- (d) Broad knowledge of current events and developments in Unesco's spheres of activity.
- (e) Supervisory ability.

- directing and supervising the semi-professional and trades courses in the electrical trades section at the training centres to which he may be assigned;

- (c) train counterpart staff as local supervisors of arts and crafts;
- (d) advise on the purchase of textbooks, educational materials and teaching aids required for the teaching of arts and crafts;
- (e) prepare work plans and periodic progress reports;
- (f) advise the Gaza Field Education Officer on the smooth operation of the education development activities in the Gaza Strip;
- (g) carry out such other duties as may be assigned to him by his supervisors (although stationed in Gaza, the incumbent will be required to travel frequently outside the Gaza Strip to UNRWA's other areas of operations: Lebanon, Syria, Jordan and West Bank).

- (d) act as principal catalyst between government authorities and resident representatives, in the identification and formulation of projects in the field of education;
- (e) arrange for advisory missions of Unesco specialists to assist UNDP and national authorities in project identification and formulation of national plans and sectoral analysis, if such supplementary assistance is required;
- (f) maintain close liaison with the Regional Office in Education in Dakar and with Unesco Secretariat for the feed back and backstopping required in the performance of the above duties.

- (c) additional monitoring and evaluation of 2nd and 3rd IDA Education Project activities;

and to identify additional studies which will lead to development of a national educational plan and future projects in education. The project will also be concerned with the continuation of school mapping activities presently supported under the Second IDA Credit, for which a small consultant provision is made in case of need. The consultant would work under the overall direction of the Co-ordinator.

Specifically, the Co-ordinator will be responsible for—

- (i) preparation of detailed terms of reference, timetables, estimates of required personnel and cost estimates for the studies already agreed upon;
- (ii) assistance to the Ministry of Education in selecting the main implementing agencies and persons to be engaged in each study;
- (iii) initiation, implementation and completion of the studies;
- (iv) training of nationals to carry out educational studies of the required nature.

The Co-ordinator will work closely with the Planning Unit and the Inspectorate MOE, the University of Malawi and Domasi In-service Teacher Training Centre (to become the Institute of Education), the Project Implementation Unit (PIU) and relevant agencies in Lilongwe, Blantyre, Zomba and elsewhere.

1. The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Nairobi City Council shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 26th February, 10th April, 11th June, 12th June, 31st July, 30th August, 18th September, 1979, and the 14th January, 1980.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated the 17th October, 1978, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on the 15th December, 1978, together with the statutory certificate from the Labour Commissioner.

The Court conducted a very full hearing into this dispute on the dates mentioned hereinabove and at the request of the Court it was agreed that the Deputy Town Clerk Mombasa should appear before the Court and explain how the Mombasa Municipal Council had tackled the question of grading as recommended by Inbucon Ltd.

On the 30th August, 1979, the parties appeared before the Court along with the Deputy Town Clerk, Mombasa, giving detailed explanation on the subject matter of the dispute as far as its implementation in Mombasa was concerned. As a result the parties agreed to try to work out a settlement of the dispute in view of the explanation to the Court given by the Deputy Town Clerk, Mombasa.

The parties then embarked on meetings and eventually settled the matter. On the 14th January, 1980, they requested the Court to make an award by consent in accordance with the agreement which they had reached on the 10th October, 1979.

The Court accordingly by consent of the parties awards that the following sixteen officers had qualified to be graded in the next higher salary Scale I at the time of implementing the Inbucon Report effective from the 1st December, 1971:

The parties having made their written submissions requested the Court on the day of the hearing to make an award by consent as they had settled the dispute at their own level. They handed the Court a signed agreement incorporating the terms of the settlement.

Accordingly by consent of the parties the Court awards that the aforesaid three employees who had been dismissed be paid five months' wages each calculated on the basis of their monthly wages at the time of their dismissal and that this awards be in full and final settlement of the dispute.

8. Interference of lunch arrangements.

1. The Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the E.A. Power & Lighting Co. Ltd., shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 17th December, 1979, and the 3rd January, 1980, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated the 8th August, 1979, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on the 15th October together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties' previous collective agreement came into force on the 1st May, 1977, and expired on the 30th April, 1979. This dispute has arisen because the parties are deadlocked on the issues in dispute while revising the said collective agreement.

The parties' submissions were forwarded to the Employment Promotion Division (E.P.D.) with a request to prepare a report thereon vis-à-vis the Guidelines and before the final submissions were made by them the E.P.D. report was with the Court and the parties. The parties were therefore able to make their comments on the very comprehensive report prepared by the E.P.D.

The Respondents have in their employment 3,999* employees with 3,091 of them being unionizable. The total wage bill for all their employees is in the region of Sh. 76,056,000 as at August, 1979. The Court was not told how much of this amount was paid to the 3,091 unionizable employees.

The present salary structure has scales from A to H and the starting salary for scale A is Sh. 430 p.m. with the maximum of scale H at Sh. 2,075 p.m. The workers are in receipt of consolidated wages and salaries although the Respondents provide houses to some of their employees who at the lowest are required to pay an economic rent of Sh. 60 p.m. with the senior staff paying a certain percentage of their salary and some top staff who are given free houses, free light and water.

The Claimants have demanded that the present minimum wage should be increased by Sh. 270 to bring it up to Sh. 700 p.m. This represents 62.8 per cent increase. In addition they have demanded that all workers should get the same wage increase of Sh. 270 p.m. on top of their present wages and salaries over the two-year period of the new agreement, i.e. Sh. 135 p.m. for the first year and another Sh. 135 for the second year. The E.P.D. have assessed that this would amount to Sh. 1,079,730 for the 3,999 employees of the Respondents over a period of two years. This represents an average increase of 18.95 per cent and 17.6 per cent in the first and second year respectively over and above the allowances which the parties have agreed at their own level.

The Respondents have offered an increase of 12.58 per cent for those who are earning up to Sh. 700 p.m. and 7.75 for those earning up to Sh. 2,500 p.m. to be spread over the two-year period from the 1st May, 1979, to the 30th April, 1980. They submitted that the proposed increases will result in additional expenditure to the Respondents of Sh. 1,354,610 for the first year and Sh. 1,146,314 for the second year. They maintained that this was consistent with the wages Guidelines.

The Respondents also referred to the parties' position on the issue of wages when deadlock was reached over it. The position appeared to be as follows:

"(a) Employer's stand: there should be wage increment of 6.64 per cent for the first year and 4 per cent for the second year; i.e. the increment to be spread over two years.

(b) Union's stand: the wage increment of 12 per cent for the lower income group and 8 per cent for the middle income group, should be received during the first year with the understanding that this increment would cover the two years."

The Claimants, however, stated that once a deadlock was reached they were not bound by any offers which they may have made with a view to reaching a settlement and asked the Court to reject the parties' positions when they recorded a deadlock.

The Claimants strongly submitted that the Respondents made a big profit every year and the workers had not received any

productivity allowances. They emphasized that the rural electrification was financed in the main by the Kenya Government and not by the Respondents.

The Court is fully aware of the Respondents' contribution to the national economy in that they are one of the biggest employers in the country with the labour force of about 4,000 people and the role that electricity plays in the development of the national economy is an obvious fact and need not be repeated.

The Court would like to refer to the wages Guidelines which were issued to the Court by the Vice-President and the Minister for Finance on the 2nd August, 1977, particularly in relation to Guideline (i) which stated:

"Productivity increases can be used to justify wage increases after the 1st January, 1978, in the following circumstances—

- (a) there has been an increase in per capita income in the economy as a whole during 1977 and beyond;
- (b) there has been an increase in the amount of production per worker in the industry or firm covered by the particular claim during 1977 and beyond;
- (c) the claim is for productivity increase is limited by the lower of the percentage increases of either (a) or (b) above."

The Court would also like to refer to the latest directive which the Court has received from the Vice-President where he has directed under Guideline (i) that productivity increases in 1979 and beyond cannot be used to justify wage increases.

Guideline (iv) has also been amended as follows:

- "(a) Overall wage increases shall average no more than one half of the rise in the cost of living. However, higher increases should be allowed for the lower paid groups.
- (b) The compensation for price increases will be spread in equal instalments so that later years of the contract period are not left without any increase."

The E.P.D. report reveals that the productivity based compensation rates have in most cases been calculated on the basis of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) per capita which in this case is estimated at 3.8 per cent and 2 per cent for 1977 and 1978 respectively.

The Court has decided that the workers are entitled to their share of GDP per capita of 3.8 per cent for 1977 but not for 1978. The Court has made this ruling after a careful study of the directives through the wages Guidelines issued by the Vice-President to the Court.

During the relevant period under review, i.e. from the 1st May, 1977 to the 30th April, 1979, the cost of living indices have risen as follows:

Wage earners	25.17 per cent
Middle income	15.46 per cent.

The workers are entitled to half of these increases together with 3.8 per cent GDP per capita for 1977.

1. Wage increments

After careful consideration of all the submissions and taking into consideration the Guidelines the Court awards that all the Respondents' unionizable employees should get a wage increase with effect from the 1st May, 1979, as follows:

	Sh.
8.2 per cent for those earning up to ..	700
5.45 for those earning up to ..	2,500

The Court further awards that all the unionizable employees should get similar increases with effect from the 1st May, 1980.

2. Leave travelling allowances

3. Hardship allowance

These two demands are completely new as the Respondents have not in the past paid either of these two items to their employees.

The Claimants explained that at present the workers from remote areas are brought to Nairobi and are then told to go on leave. They felt the workers should be assisted to travel home and the Respondents should give them leave travelling allowance. The Claimants, however, have not put forward a specific demand on the amount they would like to be awarded in their favour.

On the question of hardship allowance the Claimants produced the copy of a letter which had been written by the Acting District Commissioner, Mandera, on the 20th December, 1978, to the Respondents' general manager in which the former had stated that the Government employees stationed in any

part of North-Eastern Province are paid hardship allowance amounting to 30 per cent of their salary but subject to a maximum of Sh. 500 for married employees and Sh. 250 for single employees. He asked the Respondents to consider this allowance for their employees.

The Respondents have strongly resisted these two demands on the ground that these two items are not negotiable as per their current recognition agreement. They asked the Court to reject both these items outright.

The Respondents added that they were aware of certain difficulties that their employees faced in a few isolated stations including Lodwar, Garissa, Marsabit and Mandera. They had made suitable arrangements for them including—

- "(a) free transport from the stations to the nearest centre of reliable public transport means, e.g. employees stationed at Lodwar are transported free to and from Kitale and when they require to travel to or from Lodwar. Transportation is often by air at considerable cost to the respondents;
- (b) free travel time between station and the nearest centre of reliable public means when proceeding on or returning from leave;
- (c) improved free housing accommodation suitable for family occupation;
- (d) provision of various recreational facilities including social halls."

The Court has carefully considered the Respondents' submission that these two items are not negotiable but the Court cannot accept their submission. In the recognition agreement clause 2 (a) item 24 reads:

"84. Collection of union dues in accordance with the Trade Disputes Act and other generally accepted terms and conditions of service as may be accepted by the tripartite committee of FKE, COTU and Government."

The Court has no hesitation in finding that the leave travelling allowance and hardship allowance come the words "other generally accepted terms and conditions of service". Moreover numerous disputes on these two issues have been accepted by the tripartite committee and have been subject of Court awards.

On the issue of leave travelling allowance the Court feels that the parties have not applied their minds sufficiently to this item as there have been no fruitful negotiations on it. The Court has accordingly decided that for the time being a ruling to the effect that this item is negotiable should be made and that the parties should themselves apply their minds to this item with a view to settling it amicably. If they are not able to reach an agreement then this item should be reported as a fresh trade dispute to the Minister for Labour and then it can come before the Court as another dispute.

On the issue of hardship allowance the Court awards that the Respondents should pay a hardship allowance of Sh. 80 per month to all their employees who are stationed in North-Eastern Province.

4. Standby allowance for Scales A, C, D, and F

At present the standby allowance is as follows:

The final stand taken by the parties during negotiations was as follows:

The Court awards the following standby allowance:

5. Mode of travel on transfer

The parties' current collective agreement provides that when employees travel on transfer journeys shall be made by company transport where short distances are involved or where public transport is not available to convey the employee his baggage and family. Otherwise third class rail or bus tickets shall be made available to the employees. The Claimants, however, submitted that this was an out of date provision and needed radical alteration and demanded as follows:

Scale A-B third class rail or equivalent bus ticket.

Scale C-F second class rail or equivalent bus ticket.

Scale G-H first class rail or equivalent bus ticket.

The Court has carefully considered this demand and the Respondents' reply and has come to the conclusion that a certain improvement is warranted on this item. The Court awards that all those employees who are earning up to Sh. 1,000 shall be entitled to third class or bus ticket on transfer and those earning more than Sh. 1,000 shall be entitled to second class rail or equivalent bus ticket.

6. Night allowance for Scales A, D, E and F

When the parties were deadlocked during negotiations their respective positions were as follows:

The Respondents stated that they had based their offer on the documentary evidence in their records when employees had made claims under this item and their offer had been based on the evidence so collected.

The Claimants have demanded the following rates:

The Court has decided to accept the Respondents' offer and awards the following rates:

Scale	Sh.
A-D	55
E-F	60
G-H	70

7. Washing of Protective Clothings

The existing arrangement is that the Respondents provide protective clothing where necessary but employees are responsible for maintaining such clothing in a clean condition.

The Claimants submitted that either the Respondents should accept the responsibility to wash protective clothing or they should provide washing soap. They stated that even small employers in the country provide one or the other of the two alternatives.

The Respondents submitted that they issued upwards of 12,000 items of protective clothing to employees all over the country every year and it would be a very expensive exercise to organize the laundering of these uniforms. Further if a bar of soap monthly was issued to 3,000 odd employees it would cost them Sh. 180,000 annually and a similar amount would be needed for administration, storage and transportation charges. The Court was told that the uniform remained the property of the employee when a new item was issued.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has decided to reject this demand.

8. Interference of Lunch Arrangements

In Clause No. 4 of 1972 the Court had clarified its award on this item as follows:

"The Court rules that its award is to apply to all those employees who are required to be away from their depots for the whole day (returning the same day) provided they travel a distance of more than 15 miles in one direction from their depots."

The Claimants told the Court that subsequently their previous office bearers and the Respondents had agreed to vary the Court award with the result that the following clause is incorporated in the collective agreement:

"An employee will be entitled to claim the following allowances if in the opinion of the management his normal

lunch arrangement has been interfered with on account of his duties on the day in question. The union will have the right to make representations where unfair practice has been practiced."

The Respondents have very strongly opposed this demand on the ground that only where an employee was asked to work outside the area of operation should he qualify for payment of the allowance. They further stated that where an area of operation is so wide as to necessitate an employee's overnight stay then claims for night allowance can be made.

The Court in arriving at its decision has rejected the documents which the Respondents offered to the Court after the hearing had concluded. The Court, however, was not impressed by the reasons and arguments forwarded by the Claimants as to why they had decided to vary the Court award with the result that now some five years after that they are trying to revive the issue once again. The Court cannot accept the vague insinuation that the previous office bearers had let down the workers. The Court feels that they must have had a good reason to do so. After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court rejects the Claimants' demand.

Issues in Dispute:

1. Wage increase.
2. House allowance.

1. The Kenya Timber and Furniture Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Woody Wood Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 21st January, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated the 19th September, 1979, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on the 1st November, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The Respondents are a small family concern and started operating in 1973. In 1977 some of the directors left the company and started their own similar business and the Court was told that they are running the business on a much larger scale than the Respondents.

The Respondents have seven employees working for them and they are placed in the following three grades:

Group 1	2 workers.
Group 2	3 workers.
Group 3	2 workers.

The workers in Group 1 are at Sh. 450.20 since October, 1978, and the Respondents have offered to increase it by 5 per cent. Those in Group 2 were at Sh. 549.50 in October, 1978, and were increased to Sh. 600 p.m. in March, 1979. Those in Group 3 were also brought up to Sh. 640.20 in March, 1979, from Sh. 604.20 in October, 1978.

The Respondents have pleaded their inability to meet the Claimants' demands of 18 per cent wage increase for the first year and another 18 per cent for the second year along with a house allowance of Sh. 80 p.m. They stated that their company will collapse if the union demands were accepted by the Court as the Respondents have operated at a loss for the last two years. They, however, expected and hoped that they would make some profit this year.

The Claimants criticized the Respondents for delaying negotiations with them by not attending meetings when arranged. They submitted that their demands were in accordance

with the workers' rights of compensation for the increase in the cost of living in accordance with the Guidelines.

The Employment Promotion Division in their report have more or less confirmed the workers' entitlement to be somewhat like the Claimants' demand.

The Court has carefully considered the submissions made by both the parties and has come to the conclusion that in this case the workers cannot be compensated fully to the extent of their entitlement under the Guidelines without jeopardizing their employment. The Court is not prepared to make an award which would lead to the collapse of an undertaking with the result that the workers in employment would lose their jobs.

The Court notes that the Claimants have as yet not made any headway with the new firm started by some of the Respondents' old directors who are operating on a much larger scale.

The parties having agreed that the effective date should be the 1st February, 1979, the Court awards that the workers in Group 1 should get a 7.5 per cent wage increase on their wages as at the 31st January, 1979, with effect from 1st February, 1979. They should get another wage increase of 7.5 per cent with effect from the 1st February, 1980.

The Court awards that those in Group 2 who have been brought up to Sh. 600 with effect from March, 1979, should get one month's arrears amounting to Sh. 50.50 for the month of February, 1979. With effect from the 1st February, 1980, they should get a wage increase of 7.5 per cent on their wage of Sh. 600.

Finally the Court awards that those in Group 3 should get arrears of Sh. 56 only for the month of February, 1979, and with effect from the 1st February, 1980, they should get a wage increase of 7.5 on their wage of Sh. 640.20.

The Court rejects the Claimants' demand for a house allowance of Sh. 80 p.m.

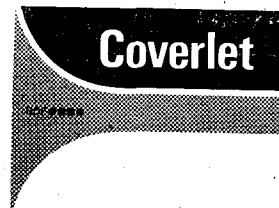

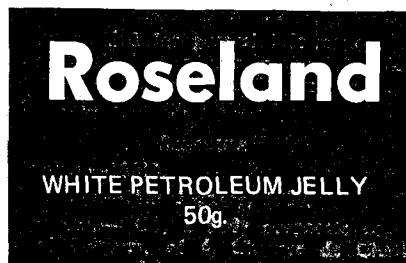

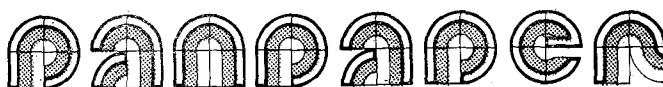

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:—

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

Kenya Gazette

D.41. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready.
