THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 76 of 1979

Parties-

Kenya Management Staff Association

and

H. Z. & Co. Ltd.

Issue in dispute-

Termination of services of Mr. Joseph Magina.

- 1. The Kenya Management Staff Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and H. Z. & Co. Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 13th and 14th February 1980 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:

Claimants .- J. Magina.

Respondents:

Yoram Raveh. S. Munyi.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 7th February, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 28th November, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Joseph Magina was employed by the Respondents as a shift account machine operator from 10th October, 1977. His services were terminated with effect from 1st June, 1978 as he was given 30 days' notice on 2nd May, 1978. The reason for his termination was that he failed to come to work on 30th April, 1978 to finish outstanding posting for computer after having been requested by the Respondents to do so and he having agreed to it. This had resulted in the Respondents sustaining a loss of Sh. 2,000 due to the computer staying idle.

The dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and the Ministry's findings were as follows:

- "After going through both submissions I find that:
- (a) There is a serious omission of the termination clause in the letter of appointment and cannot rule out deliberate action
- (b) The action taken against Mr. Magina was too harsh in the circumstances and this fact is accepted by management representative who said that Mr. Magina deserved a second warning letter rather than dismissal.
- (c) It would seem that Mr. Munyu's opinion was not obtained before Mr. Magina was sacked.
- (d) The allegation that Mr. Magina didn't know his work has not been proved. I therefore find he suffered a wrongful dismissal.

I recommend that he be paid three months' salary to compensate him for the wrongful dismissal plus all his other terminal benefits".

The Claimants are claiming a sum of K.Sh. 14,346/15 from the Respondents on the ground that Mr. Magina's services were terminated wrongfully by them in that they had not complied with the warning procedure in sacking him after one warning only. This claim also includes three months' salary in lieu of notice as they allege that Mr. Magina was entitled to three months' salary in lieu of notice in the event of termination of his services.

The Respondents have most vigorously resisted this claim on the ground that it was a false case in which certain forged letters had been produced by the Claimants in order to support their fictitious demand.

The Court would first of all like to deal with the letters which Mr. Magina is alleged to have written to the Respondents' finance manager on 14th October, and 18th November, 1977, and 17th January, 1978. During the hearing the Respondents asked the Claimants to produce the original copies of these letters as the Respondents denied having received any of these letters. The Claimants stated that the original copies were very faint and therefore Magina had made photostat copies of these. When Magina was giving evidence he was asked to produce the copies and he produced handwritten letters in original and stated that he had made these copies of the letters which he had sent. When the Claimants' representatives were asked to produce the faint copies as

alleged by them they produced photostat copies of the documents which Mr. Magina had produced. The Court has no hesitation in finding that these letters are, to say the least, very suspicious and the Court cannot rely on them to any extent in this dispute.

The Court notes that the Respondents alleged that the Claimants' appendix 11 which is a letter dated 14th October, 1977 and is alleged to have been written by the Respondents' finance manager to Magina informing him that he was no longer allowed to be a member of a trade union is forged. From the evidence that was led by the Respondents on this particular point regarding the serial number of the letter and the absence of the copy in their relevant file and the evidence of the finance manager saying that it is a forgery the Court regrets that it cannot come to a definite conclusion one way or the other in the obsence of evidence from a handwriting expert. In any case, this letter is not crucial to this dispute because Claimants did represent him in this matter right from the date of his termination.

The Court would now like to refer to another important point in this dispute and that is that Magina while giving evidence told the Court in cross-examination on 13th February, as follows. "I am not working now. I have not worked since was sacked by the Respondents." Then in an answer to the Judge on the same day he said, "I have been looking for employment. I got casual work for operating machines for one week or a fortnight". On 14th February, 1980 Magina was recalled at the request of the Respondents and he said, "I have not said I don't want reinstatement because I am not working anywhere. I am working at Sunflag Industries as a casual, almost one month." At this stage the Respondents confronted him with a letter from the Sunflag Industries as a casual, almost one month." At this stage the that Magina was employed by them from 14th June, 1978 as accounting machine operator at a salary of K.Sh. 1,800 p.m. On being shown this letter Magina admitted that he had been working with them from June, 1978! The Court is amazed that the Claimants expect the Court to believe the evidence of Magina after what transpired on such an important point in disputes of wrongful dismissals. The Court finds that Magina is an utterly and completely unreliable person and the Court is not prepared to believe any part of his evidence. The Court has no sympathy for a person who produces suspicious letters and then contradicts himself so blatantly while giving evidence on oath.

The Court notes that the Respondents have suggested that this false case may have been cooked up by Magina with the assistance of the Claimants but the Court cannot without embarking on a detailed inquiry in this respect make a finding on this point. The Court must, however, point out to the Claimants that if they had taken the trouble of dispassionately studying the evidence that was produced by Magina they would have very quickly found out that their member had absolutely no case and that pursuing it further to the Industrial Court level would only end up in smearing their reputation as a trade union. The Court hopes that the Claimants will in future be extremely careful in the matters that they handle on behalf of their members otherwise they might find themselves in serious difficulties one of these days.

The Court has come to the conclusion that Magina having accepted to come on 30th April, 1978 to work on the computer and having failed to do so committed a gross misconduct as the machine was idle and the Respondents suffered a loss. If he had told them that he was not coming there were other machine operators who were willing to come on that day. For this he deserved a summary dismissal and therefore the warning procedure was not relevant to this dispute at all.

After careful consideration of all the submission the Court has decided to literally throw this case out and the Claimants' demand is rejected as it is nothing more than a speculative claim. The Court would like to reiterate its warning once again that the parties must be discouraged from bringing such disputes to the Court. If the Court had the necessary powers it would have awarded heavy costs against the Claimants in this dispute.
