of overtime. The chief accountant had reported this matter to their committee meeting held on the 7th December, 1976, and the discussion is recorded Minute No. 9/76/77.

The Respondents emphasized that this system did improve the efficiency in the banking section and that the cost of unnecessary overtime had been reduced. They asked the Court to find that the payment of a flat rate of Sh. 70 by way of overtime was reasonable.

The Respondents pointed out that the claims which were the subject matter of this dispute appeared to be fraudulent as to begin with some of these employees in respect of whom overtime had been claimed had been on leave during the period in respect of which overtime was being claimed and further if the Claimants' allegation of 106 hours' overtime per month was taken seriously it would mean that every worker worked

about 5.3 hours per day as overtime. This, they submitted, was not only ridiculous but fraudulent. Moreover, in 1977 there were only 35 employees in the banking section and not 50.

The Count finds that there are some very unsatisfactory aspects of this dispute and they have really come as a surprise because the Court expects the parties to the industrial relations in this country to fully understand by now the importance of the collective agreements and the strict adherence to their provisions. They should also know how and when such agreements are revised. If the Respondents' management had not been so ignorant or had not decided to deliberately violate the clause regarding overtime in the collective agreement the workers would not have been given this opportunity of making false and inflated claims in respect of alleged overtime worked.

The Court has no hesitation in finding that the Respondents have committed a breach of the overtime clause as far as employees in the banking section are concerned but this does not mean that the Court can accept and allow inflated claims made by their employees through the Claimants. In fact during the hearing the Claimants' representative admitted that there could be some calculating error in working out the overtime claims. In view of what the Respondents have submitted there is no doubt that the Claimants' figures quoted in their appendix 3 are not genuine.

The Court must refer to the fact that the Respondents' chief accountant had made the following statement at the meeting of the 7th December, 1976:

"The Chief Accountant reported to the committee that there are incompetent persons in the banking who do not improve. Their work always remains behind and they cause delays in balancing books and in payout calculations. He went on and reported that some persons report on duty drunk after lunch hours. Their incompetency makes the banking section pay overtime averaging Sh. 100 p.m. which is very expensive."

The Court is of the view that the answer to this claim lies in the chief accountant's statement that the overtime averaged about Sh. 100 p.m.

The Court would have expected the Respondents through their chief accountant to replace inefficient workers and those who came drunk in the afternoon to be replaced with competent persons from their societies.

It is most unfortunate that the Respondents did not follow the managenial practices properly in this dispute but this error on their part does not entitle the Claimants to put forward exaggerated claims on behalf of their members.

The Court notes that the system of recording names of employees who remain behind after the normal working hours and the time they actually leave the offices continued to be followed for administrative purposes other than for the computation of overtime payment. This means that the necessary records are in possession of the Respondents.

After giving careful thought to the problems raised in this dispute the Court has come to the conclusion that the best method of dealing with it is to award the workers a flat rate of Sh. 100 p.m. which according to the chief accountant is the average overtime they worked. The sum of Sh. 70 which the Respondents have already paid to the workers should be deducted from this amount. The Court accordingly awards that all those employees in the banking section who have worked overtime during the material time should be paid the balance of Sh. 30 per employees per month and that this arrangement should continue from November, 1976, up to the end of December, 1979, and thereaften the Respondents should pay the employees their overtime claims strictly in accordance with the provisions of the collective agreement in force. The Court would like to make it clear to the parties that it is now up to them to go through their records, if need be with the assistance of the Provincial Labour Officer, Nyeri, to work out the arreas due to the various employees in the banking section in accordance with the directions given in the Court award.
