KENYA GOVERNMENT OCCUPATIONAL TESTS Nos. 1, II AND III FOR TELEPHONE OPERATORS—1980

IT IS notified for general information that this year's Occupational Tests Nos. I, II and III for Telephone Operators, details of which are set out in Personnel General Letters Nos. 21 of 25th April, 1979 and 9 of 21st March, 1980, will be conducted as follows:

- (a) The written English Language Examination will be held on Thursday, 3rd July, 1980, at 9.30 a.m.
- (b) The oral English Test (for blind candidates only, if any) will be conducted here in Nairobi on Thursday, 3rd July, 1980 at 9.30 a.m. The venue of the oral tests will be notified to the candidates concerned, through their Heads of Departments soon after the registration of candidates.
- (c) Programme for the Practical Tests for all the candidates will be drawn up soon after the closing date for registration of candidates (see paragraph 4 below), and will be released later to all the Ministries/Dapartments in another circular.

2. ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER

The Occupational Tests will be open to civil servants only who must be Kenya citizens, and in the case of:

(i) Occupational Test No. I

Should be serving Telephone Operators Grade I (Job Group E) with at least two (2) years' service in that grade.

(ii) Occupational Test No. II

Should be serving Telephone Operators Grade II (Job Group D), who have been confirmed in their appointments and admitted to the Permanent and Pensionable Establishment; and with at least three years' service in that grade.

(iii) Occupational Test No. III

Should be serving in the obsolete (Job Group "C") grade or are ungraded E.A.C.E. holders who had been employed on telephone duties for a period of at least one (1) year as at 1st January, 1978. Those who attempted this test last year and failed, are eligible to re-sit the test this year.

(iv) Candidates who attempt and fail Occupational Tests Nos. I and II will not be allowed to take them until after a period of two (2) years from the date they last attempted the tests.

3. CONDITIONS FOR PASSING THE OCCUPATIONAL TESTS

In order to pass in full any of the Occupational Tests, a candidate is required to pass both the written English (or Oral English Test in the case of Blind Telephont Operators) and the Practical Test at one and the same sitting. No partial passes are allowed.

4. Application (Entry) Forms

- 11. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the President: No application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed charged or assessed by the Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President, in lieu thereof.
- 14. The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purposes shall have the right to enter the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of mains or service pipes, of telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.
- 15. The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th year of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at the rate of 4 per centum as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

- 1. Applications should be submitted to the Clerk to Council, Kilifi on prescribed forms on or before noon the 25th April, 1980. Applicants must enclose with their applications, their cash, postal or money orders for K.Sh. 1,000 as a deposit which will be dealt with as below:
 - (a) Credited to a successful applicant.
 - (b) Refunded to unsuccessful applicant.
 - (c) Forfeited if a successful applicant fails to pay within 30 days of the offer of the plot from the date of the letter of allotment and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

- 2. Applicants must in their applications state if they own any other plots in Watamu Township giving details of the plot numbers, failure to disclose may result into the application being disqualified.
- 3. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating:
 - (a) The amount of capital available for the purchase of the plot.
 - (b) The amount of capital available for the development of the plot. Attach banker's statement of his/her account, letter or any other evidence of financial status in support.
 - (c) The manner in which it is proposed to raise the balance required for the development of the plot.
 - (d) Individuals must quote their identity card numbers and their nationality.
 - (e) In case of companies, names of directors must be included and a photostat copy of the company's registration certificate.
- 4. The successful allottee of the plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 30 days of notification of his/her/their application has/have been successful, the stand premium, initial annual rent, conveyancing and registration fees, stamp duty, survey and provisional assessment of roads and drainage charges. In default of payment within a specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the application and the applicant shall have no claim to the plot or deposit paid on application.

General Conditions

- 1. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280), of the Laws of Kenya and the title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 2. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in the letter of application.
- 3. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the issue of the letter of allotment.

Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six calendar months of the actual registration of the grant submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and system of drainage for disposing of sewage, surface and sullage water) drawings, elevations and specifications of the building the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the said actual registration of the grant complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner of Lands in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expenses) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall (1) refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and the buildings shall only be used for one private dwelling house (excluding a guest house).
- 6. The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land hereby allocated or such lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.
- 8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land without prior consent writing of the Commissioner of Lands.
- 9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer sublet, charge or part with possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands: No application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed:

Provided that such consent shall not be required for the letting of individual shops, offices and flats.

- 10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of construction of roads and drains sewers, serving or adjoining the land and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as foresaid.
- 11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportionate cost for the maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner my assess.
- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.
- 14. The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.
- 15. The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental as per schedule payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th year of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at a rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 21 of 1979

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers

Pan African Insurance Co. Ltd.

Issues in dispute:

- 1. Wages and wage increase.
- 2. Annual leave part (a).
- 3. Compassionate leave part (c).
- 4. Housing allowance.
- 5. Redundancy part (c) (i) (ii) (iii).
- 6. Leave travelling allowance.
- 7. Loans.
- 8. Bonus.
- 9. Burial expenses.
- 10. Gratuity.
- 11. Working hours.
- 12. Calculation of overtime payment rate.

INTERPRETATION APPLICATION

Ruling

The Court announced its award in the above dispute on the 25th October, 1979. The parties have put forward different interpretations on the Court award in respect of wages and wage increase and compassionate leave part (c).

The Claimants maintained that the Court award means that all the employees' wages should be brought up to the new wage rates awarded by the Court and on top of that they should get an increase of similar amount with a further minor adjustment to take them up to the next notch. If this is not done then the wage increases awarded to the employees would work out at around 8 per cent would be in line with the offer made by the Respondents during the hearing and the Claimants doubted if the Court intended to do that. They pointed out that the Respondents' employees were due a wage increase of 17.5 per cent under the Guidelines and there was no argument put forward on behalf of the Respondents as to why the workers should not get their entitlement under the Guidelines. Further they pointed out that the Court had retained the old annual increments instead of adopting the higher annual increments as had been offered by the Respondents. They maintained that the following increases were due to their members under the Court award:

The Claimants produced a paper showing actual picture which would emerge if their interpretation was upheld and maintained that it would be within the Guidelines.

The Respondents on the other hand maintained that the workers would get the new rate for their grade from 1st January, 1979 and then they would get their annual increase for that particular grade either on the 1st March or 1st October, 1979. They pointed out that the increases for the first year for the various grades as awarded, according to their interpretation ranged as follows:

They maintained that these were within the Guidelines as revealed by E.P.D.

The Court notes that on the 13th November, 1979 the Claimants wrote a letter to the Respondents in which they stated as follows:

"We strongly hold that on your implementing the award you should put the following into account, otherwise the union will have no option but to hold that the award is wrongly implemented.

- (a) 4th November, 1968 is the inception of counting years of service for those who were in the employ of the company by then and thereafter 4th November of year following would be the anniversary date for such counting years of service and for those who were employed after 4th November, 1968 the inception of counting years of service and the anniversary date would depend on the individual's date of engagement.
- (b) You immediately adjust the present notches to new notches for the employees grades and you grant wage increase determined by the Industrial Court.
- (c) For those earning over and above their grade rates to be granted increases as provided for in the award.
- (d) Those hanging between the notches as a result of provision (b) above to be brought to the immediate notch."

In reply to this letter the Respondents' personnel manager wrote as follows:

"We refer to your letter dated 13th November. We have now implemented the Industrial Court award taking into consideration points (a), (b), (c) and (d) of second paragraph of your letter. You will appreciate that arrears had to be calculated from 1st January, 1979 which has been done in the shortest possible time."

The Court would also like to refer to a letter of 15th February, 1980 which the Claimants wrote to the Respondents' company secretary/finacial controller in which they at one point stated as follows:

"(c) You agree that the Court award meant to give wage increase only to the minimum in each grade of K.Sh. 140 for subordinate K.Sh. 160 to the special subordinates K.Sh. 170 to clericals Grade II, etc. Surely you can see that this outlook is not plausible as the Court would not have meant that only those on minimum should get the figures quoted above and the rest should get half the amount."

The Court would now refer to the following two paragraphs in the Court award on page 4:

"The E.P.D. have further pointed out that as against the Claimants' demand of 40 per cent and the Respondents' offer of 8.2 per cent the maximum permissible increase under the Guidelines with 1977 G.D.P. included averaged at 17.5 per cent

The Court notes that in line with the past practice between the parties, the parties are agreed that the general wage increase should be granted to the workers at the commencement of the new collective agreement instead of being split in two instalments. The reason for this is that the later period of the agreement is taken care of by the annual increments."

It is obvious from the above that the Court intended to give the workers their full entitlement under the Guidelines and in line with the past practice they were to get it in one instalment in the beginning as the later years would be taken care of by the annual increments. The Court would also like to refer to its proviso B on the wage award which clearly states that for the employees whose basic monthly wages are below the specified new minimum rates for their grades their wages shall be brought up to the applicable new minimum rates for their grades and then be granted wage increases for such grades.

The Court referred the document produced by the Claimants to the Employment Promotion Division for working out a detailed analysis and the E.P.D. report shows that the current salary bill per month for the 119 employees is K.Sh. 136,044 and in accordance with the Claimants' interpretation the workers would get an average increase of K.Sh. 178/32 giving a weighted average of about 15.1 per cent. This would result in the total increase in the salary bill per month of K.Sh. 21,220. The E.P.D. confirmed that the Claimants would appear to be within the Guidelines stipulated.

The Court has carefully considered the various points made by the parties in connexion with this application and finds that the Claimants' interpretation is the correct one. Indeed the Respondents themselves, as stated earlier, had agreed to implement the award in accordance with what the Claimants had stated in respect thereof. It appears that later on the Respondents had other thoughts on the matter.

The Court accordingly rules that the Claimants' interpretation is the proper interpretation of the Court award and directs the Respondents that they should implement it forthwith on those lines.

The Court would like to record that the Respondents have confirmed that no employee has suffered or will suffer any wage deduction and the annual incremental rates have been or are to be applied in accordance with the Court award.

Finally the Court cannot in this application consider the Respondents' request that they had made certain typographical errors in the collective agreement and the Court should rectify them.

On the question of compassionate leave para (c) the Claimants' interpretation really is an appeal for the Court to vary

its own award. The Claimants' demand was rejected by the Court on this issue. The Court must reject the Claimants' application on this issue a it is not an interpretation application. They would no doubt be in a position to raise this matter again during the next revision of the collective agreement.
